More charges come for LC man accused of stealing over \$100,000 in heavy equipment

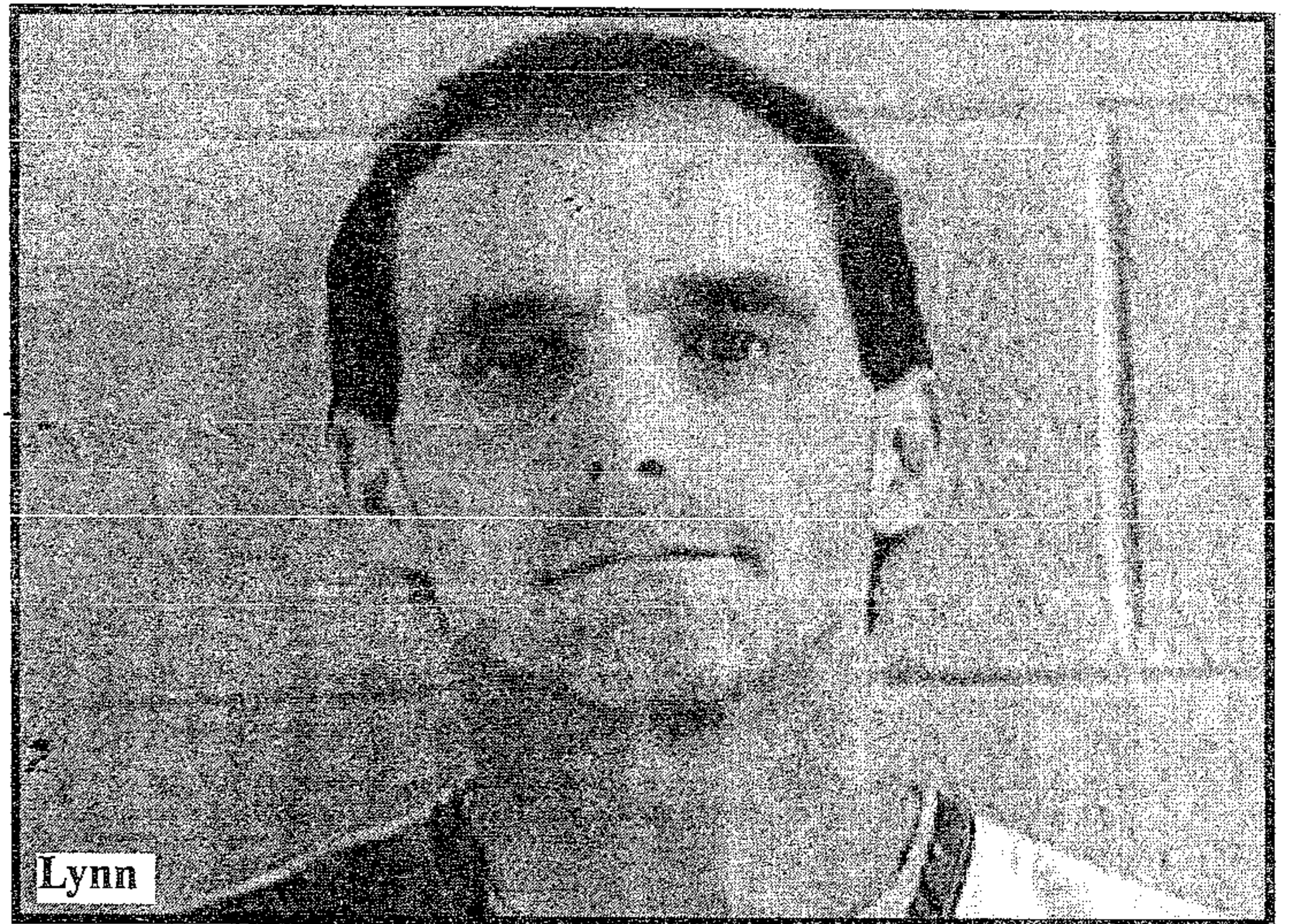
A local man who apparently thinks anything goes and everything is up for grabs is facing more theft charges following an investigation conducted by Detective Jonathan Sartin into the larcenies of multiple pieces of heavy equipment valued at thousands of dollars that have been taken from various job sites in the area.

According to warrants filed by Detective Jonathan Sartin, LCPD; on or about Novem-

ber 1, 2012, the victim left a Kubota Mini Excavator at a job site on Kingston Pike where they had been working. When the workers returned to the job site on November 5, the Kubota was gone.

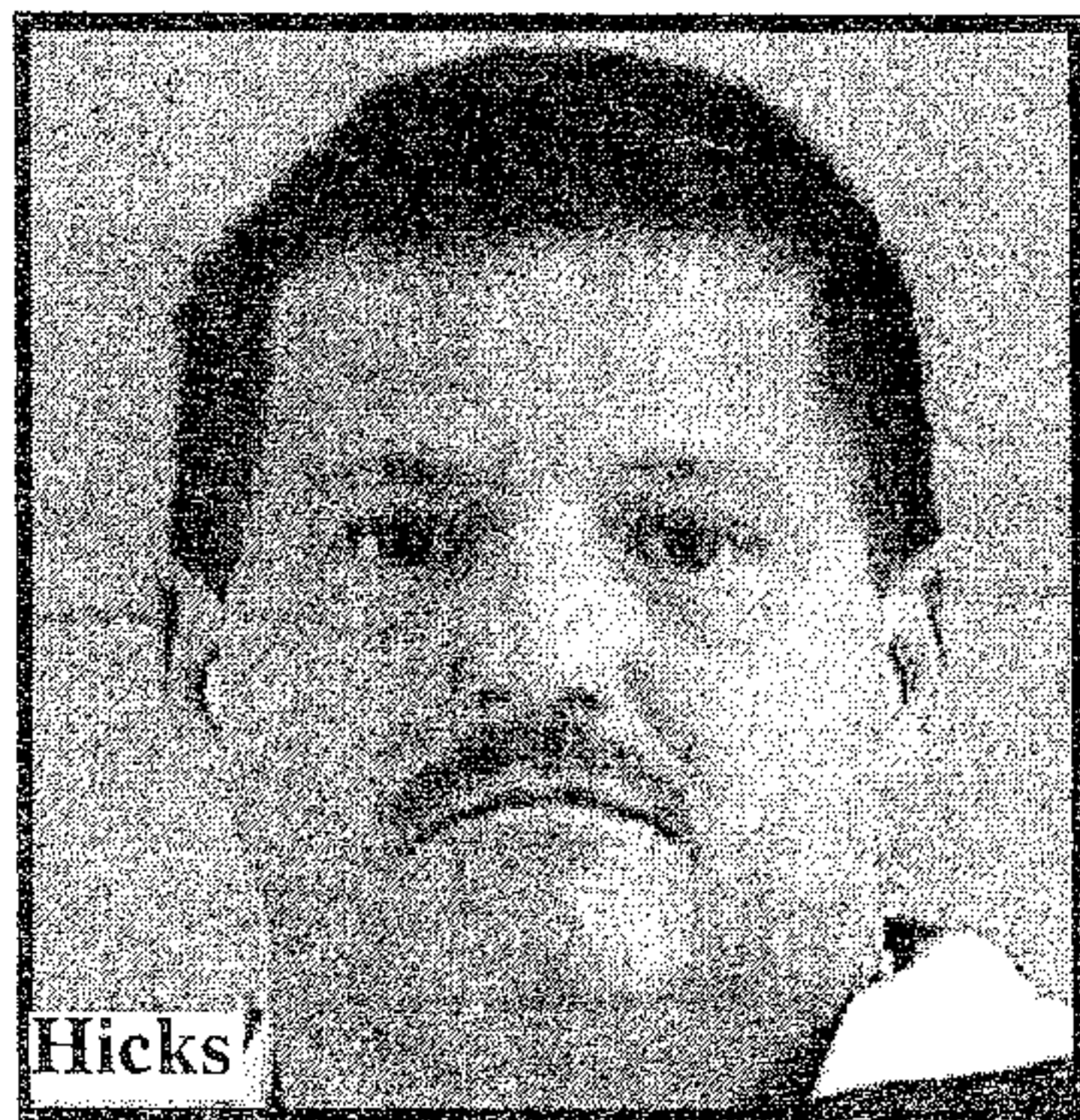
According to a witness, Jamey Brian Lynn had brought the Kubota Mini Excavator to his residence on Browder Hollow Road in Lenoir City where it was recovered. The total value of the Kubota mini excavator is \$25,000.

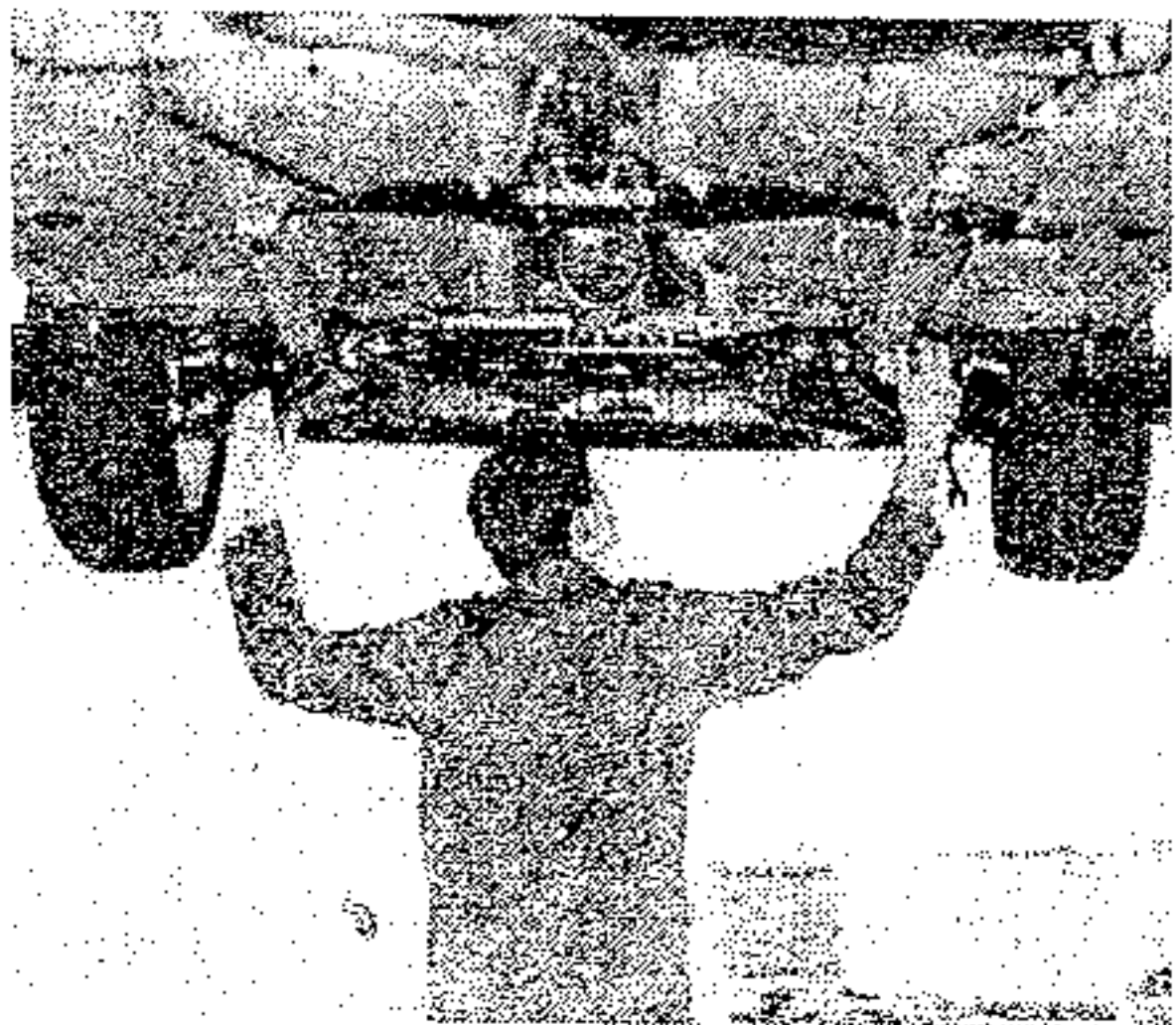
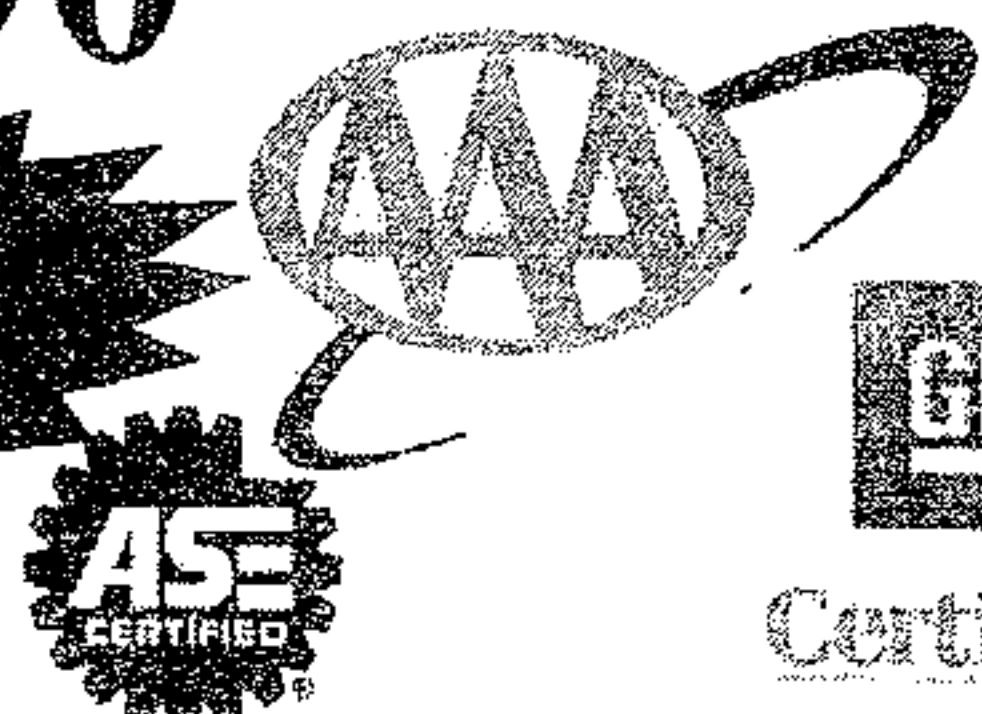

In another warrant, on November 2, 2012, the victim left a Bobcat skid steer on Hwy 321 where they had been working. When the workers returned to the job site on No-

vember 6, 2012, the Bobcat skid steer was gone.

According to a witness, Jamey Brian Lynn had brought the

Bobcat skid steer to his residence on Browder Hollow Road where it was recovered. The total value of the Bobcat skid steer is \$19,500.

In another warrant, on or about November 1, 2012, the victim left his 32-foot goose neck trailer with a kidney shaped swimming pool on it on Kingston Pike. When the victim returned to get it on November 5, 2012, the trailer and pool was gone.

According to a witness, Jamey Brian Lynn had brought the pool to his residence on Browder Hollow Road where it was recovered. The pool is valued at \$12,000.

Detective Sartin noted he saw the trailer at Lynn's Huntsville Hollow Road residence.

In another warrant, on or about November 10, 2012, the victim left a Bobcat skid steer on East Broadway where they had been working. When the workers returned to the job site on November 12, 2012, the Bobcat skid steer was gone.

According to a witness, Jamey Lynn had brought the Bobcat skid steer to his residence on Riverview Road. The value of the skid steer is \$20,000.

A few days later, Detective Sartin filed two more charges of theft over \$10,000 against Lynn. According to one of those warrants; on or about November 9, 2012, the victim

left a Case backhoe at Hayfield and Kingston Pike where they were working. When the workers returned on November 12, 2012, the Case backhoe was gone.

According to a witness, Jamey Brian Lynn brought the backhoe to his residence on Riverview Road where it was recovered. The backhoe was valued at \$23,000.

In the other warrant; on or about May 8, 2012, the victim left a Bobcat skid steer at Kingston Pike and Everett Road in Knox County where they had been working. When the workers returned on May 9, 2012, the Bobcat skid steer was gone.

According to a witness, Jamey Brian Lynn brought the Bobcat skid steer to his residence on Browder Hollow Road where it was recovered. The value of the Bobcat skid steer is \$23,000.

Jamey Brian Lynn, 42, of Huntsville Hollow Road, Lenoir City was charged with six counts of theft over \$10,000.

Lynn was charged in late-November with theft over \$10,000 in connection with the larceny of a Fast Trac mini excavator taken from a Highway 321, Lenoir City job site. (see the Wednesday, November 28, 2012 edition of The Daily Edition for details.)

Detective Jonathan Sartin, LCPD made the arrest.

A local man is accused of making out bogus checks on non-existent bank accounts and cashing them a local Hispanic business where he received more than \$1600 in cash.

According to warrants filed by Detective Jack Fine, LCPD; on October 1, 2012, Roger Hicks took a check in the amount of \$980 to Servicios Latinos to cash it. The check was from Athco in Lenexa, Kansas, but the checking account number does not exist.

Hicks passed the check with the intent to defraud another.

In another warrant, on September 29, 2012, Roger Hicks took a check for \$680 to Servicios Latinos to have it cashed. The check was from Sienna Heights University in Adrian, Michigan and was made out to Hicks. The account number does not exist and this was done to defraud another.
