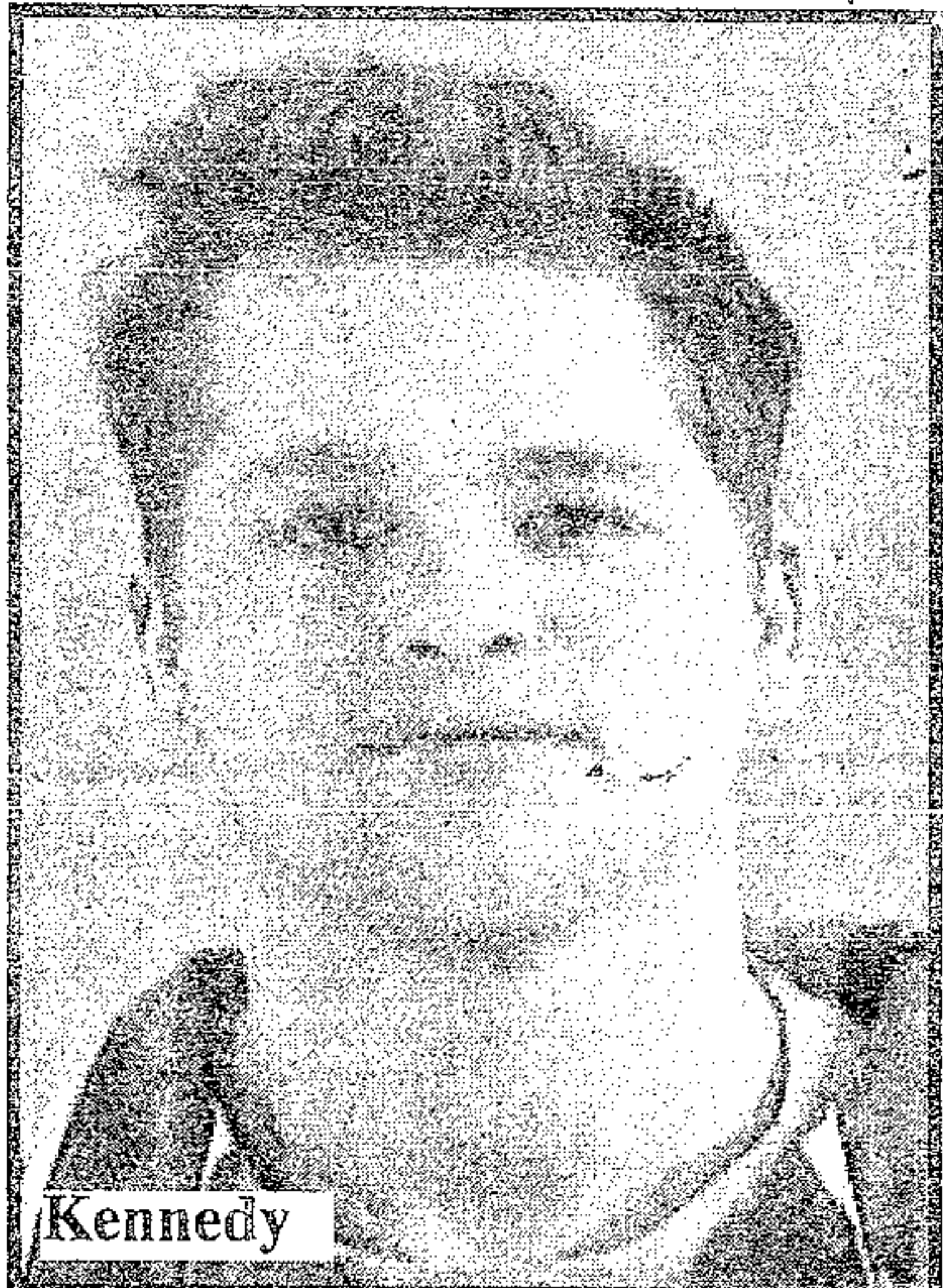


Over \$10K in damage to vehicle gets man charged with felony

Detective Charles Cosner charged a young Lenoir City man with vandalism following an investigation into thousands of dollars in damages done to a BMW earlier this year.

According to the warrant filed by Sgt. Detective Charles Cosner, LCSO CID; on or about May 27, 2012, Gage Conley Kennedy did knowingly cause damage to the victim's 2003 BMW while attending a social gathering on Hines Valley

Detective Jonathan Sartin arrested a local man on charges he damaged a woman's vehicle, then made threats against her life during numerous phone calls Friday.

According to warrants filed by Detective Jonathan Sartin, LCPD; on or about December 14, 2012, Edwin Serano went to the victim's residence in Lenoir City. While there he let the air out

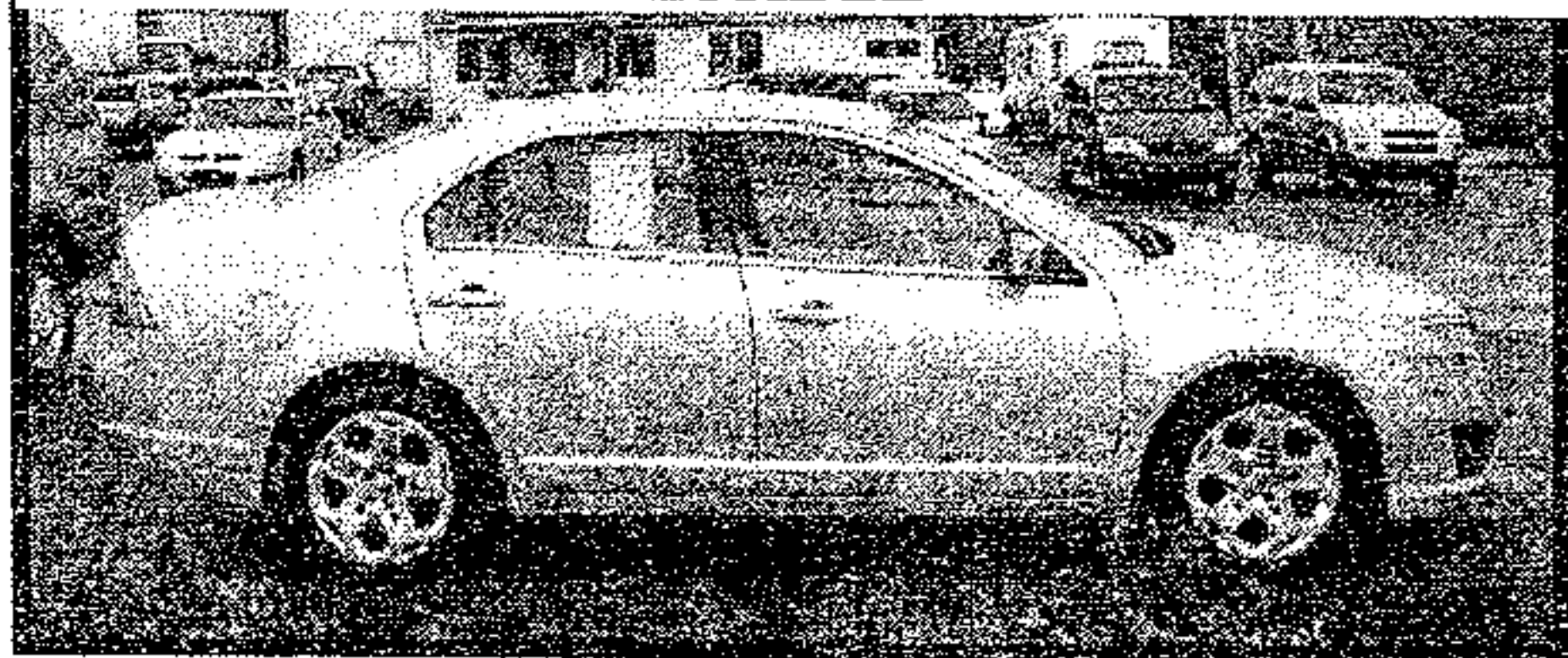
