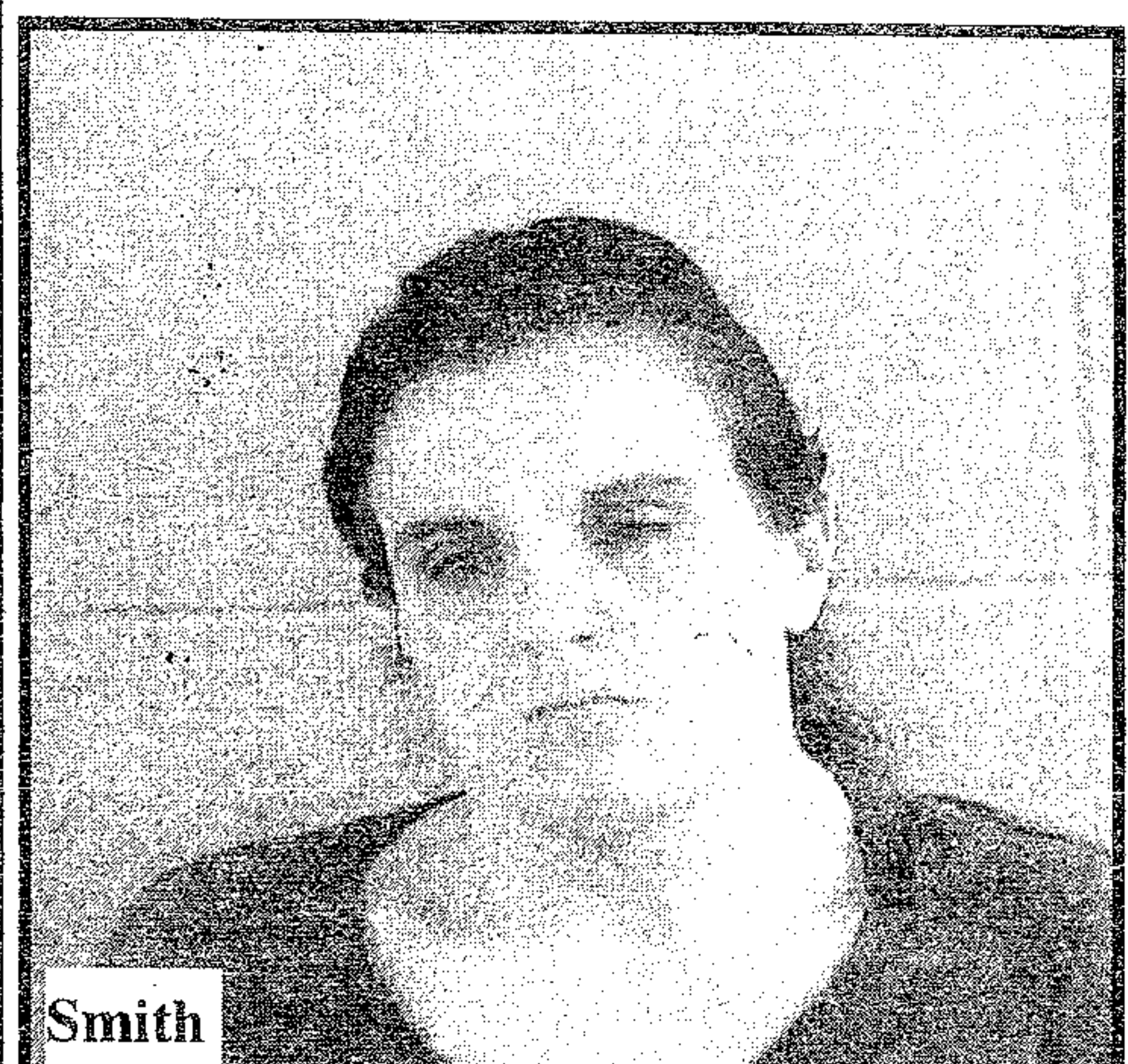

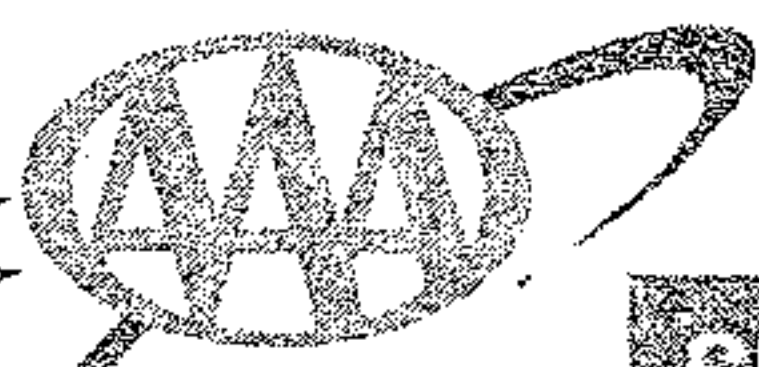

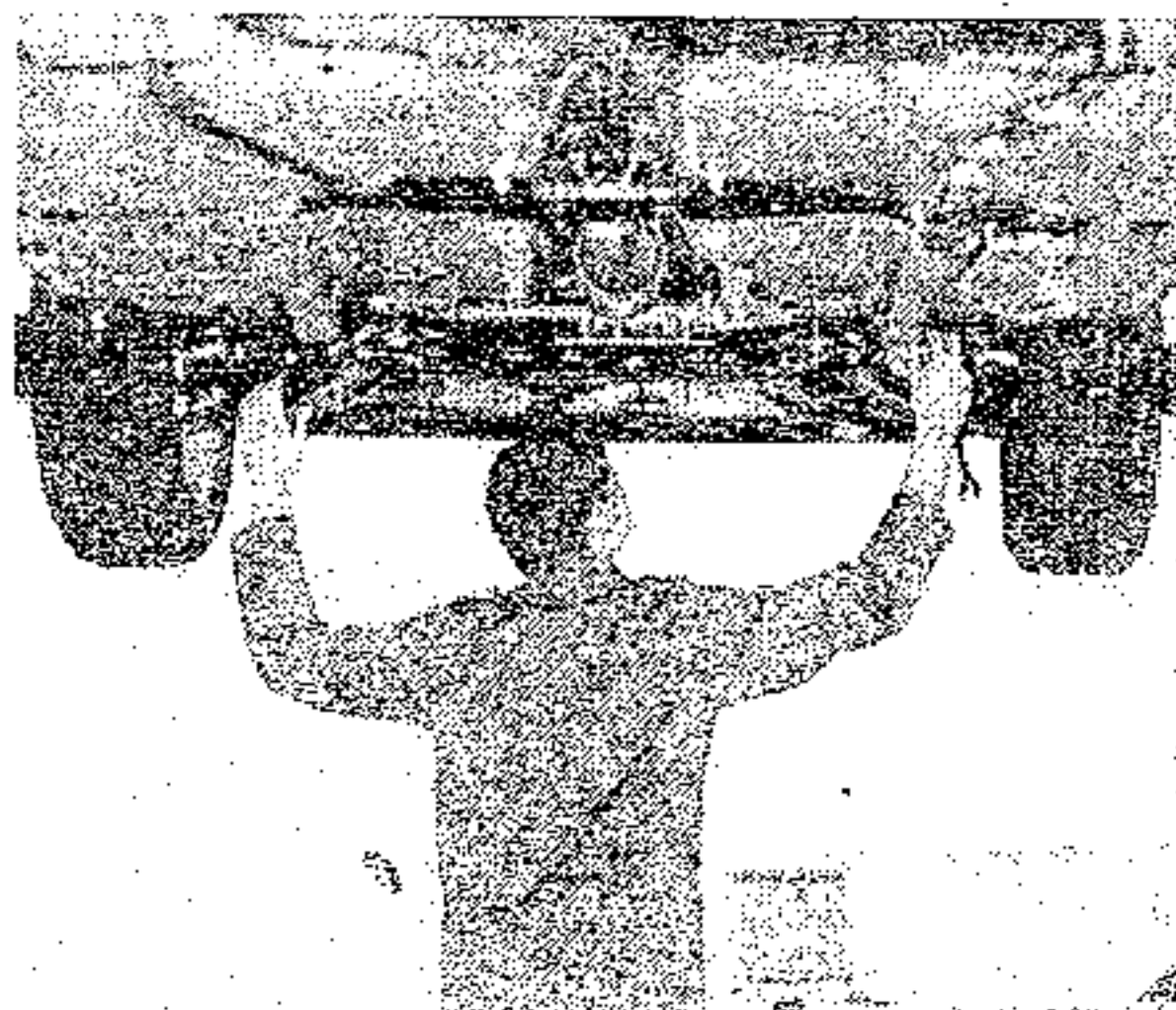

Public Notice LCUB Cross Connection Program

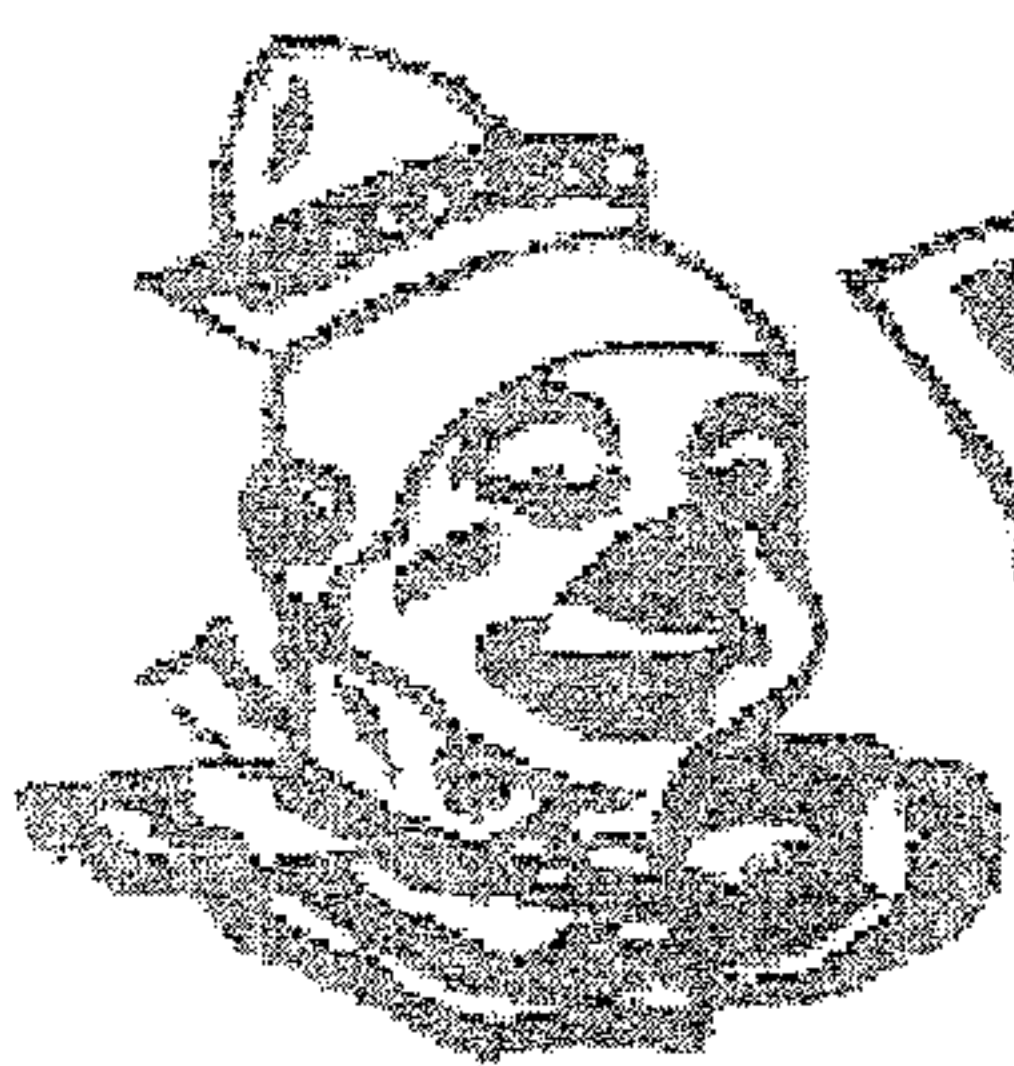
The Lenoir City Utilities Board is pleased to announce it has contracted with Tennessee Utility Assistance, LLC. of Murfreesboro, Tennessee to assist with the State Required Cross Connection Control Program. This program is designed to inform you, the customer, about existing or potential cross connections that may exist in your home/business' plumbing system. Lenoir City Utilities Board's goal is to provide our customers with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve and protect our drinking water resources. We are committed to ensuring the quality of your drinking water.

Cross Connections: A cross connection is any connection or possible connection between a potable water system and any source of contamination through which contaminated water could enter the potable water system. An example is the common garden hose attached to a sill cock with the end of the hose submerged into a bucket of detergent. Other examples include: in ground lawn sprinkler systems, swimming pools, hot tubs, etc.

Starting February 2012, our contracted firm will notify customers via postal letter with a scheduled date for a cross connection inspection. The inspection usually takes 10-45 minutes and a loss of water may occur during this time. In previous years, customers have contracted with outside vendors to have the inspections performed, any outside tests reports will not be accepted in the future. The new inspection and test performed will be at a cost of \$51.50 per device/customer this year. Lenoir City Utilities Board and Tennessee Utility Assistance, LLC will be conducting all residential and commercial Cross Connection Inspections and will be contacting customers in the future.

In order to maintain a safe and dependable water supply, changes to customer's plumbing may be required. Inspections and/or improvements may result in a cost to the water customer. We ask that all customers help us protect our drinking water supply by participating in the cross connection control program and the upcoming efforts to keep operational costs to a minimum. Thank you for allowing us to continue providing your family with clean and safe drinking water.

Deputy Bruce Padgett, LCSO made the arrest at the Roane County Jail.

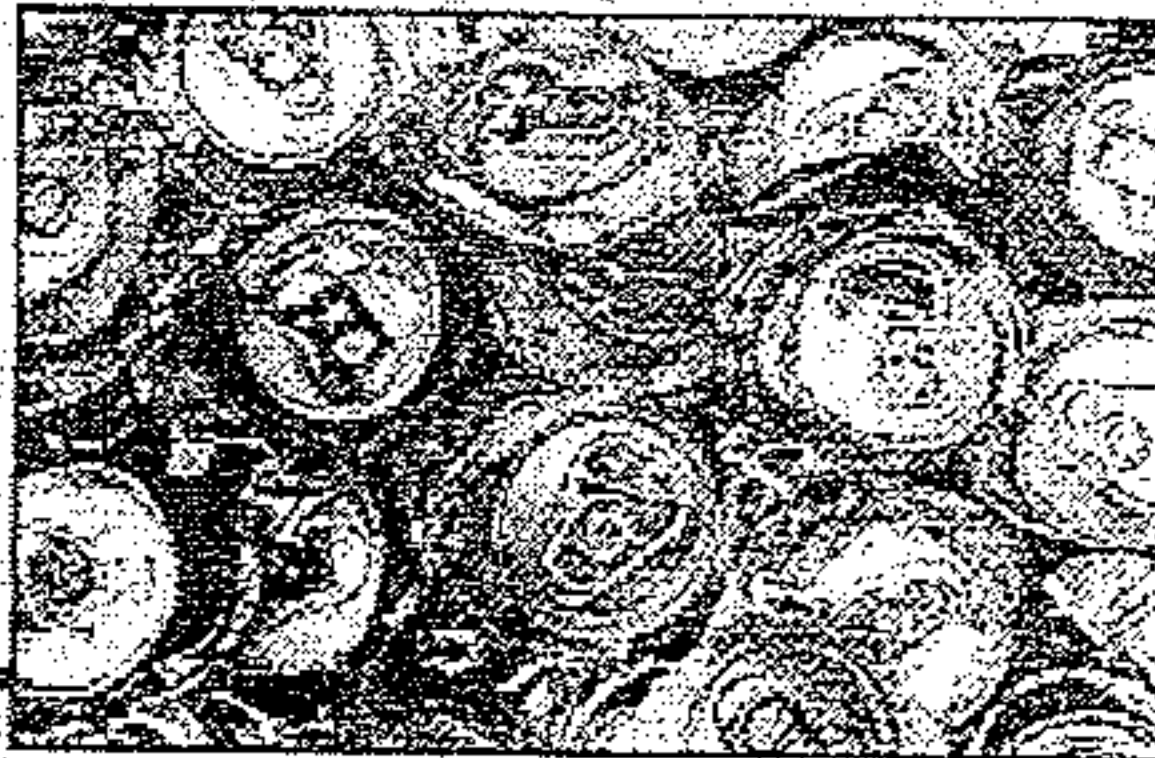

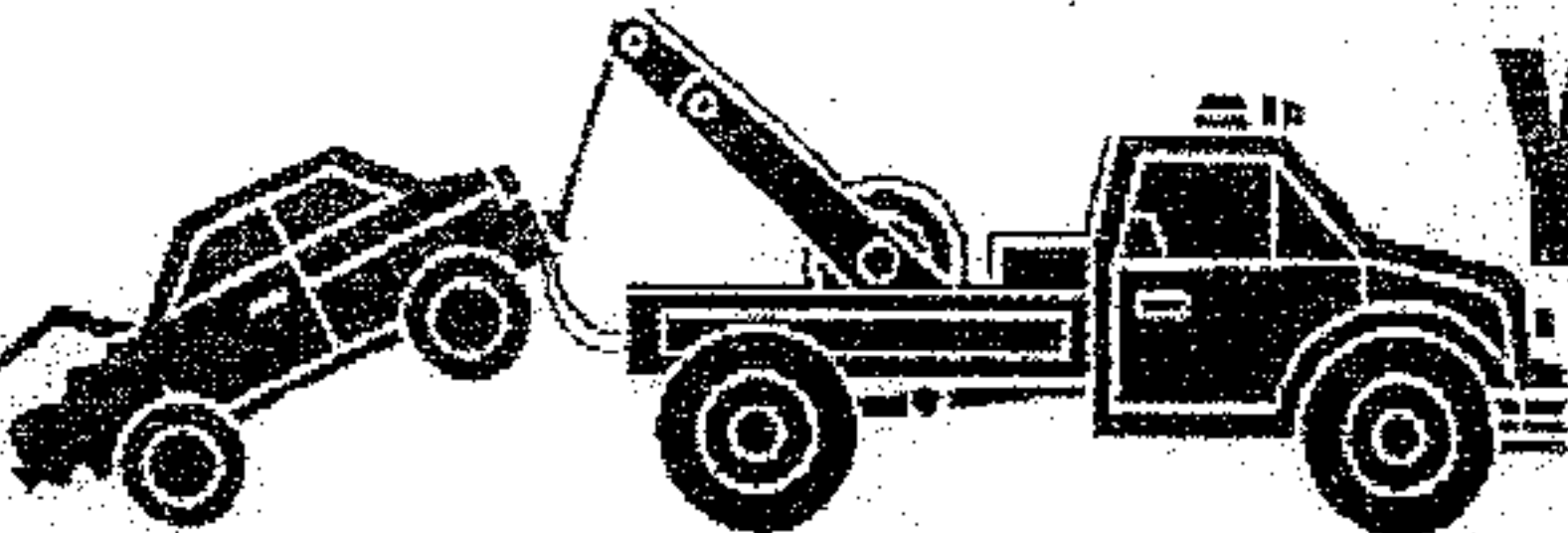

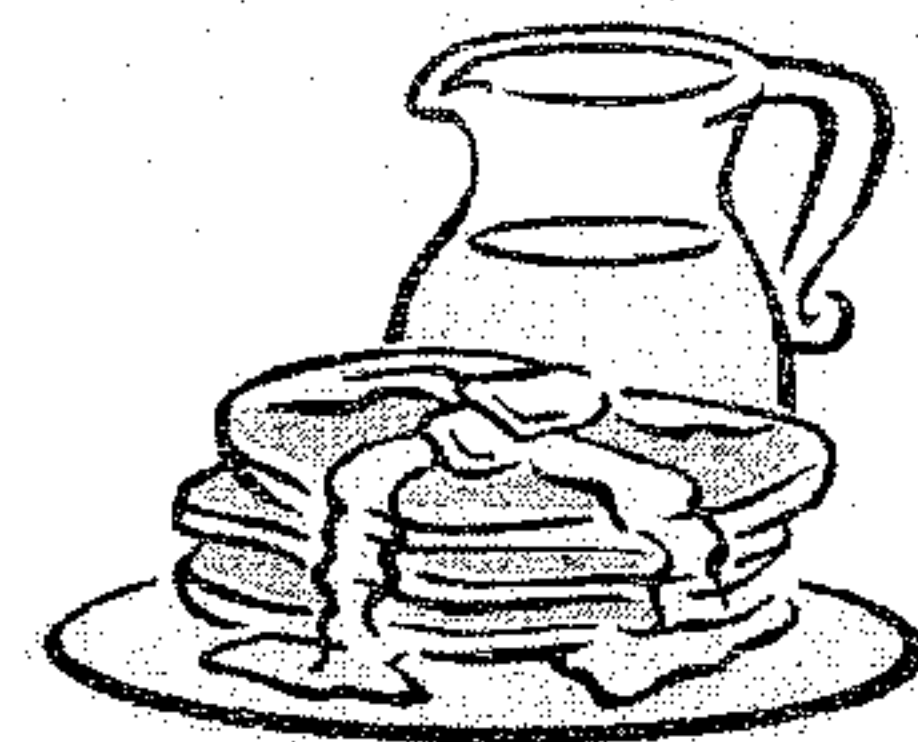

Feud

A local woman has been charged with arson and stalking in connection with a family feud that culminated in the destruction of a storage shed when she allegedly set it afire after sending numerous threatening letters to the victim and other family members.

Pamela Sue 'Pam' Loveday, 51, homeless was charged with arson, stalking, and failure to appear.

According to multiple records, on or about February 8, 2012, Mr. Vaugh Loveday reported he and the rest of his family are being harassed by his daughter, Pam Loveday. Mr. Loveday provided a letter recently left in his son's mailbox, written by Ms. Loveday that was very threatening in

nature.

Mr. Loveday also stated they have a file containing approximately 200 letters from Ms. Loveday containing similar threats. The letters are received by various means and arrive approximately two to three times per week.

Mr. Loveday has told Ms. Loveday several times that the harassment and threats are unwanted and to stop all communications including letters, with him and his family. Detective Charles Cosner, LCSO-CID made the arrest Thursday.

According to an affidavit filed by Detective Jonathan Sartin, LCPD; on or about February 9, 2012, Ms. Loveday went to a West Broadway, Lenoir City residence where she set fire to a storage shed be-

longing to Vaugh Loveday of Loudon.

The shed was totally destroyed from the fire that Ms. Loveday set. She was located at Knights Inn in Lenoir City and where an odor of gasoline was found on her shoes and clothing.

Detective Sartin made the arrest Friday at the Loudon County Jail.

Loveday also was charged with failure to appear out of Knox County.

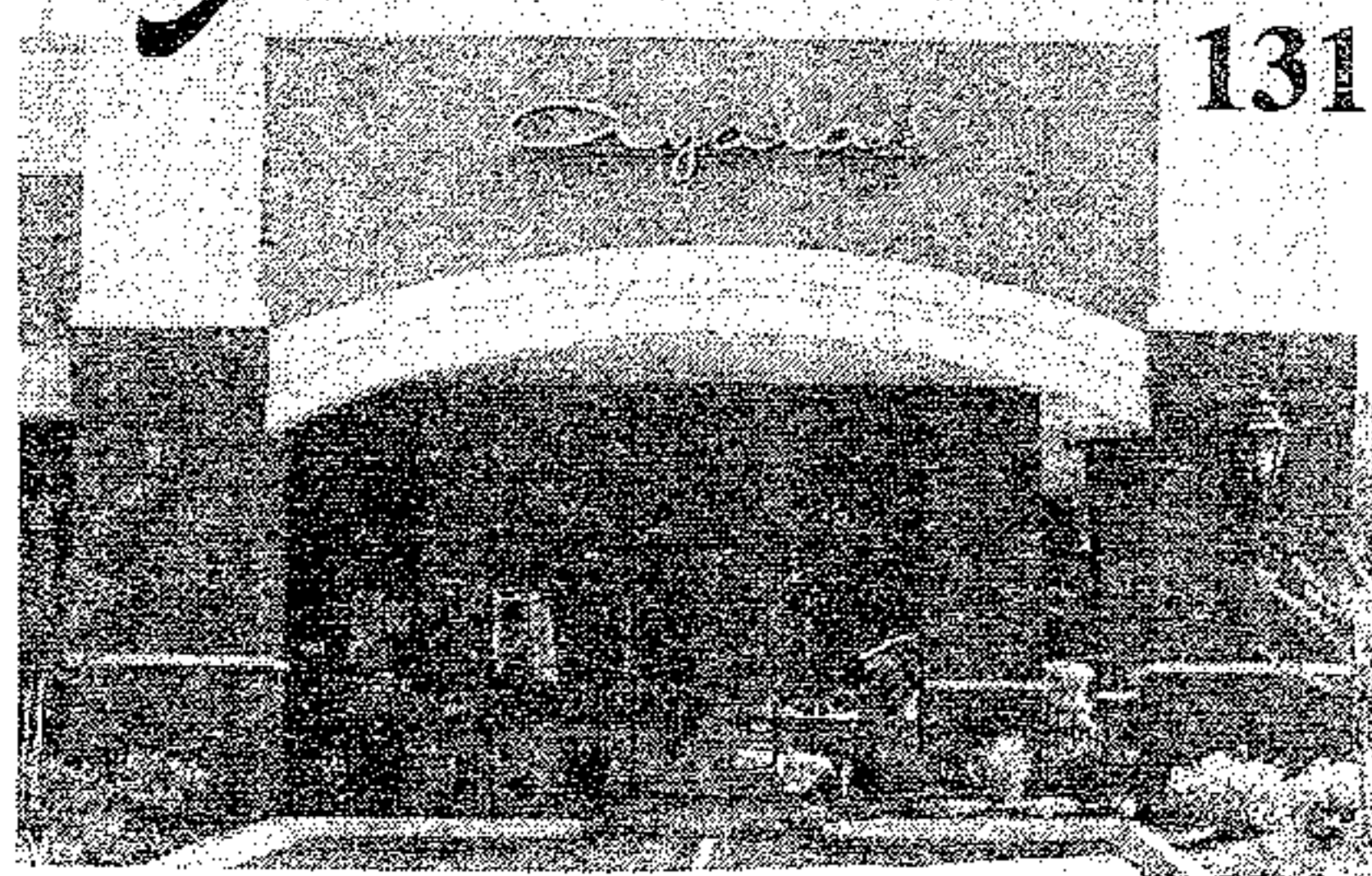

Fraud

A Philadelphia woman was jailed Friday following an investigation into allegations she was obtaining prescription drugs by fraudulent means.

Erica Roshanda Smith, 37, Steekee Creek Road, Philadelphia was charged with obtaining drugs by fraud and violation of probation.

According to affidavits; on February 10,

2012, Agent Brendan DeBoer, 9th DTF participated in an investigation with Officer Samuel Harrison, LPD involving prescriptions being fraudulently obtained by Erica Smith of Philadelphia. Agent DeBoer and Detective Harrison went to Ms. Smith's residence on Steekee Creek Road and interviewed her regarding the prescriptions.

Ms. Smith was read her Miranda Warnings and agreed to speak with

the lawmen. She made statements that over the last 30 days on approximately 6 separate occasions she called in to local pharmacies claiming to be a doctor and ordering prescriptions for the drug tramadol. Ms. Smith then picked up the pills and used them for her own consumption.

Ms. Smith told the officers she was abusing the medication by consuming over 25 pills a day. Agent DeBoer took her into custody and transported her to the Loudon County Jail.

Later that day, Ms. Smith was arrested again on a violation of probation warrant by Deputy Brad Rayfield, LCSO.
