ber 12, 2011 Trooper Matthew Armes, THP investigated a crash with injury that occurred. The crash investigation revealed that the vehicle, a 2009 Dodge extended cab pickup truck was owned by Derrek Scott Elder and that Greg A. Fowler was operating the vehicle traveling on East Coast Tellico Parkway along with passengers Derrek Scott Elder, Jeremy C. Breeden and Jessica J. Breeden. Derrek Scott Elder was in the bed of the pickup standing behind the cab.

The driver of the truck Greg Fowler executed a right turn onto Morganton Road at a high rate of speed resulting in Derrek Elder to be thrown from the bed of the truck onto the roadway surface resulting in multiple serious bodily injuries.

Trooper Armes further stated the driver of the vehicle, Greg Fowler was driving while intoxicated and also alleges that Derrek Scott Elder did knowingly consent to Greg Fowler to drive his vehicle while in an intoxicated condition. Elder along with Greg Fowler and two other passengers had been consuming several alcoholic beverages the morning of December 12, 2011.
