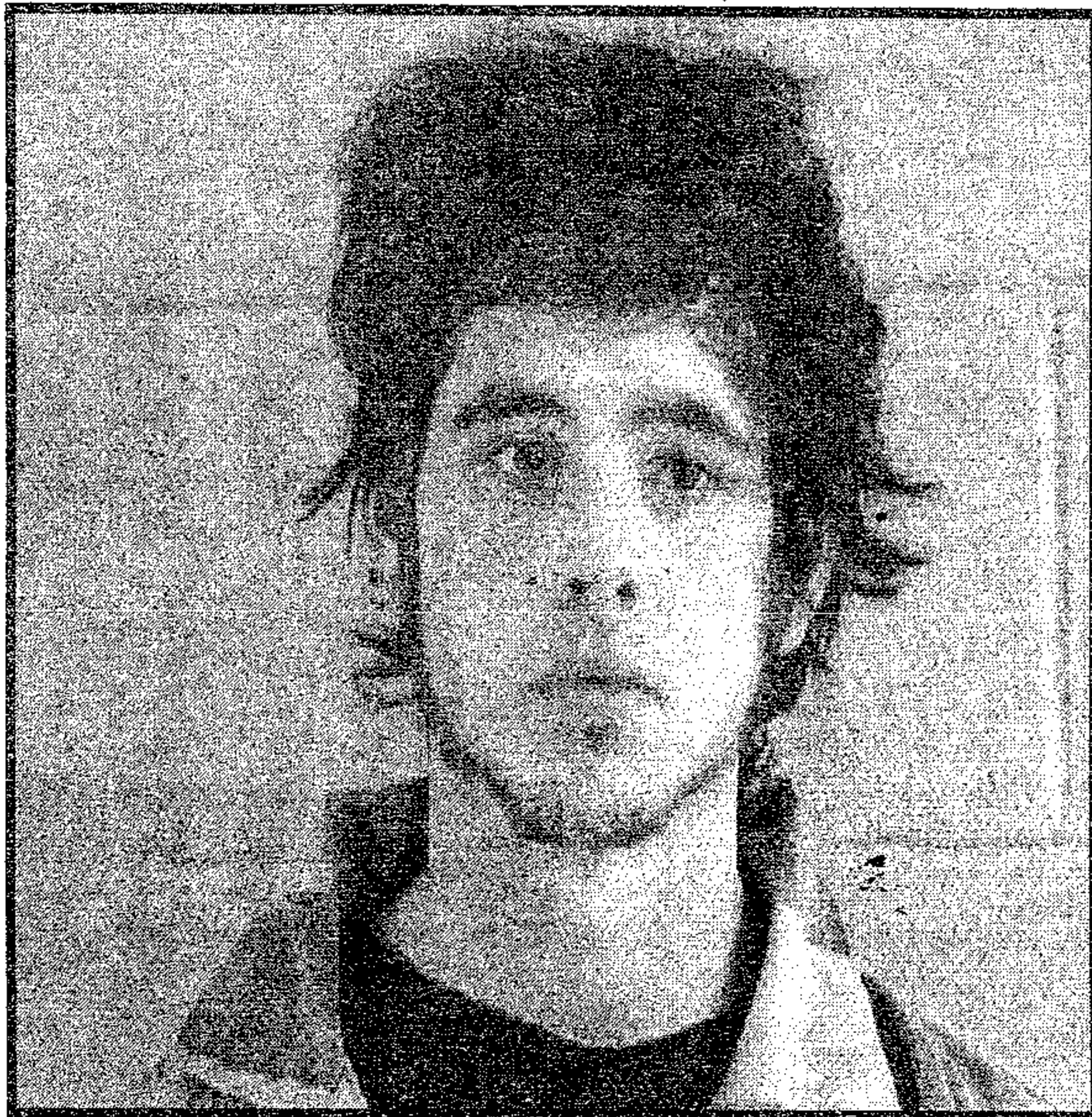


How dumb do you gotta be to kick an officer while your in custody?

Stay Away

Mr. Finchum fled the apartment into the woods. He was identified by his mother as the attacker. She stated he was banned from the apartment complex and was there unlawfully.

Finchum had unlawfully entered his mother's apartment and woke her up to inform her he received a citation a few hours earlier from Officer Gentry, LCPD. Finchum's mother notified him he was not to be at the apartment complex, he would get her evicted and he was to leave immediately. Mr. Finchum wouldn't leave and would not allow his mother to leave.

As the victim was attempting to leave the apartment, Finchum held the victim against her will. When she was screaming for help he was telling her to stop, and when she reached for her cell phone to call 911, he stole it and ran into the woods behind the apartment complex.

Records indicate Finchum had signed a trespassing notice stating he was not to be on Lenoir City Housing Authority property earlier that day.

However, Mr. Finchum reportedly told Detective Jonathan Sartin, LCPD that the order was not going to stop him.

LCPD Officers Burley, Sennett, and Felts, proceeded to search the woods for Finchum, who was located about 30 yards in the woods. He was ordered to the ground and complied. K9 Officer Sennett was the covering officer while Officer Burley handcuffed Mr. Finchum.

While returning from the woods, Finchum proceeded to kick Officer Burley in the right leg, just below the knee. He was taken to the ground and then transported to the waiting police vehicles without further incident.

Muddy Creek Road for a non functioning tail light. The driver, Anthony Satterfield, had red bloodshot eyes, and

slurred speech. When he exited the vehicle, Satterfield was very unsteady on his feet and the deputy had to help him walk. After

Mr. Satterfield got out of the vehicle, Deputy Bowman noticed a small white pill, identified as lorazepam, laying in the driver's seat.

Mr. Satterfield did poorly on field sobriety tasks, was read the implied consent advisement and gave consent. He told the deputy he had been smoking marijuana and taking xanax on that day. A search of Satterfield's car produced a glass bowl used to smoke marijuana and when asked if it was his, Satterfield replied yes and he was smoking marijuana out of it that night.

Mr. Satterfield was escorted to the Fort Loudoun ER for a chemical test and then to the Loudon County Jail.

Christopher Leon Lane, 25, Highway 70 West, Lenoir City was charged with violation of probation and simple possession of marijuana.

According to records, Deputy Cody Fritts, LCSO stopped a black Ford Mustang on Highway 70. The passenger, Christopher Lane, got out and took off walking at a fast pace, towards his residence.

The deputy repeatedly told Lane to stop, but he kept walking. Lane went around the side of his residence, out of sight, and then returned

a short time later.

Mr. Lane gave the officer consent to search his person and he discovered a small bag of marijuana in Lane's right pocket. Mr. Lane also had a violation of probation warrant against him. He was placed into custody and transported to jail.

James N. McNutt, 31, Carlton Circle, Knoxville was charged with DUI 1st offense.

According to reports, Sgt. Jimmy D. Whitt, THP observed a black Toyota traveling north on Interstate 75 and noted it was in the right lane and weaving across the center line. It continued across the left northbound lane and ran out of the road.

Sgt. Whitt performed a traffic stop at the 84 mile marker and identified the driver as James McNutt. Mr. McNutt appeared to be very sleepy and stated he hadn't slept in a couple of days. His speech was lethargic and slurred.
