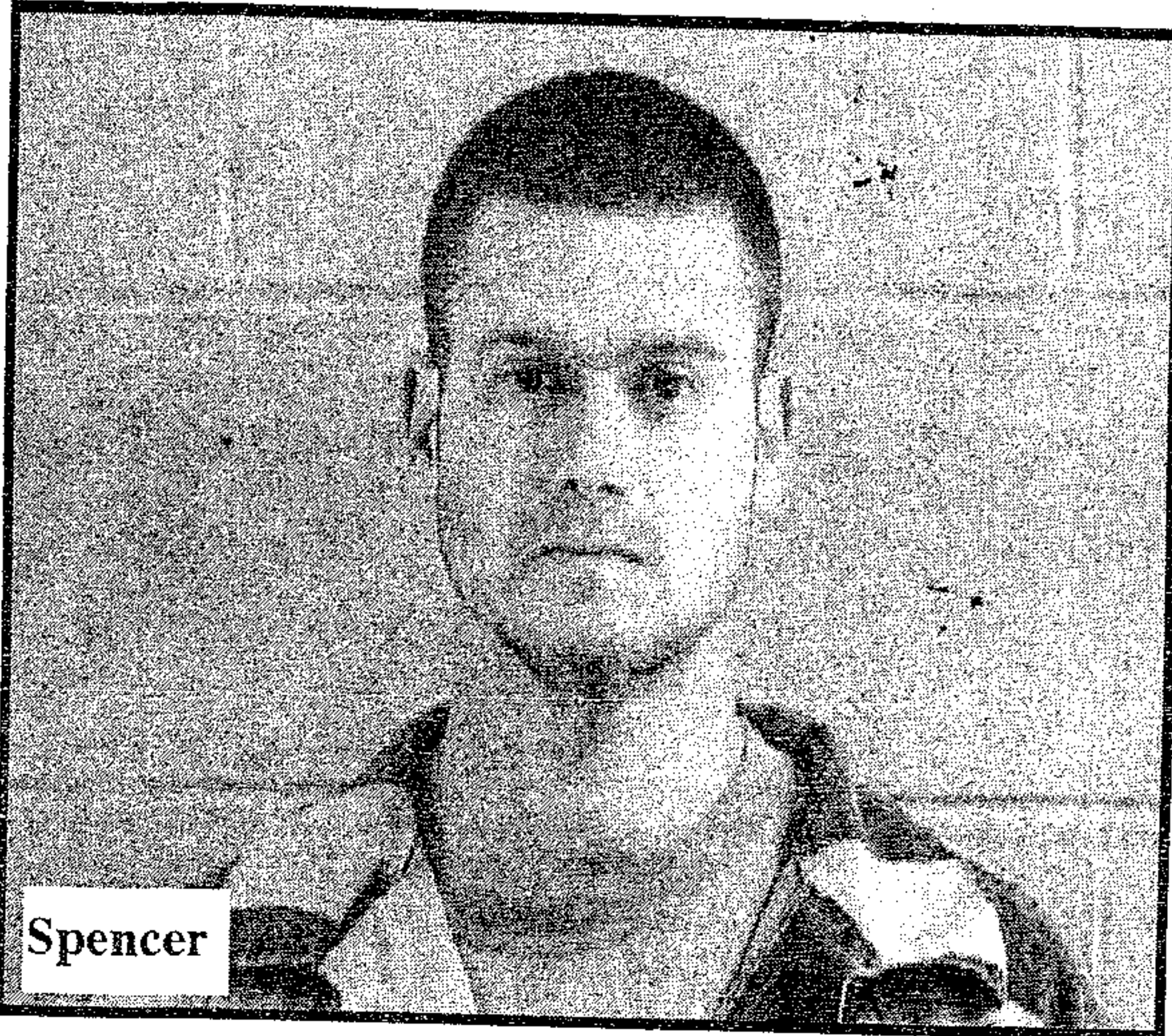

## Loudon man punches LC businessman, vandalizes property, goes to jail

A Loudon man who reportedly decided to handle a dispute with a Lenoir City businessman by using violence and vandalism tactics was taken to jail in connection with his alleged actions and, once at the jail, was found to have marijuana in his possession, which he claimed was his medicine.

charged with introduction into a penal facility, felony vandalism and assault.

According to affidavits filed by Detective Jack Fine, LCPD; on January 27, 2012, at 3:55 PM, Brandon C. Spencer went to Wiggins Siding & Guttering and punched business owner Chris Wiggins in the stomach with his fist while at Wiggins' place of business located at 112 East Broadway in Lenoir City. Upon leaving the business he told Wig-

gins he would whip his a\$\$.

On February 7, 2012 at 5:30 PM, and February 8, at 8:00 AM, Mr. Spencer slashed and cut the tires on two vehicles owned by Wiggins. Both vehicles were parked on South A Street near the museum.

The vehicles were listed as a 2003 Chevrolet box truck and a 1993 Ford F-150. Eight tires were slashed totalling \$1733.25. Both vehicles were business vehicles and caused a loss in Wiggins' busi-

ness estimated at a total of \$3445.

Officer Brandon Burley, LCPD made the arrest Friday and upon searching Mr. Spencer, asked him if he had anything illegal in his possession, to which Spencer replied, "No." Once at the jail, however, a small bag of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana was discovered on Mr. Spencer's person, which Spencer stated was his medicine.

Deputy Nathan Wilson, LCSO made the arrests Friday at the jail.



**What's Next?**

According to reports, Deputy Brandon Dixon, LCSO responded to a theft call on Elm Street in Philadelphia Tuesday. The victim advised sometime between February 12 and February 20, 2012, someone came onto his property and stole a refrigerator and an electric stove.

The victim advised he did not give anyone permission to take the appliances from his property and valued both at about \$600.

The crime is under investigation.

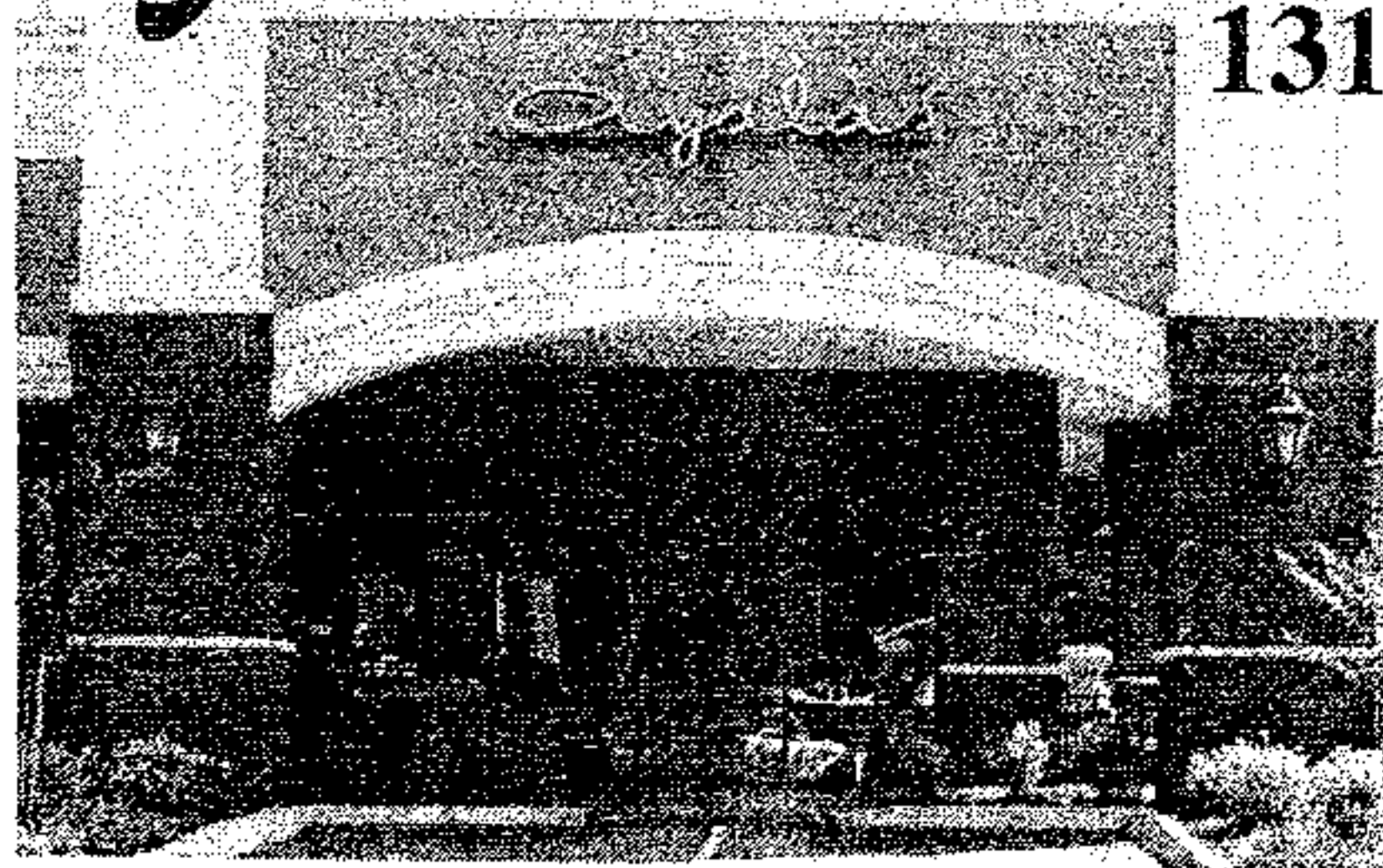

Charles William Moore, 26, Highland Avenue, Lenoir City was charged with assault by domestic violence and possession of drug paraphernalia..

According to reports, Deputy Chris Jenkins, LCSO was called to Highland Avenue Friday morning on a domestic dispute. The

female was bleeding from the nose and the male had already left the premises. When the lawman arrived at the residence he observed blood in the victim's nose and on her hands and there was blood on clothing and the floor of the bedroom.

The victim stated she and Moore got into a verbal altercation and the argument turned physical when he grabbed her purse and as she tried to get it back he hit her in the face, causing damage to her nose. She tried to get her phone to seek medical treatment or call 911 when Moore got it and broke it by

throwing it against the wall.

The deputy noted in his report there was broken glass on the floor in plain view, bloodstains on the bed and a towel the victim said Mr. Moore used to try to clean up the blood. A broken and disabled Motorola Slide phone was also in the bedroom.

Two witnesses were at the residence and heard the altercation from the other room and advised they heard things breaking and also heard the victim say she was bleeding and the victim said she was in pain and feared for her safety.

Mr. Moore was located minutes later at LCUB on Depot Street by Deputy T. J. Scarbrough, LCSO. He had cuts, scrapes and blood on his hands. Mr. Moore advised he had two syringes in his vehicle.

Two syringes and a spoon with white

powder residue on the spoon were found in the console. Moore was taken into custody and duly charged. Deputy Jenkins made the arrest. LCSO Deputies Brandon Dixon, T.J. Scarbrough and Corporal Pete McGinley were also on the scene.


