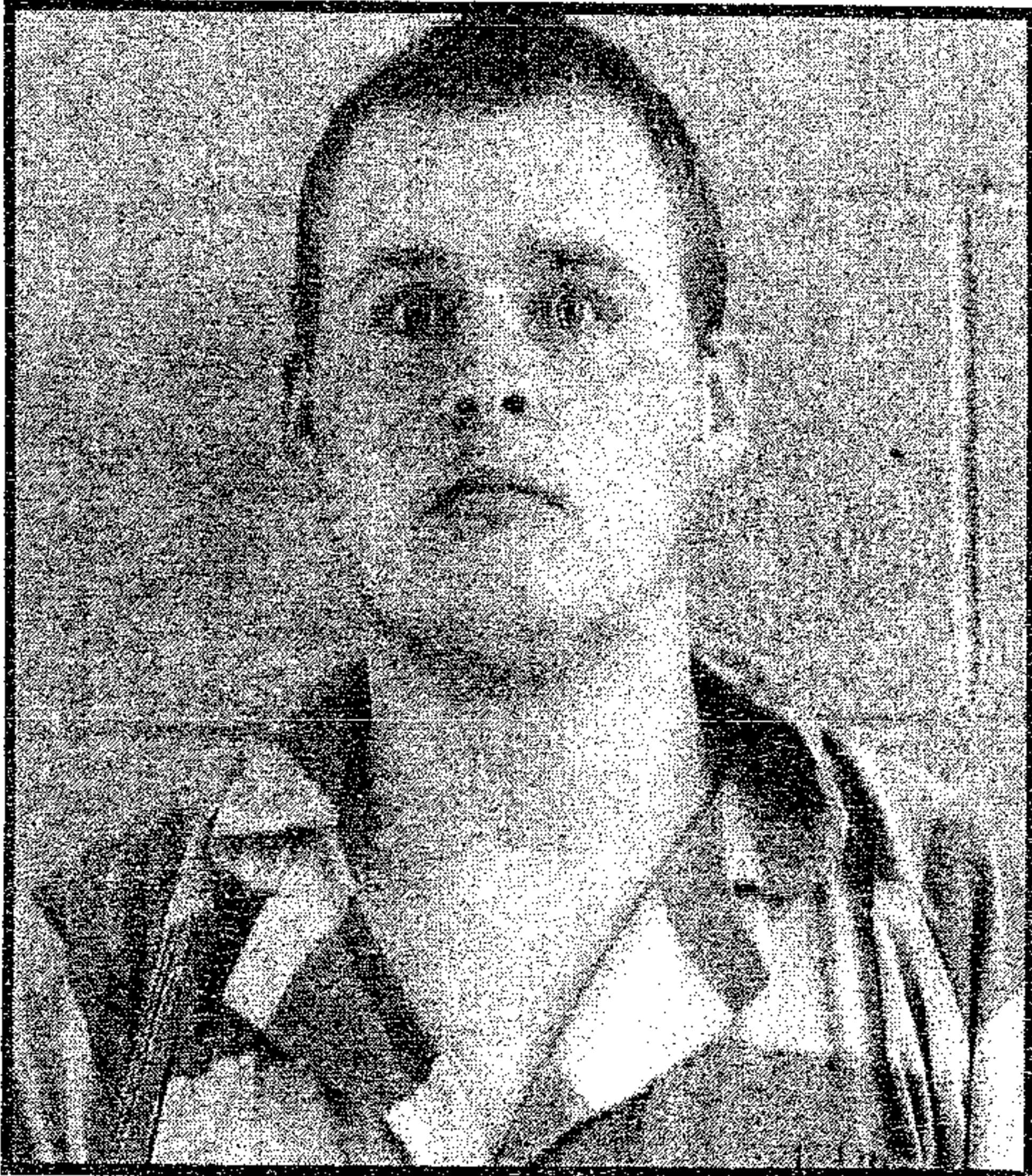

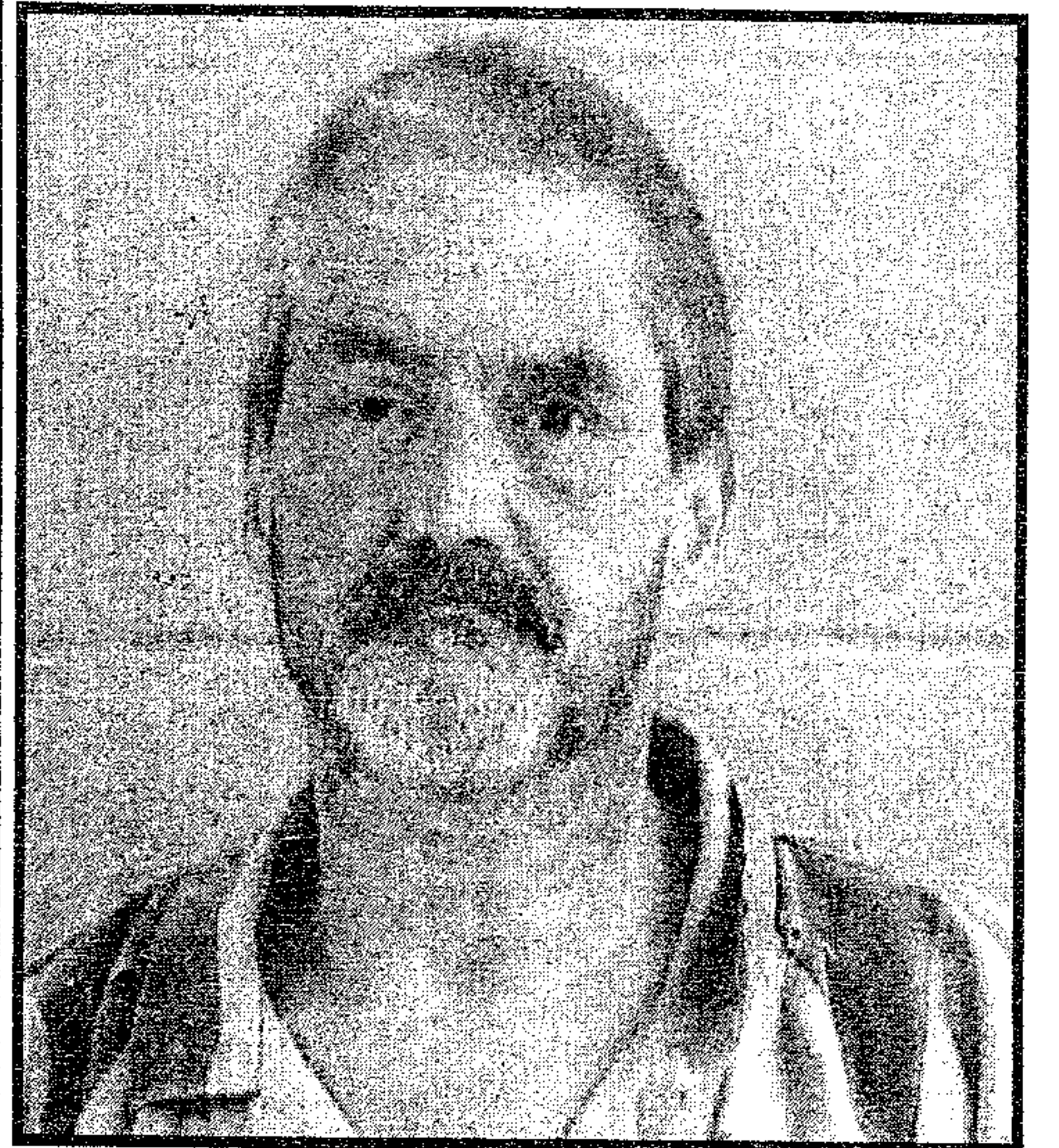

Arsonist Threatens Arson serving several years for arson. fresh out of prison after William Curtis Crew,

30, Spring Street, Philadelphia was charged with domestic assault.

According to records, Deputy Stegall, LCSO responded to Spring Street Monday on a domestic and reported the victim stated she was at Mr. Crew's residence on Spring Street when her ex-boyfriend, William 'Billy' Crew came inside after talking to Deputy Stegall and Lt. A.J. Yokley, LCSO, about another incident where he was threatening another person on Elm Street, which is just a short distance from Crew's residence.

The woman reported Crew was intoxicated and started calling her a snitch and other names and threatened to burn

her house down. The victim said she was in fear for her life because Crew was just released from prison after serving eight years for arson.

Deputy Stegall then went to Mr. Crew's residence on Spring Street and took him into custody. It was noted in the deputy's report Crew had already displayed violent behavior and there was reason to believe that Crew was able to carry out his threat.

Possible Scrap Thief?

March 9, 2011, Mr. Jimmy Williams reported that during the weekend of March 3, 2012, he noticed several items missing from his farm on Hotchkiss Valley Road in Lenoir City and described them as a front-end loader bucket,



Bruce Winfred Jenkins, 54, West Second Avenue, Lenoir City was charged with promoting the manufacture of methamphetamine and possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to affidavits; on March 11, 2012, Investigator Jason Butler, LCPD-ND responded to 502 West Second Avenue to investigate possible drug activity. Mr. Bruce Jenkins consented to a search of his residence for drugs.

Upon searching the

Jenkins residence, officers found several chemicals used to manufacture methamphetamine such as muratic acid, antifreeze and Coleman Fuel. Officers also found several shavings of lithium batteries in the attic space.

Other items used in the manufacturing phase were found in the rear bathtub and included glassware and a man made funnel, which was created by cutting off the top portion of a 20 ounce plastic bottle.

Officers also found numerous hypodermic needles throughout the bedroom, which are commonly used to in-

ject meth, as well as a cut off straw, which is commonly used to smoke meth.

Investigator Butler made the arrest Monday.

Joseph Lee Phelps, 21, Grandview Drive, Loudon was charged with sexual battery.

According to an affidavit filed by Investigator Jason R. Smith, LCSO-CID; on March 12, 2012,

a thirteen year old female reported to law enforcement she was at her father's residence on Grandview Drive and Joseph Lee Phelps was there as well. The girl said they were playing a game and poking each other when Phelps pulled out his penis and she massaged him until he climaxed.

Phelps was interviewed at the Loudon County Justice Center and after having been read his rights,

advised the thirteen year old female massaged him after they had texted and been poking each other.

Investigator Smith made the arrest Tuesday.

Extension

due date falls on any federal holiday recognized by the Internal Revenue Service. This extension also applies to any remittance due or other tax document, including quarterly estimated payments and extension requests.

Due to the observance of Emancipation Day in Washington, DC, the Internal Revenue Service announced April 17, 2012, as the official due date for filing individual federal tax forms. Tennessee law now allows taxpayers to effectively have the same due dates for their state tax returns as they have for their federal 1040 series returns.

The extended due date is April 17, 2012. Returns and tax payments normally due on April 15, 2012, that are postmarked on or before April 17, 2012, will be considered timely filed. Any tax returns or payments

required to be electronically filed are also allowed the extended time to file and pay. Electronic filers using the Global Payment Systems option have until 3:00 p.m., Central Time on April 16, 2012 to remit their returns and payments.

"This legislative action makes good sense for Tennesseans," said Revenue Commissioner Richard H. Roberts. "Allowing our state's citizens the same extended due date available to them at the federal level eliminates confusion and ensures taxpayers are given credit for timely filing and paying their taxes."


