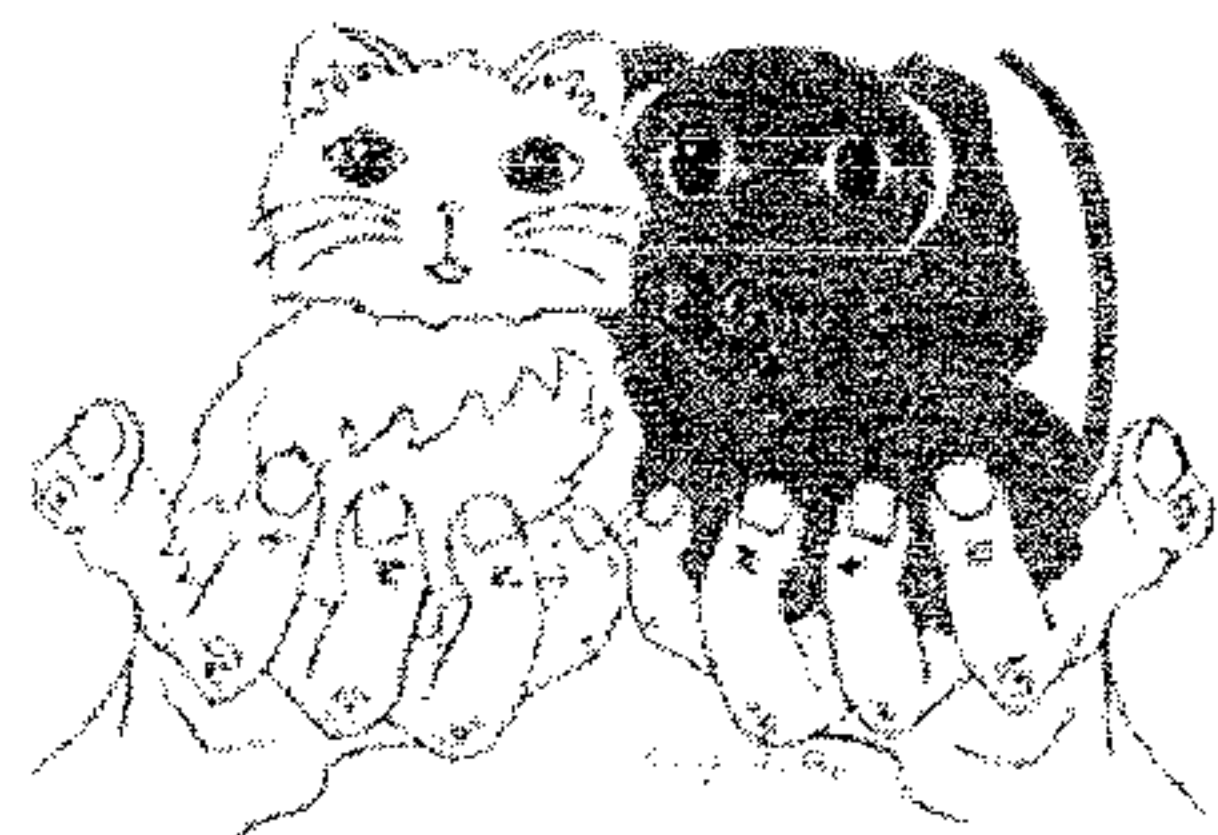
Deputy Fritts was able to catch up with the cars, just before exit 364 when one of the cars, a red Grand AM, contin-

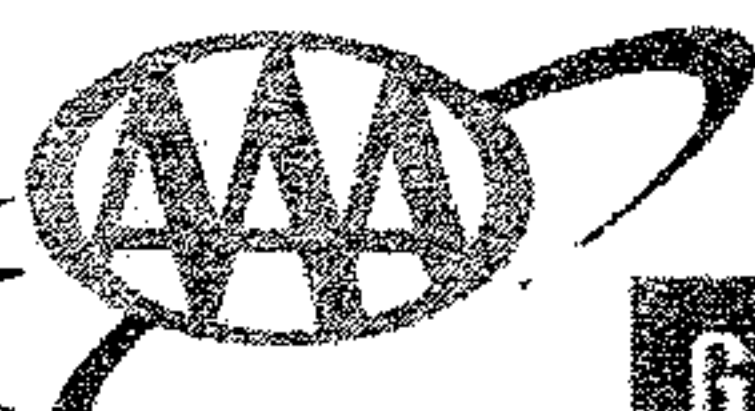
