

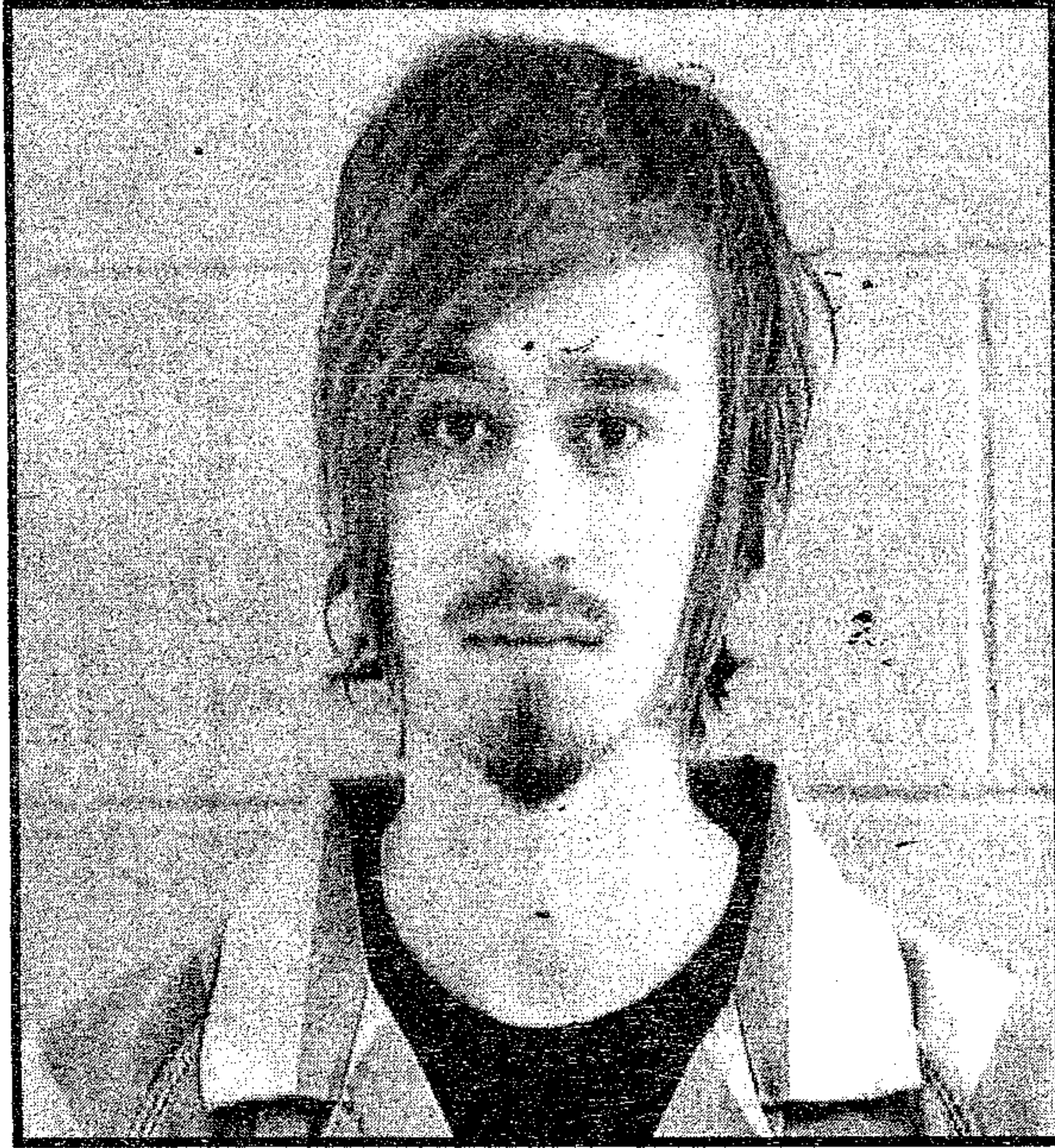

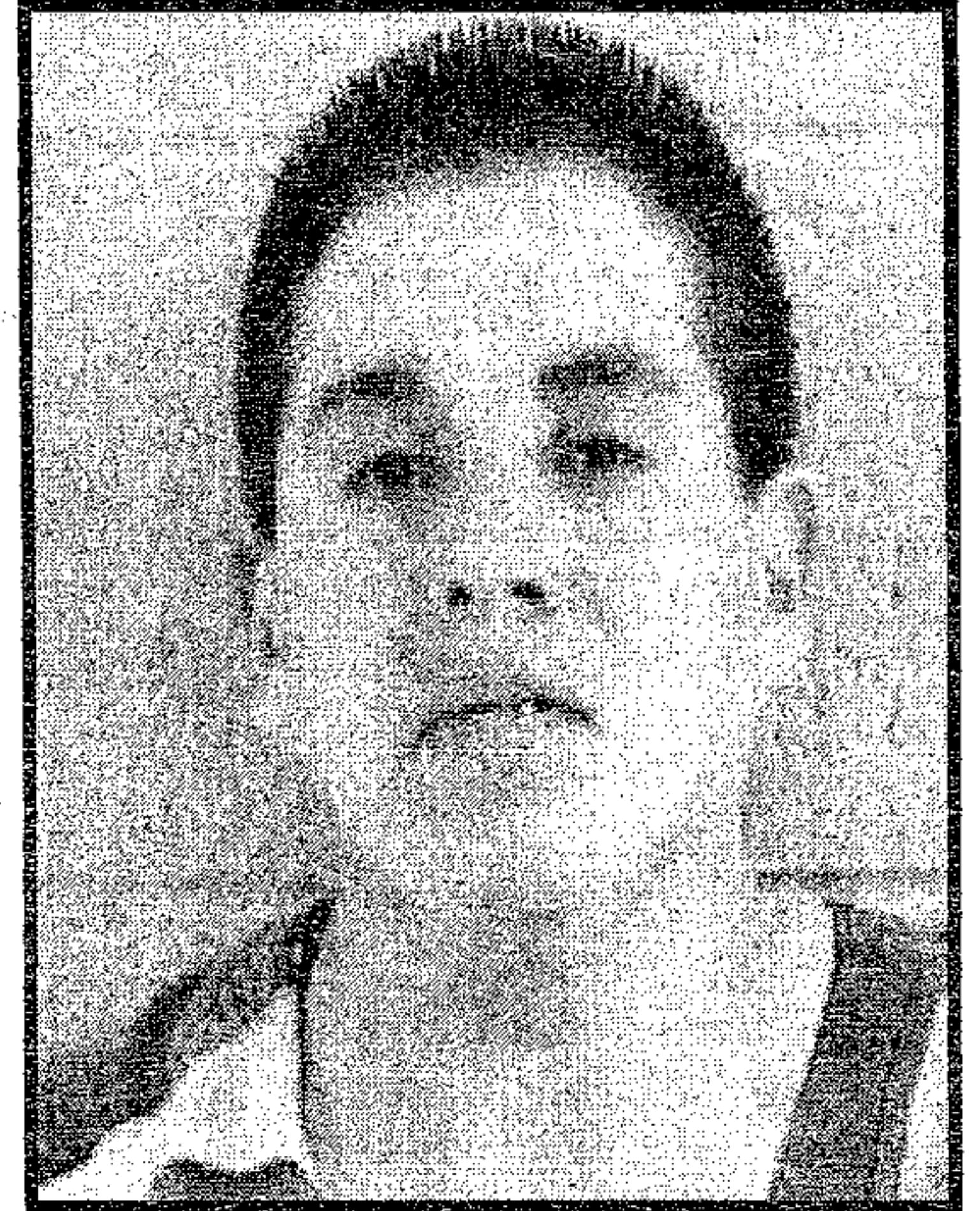

at the 68 mile marker and noticed it having problems maintaining it's lane of travel and conducted a traffic stop. The driver was identified as Colton C. Rector. Mr. Rector was extremely nervous and the lawman asked him to exit the vehicle so he could administer field sobriety tasks. Corporal Michael Watkins, LCSO, was on scene and deployed his K-9 partner Denero to sniff the vehicle. Corporal Watkins advised, Denero alerted and after the

sobriety tasks Deputy Stegall asked Me. Rector if he had drugs in the car and he stated there was a glass bong in his backpack and gave consent to search. While searching the vehicle the bong and a marijuana grinder were located and Mr. Rector was placed under arrest. Corporal Watkins advised him if he had any drugs on his person and he entered the jail he would receive another charge. Mr. Rector then advised the corpral he had marijuana in his crotch area. Mr. Rector

was allowed to retrieve the items from his pants and he pulled out four plastic baggies weighing approximately 1.6 grams that field tested as meth, five pieces of xanax pills and 1.5 grams of marijuana.

Rector was transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Mr. Mooney was unsteady on his feet during field sobriety tasks and did poorly on them. Trooper Carr found seven empty beer cans in the vehicle, and reported some of them appeared to be cold and half full. He also noticed Mr. Mooney

had spilled beer on his pants. Mooney was placed under arrest and explained the implied consent law, which he refused.

Carl Thomas Ramage, 42, Custer Road, Maryville was charged with public intoxication.

According to reports, Officer Dennis Guider, LCPD, was dispatched to Bimbo's Tuesday, around 3:04 PM, on a possible intoxicated person. When the officer arrived at Bimbo's he was told the man in question was in the bathroom.

Ramage was in the men's room washing his hands and smelled strongly of an alcoholic beverage. He also was jerky. Ramage did poorly on field sobriety tasks and was placed under arrest.

According to reports, Corporal Michael Watkins, LCSO, responded to Kiser Road in Philadelphia Thursday, to an accident involving a maroon Ford Taurus running into a residence. On arrival the corporal found the Taurus nosed into the residence and Mr. Anthony Walden standing near the car. Mr. Walden explained he was driving north on Kiser Road when another vehicle ran him off the road and he lost control and went

through a fence and hit the house.

Mr. Walden was very unsteady on his feet and seemed very talkative. Corporal Watkins administered field sobriety tasks which Mr. Walden did poorly on. A check through NCIC revealed his drivers license was revoked for a prior DUI in July of 2007. Mr.

Walden was placed under arrest and a search of his person produced a baggie containing approximately 7.2 grams of marijuana, a cigarette pack with three pills identified as anxia, a small blue baggie weighing approximately .7 grams of white powder that field tested for meth, rolling papers,

burnt aluminum foil and two different straws containing residue. Walden was transported to the Loudon County Jail where he received a citation for financial responsibility due to no proof of insurance. He was read the implied consent advisement and

refused to give blood. Therefore, he was also cited for violation of the implied consent law.


