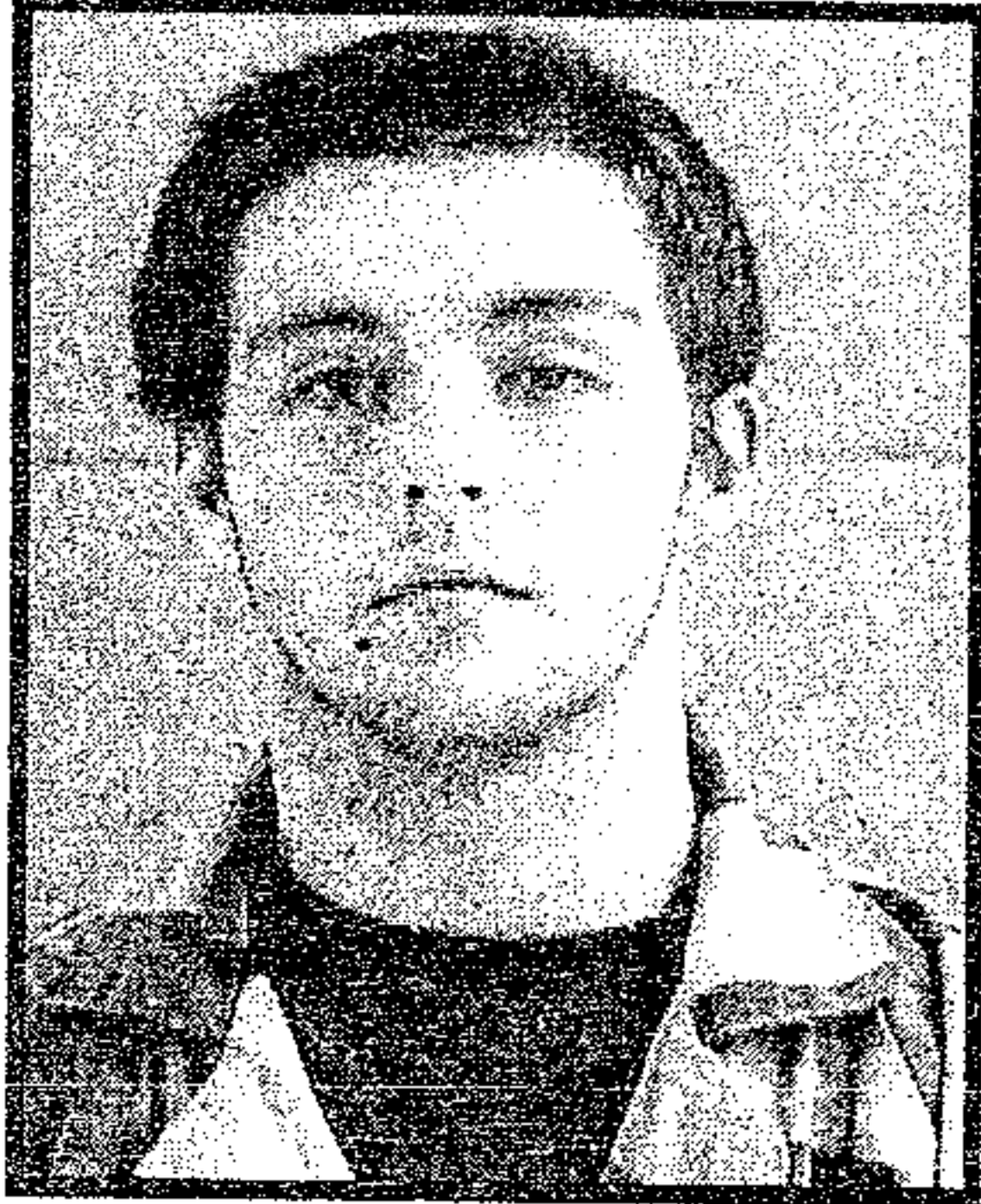

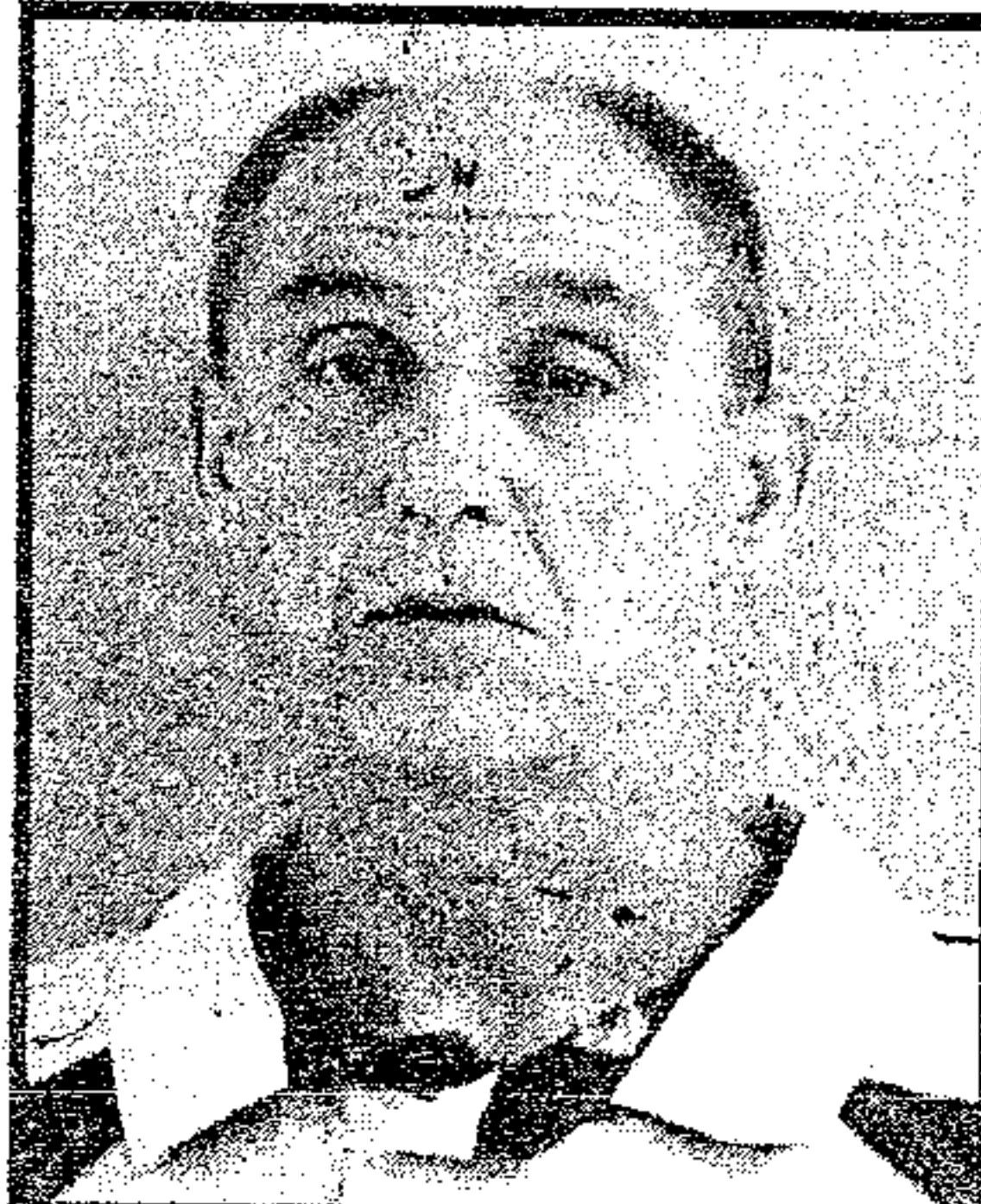
Sartin nabs two for stolen weapons

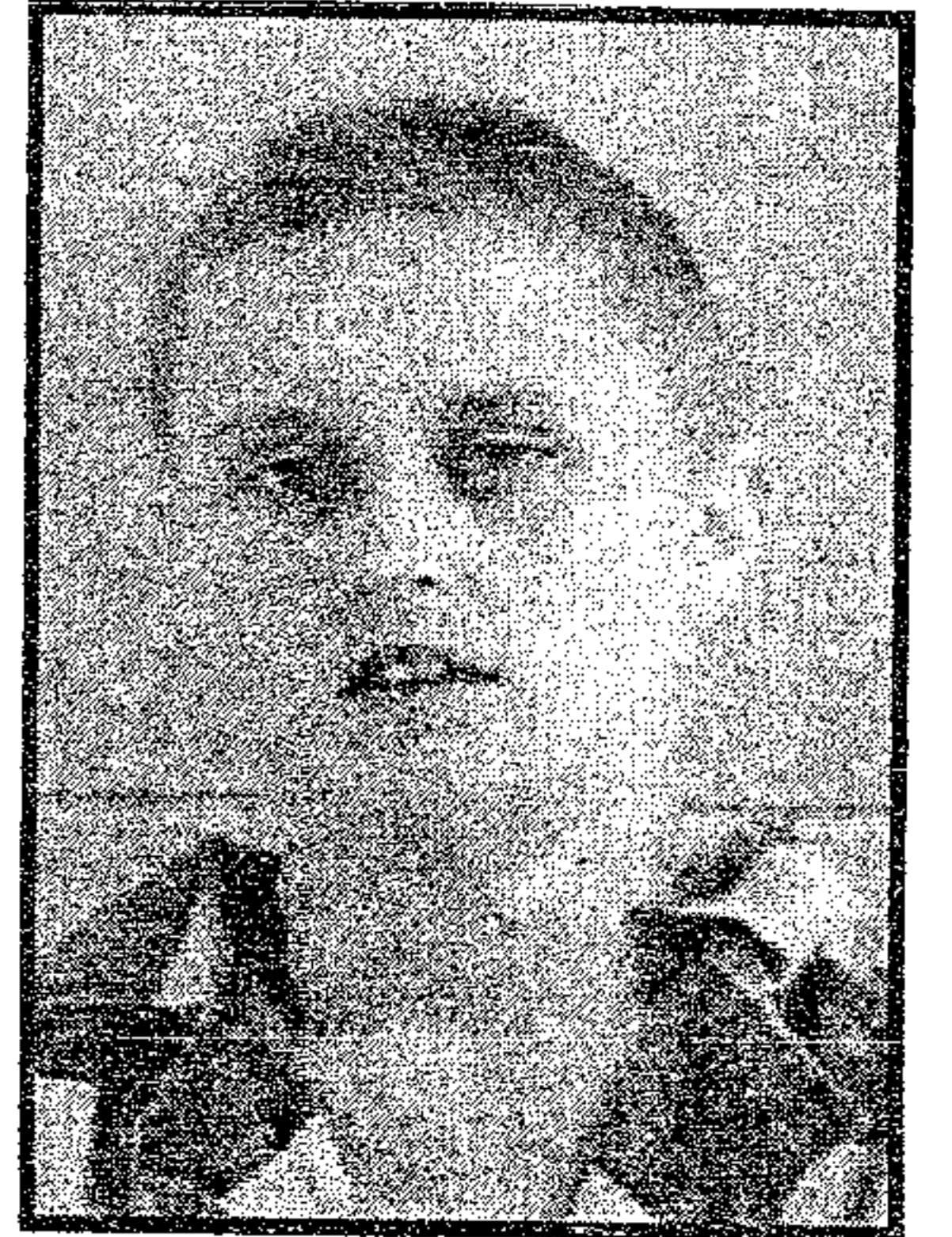

According to reports, Sunday, around 2:49 PM, the Loudon Police Department was notified of an accident on Highland

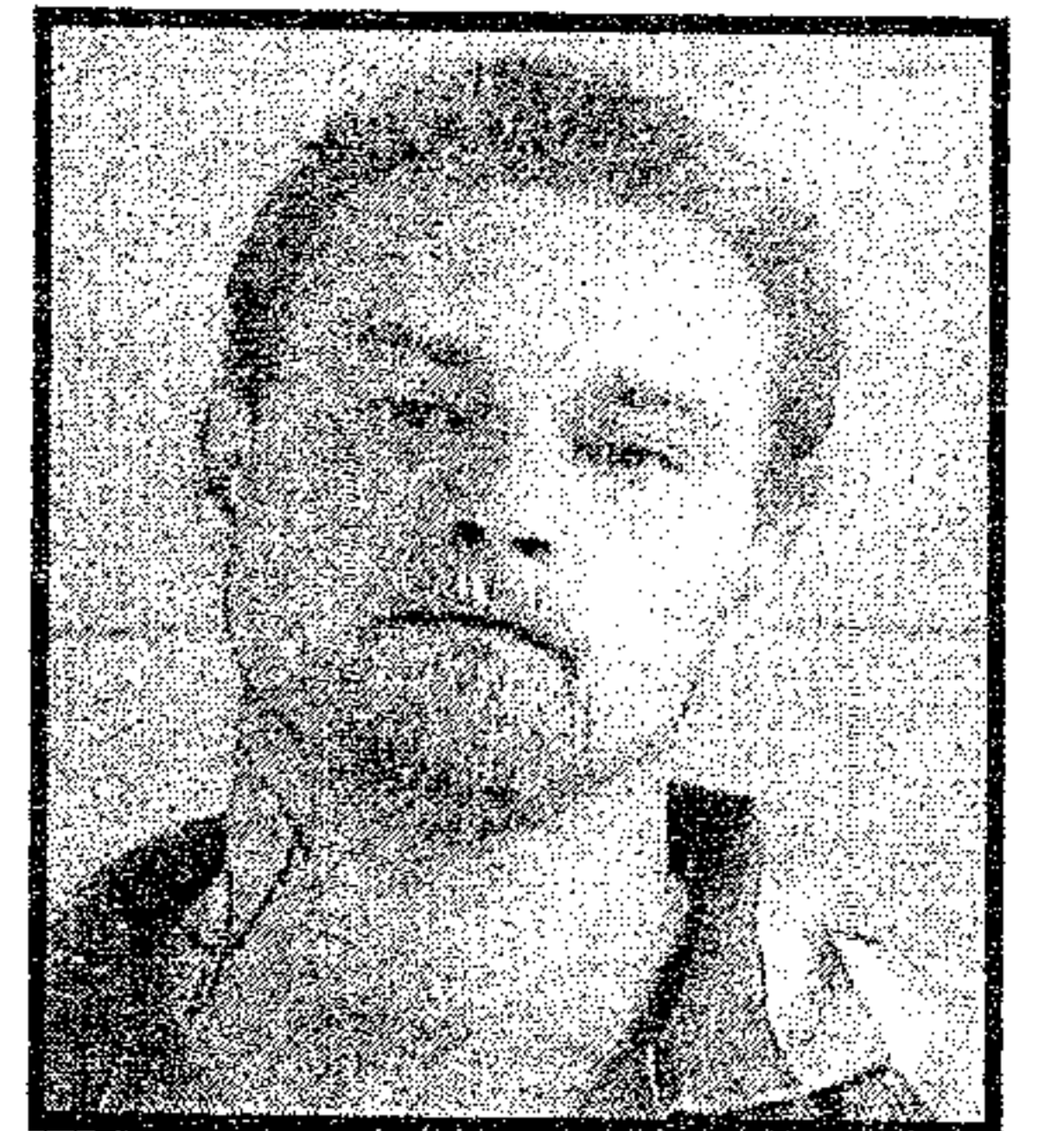

NASHVILLE – The Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development is making preparations to suspend unemployment benefits for claimants in the Extended Benefit (EB) program. More than 10,000 claimants who are in the last 20 of 99 weeks available will receive their last benefit payment the week of April 12, 2012. The EB program is triggered on and off by the health of Tennessee's unemployment

Intoxicated

Avenue at the corner of Arden Street. When law enforcement arrived on the scene the car reportedly involved was gone. A vehicle matching the description was located on Maremont Parkway and was stopped. The car had damage to the left side consistent with the description of the accident. LPD Officers Buddy Bradshaw and Ken Debour identified the driver as Stacy A. Breeden.

Mr. Breeden had bloodshot eyes, was unstable on his feet and appeared to be very confused. Breeden was transported back to the

scene of the accident, where he had driven from Maremont Parkway across Highland Avenue, struck a house, a fire hydrant and a street sign. The impact damaged the front of the house by breaking a pillar on the porch, completely removed the street sign from the ground and broke the fire hydrant.

When asked of his activities through the day, Breeden's story had many inconsistencies and he was unsure of his current location. He did poorly on field sobriety tasks and was advised of his rights under the implied consent law.

Mr. Breeden was transported to Fort Loudoun ER where he submitted to a chemical test, then to the Loudon County Jail. Officer Brandon Nix, LPD was also on the scene.



 rate. The trigger rate is based on a "look-back" provision of three years. To remain triggered on, the state's current rate must be higher than 120% of the average rate three years ago. The state's current rate recently dropped to 8.0%, dipping below the threshold to continue the program.
 "Claimants who have been unemployed the longest are the ones af-

ected by this change," said Commissioner Karla Davis. "As Tennessee's employment opportunities improve, other federal benefits could be reduced as well."
 to three years. The Tennessee General Assembly passed legislation, and Governor Haslam signed into law this three-year "look-back" provision to allow Tennessee to remain triggered on to EB until Tennessee's total unemployment rate improved enough to trigger off of the program.

Approximately 10,000 Claimants will receive notifications of the program expiration in the coming days. These claimants will not be eligible for additional benefits again until they earn qualifying wages.

In December of 2010, the United States Department of Labor informed Tennessee that it was in danger of triggering off the Extended Benefits program unless Tennessee's General Assembly passed legislation to extend the EB "look-back" provision from two years to three years.

tion to track him down just three blocks away where the owner pointed him out as the one who had been driving. Christopher Owen Brickman, 30, Cedar Avenue, Marysville, Washington was charged with DUI, implied consent law and leaving the scene of an accident with property damage.

According to reports, Officer B. Burley, LCPD received a dispatch from Loudon County E911 Center of an accident in the CVS parking lot Monday, around 6:25 PM. While

enroute, Officer Burley saw Christopher Brickman walking up the road. The officer proceeded to the accident scene to ensure there was no one injured and to have a tow truck respond.

There were no injuries, however the vehicle involved in the accident, a red Toyota Camry, had extremely heavy damage. Two wheels were bent sideways, laying flat on the ground and the car was in a grassy area where it struck a telephone pole, after running over the curb.

The vehicle was in-

operable, with no keys in it, but there were multiple open containers of alcoholic beverage

it. After verifying the address on the registration, Officer Burley drove to a residence on Simpson Road, about three blocks away from the accident scene, where he made contact with the registered owner of the Toyota and asked if he

knew where his vehicle was. The man stated it was involved in an accident. Officer Burley asked who was driving and he responded "him" and pointed at Christopher Brickman. Mr. Brickman stated he had been driving (Bad Friend ctd. pg. 7)
