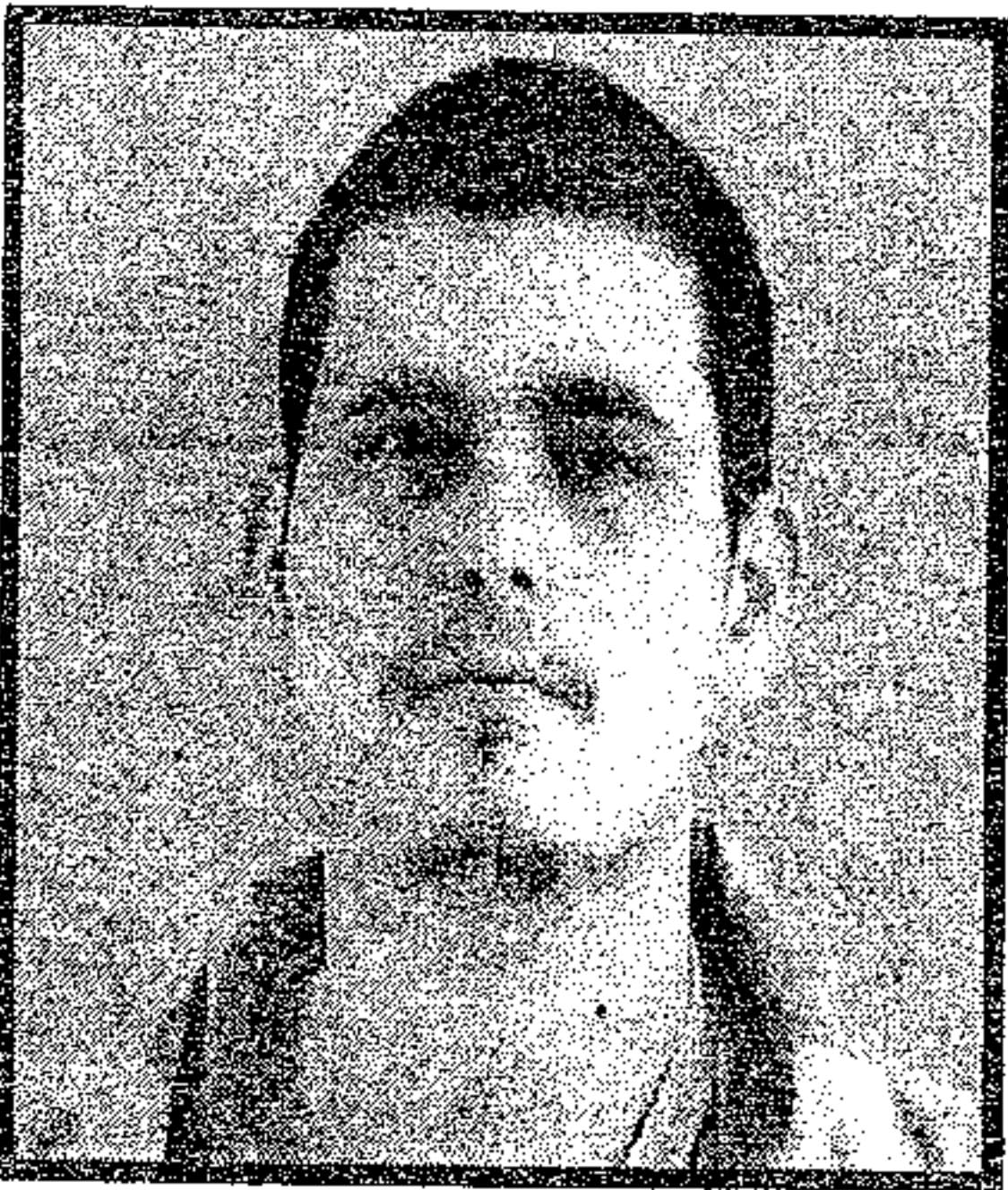

The heifer was black with a white face and was valued at \$300. The cow napping is under investigation.

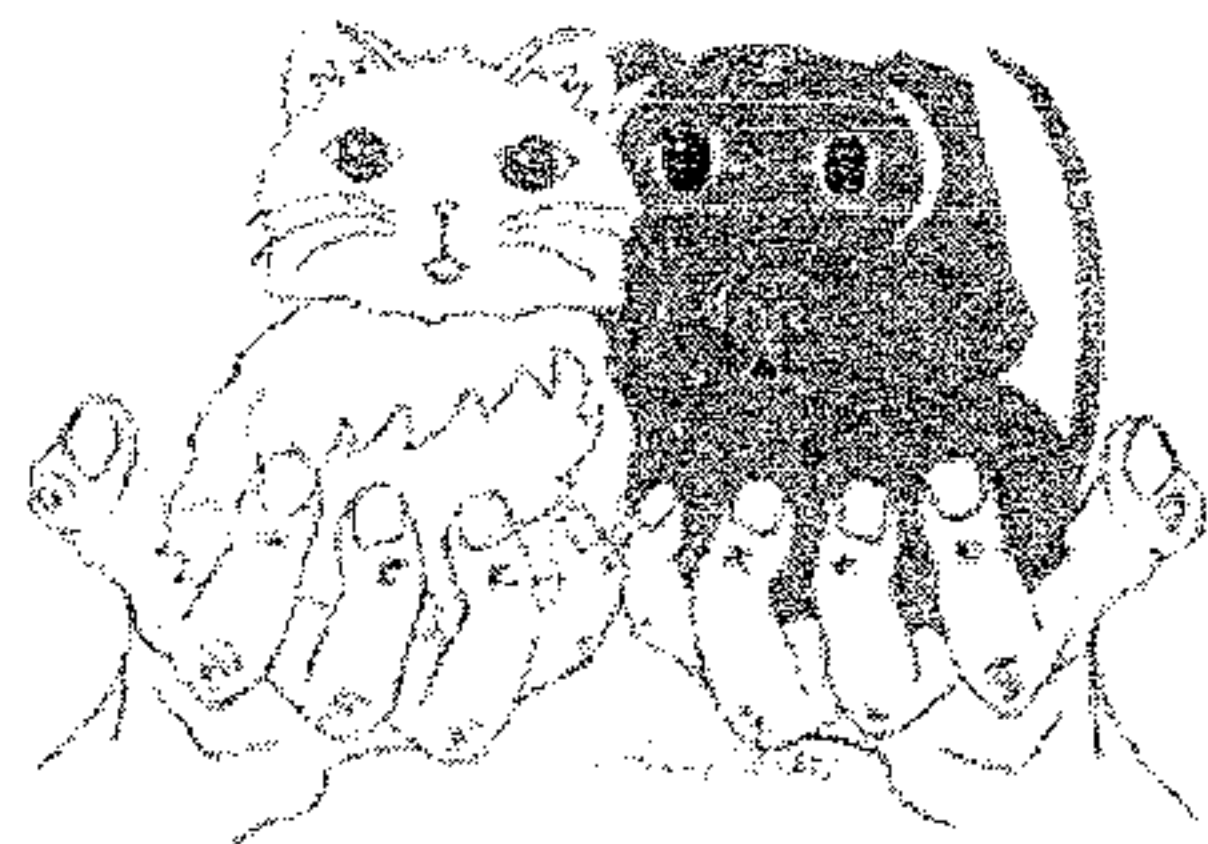



According to an affidavit filed by Detective Jack Fine, LCPD, and according to the victim's statement; on January 5, 2011, at approximately 7:00 PM, Nathan Johnson was at Executive Pawn, 785 Highway 321, Lenoir City and was upset because his pawned items had been sold. When Johnson started to leave the store, he was

attempted to damage items and when the victim told him to leave, Johnson charged at the victim and struck him in the face before leaving the store.

According to a Loudon County Grand Jury indictment: Mr. Johnson was convicted of the offense of child abuse and neglect, manufacturing schedule II methamphetamine, and simple possession of schedule VI and violated his probation by failing to report

on February 1, 2012, for an ACRC meeting as instructed. Johnson also violated the conditions of his probation when he signed an "admission of drug use" on December 9, 2011, for overuse of his oxycodone and alprazolam prescription and for THC use.

Johnson also tested positive for THC during a drug screen on December 12, 2011 and again on January 18, 2012, and he failed to pay supervision fees in

full, owing \$30 in arrears.
