The report states, Deputy Craig Brewer, LCSO, responded to Meadow Road West Thursday, for a domestic dispute. On arrival, the deputy found

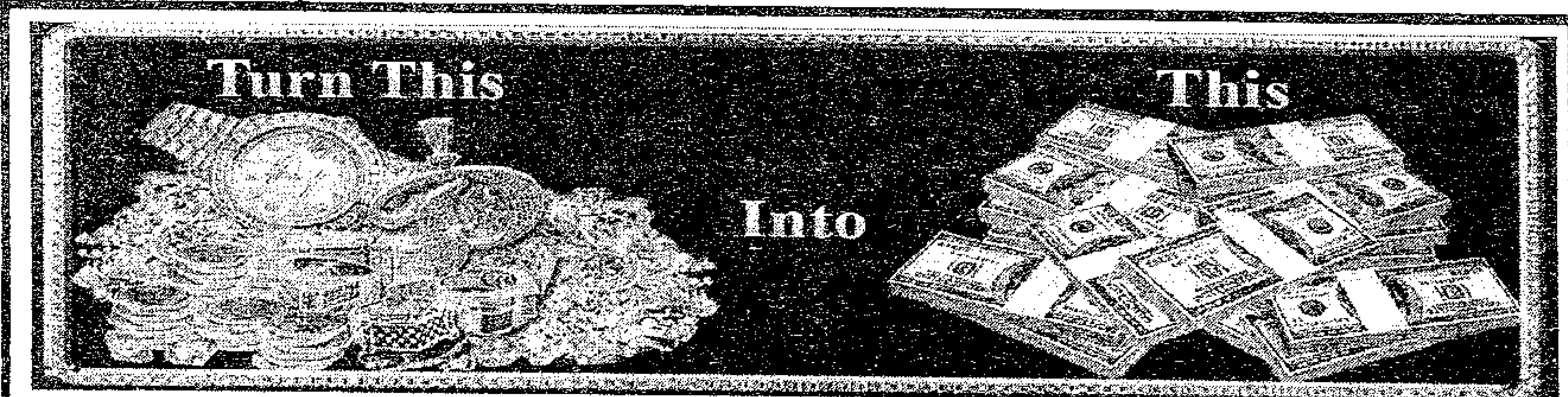
Michael Coad in the driveway. While talking to Mr. Coad and his wife,
