Jonathan Lee Human, 35, Old Eblen Road, Lenoir City, was charged with two counts of theft under

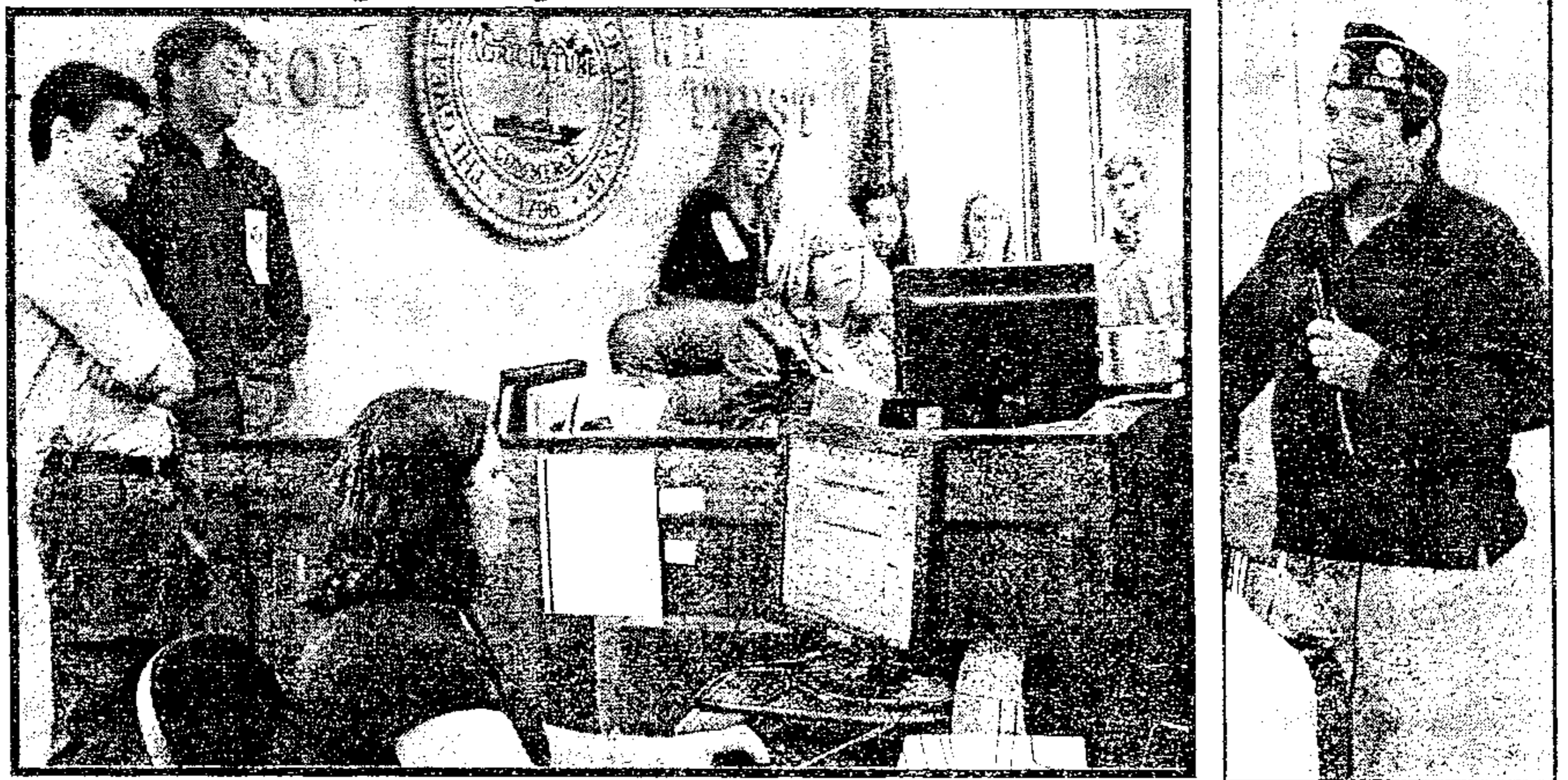

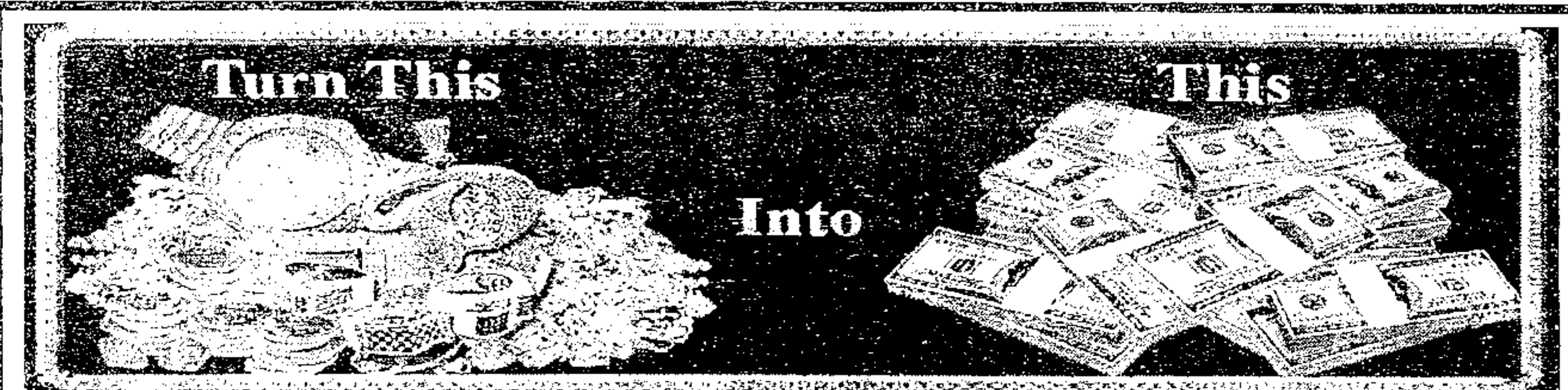
placed under arrest.

Double Trouble etd. a witness reported he observed a green four door car with a different color hood occupied by a male and female in

the parking lot of Charter Communications, located on Ford Road in Lenoir City. The witness identified it as being the same vehicle

that was suspected of taking eight Alpha Cell batteries from the business on the previous day, April 19, 2012.

The witness stated

he'd observed a female loading similar batteries into the trunk of the vehicle while the male remained in the passenger seat. When the witness yelled at the female, she jumped into the passenger seat and the male assumed the drivers position and the couple sped away from the business.

During the investigation into the theft of the batteries at Charter Communications, the same batteries were recovered from Interstate Battery located on Highway 321 in Lenoir

City. A sales receipt, along with a statement from an employee at Interstate Battery, identified the sellers of the batteries as Travis and Jennifer Langley.

After the second larceny, the couple returned back to Interstate Battery to sell more batteries, at which time, an employee of the business notified law enforcement of their presence.

While responding to the area, Deputy Chris Jenkins, LCSO located the vehicle on Hines Valley Road as it pulled into the driveway of a residence. The occupants were identified as Mr. Travis Langley and Mrs. Jennifer Langley, both of whom were taken into custody.

An inventory of their car revealed three Alpha Cell batteries identified as belonging to Charter Communications.
