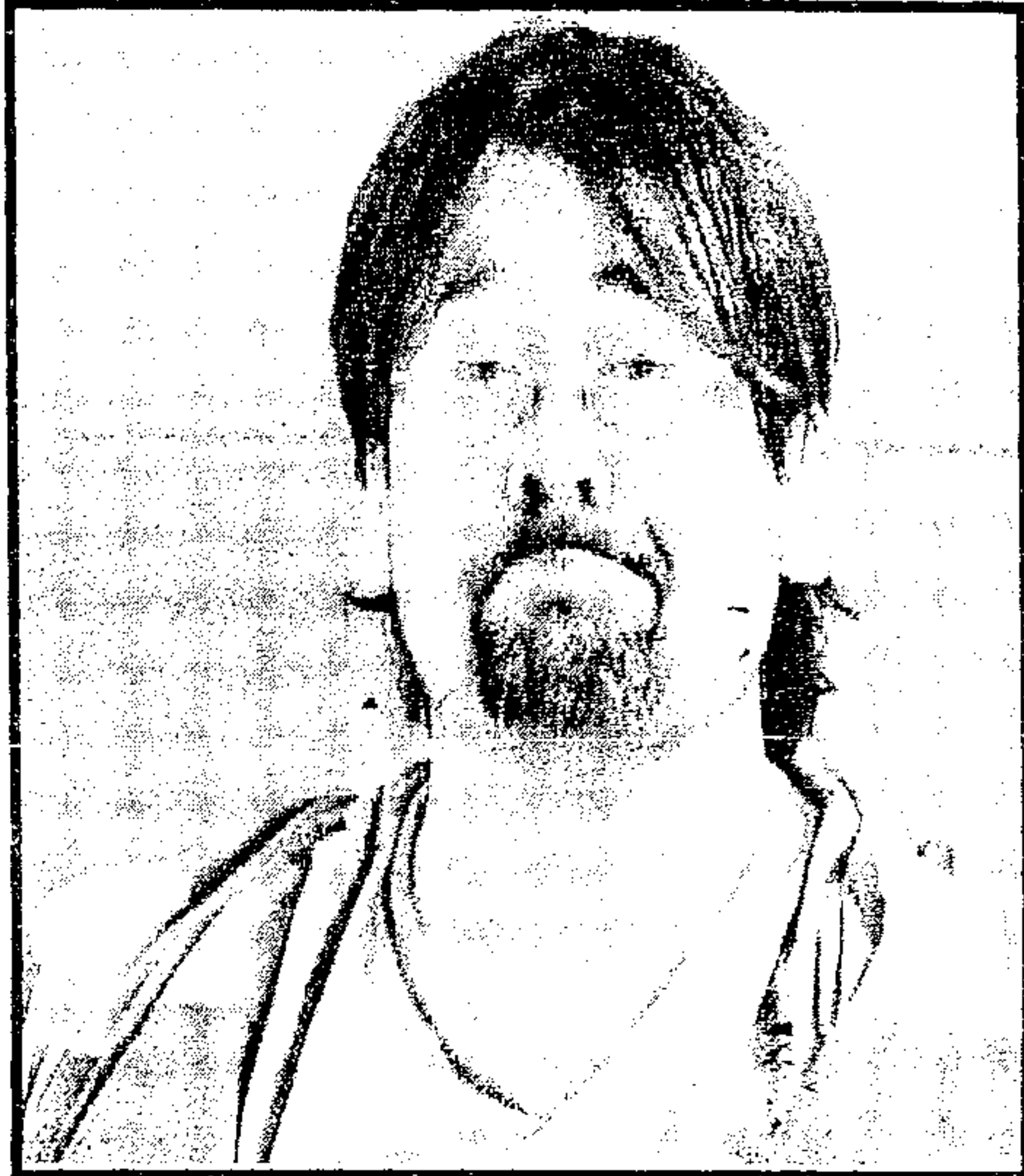

Spitting man gets jailed after DUI stop

Britt Jason Knight, 35, Church Street, Loudon, was charged with driving on revoked, driving under the influence, disorderly conduct and open container.

According to affidavits, filed by Officer Emily Lawson, LCPD, Saturday, at approximately 2:39 am, Officer Lawson was sitting at Rock Springs Park watching the intersection of McGhee Boulevard and Rock Springs Road, when she heard a vehicle on McGhee Boulevard screech the tires as it approached the stop sign. The vehicle, a black GMC Jimmy

stopped at the stop sign and then squealed the tires loudly causing a disturbance in the residential area during a time when most people are presumed to be sleeping.

The officer conduct-

ed a traffic stop at the Sixth Avenue Church of God and identified the driver as Britt J. Knight.

Mr. Knight had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person, bloodshot glassy eyes, and a disheveled appearance. The officer asked if he had a license and he said he didn't and gave

her a Tennessee "Identification Only DUI Offender" card.

Mr. Knight had a clear glass cup in his cup holder containing an amber liquid which appeared to be beer and when asked what was in the cup he admitted it was beer. He did poorly on field sobriety tasks and was taken into custody.

Mr. Knight became extremely belligerent and vulgar at that point. Due to prior convictions and revocation for DUI, Mr. Knight was




transported to the Fort Loudoun Medical Center ER for a mandatory blood draw, which he consented to.

As they approached the automatic doors at the ER, Mr. Knight shouted profanities and kicked the glass door continuing to cause a disturbance in the emergency room, when he spoke with loud obscenities particularly F-ing Bi and F-ing Cu, then violently kicking the door of his hospital room closed. After the blood draw he was placed in the back of the patrol car for transport to the jail.

As the officer pulled away from the hospital, Knight began to spit in the car and onto the window. The divider

between the back seat and Officer Lawson's seat is partially steel mesh and she didn't want to be spit on so she turned around and went back to the ER parking lot where she was assisted by Detective Sartin and Lt. Flynn in placing a surgical mask on Mr. Knight's face as well as placing his shirt over his head to prevent him from spitting.

However, they hadn't made it out of the parking lot, when he managed to squirm out of the shirt and mask. The officer returned to the ER parking lot and a pillow case was placed over his head which he proceeded to snort and spit phlegm into during the transport to the jail.

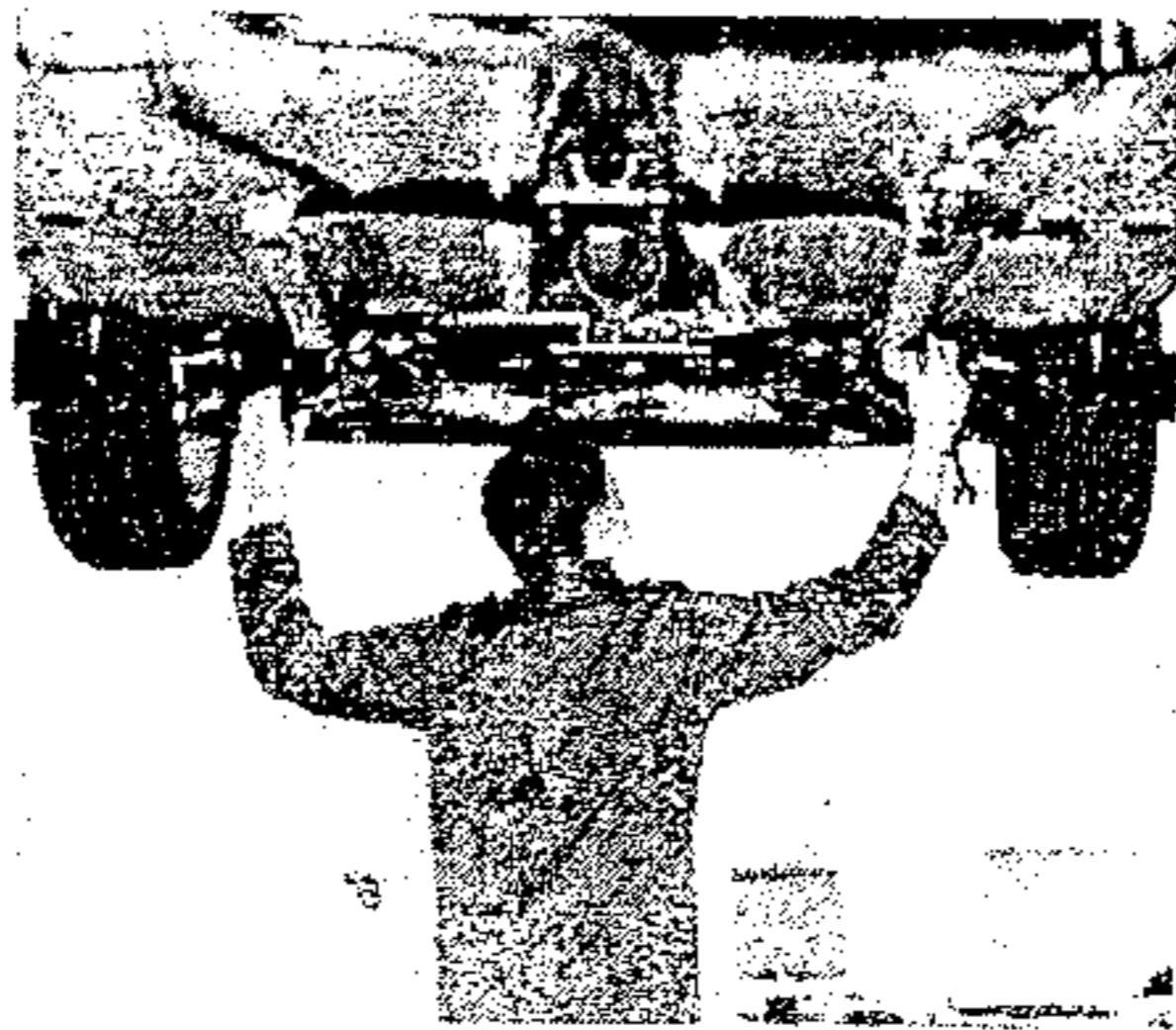

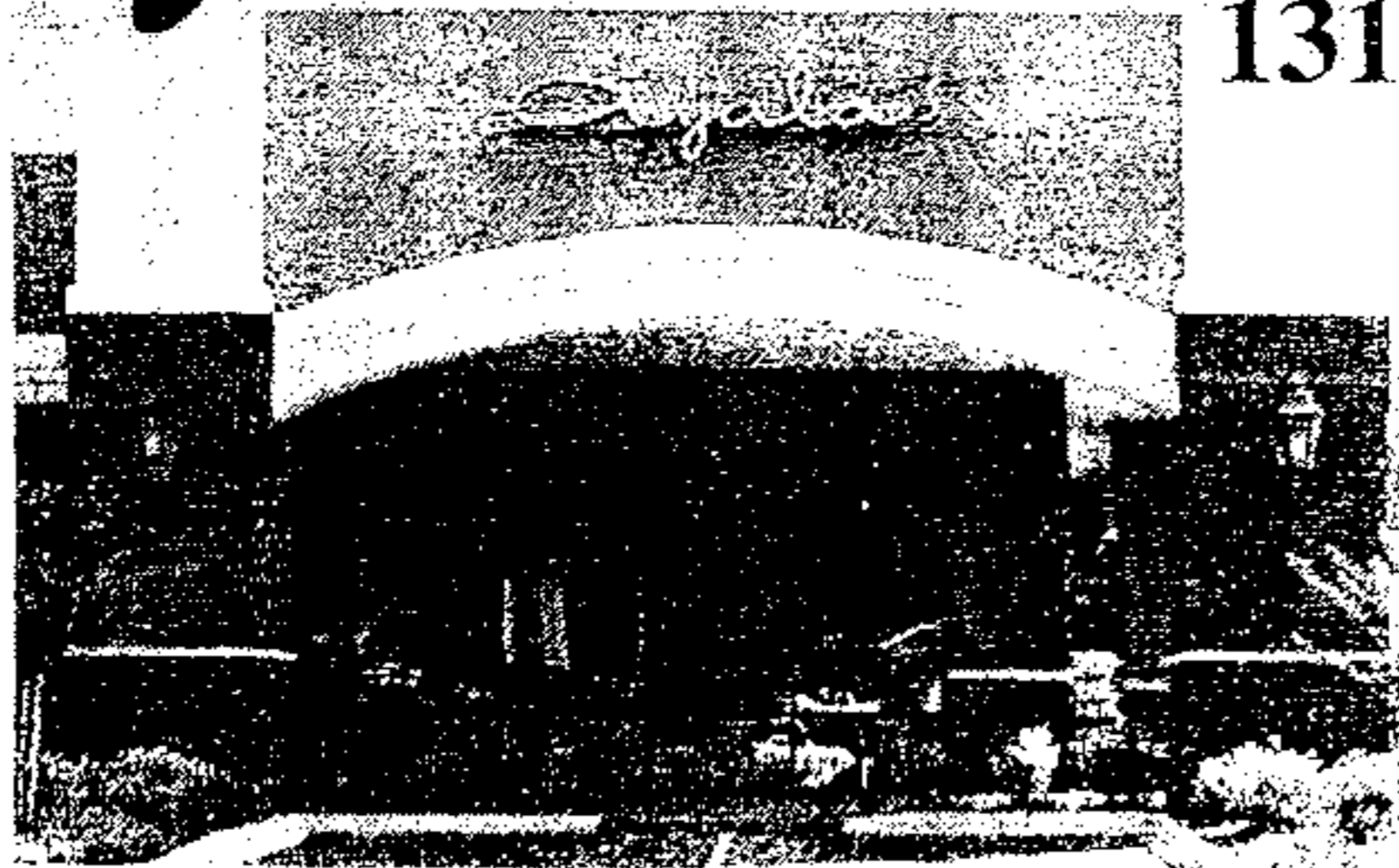
