A Philadelphia woman was charged Wednesday when she returned to jail from a furlough and a search revealed she had four taped-up containers hidden inside her body.

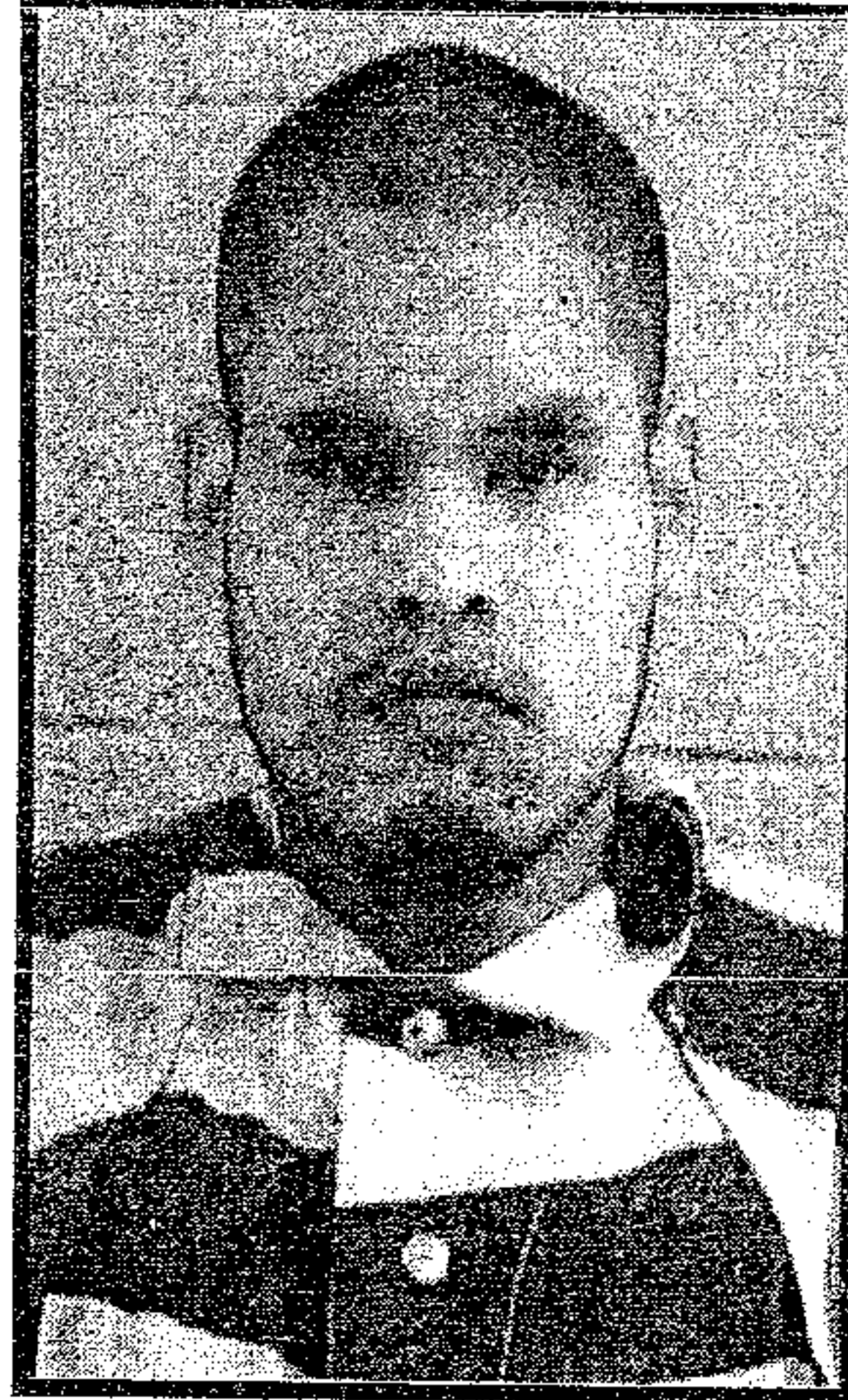
Portia Lynn Williams, 30, Donaldson Road, Philadelphia was charged with introduction into a penal facility.

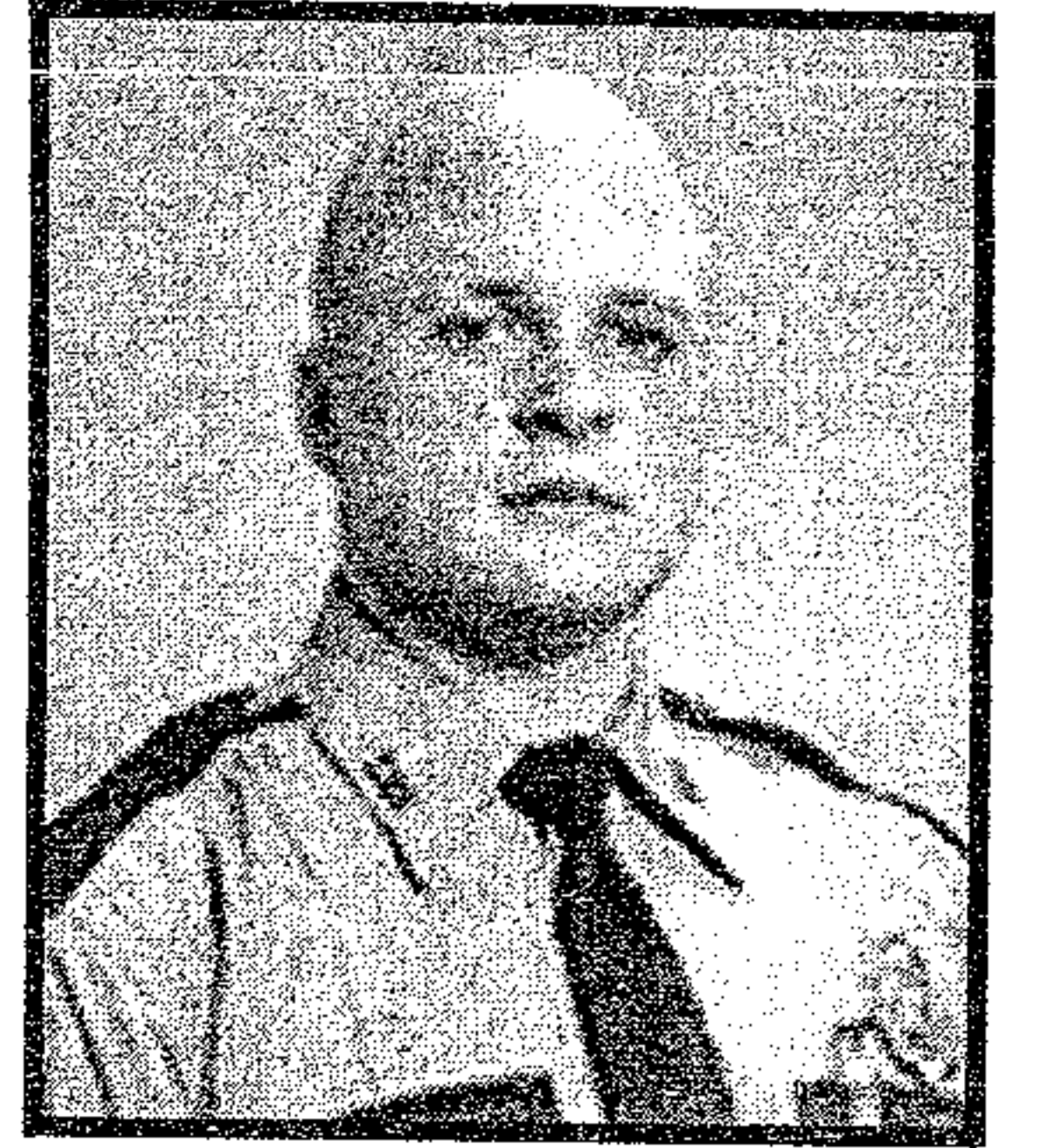

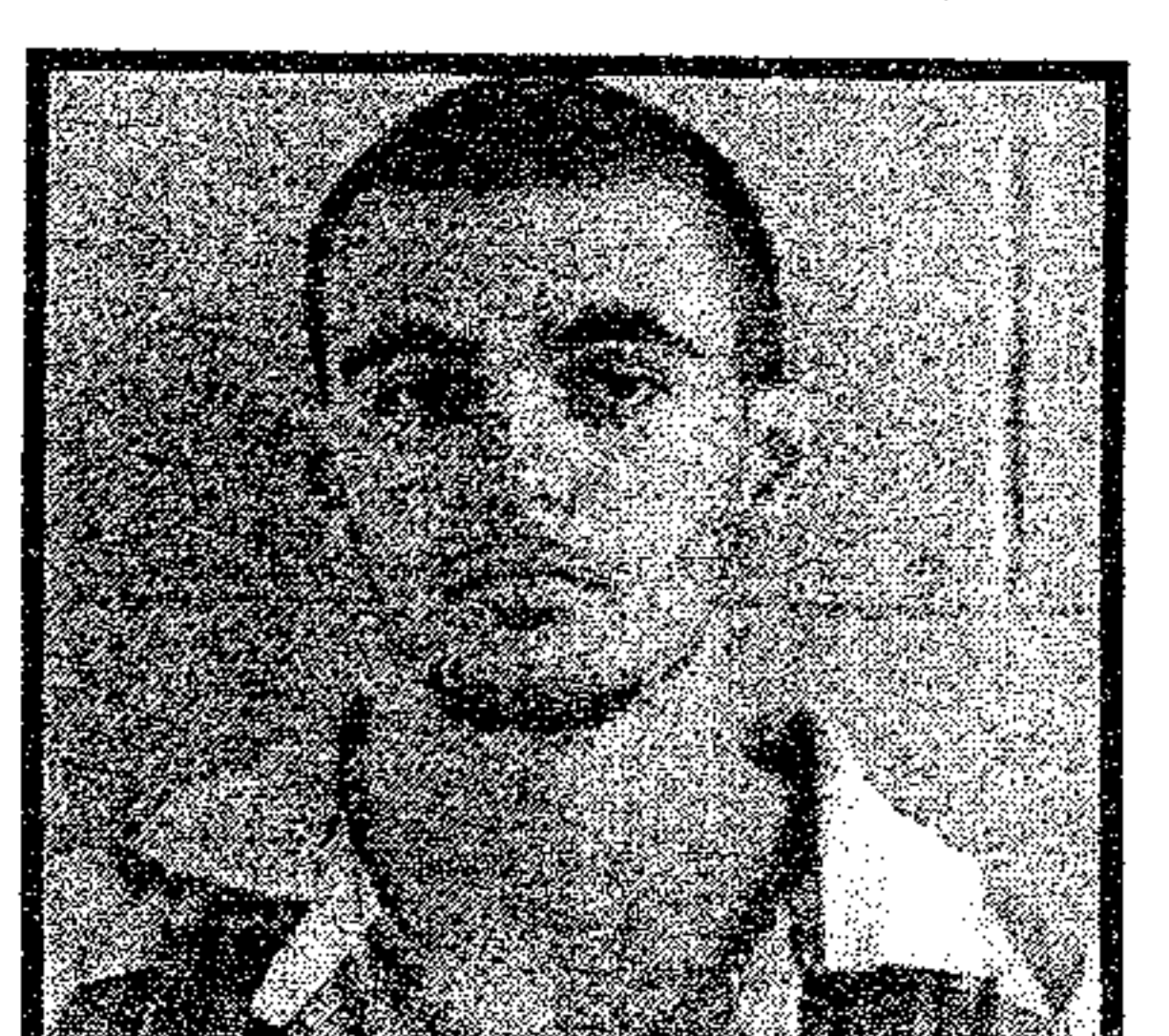

That Many?

According to records, Wednesday, around 9:30 PM, while searching Ms. Portia Lynn Williams, who turned herself in after a furlough, Deputy Olwin Norman, LCSO noticed something in Williams'

vagina and asked her to remove it.

Ms. Williams pulled out four taped up containers about 2 1/2 inches in length and about 1 1/2 inches in width and was duly charged.

The report didn't indicate what was in the containers.

The fourth elk hunt will be held Oct. 15-19, 2012 at the North Cumberland Wildlife Management Area, located off I-75, north of Knoxville. Once again, there will be five Elk Hunting Zones designated at the WMA.

Persons may apply

at any TWRA license agent, TWRA regional office or online at www.tnelkhunt.org.

As in the previous three hunts, five individuals will be selected to participate. Four of the participants will be selected through a computer drawing conducted by the TWRA. Nonresident applicants will be restricted to no greater than 25 percent of the drawn permits. The fifth participant will be the recipient of a permit that is donated to a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO), which this year is the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Foundation.

In addition, newly-added this year is a Young Sportsman Elk Hunt. After completing the regu-

lar elk hunt draw, a special computerized youth drawing will take place for resident applicants who will be between the ages of 13-16 on the opening day of the elk hunt. The lucky recipient will be awarded the special youth elk tag. The dates of the youth hunt will be Oct. 20-21 and the participant would be able to hunt on any of the five elk hunting zones designated at the North Cumberland Wildlife Management Area. A youth entering the draw must designate if he/she would prefer to participate in the youth hunt or regular hunt if drawn.

There is no applica-

tion fee for current Tennessee Annual Sportsman License holders, Lifetime Sportsman License holders, or an Annual Senior Citizen Permit (Type 167). All other applicants will be charged a \$10 non-refundable permit fee, and an internet usage fee (if applying online or by telephone). For those applying at a license agent, there is a \$1 agent fee in addition to the \$10 non-refundable permit fee.

The successful applicants will be announced at the June meeting of the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Commission in Nashville. Successful applicants will not be allowed to reapply for an elk quota hunt permit for 10 years following a successful draw.

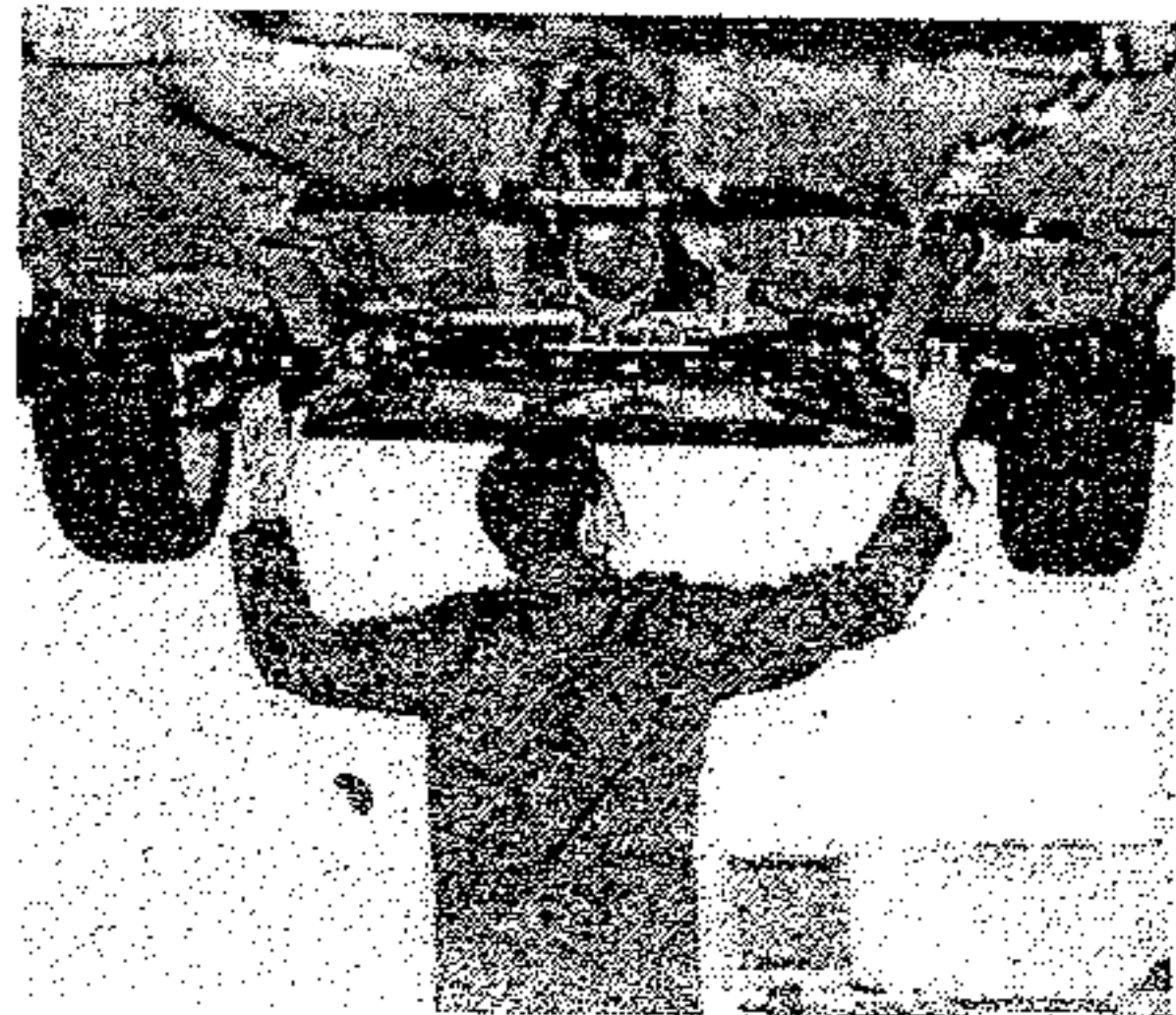

Trooper

Security in welcoming 44 State Troopers to the Highway Patrol on Friday morning. Trooper Cadet Class 512 took their oath

of office in a graduation ceremony at Tulip Grove Baptist Church in Old Hickory.

Trooper Colby Huff of the Knoxville District is

the newest State Trooper assigned to Loudon County.

Members of Cadet Class 512 have spent the past 18 weeks undergoing

extensive law enforcement instruction at the department's Training Center. The more than 890 hours of classroom training included criminal and constitutional law, patrol procedures, professional ethical conduct, crash investigation and firearms. The new graduates will now advance to a maximum of 12 weeks of field training.

"The Tennessee Highway Patrol Troopers' Creed says 'Many are called, but few are chosen,'" Gov. Haslam said. "Thousands applied after the announcement was made of a new trooper cadet class. The 44 cadets who are here with us this morning are those chosen few. You have firmly applied yourselves through 18 weeks of training and are now part of the elite group of law enforcement officers known as the Tennessee Highway Patrol. Congratulations."

The Trooper Cadet Class began on January 22, 2012 with 54 cadets. The 44 graduating cadets include 19 with previous law enforcement experience and 16 former military members. Two cadets are female.

During their training, the Cadets participated in a blood drive for the American Red Cross and held a car wash, donating all proceeds to Concerns of Police Survivors (C.O.P.S.). The cadets also ran in the re-

cent Law Enforcement Memorial 5K hosted by the Department of Safety and Homeland Security and several other state agencies. They won the Law Enforcement Challenge competition, besting all of the other law enforcement agencies that participated.

"I am proud of these men and women and the commitment they have already made during their training to serve in the community," Department of Safety and Homeland Security Commissioner Bill Gibbons said. "Tennessee State Troopers act as more than just law enforcement officers on our highways. They are servants of the people. I am honored to call the 44 before us today, the newest members of Tennessee's finest."

During the ceremony, Trooper Ryan Quinn was named the top cadet and presented the Calvin Jenks Memorial Award for Excellence for his leadership, work ethic and academics. The award was named in honor of the late Trooper Jenks, who was killed in the line of duty in January 2007. Trooper Quinn is assigned to Rutherford County in the Nashville District.

Friday's exercise included a processional of graduates, the presentation of the colors by the THP Honor Guard and the Oath of Office administered by Commissioner Gibbons.

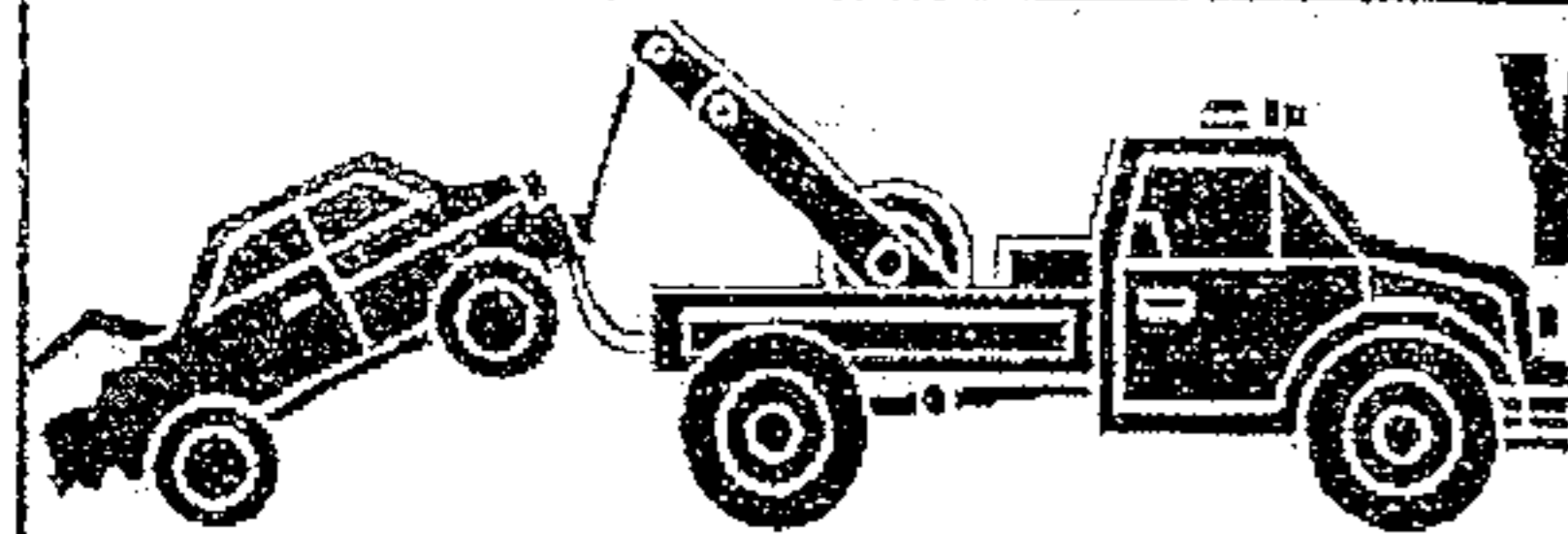

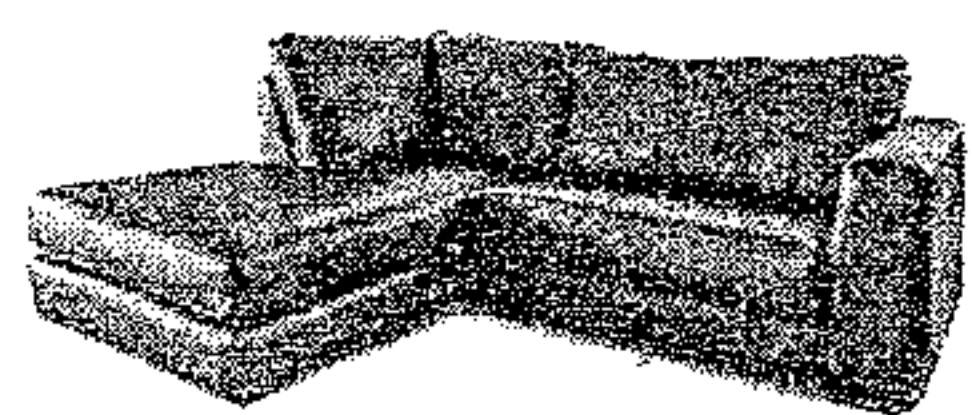

Bud Ice cans were found on the ground and in Michael Boyd's truck. All three men had bloodshot eyes, slurred speech and an odor of alcohol on them.









