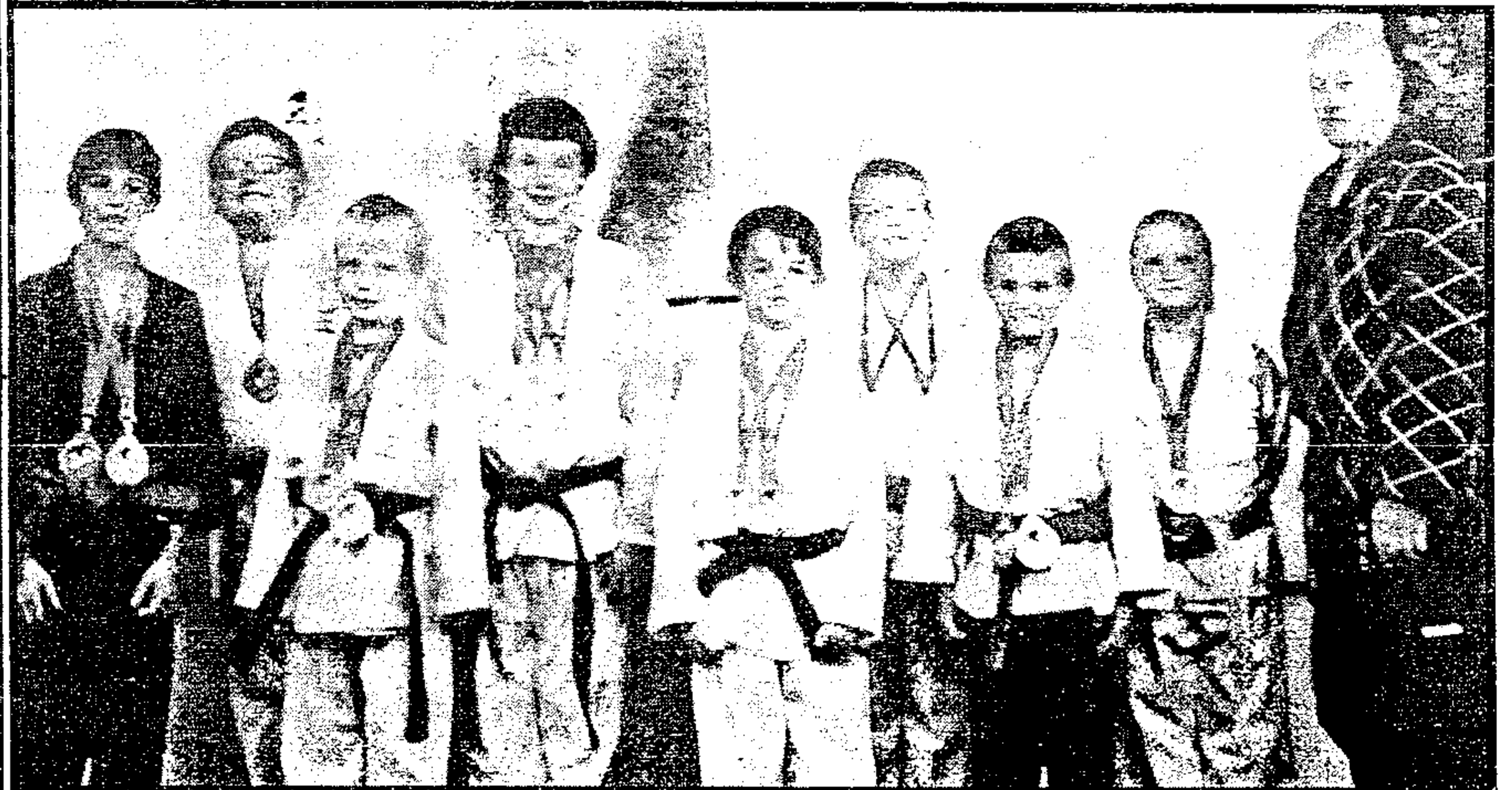


Today was a special day in my life. I was as proud as any father could be as I stood and watched my son raise his hand and take

**Drug op nets 1**

Johnny Wayne Coffman, 45, Kingston Street, Lenoir City was arrested on four felony warrants.

According to affidavits filed by Investigator Jason Butler, LCPD-ND; on four dif-

ferent occasions in February of 2012, Johnny Wayne Coffman, sold a quantity of schedule II controlled substance, oxycodone, to a Lenoir City Police Department confidential source at Coffman's residence on Kingston Street.

Coffman sold the schedule II drugs within 1000 feet of the Wampler Keith and Rock Springs Parks.

Investigator Butler made the arrest Tuesday, at Coffman's residence.

According to an affidavit filed by Officer B. Burley, LCPD; on June 3, 2012, Mr. Bahena vandalized a 1998 green Chevy Malibu by taking the metal cap off a Coca Cola can and dragging it down the side of the victim's car. Mr. Bahena caused deep scratches to the driver's side of the vehicle including the driver's side front quarter panel, driver's front door and driver's rear door.

Many of the marks on the vehicle penetrated all levels of the paint and went into the metal. The marks were also on the driver's side door handle and entry guard.

but chose to join as an Airborne Infantry Soldier and looks forward to the opportunity to deploy wherever his country needs him.

There is nothing I would not do for my boy and I would never allow anyone to harm him if within my power. Sound honorable? Not so fast.....

The following passage of scripture contains a glimpse into God's character and a hint of the sacrifice He will later make for you and I. This true story reveals God's expectation of our faithfulness, God's compassion and mercy towards us (His children) and also some insight into God's provision and blessings to those who are found faithful. Take your time, maybe even read it twice, and allow this story in Genesis to speak to your life.

Genesis 22:1-19 (NKJV) (1) Now it came to pass after these things that God tested Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!", and he said, "Here I am". (2) Then He said,

"Take now your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you. (3) So Abraham rose early in the morning and saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son: and he split the wood for the burnt offering, and arose and went to the place where God had told him. (4) Then on the third day Abraham lifted his eyes and saw the place afar off. (5) And Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the lad and I will go yonder and worship, and we will come back to you." (6) So Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac, his son; and he took the fire in his hand, and a knife, and the two of them went together. (7) But Isaac spoke to Abraham, his father, and said, "My father!" and he (Abraham) said, "Here I am, my son." Then he said, "Look, the fire and the wood,

but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" (8) And Abraham said, "My son, God will provide for Himself the lamb for a burnt offering." So the two of them went together. (9) Then they came to the place in which God had told him. And Abraham built an altar there and placed the wood in order; and he bound Isaac, his son, and laid him on the altar, upon the wood. (10) And Abraham stretched out his hand and took the knife to slay his son. (11) But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" So he said, "Here I am". (12) And he said, "Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, from Me." (13) Then Abraham lifted his eyes and looked, and there behind him was a ram caught in a thicket by its horns. So Abraham went and took the ram, and offered it up for a burnt offering instead of his son. (14) And Abraham called the name of the place, "The

Lord Will Provide"; as it is said to this day, in the Mount of the Lord it shall be provided. (15) Then the angel of the Lord called to Abraham a second time out of heaven, (16) and said, "By Myself I have sworn, says the Lord, because you have done this thing, and have not withheld your son, your only son, (17) blessing I will bless you, and multiplying, I will multiply your descendants as the stars of the heaven and as the sand which is on the seashore; and your descendants shall possess the gate of their enemies. (18) In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have obeyed My voice. (19) So Abraham returned to his young men, and they rose and went together to Beersheba; and Abraham dwelt at Beersheba.

Although God will sometimes allow us to be tempted and tried, aren't you glad that He doesn't "Test" our faith like He did Abraham's that day? Can you imagine how Abraham felt when Isaac asked him where the lamb was that was to be sacrificed? Or how Abraham felt as he tied his

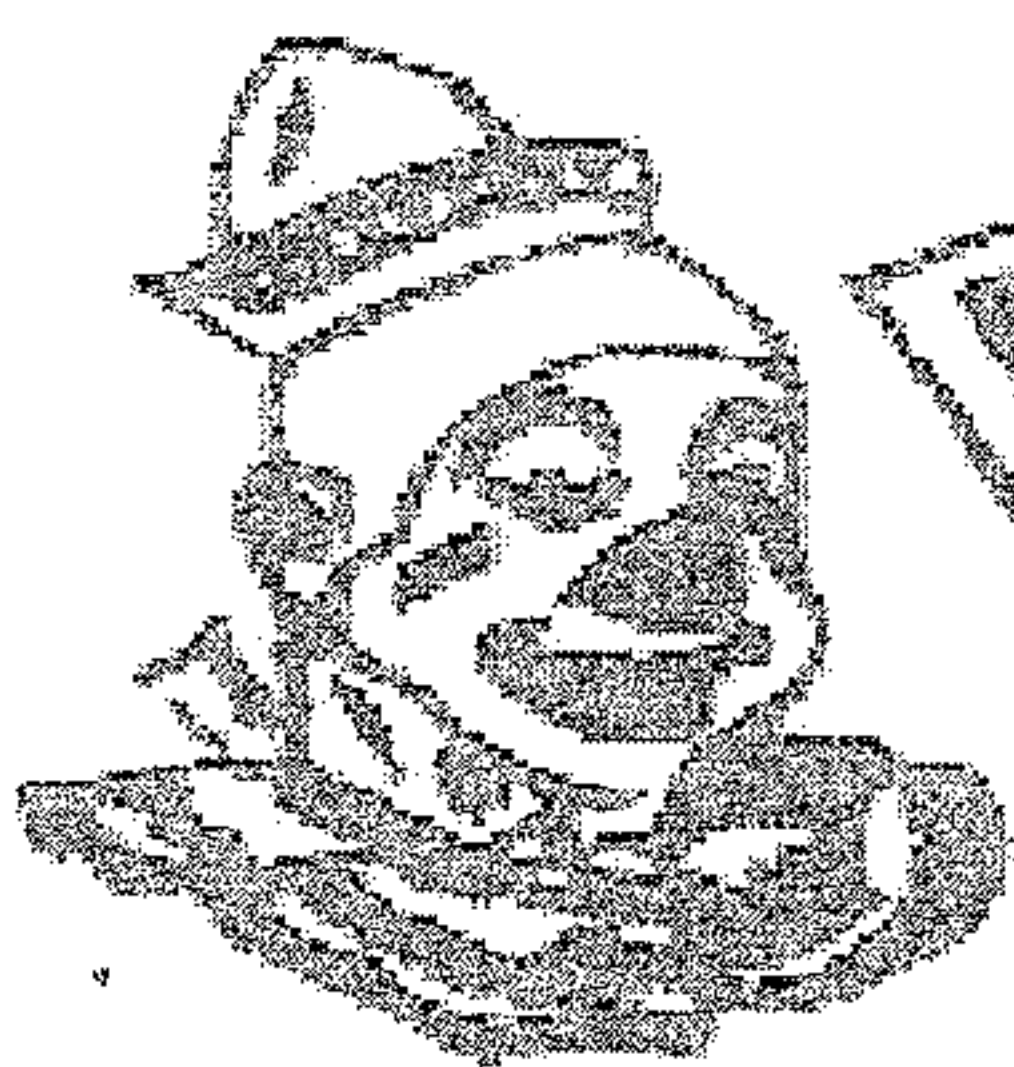
son to the wood pile and picked up the knife to take his son's life in obedience to God's command?

What if we were asked to send our only son to a wicked place to give his life for someone else? What if we knew beforehand that our son would be beaten, mocked, scourged, nailed and left to die while many stood around laughing and taunting him? could you do it? Would you do it? God did!

John 3-16-17 (NKJV) (16) For so loved the world (You and me) that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. (17) For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world, through Him, might be saved.

When I consider that Abraham was so obedient to God that he was willing to take the life of his only son upon God's command, I am reminded of how selfish a Christian I really am and how little I sacrifice for the Creator of the universe and the Giver of every breath I take. How bout you?

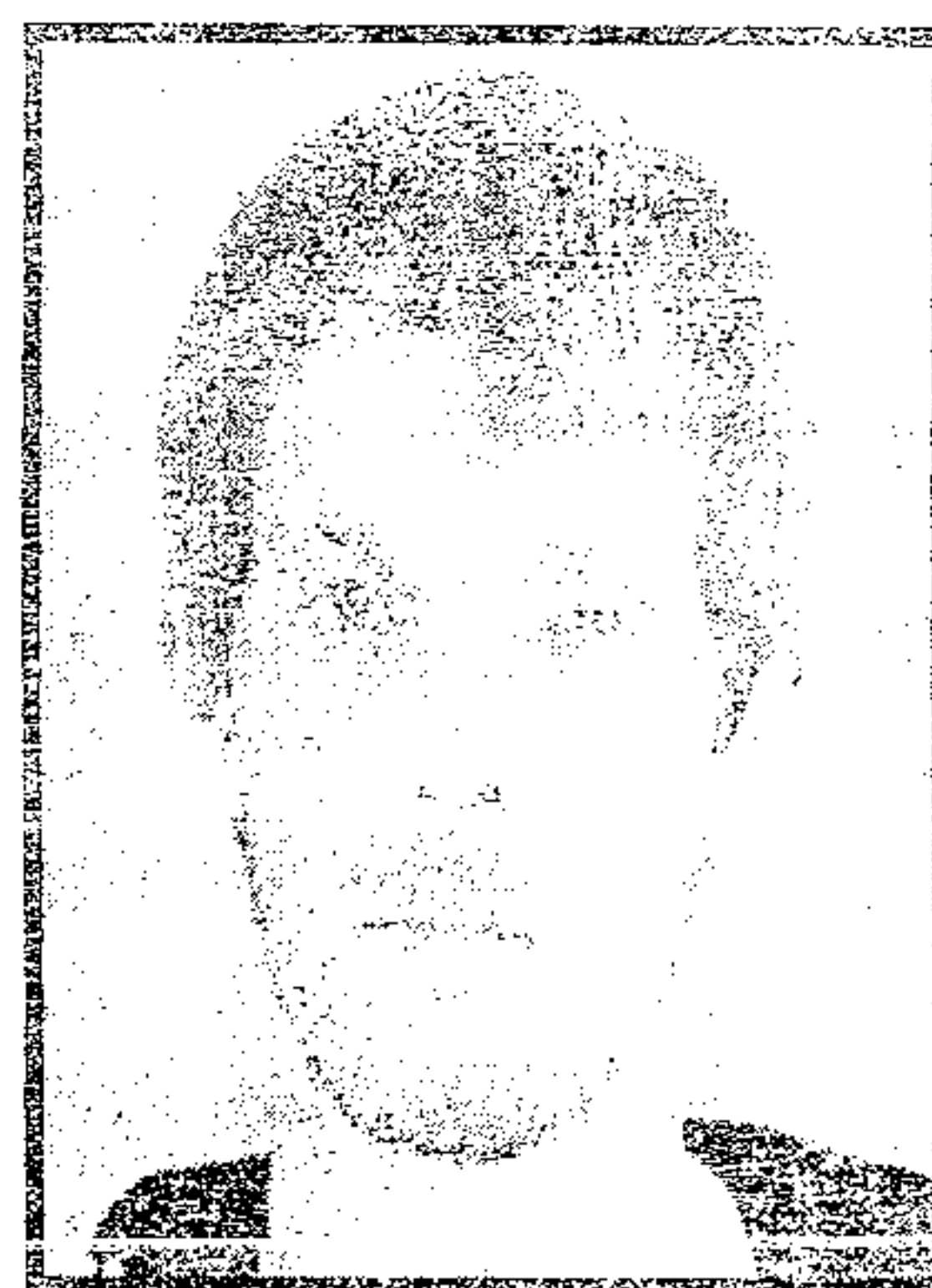

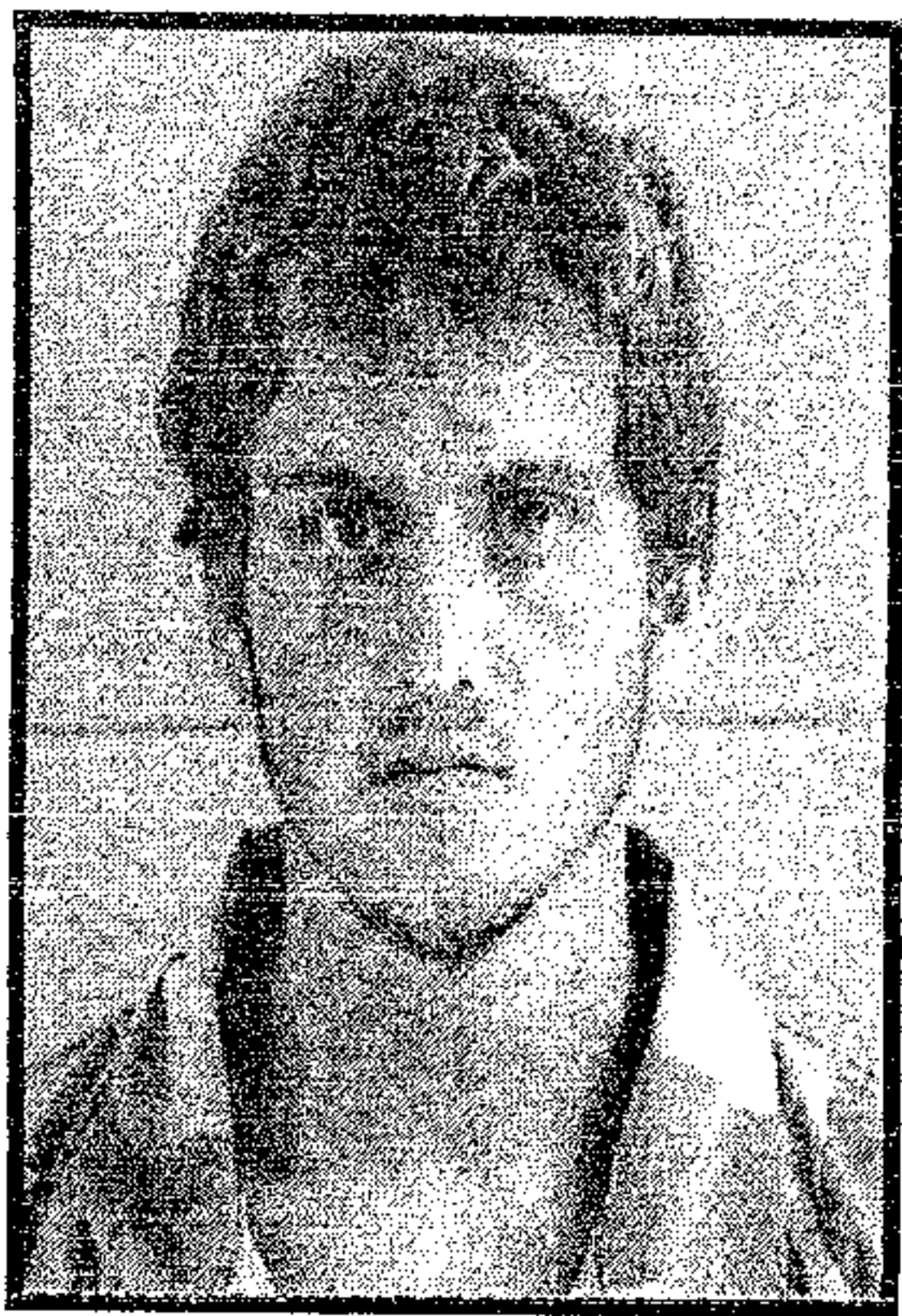

After officers received consent to search the residence to look for Huffine, Investigator Butler found him hiding in a rear bedroom closet. Huffine was taken into custody.

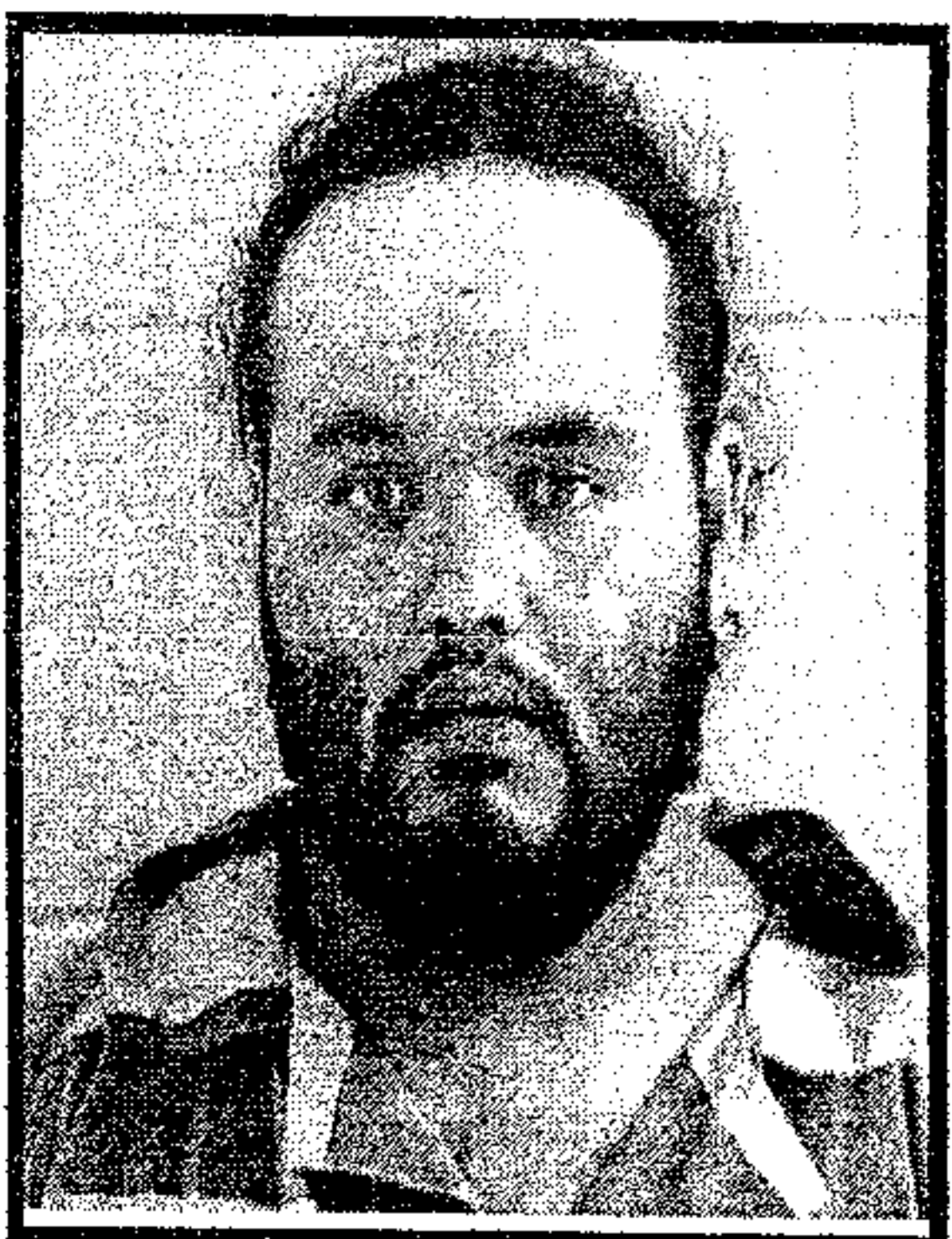

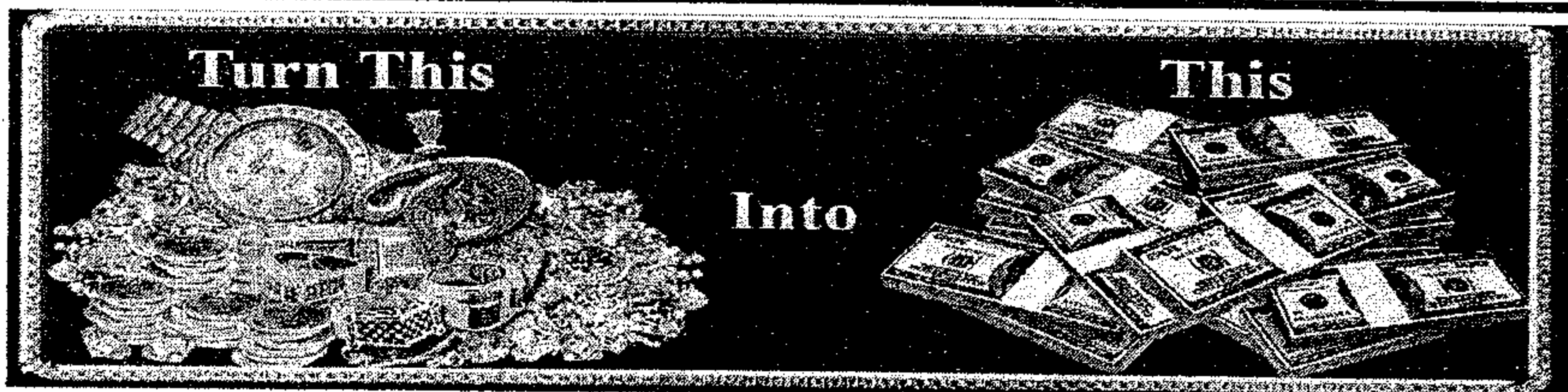

plying to the corporal's orders.

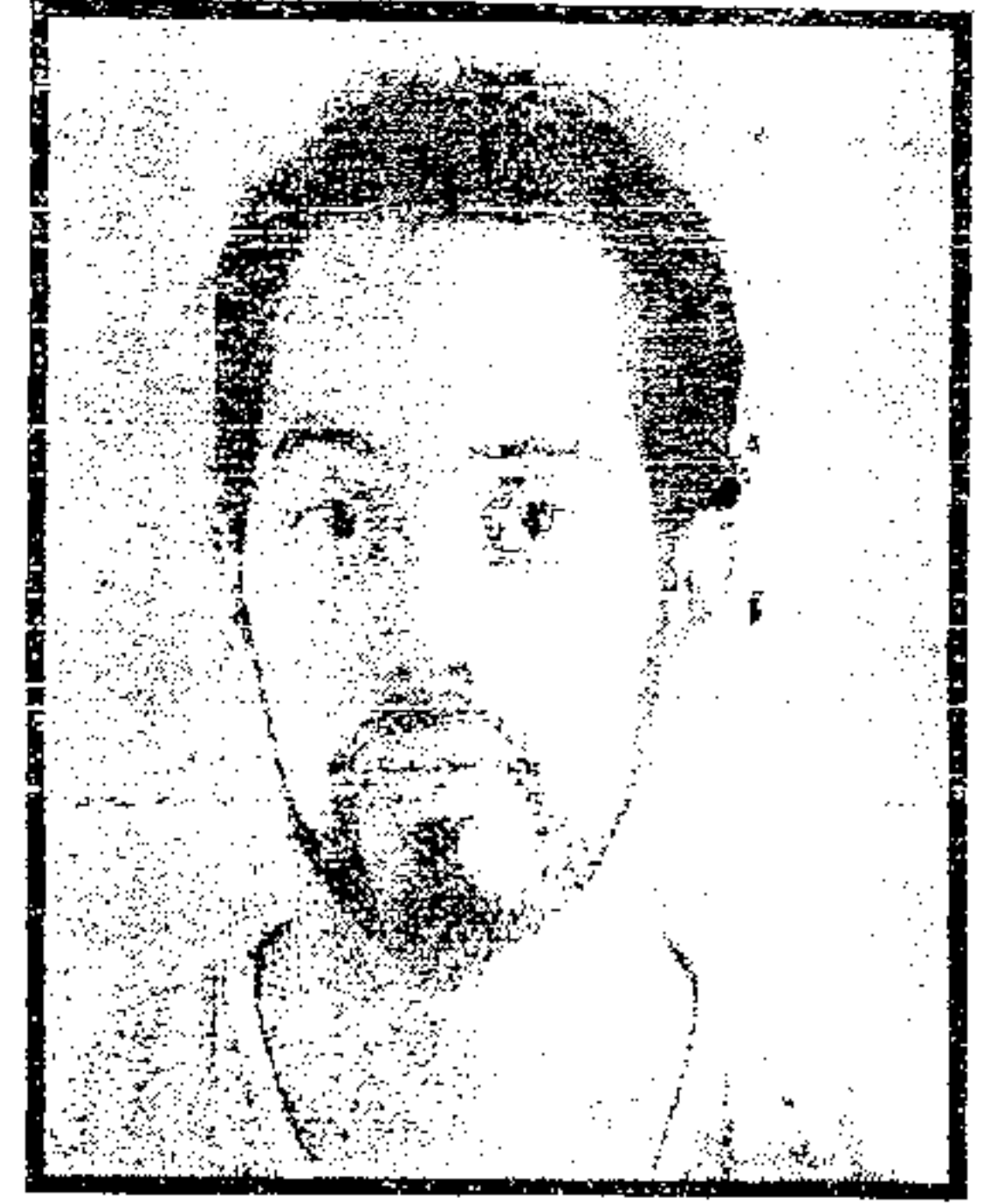
Both inmates were pulled out of the block and were examined by the jail nurse. The victim sustained red marks to the side of his head and face.
