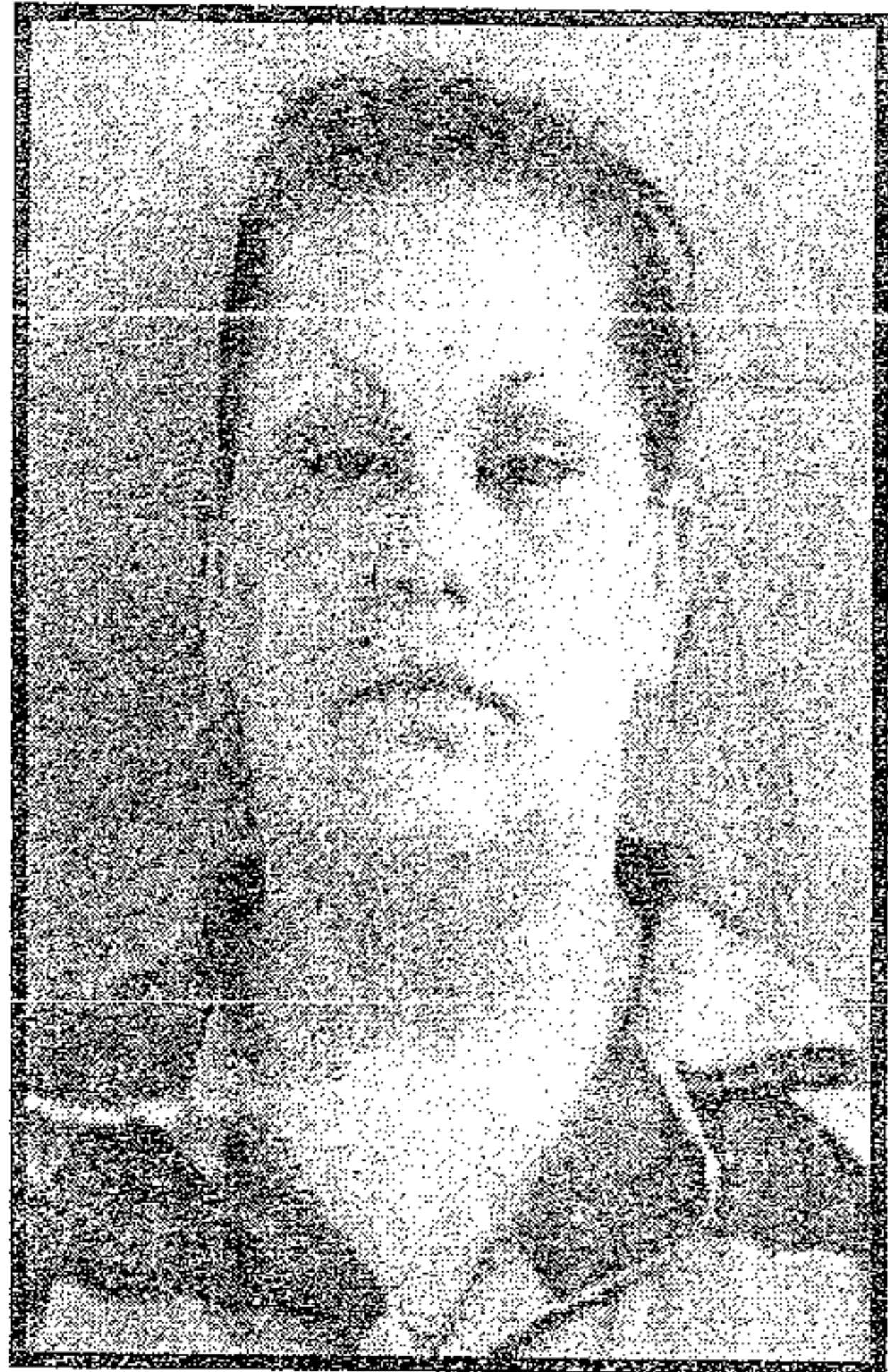

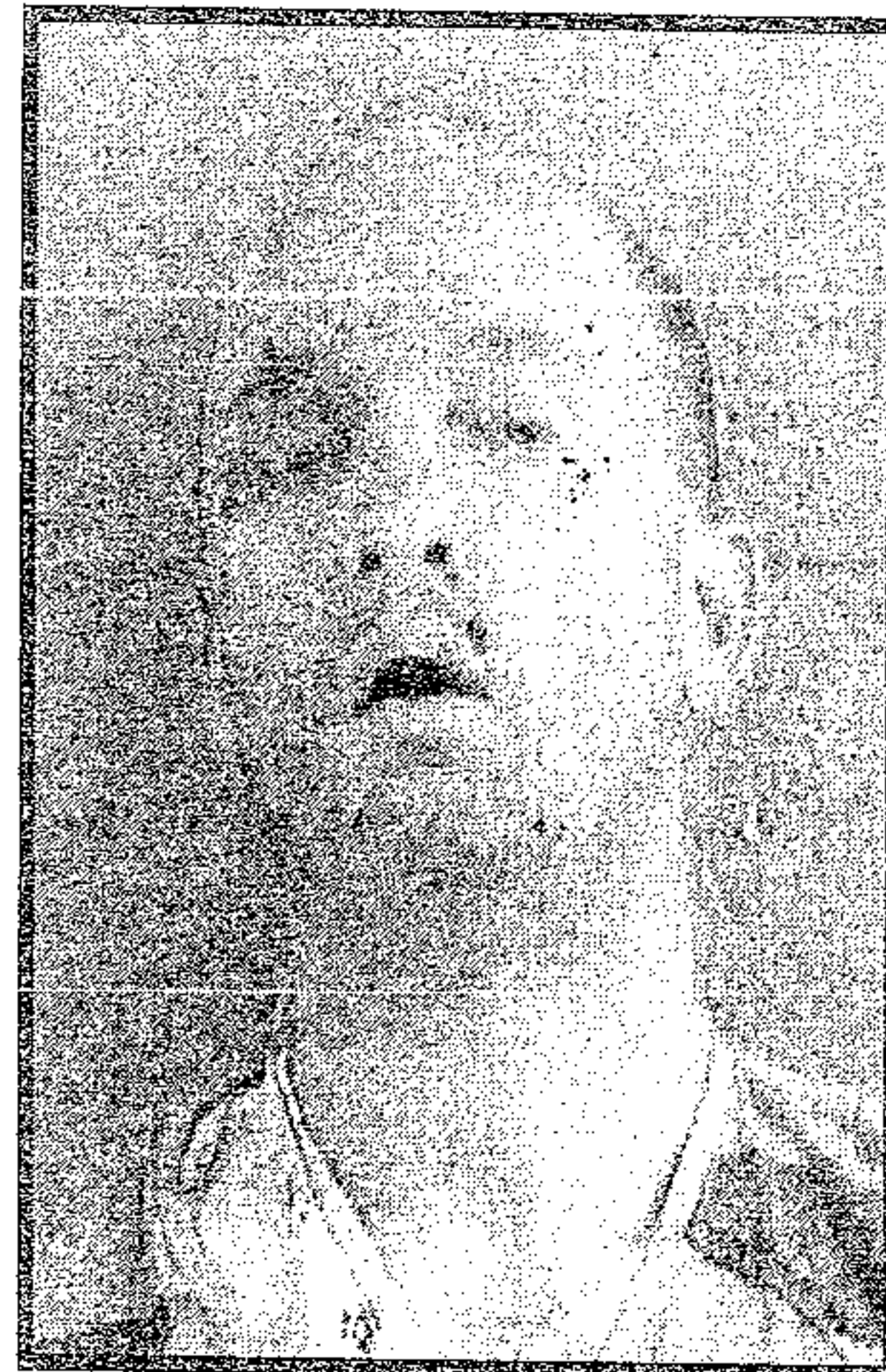


## Update: Charges mount for crash survivor

## What is Flag Day all about?

In the United States Flag Day is celebrated on June 14. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened that day by resolution of the Second Continental Congress in 1777. The United States Army also celebrates the Army Birthday on this date; Congress adopted "the American continental army" after reaching a consensus position in the Committee of the Whole on June 14, 1775.

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; in August 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress.

Flag Day is not an official federal holiday, though on June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first (and only) U.S. state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday, beginning in the town of Rennerdale. Title 36 of the United

was charged with burglary and theft of property \$1000 - \$10,000.

According to affidavits filed by Detective Brian Jenkins, LPD; on June 3,

2012, around 3:00 AM, Jonathan N. Monday entered the Jiffy Market located at 900 Grove Street after business hours by prying open the front doors. Entry was made without the consent or

knowledge of the store owners with the intent to commit theft.

Theft was committed by taking approximately \$1500 worth of cigarettes and approximately \$160 in currency.

The store's surveillance video captured two individuals exiting a gold Chevy S-10 pickup with chrome bed rails. A third suspect stayed in the truck while the other two pryed open the door, entered the store and took several cartons of cigarettes and money. The individuals put the cigarettes in what appeared to be 'white, plastic trash bags to carry them.

from the Good Fellows burglary. They were in similar white plastic trash bags as the ones used at the Jiffy. There was also other evidence recovered at the scene of the crash, which appeared similar as items used in the Jiffy burglary.

Also recovered at the crash scene was a set of bolt cutters, a yellow hatchet and some blue latex gloves, all in a canvas bag. These items are commonly used in burglaries.

There were three occupants in the vehicle during the crash. Monday, Travis Lee Lay, and the driver Tim Hardwick. Both Hardwick and Lay were pronounced dead at the scene of the crash.

Corporal Michael Wilson, LCSO served the warrant at the Loudon County Jail.

On June 5, 2012, LPD Officers Jon Yates and Sam Harrison pursued the same truck from the area of another burglary at Good Fellows on Highway 72 in Loudon. The pursuit resulted in the truck crashing on Highway 72 near Prospect Church Road. At the scene of the crash Detective Jenkins recovered several cartons of cigarettes taken

**Yelverton arrest.**

According to records, Friday, around 4:16 PM, Officer J. Anderson, LCPD observed

Mr. Yelverton driving a black Kia Amanti on Broadway at F Street. Officer Anderson had prior knowledge of Yelverton having ac-

tive arrest warrants in Loudon County and when he pulled behind Yelverton's vehicle to initiate a traffic stop Mr. Yelverton immediately

pulled into a driveway at 1107 West Broadway and bailed out of the car on foot.

Yelverton ran behind the house and through a culvert into the woods between M and N Street and when he entered the culvert the officer told him to stop or he would be Tasered. He ran out the other side of the culvert and the officer attempted to deploy his Taser but one of the leads missed Yelverton and was not effective.

After setting up a perimeter around the wooded area, Mr. Yelverton was taken into custody by LCPD Officers J. Felts and K.

Sennett.

Records indicate Mr. Yelverton knew he had active warrants for his arrest and that's why he ran from law enforcement. Officer Anderson made the arrest.

Once at the Loudon County Jail, Robert Yelverton was charged with violation of probation, two counts of failure to appear on revoked drivers license charges, two counts of failure to appear on charges of burglary other than habitation, and two counts of theft of property \$1000 - \$10,000. Deputy Stegall, LCSO served those warrants in the jail.

### Flag Day

States Code, Subtitle I, Part A, CHAPTER 1, § 110 is the official statute on Flag Day, however, it is at the President's discretion to officially proclaim the observance.

#### Properly Display Our Flag

There is a right way and a wrong way to display the flag. The American flag should be held in the highest of regards. It represents our nation and the many people who gave their lives for our country and our flag. Here are the basics on displaying the American flag: The flag is normally flown from sunrise to sunset.

In the morning, raise the flag briskly. At sunset, lower it slowly. Always, raise and lower it ceremoniously.

The flag should not be flown at night without a light on it.

The flag should not be flown in the rain or inclement weather.

After a tragedy or death, the flag is flown at half staff for 30 days. It's called "half staff" on land and "half mast" on a ship.

When flown vertically on a pole, the stars and

blue field, or "union", is at the top and at the end of the pole (away from your house).

The American flag is always flown at the top of the pole. Your state flag and other flags fly below it.

The union is always on top. When displayed in print, the stars and blue field are always on the left.

Never let your flag touch the ground, never...period.

Fold your flag when storing. Don't just stuff it in a drawer or box.

When your flag is old and has seen better days, it is time to retire it. Old flags should

be burned or buried. Please do not throw it in the trash.

### Retiring Unserviceable American Flags

American Legion Post 256 will be "properly retiring unserviceable" American flags on Saturday June 16th. The Flag Retirement Ceremony will be conducted at the Tellico Village Fire Department on Chota Road starting at 10:00 AM.
