
A Loudon man found himself behind bars when his vehicle was stopped because two children in it were not properly restrained and he was found to have been driving under the influence on revoked.



Heat Sick

It is estimated that approximately 700 people die annually due to heat-related illness. In the summer of 1980, a severe heat wave hit the United States, and nearly 1,700 people lost their lives heat-related illness. Likewise, in the summer of 2003, tens of thousands of people died in Europe from an extreme heat wave. High temperatures put people at risk.

Heat stroke: Heat stroke is a form of hyperthermia, an abnormally elevated body temperature with accompanying physical symptoms including changes in the nervous system function. Unlike heat cramps and heat exhaustion, two other forms of hyperthermia that are less severe, heat stroke is a true medical emergency that is often fatal if not properly and promptly treated. Heat stroke is also sometimes referred to as heatstroke or sun stroke. Severe hyperthermia is defined as a body temperature of 104 F (40 C) or higher. Infants, the elderly, athletes, and outdoor workers are the groups at greatest risk for heat stroke. Common symptoms and signs of heat stroke include: high body temperature, the

absence of sweating, with hot red or flushed dry skin, rapid pulse, difficulty breathing, strange behavior, hallucinations, confusion, agitation, disorientation, seizure, and/or coma.

Heat exhaustion: Heat exhaustion occurs when a person exercises or works in a hot environment and sweating cannot dissipate the heat generated within the body. Often dehydration occurs because the person hasn't replaced the water lost by sweating. Symptoms of heat exhaustion include profuse weakness, sweating, nausea, vomiting, headache, lightheadedness, and muscle cramps.

Heat cramps: Heat are intermitcramps tent, involuntary muscle spasms that occur in an individual who is physically active in hot weather. Heat cramps usually affect the major muscles that are being stressed in a hot environment. Individuals at risk for heat cramps include those who work or are active in a hot environment. Individuals with impaired temperature control mechanisms, such as infants, young children, and the elderly, are also at a greater risk of heat cramps. Heat cramps are the earliest symptoms of a heat-re-

lated illness. Symptoms of heat cramps include profuse sweating with involuntary spasms of the large muscles in the body. Heat cramps also may be a symptom of heat exhaustion.

Heat rash: A heat rash occurs when sweat ducts become clogged and the sweat can't get to the surface of the skin. Instead, it becomes trapped beneath the skin's surface causing a mild inflammation or rash. Heat rash is also called prickly heat or miliaria.

Dehydration: Dehydration occurs when the amount of water leaving the body is greater than the amount being taken in. The body is very dynamic and always changing. This is especially true with water in the body. We lose water routinely when we: breathe and humidified air leaves the body (this can be seen on a cold day (the breath you see in the air is water that has been exhaled); sweat to cool the body; and eliminate waste by urinating or having a bowel movement. In a normal day,

a person has to drink a significant amount of water to replace this routine loss.

Understanding one's environment is perhaps the most important step in preventing heat-related illness. If possible, activities strenuous should not be performed in excessively hot or humid environments. However, people often have to work in the heat of the day, or indoors in hot situations and need to make the effort to protect their bodies. These can include frequent breaks taken in a cooler areas, adequate fluid intake, and slowing the pace of work to decrease heat generation within the body.

One bullet struck the passenger side mirror and two other bullets struck the tailgate of the couple's vehicle.

As Vandermeeden was firing at the victims, Ms. Elrod sped up to stay in close contact with them. During the chase," Ms. Elrod passed other motorists both on the left side and right side of the vehicles, disregarding the safety of the public.
