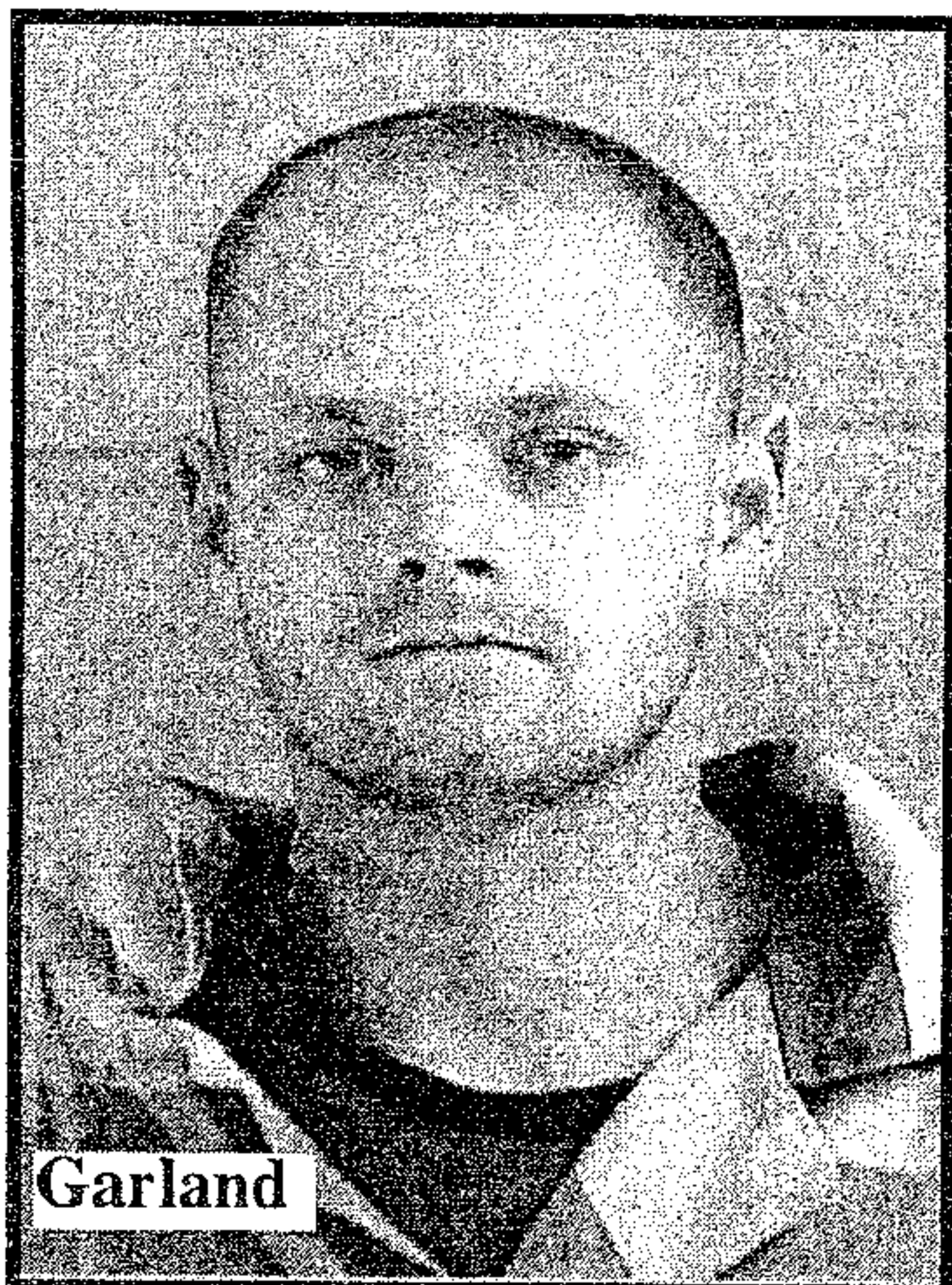

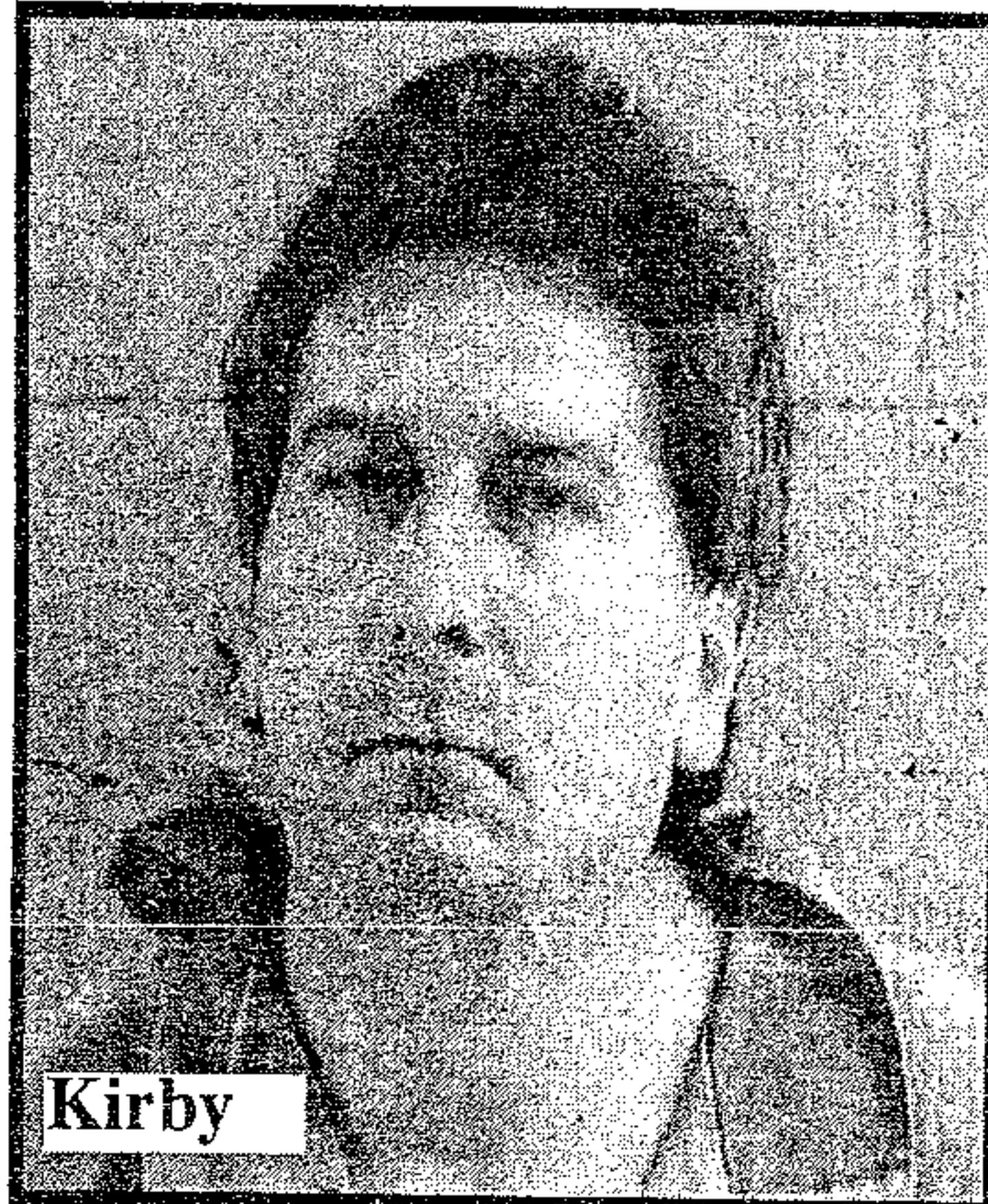

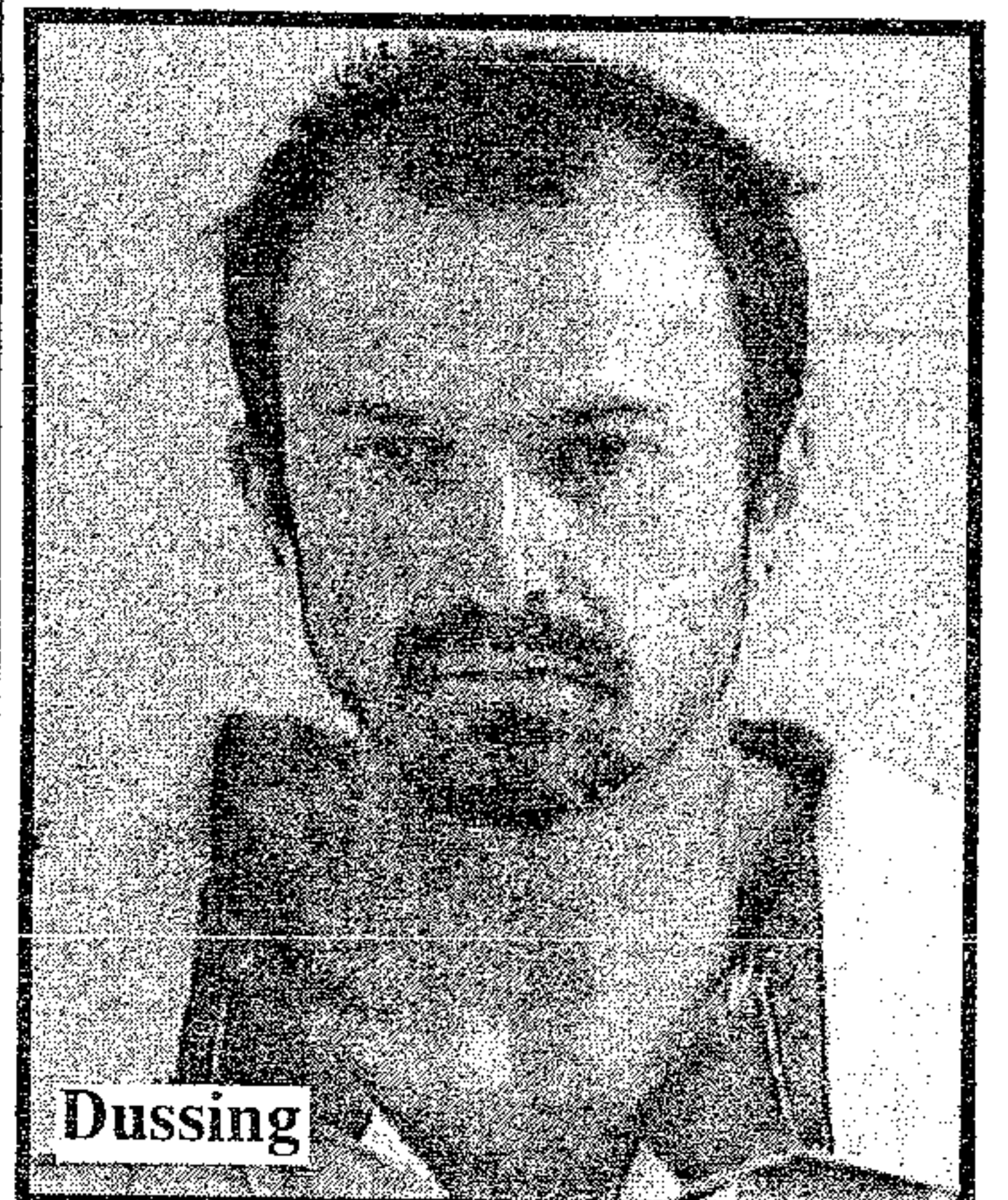

execution of a search warrant at their Lenoir City home that produced several hundred dollars in bogus bills.

Kelly Suzanne Ad-

ams, 31, Highway 321, Lenoir City was charged with three counts of criminal simulation.

Christopher Lee Smallen, 33, Highway

321, Lenoir City was also charged with three counts of criminal simulation.

According to affidavits filed by Investigator Jeff Russell, LCSO-

CID; on June 29, 2012, during an investigation of counterfeiting paper money in Lenoir City, Kelly Adams gave consent to search her residence. During the search, a printer and several copied bills were found in the bedroom.

Records indicate the bills consisted of four \$100 dollar bills, one \$10 dollar bill, and

four more, old style \$100 dollar bills, all of which were found copied on paper.


Christopher Smallen is Ms. Adams' boyfriend and also lives in the residence. They share the same bedroom where the money and printer were found.

Investigator Russell made the arrests Tuesday at the Loudon County Jail.

Mr. Dussing was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail to await extradition.

After receiving consent to search the vehicle, Officer Dishner reported he found a Tennessee ID that proved Mr. Gardner was in fact Justin Garland, who had knowingly given a false name to avoid being arrested.

Mr. Garland advised he lied because of an outstanding warrant in Sevier County.

Kirby

Corporal Michael Watkins arrested a Lenoir City man on DUI and drug possession charges after finding him reportedly under the influence of an intoxicant and in possession of more than three grams of cocaine during a traffic stop on I-75 Friday.

Martin Dennis Kirby, 50, Ivey Avenue, Lenoir City was charged with DUI 1st offense, possession of schedule II cocaine, possession of schedule II oxycodone and possession of schedule IV xanax.

According to reports, Corporal Michael Watkins, LCSO received a call Friday of a possible intoxicated driver traveling south on Interstate 75 in a blue Hyundai. The corporal spotted the vehicle on Town Creek Road and, noticing it crossed the centerline numerous times, he stopped it near Myers Road. The driver, Mr. Martin D. Kirby, had slurred speech and when asked to exit the vehicle he was very unsteady on his feet.

Mr. Kirby performed poorly on field sobriety tasks and a check of his license through NCIC revealed his driving privileges were suspended for failure to satisfy citations. He also had an active warrant out of Knox County for failure to appear.

Corporal Watkins deployed his K9 partner Denero to perform a drug sniff of the vehicle and the K9 alerted there was, or had been, the odor of drugs in the vehicle.

A search of Mr. Kirby's person produced a small clear baggy with a white powder substance weighing approximately 3.1 grams, which field tested positive for cocaine. A small metal cylinder with three blue oval pills identified as xanax and one small blue pill identified as oxycodone were also found in Mr. Kirby's pocket. He was placed under arrest and read the implied consent advisement. He agreed to be tested

and was transported to the Fort Loudoun ER before going to jail.

Jeremy Scott Glisson, 31, Tomotley Drive, Maryville was charged with DUI 1st offense.

According to reports, Deputy Cody Fritts, LCSO witnessed a red Ford F-150 traveling south on Highway 411 and when it made an illegal u-turn and started going north, he stopped it in the Greenback Corner Market parking lot.

The driver, Mr. Jeremy S. Glisson, had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person and very bloodshot eyes. He stated he'd had two beers before going to a bar and three more beers while at the bar. There were two empty Bud Light cans and one unopened Bud Light inside Mr. Glisson's truck.

Glisson performed

poorly on field sobriety tasks and was transported to the Fort Loudoun ER where he was read

implied consent and agreed to a blood test before being taken to the Loudon County Jail.

DORL with illicit pills

Agent Jeff Vittatooe arrested a Loudon man on drug and driving related charges after he stopped the man's vehicle because he was not wearing a seat belt and discovered two illicit pills in his possession.

Bobby Lynn Massey, Jr., 44, Burnett Circle, Loudon was charged with possession of schedule II controlled substance and driving on revoked license.

According to affidavits; on or about June 28, 2012, Agent Jeff Vittatooe, 9th DTF stopped a Ford truck at the Kwik Pantry on Highway 11 in Loudon for a violation of the seat belt law. As the agent approached the driver, Bobby Massey, Jr., he observed a gold colored object with blue on it grasped in his right hand.

Mr. Massey reached beside the driver seat for a moment and then walked around the truck to the passenger

side and no longer had the object in his hand.

As Agent Vittatooe walked around to the drivers side of the truck, the door was open and he could plainly see an Al-toid can with blue on it, stuck between the floor and the floor mat of the truck. Upon retrieving the can, the agent discovered it contained a small dark yellow pill and a small light colored yellow pill. He reported he asked Mr. Massey what the pills were, Massey stated one was an oxy.

One pill was identified as oxycodone and the other was determined to be opana and Mr. Massey did not have prescriptions for the medications.

Further investigation revealed Mr. Massey also was driving on a revoked license. He was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.
