**Sales Tax Holiday**

"The annual Sales Tax Holiday was designed with Tennessee families in mind, providing savings for

families, especially as students start the new school year," Gov. Bill Haslam said.

The holiday begins Friday, August 3 at

12:01 a.m. and ends Sunday, August 5 at 11:59 p.m. During the designated three-day weekend, consumers will not pay state or lo-

cal sales tax on clothing with a price of \$100 or less per item, school and art supplies with a price of \$100 or less per item, and computers with a price of \$1,500 or less.

"As in years past, last year's tax-free weekend was very successful, providing Tennessee taxpayers nearly \$9.6 million in tax savings" said Revenue Commissioner Richard H. Roberts. "We are hopeful that all Tennessee shoppers will take advantage of the tax relief provided by the 2012 Sales Tax Holiday."

The Tennessee Department of Revenue also assists consumers via e-mail, [Salestax.Holiday@TN.gov](mailto:Salestax.Holiday@TN.gov), and through its toll-free statewide telephone hot line, (800) 342-1003. Staff is available to answer questions Monday through Friday 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Central Time. (Out-of-state and Nashville-area callers, please dial (615) 253-0600.)

Examples of exempt

items include:

**Clothing:** Shirts, dresses, pants, coats, gloves and mittens, hats and caps, hosiery, neckties, belts, sneakers, shoes, uniforms whether athletic or non-athletic and scarves

**School Supplies:** Binders, book bags, calculators, tape, chalk, crayons, erasers, folders, glue, pens, pencils, lunch boxes, notebooks, paper, rulers and scissors

**Art Supplies:** Clay and glazes; acrylic, tempera and oil paints; paintbrushes for artwork; sketch and drawing pads; and watercolors

**Computers:** Central processing unit (CPU), along with various other components including monitor, keyboard, mouse, cables to connect components and preloaded software (Note: While the CPU may be purchased separately, other items must be part of a bundled computer package in order to be eligible.) iPads and other tablet computers are eligible for tax exemption, while smart phones and video game consoles are not.

According to records, Monday, around 3:26 PM, Agent Brendan DeBoer, 9th DTF responded to a call dispatched to the Loudon Police Department about a female passed out behind the wheel of a silver Mitsubishi Galant. When officers arrived on the scene, they found Jennifer Mizer passed out and lethargic behind the wheel of the Mitsubishi.

Ms. Mizer was given field sobriety tasks, which she failed and was asked to consent to a blood test, which she refused. Gunn,

however, consented to a search of her vehicle and person.

A search of Mizer's person uncovered several pill bottles of oxycodone with a substantial amount missing. A ledger was found in her purse showing how many pills or money was owed to her or that she owed to other people.

Ms. Mizer consented to a search of her phone and text messages. Numerous messages involved the sale of pills, specifically oxycodone. Ms. Mizer was believed to have been selling a substantial amount of oxycodone and was arrested.

There was also a two year old child in the vehicle at the time of her arrest.

**South Carolina Couple Charged with TennCare Fraud**

NASHVILLE – A South Carolina couple is charged with TennCare fraud in connection with misrepresenting their residency in order to obtain TennCare benefits.

The Office of Inspector General (OIG) today announced the arrest of James E. Mink, 65, and his wife, Linda, 65, both of Aiken, South Carolina. The Tazewell Police Department and the Claiborne County Sheriff's Office assisted with the arrests.

The Minks were indicted by a Claiborne County Grand Jury, and each charged with one count of TennCare fraud and one count of theft of services. Investigators say they gave a false statement about where they live, giving a Tennessee residence. Living in South Carolina makes them ineligible to receive benefits through TennCare.

"We will prosecute people who misrepresent their income, address or employment to gain TennCare benefits," Inspector General Deborah Faulkner said. "Tennessee taxpayers have made it clear they want to end this kind of criminal activity in the TennCare program." Illegally obtaining

TennCare medical benefits is a Class E felony that carries a maximum penalty of two years in prison. The theft of services charge carries a maximum sentence of up to four years in prison. District Attorney General William Paul Phillips will prosecute.

The OIG, which is separate from TennCare, began full operation in February 2005 and has investigated cases leading to over \$3.5 million paid in restitution and recoupment to TennCare, with a total estimated cost avoidance of over \$173 million for the TennCare program, according to latest figures. To date, over 1,600 people have been charged with

TennCare fraud.

Through the OIG Cash for Tips Program established by the Legislature, Tennesseans can get cash rewards for TennCare fraud tips that lead to convictions. Anyone can report suspected TennCare fraud by calling 1-800-433-3982 toll-free from anywhere in Tennessee, or log on to [www.tn.gov/tnoig](http://www.tn.gov/tnoig) and follow the prompts that read "Report TennCare Fraud."

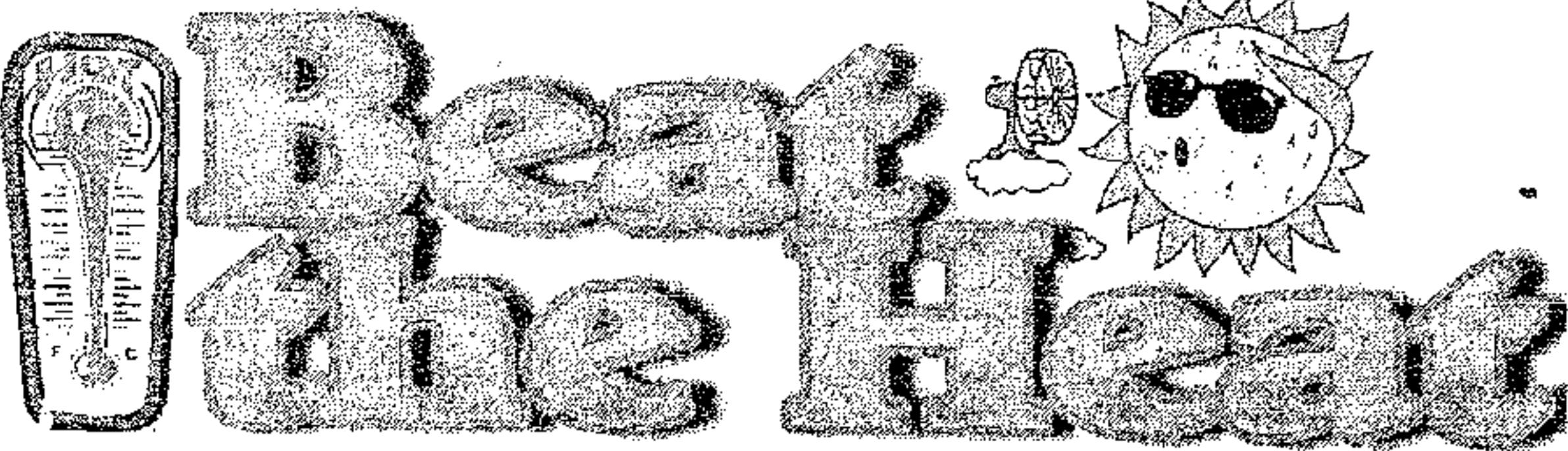




