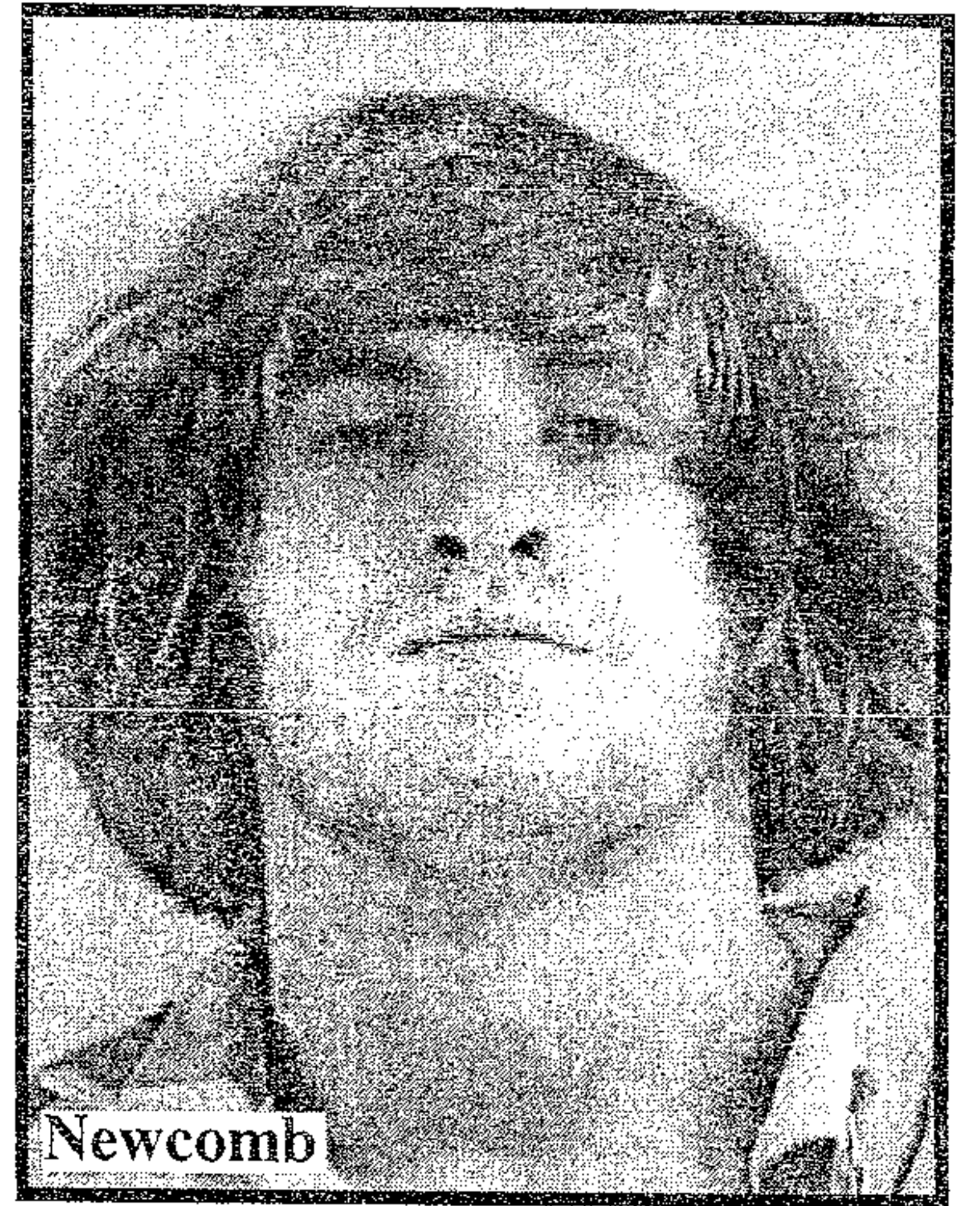

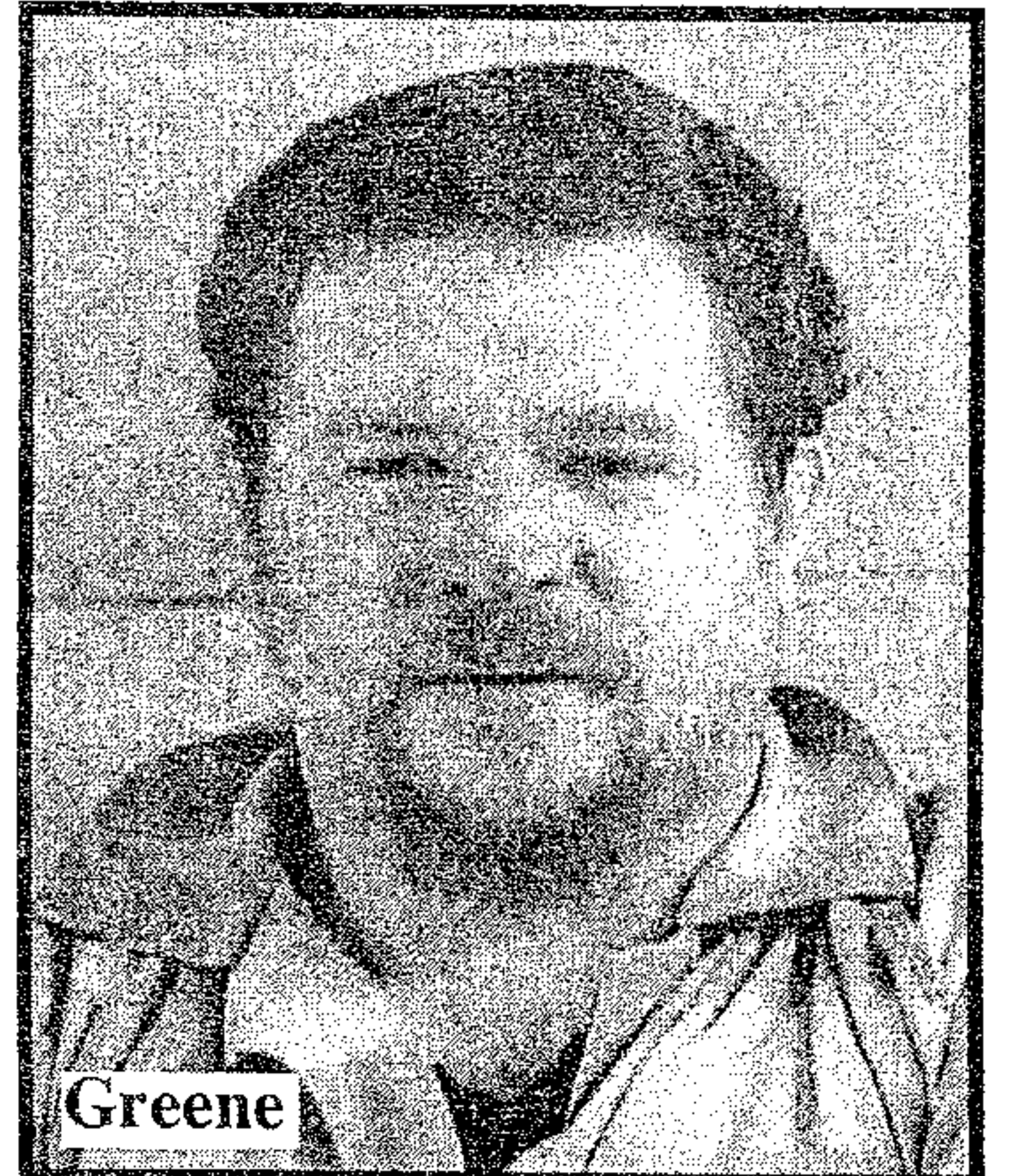

A Loudon mother is accused of contributing to the delinquency of her own child when she allegedly stole \$25 worth of hair care products then gave them to her juvenile daughter to carry out of the store.

Brigitte Michelle Bowers, 'aka' Bridgette Snodderly, 30, Carding Machine Road, Loudon was charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor and theft under \$500.

According to affidavits filed by Detective Brian Jenkins, LPD; on June 18, 2012, Brigitte Bowers entered into the Food City on Highway 72 North in Loudon where she concealed two hair care products valued at \$25 in two different hand bags, then put both hand bags on her juvenile daughter's left arm and allowed her to leave the store with them. Both mother and daughter worked in concert to remove the items from the store and passed all points of payment without paying for the items.

Bowers participated in the act of delinquency with her juvenile daughter, therefore contributing to the delinquency of the child. Deputy Nathan Wilson, LCSO served the warrants and made the arrest Thursday, at the Loudon County Jail.

Busted

David Ray Newcomb, 22, Hines Valley Road, Lenoir City was charged with felony vandalism, attempted theft, possession of burglary tools and contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

According to affidavits filed by Officer Jonathan Yates, LPD; on July 27, 2012, around 2:36 AM, Officer Yates was notified by a citizen of a possible break in to a Coke machine at the Commerce Street Laundry Mat. He arrived on the scene and made contact with a 16 year old female in the parking lot posing as a lookout. He also observed a male laying on the ground at the base of the Coke machine.

The male subject, identified as David Ray Newcomb, had a pry bar

in his hand and was in the act of breaking into the machine. He had busted the coin and dollar mechanism, the front cover, the frame and the lock bar, causing the complete destruction of the machine with losses greater than \$1000.

Officer Yates advised

Mr. Newcomb his rights and Newcomb agreed to talk with him. Newcomb admitted to breaking into the machine with the intention of stealing the products and money, but was unsuccessful in the theft.

The lawman reported Newcomb also knew the

female was underage and he had aided her to be out past curfew. Both were arrested.

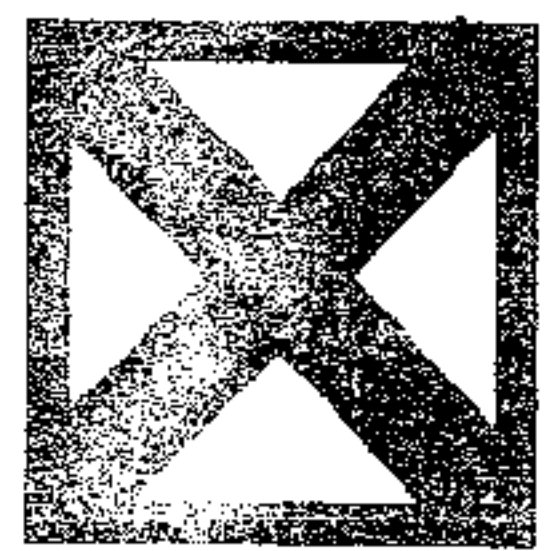

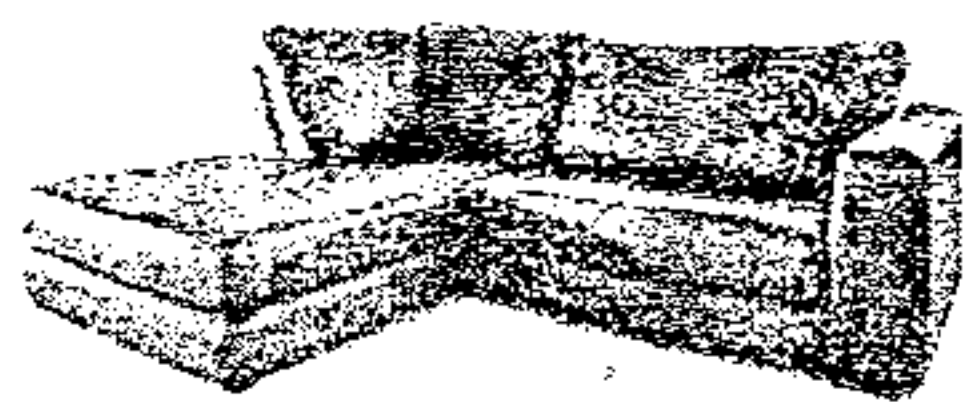

schedule II oxycodone for resale, possession of schedule II opiana, possession of schedule II hydrocodone, possession of schedule II methadone, and introduction into a penal facility.

According to affidavits; on Thursday, Agent Brandan DeBoer, 9th DTF conducted a traffic stop on a silver

Nissan Sentra that was involved in a narcotics investigation, with the knowledge that the passenger of the vehicle, Cheyanna Suddath, was carrying numerous types of prescription medication that she did not have prescriptions for. Ms. Suddath was asked to step out of the vehicle and read her Miranda Warnings and she agreed to speak

with Agent DeBoer.

The agent reported he asked Suddath if she had anything illegal on her person, and she advised she had numerous pills inside her bra. She removed the pills herself and put them on the hood of a Lenoir City Police car.

14 oxycodone pills, 1 opiana, 3 hydrocodone and 11 methadone pills were recovered.

Ms. Suddath also produced 2 hypodermic needles that she had thrown into the back seat when she was being stopped by law enforcement.

Agents of the 9th Drug Task Force had prior knowledge Ms. Suddath had just com-

pleted a drug deal for several oxycodone pills at the Flying J on Watt Road. Suddath was charged with several Drug Control Act violations and transported to the Loudon County Jail. Officer Jason Butler, LCPD was also on the scene.

Ms. Suddath was charged with introduction into a penal facility because while booking her into the Loudon County Jail, Corporal Angi M. Martin, LCSO located one whole white round pill and two halves of the same pill identified as suboxone in a clear cellophane cigarette wrapper in Ms. Suddath's wallet.

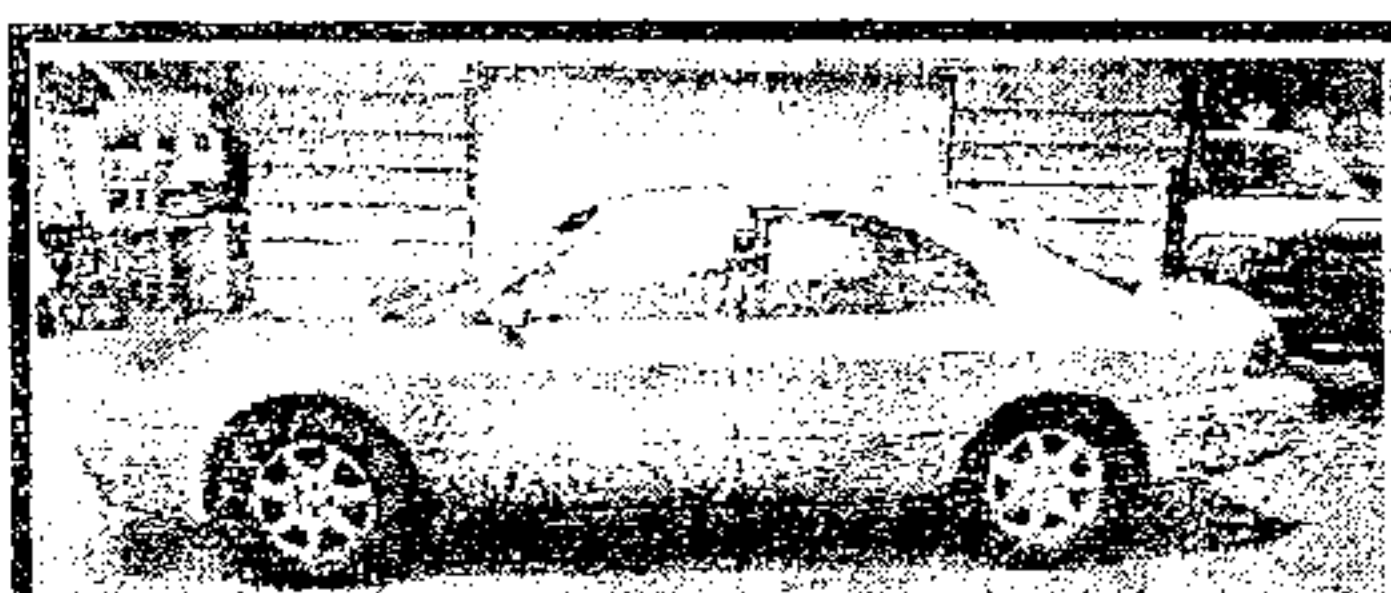
