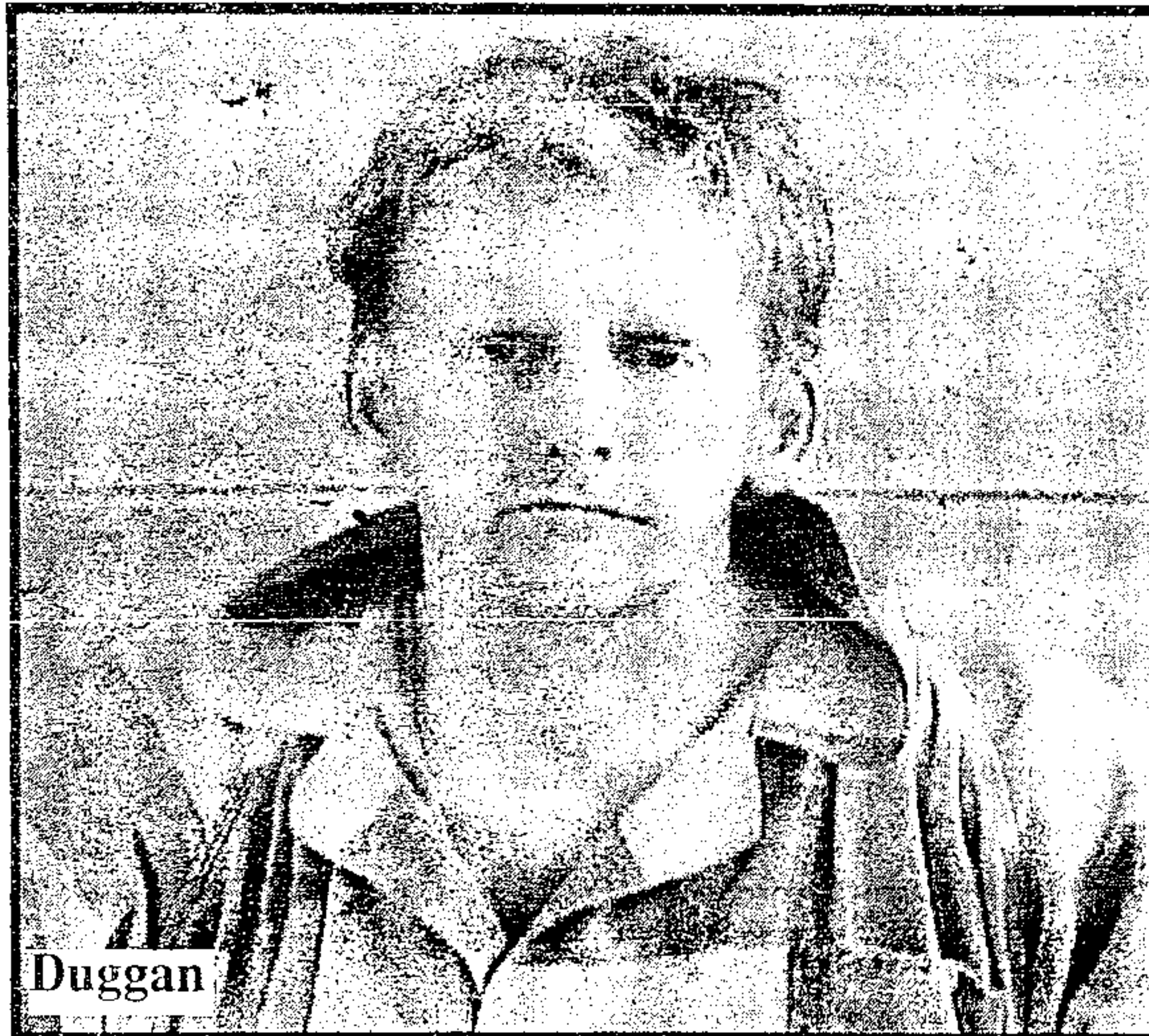

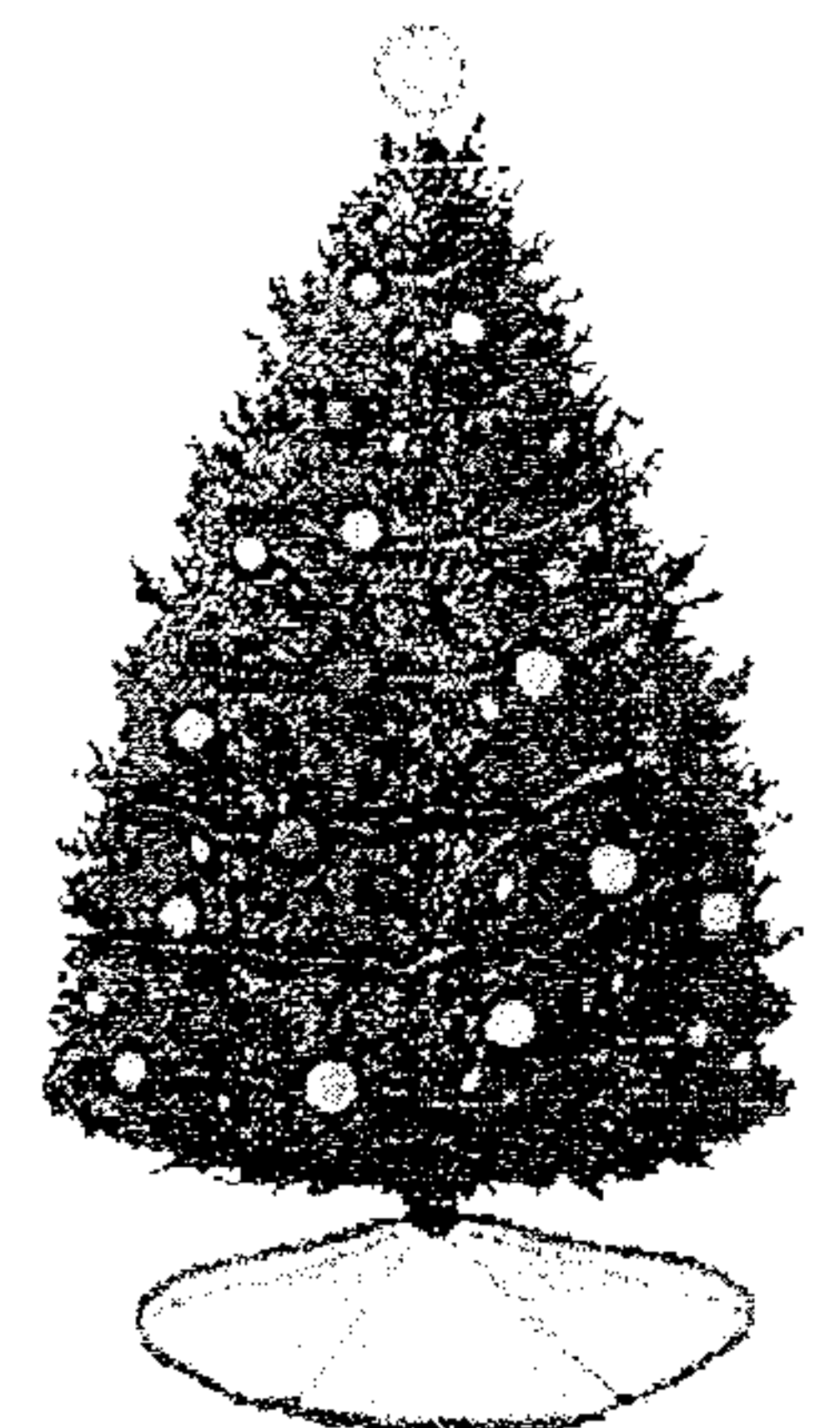

NASHVILLE - Youth between the ages of 10-15, who are hunter safety certified and who have never harvested a deer,

are eligible to win a spot in a special hunt. The hunt will be held in conjunction with the opening day of the

2012 Tennessee Young Sportsman Deer Hunt on Saturday, Oct. 29, the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency has

announced.

A total of 42 young hunters will be selected to participate in one event to be held in

Humphreys County and another in Trousdale County near the Smith County line.

The Humphreys County hunt will have

30 youngsters to be selected for participation as a gracious landowner has again donated his property for these young hunters. The private farm incorporates a variety

of wildlife management practices and totals more than 2,000 acres of prime deer habitat.

In addition to the Humphreys County hunt, 12 additional lucky hunters

will have the opportunity to hunt in some prime deer habitat in the Trousdale County hunt.

Both locations will have a Friday night cook-out and campout (participants must provide their own camping gear). Breakfast and lunch will also be provided on Saturday.

TWRA will hold a drawing and the winners will be notified by Oct. 15. Confirmation packets will be sent to the successful participants that will include directions and a list of items to bring along with area hotels. Winning hunters are responsible for providing the appropriate Tennessee

hunting license and must be accompanied by a non-hunting adult at least 21 years of age or older.

An application is available on the Wildlife Resources website at tn.gov. Interested hunters may complete an application and mail it to the following address: Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency, Youth Deer Hunt Giveaway, P.O. Box 40747, Nashville, TN 37204. 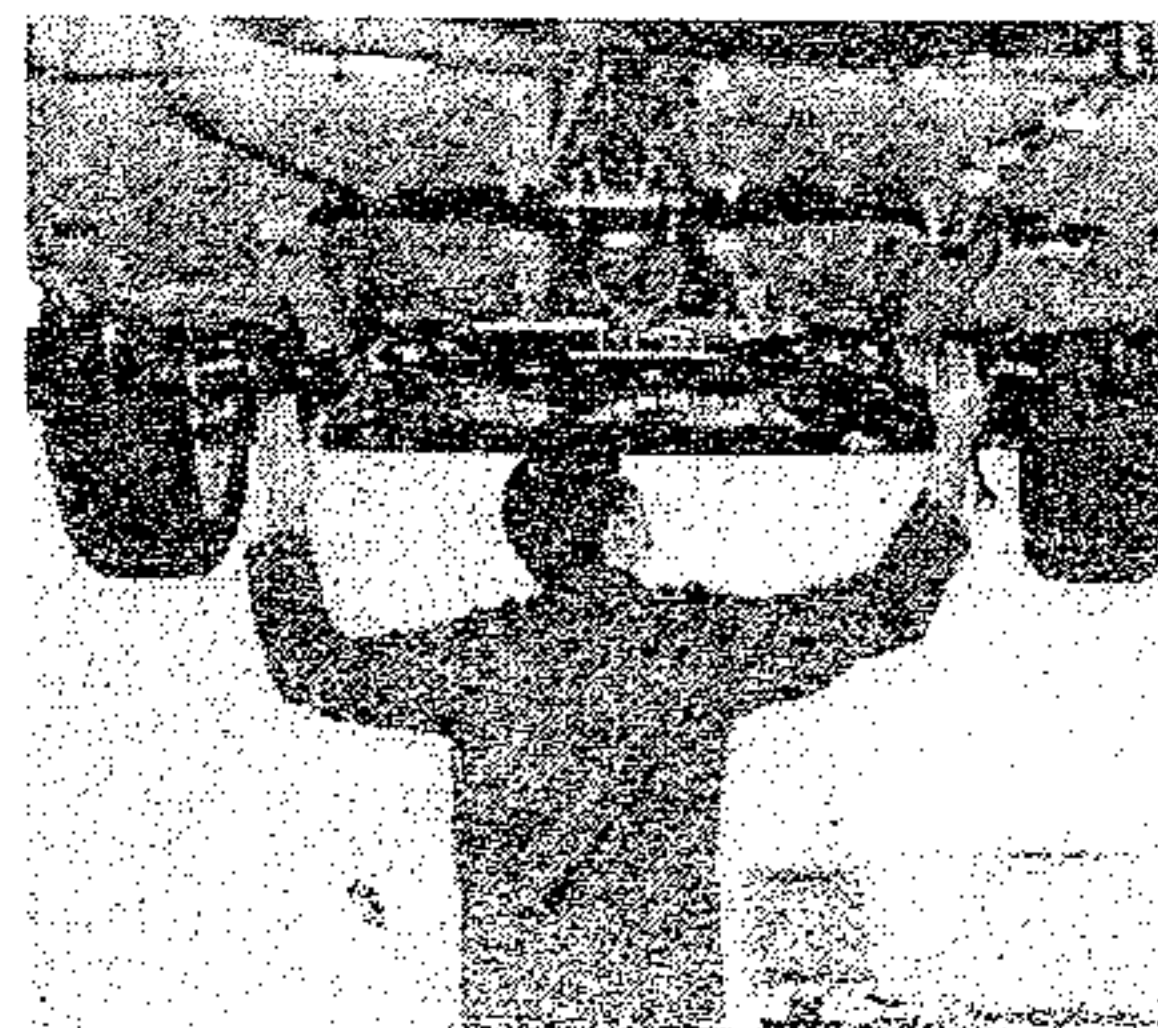

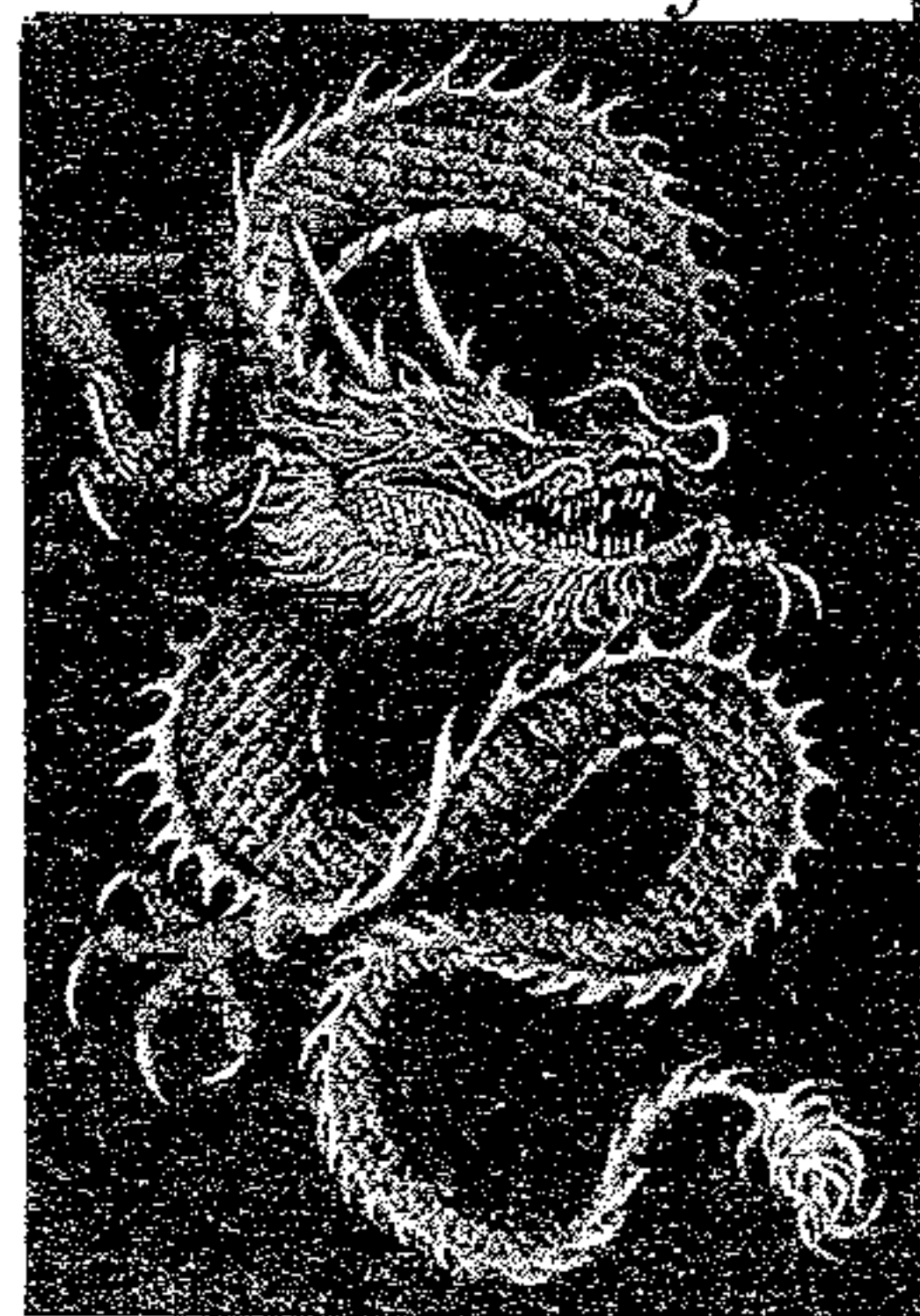

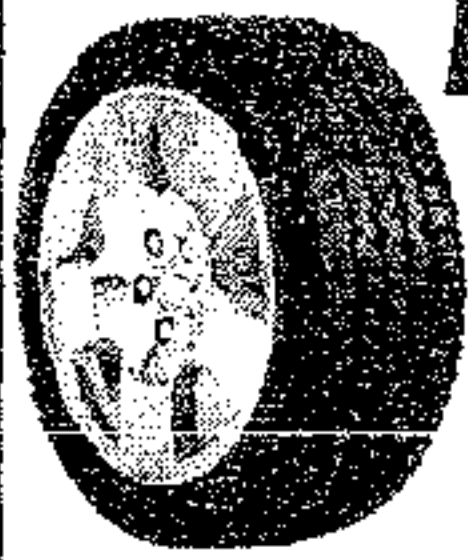

Lenoir City to investigate a shooting. Upon arrival it was learned the victim was Stacy Duggan, who lived in the home. Mrs. Duggan had received a gunshot wound to the head.

Upon further investigation it was learned from witnesses that Dan and Stacy Duggan's 11-year-old son had found a gun near the railings in a bunk bed that he was sleeping in, and had fired one, shot hitting his mother in the head.

The weapon was clearly located in a place the child could easily access the weapon. Mr. Dan Duggan admitted the gun was there and had known it was there at the time the child went to sleep. There were also other unsecured weapons and ammo in the residence.

The weapon found by the child was a small .22 caliber derringer type handgun.

Daniel Gary Duggan, aka Dan, 37, of Parkway Drive, Lenoir City, was charged with child neglect.

for suspicion of DUI and they both found reeking with alcohol and marijuana. One of the men is accused of throwing a beer can out the window while they were being pulled over

and neither man was willing to claim possession of marijuana found in plain view of others.

Justin Andrew Bullard, 26, of Martel Road, Lenoir City was charged with driving on revoked license 2nd offense and simple possession of marijuana.

Tony Brock Tite, 26, of Snyder Road, Knoxville was charged with public intoxication and simple possession of marijuana.

According to the reports, Deputy Cody Fritts, LCSO observed a red Blazer cross the center line multiple times on Martel Road. The vehicle also had a left rear brake light out. Upon stopping the vehicle the deputy made contact with the driver, Justin Bullard. Bullard had the odor of an al-

coholic beverage and marijuana coming from his person. Bullard had slurred speech and blood shot eyes.

In the middle of the console area in plain view was a hand rolled marijuana cigarette.

Mr. Tite had slurred speech and the odor of an alcoholic beverage and marijuana coming from his person.

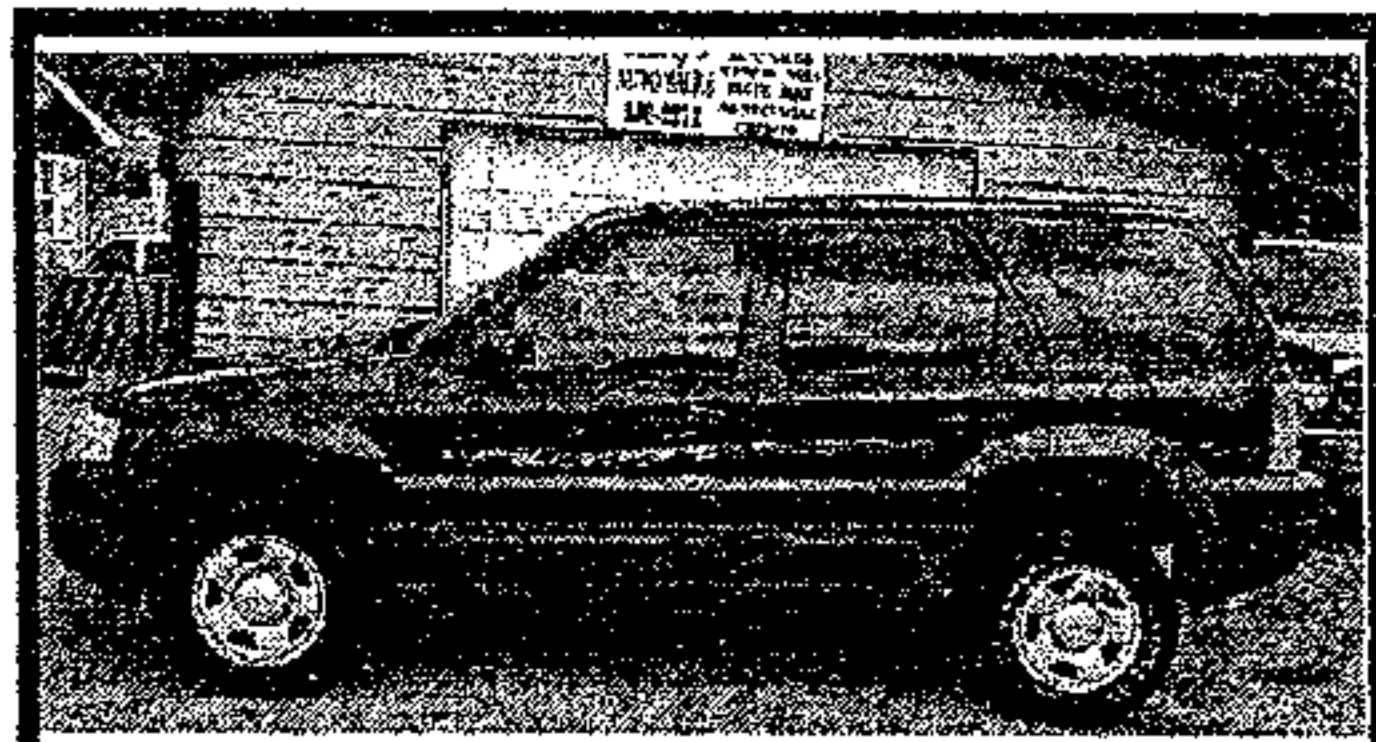
Tite performed poorly on sobriety tasks and was charged.
