Crystal Lynn Cannon, 26, of Town Creek Circle, Lenoir City was charged with a theft out of Knox county.

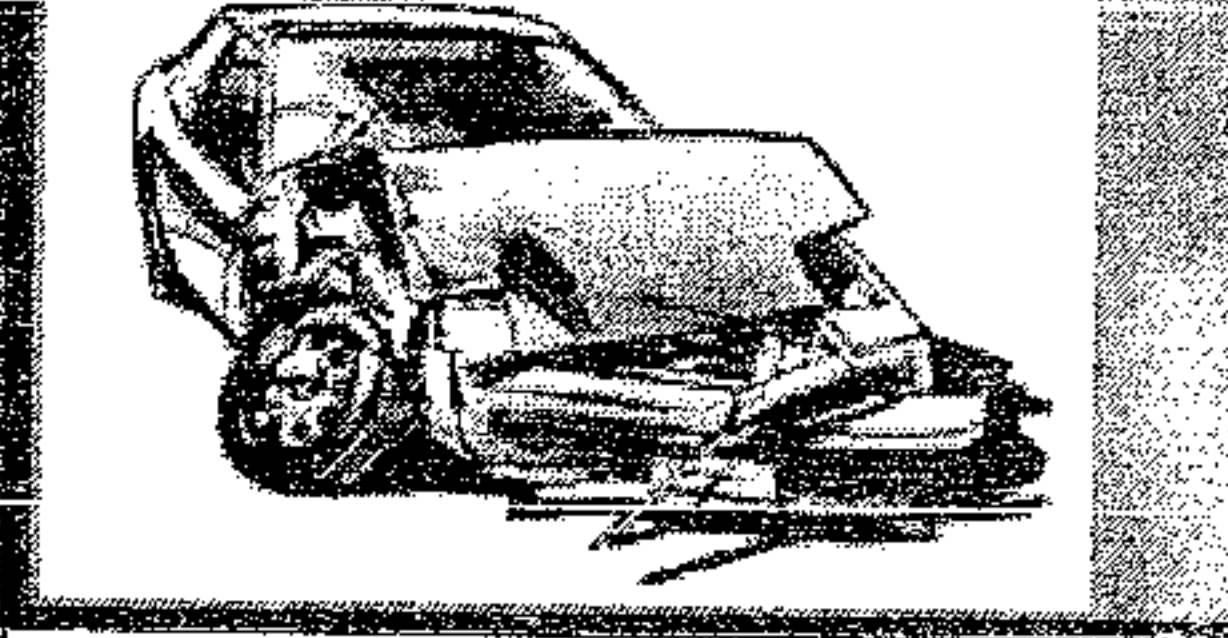
