The founder of Fender Guitars never knew how to play the guitar! Leo Fender began the company that produces the most popular guitar in the world, yet he was certainly no musician; he was an engineer. In fact, he did not even know how to tune a guitar. Perhaps for this reason Fender set the standard for what an electric guitar should be and made some of the finest on the market. He looked less at the musical aspect and more at the mechanics of what made someone able to play a guitar and how to make it sound better. For his work, he was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1992 without playing an instrument!
