

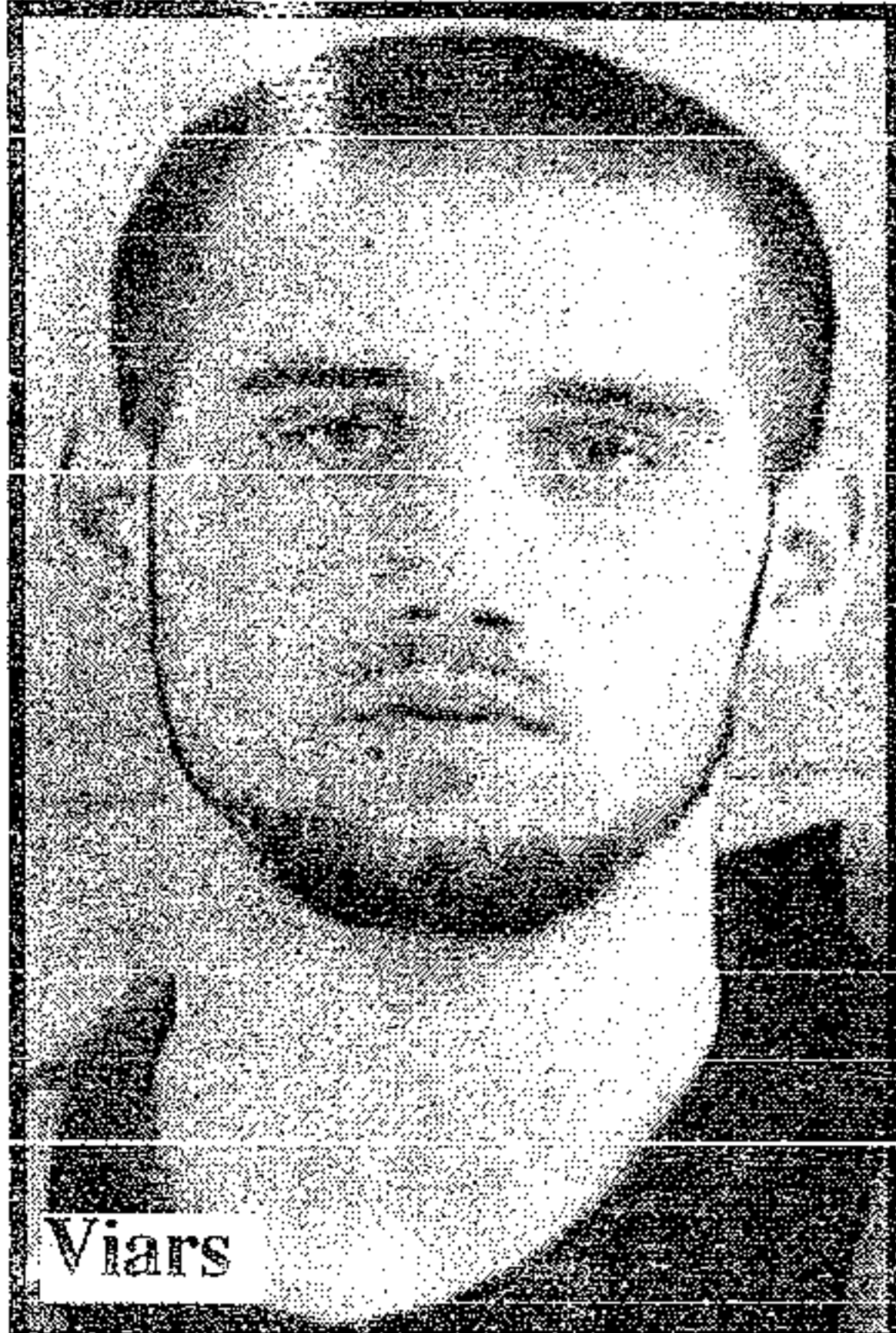

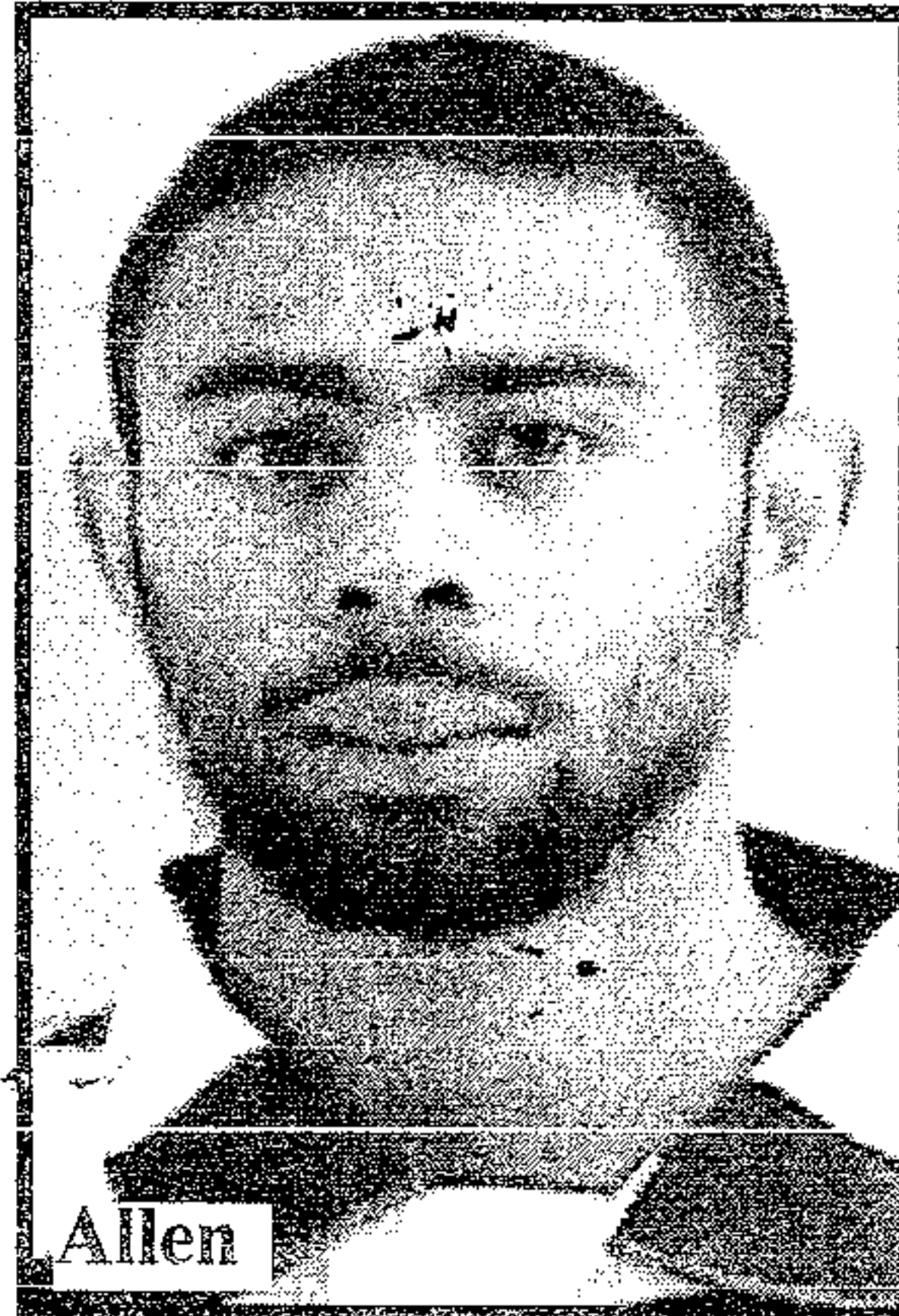
## Two charged in West End Storage theft One also charged in Ldn Qtrback Club theft over \$1000

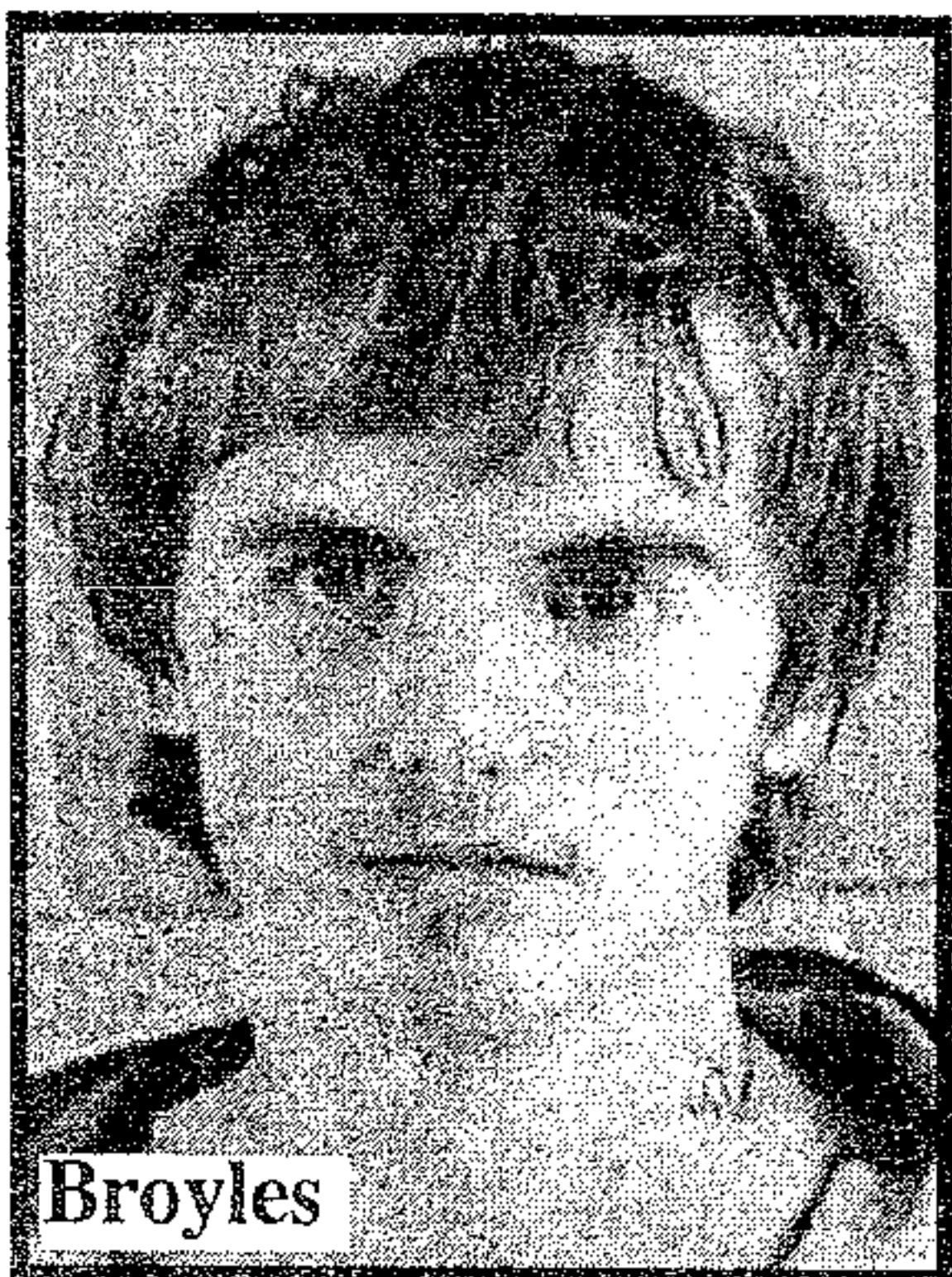

## Youth Hunt to Conclude 2012-13 Deer Season

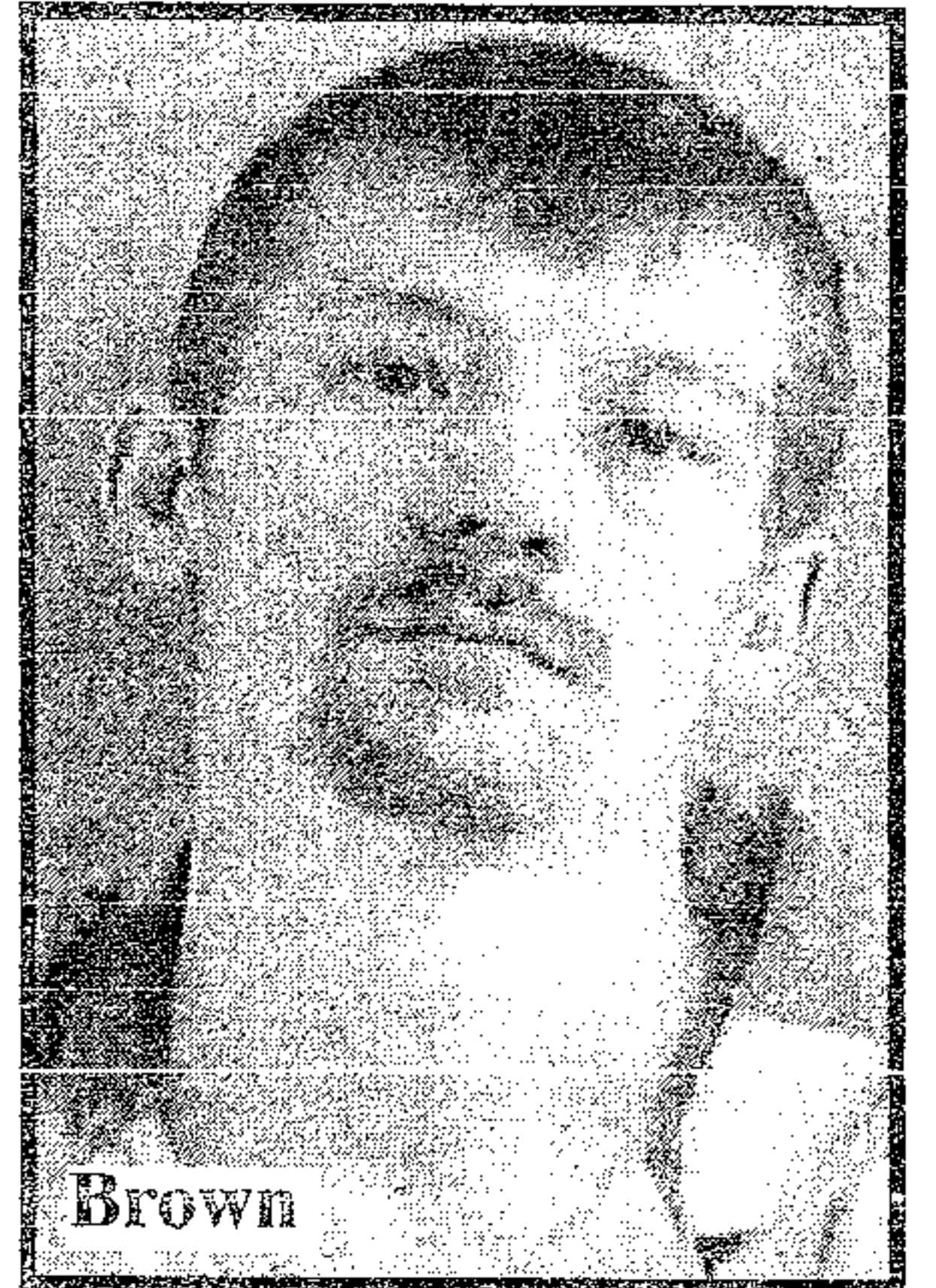
NASHVILLE - The second of the season's youth hunts, scheduled for Jan. 12-13, will conclude the 2012-13 deer hunting season in Tennessee.

A local man was jailed following an investigation into the theft of scrap metal he reportedly sold to a Lenoir City recycler.

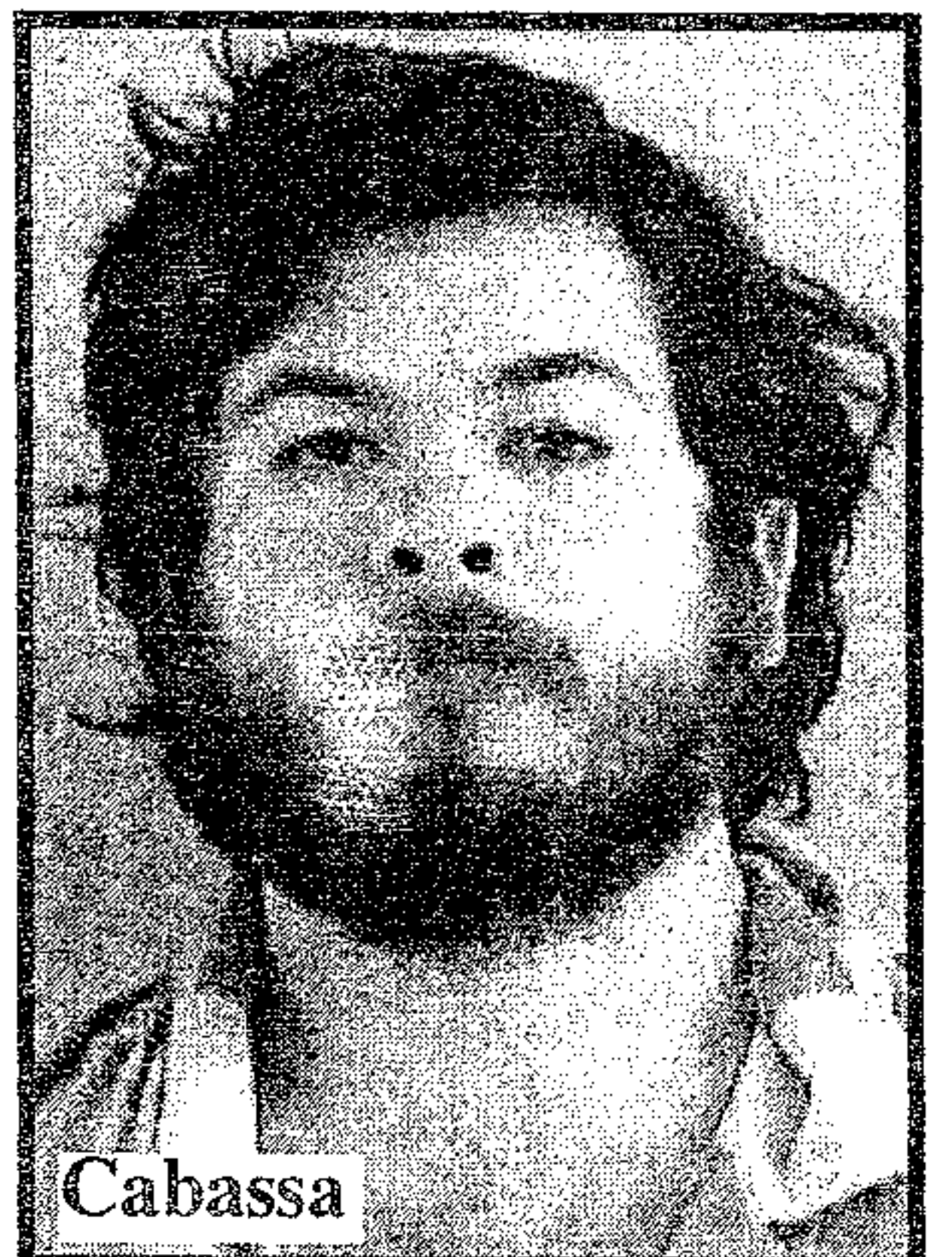

NASHVILLE -The Tennessee Highway Patrol arrested 96 individuals on suspicion of impaired driving in counties

participating in the "No Refusal" enforcement effort over the New Year's holiday period. The holiday period ran from

6 p.m., Friday, December 28 through midnight on Tuesday, January 1, 2013. Two suspects refused to take a breathalyzer

test, resulting in warrants for a blood sample under the "No Refusal" law.

### Thieves

2012, Johnathon Viars and Joshua Eric Allen entered the West End Storage Business on Ward Avenue in Loudon. Viars and Allen entered the business through a rear window without the owners permission or consent for the purpose of committing theft.

While inside the building, Viars and Allen took approximately \$125 in cash and electronics from a filing cabinet behind the counter. The money was taken with the intent to deprive the owner of its value.

During an interview, Viars admitted he took the money.

Johnathon Viars, 18, of Pine Top Street, Loudon was charged with theft under \$500 and burglary. Officer Brandon Nix, LPD made the arrest.

In another warrant, on September 10 2012, the Loudon Quarterback Club was operating a haunted house fundraiser and the victim was operating the sound system. The victim had over \$1000 worth of audio equipment left in the building.

During the night of September 10th, Joshua Eric Allen entered the building without permission. Allen took the entire sound system, which consisted of over 20 pieces of equipment.

On December 10th, Detective Jenkins interviewed Allen in reference to the theft and he gave a statement indicating he was responsible for the theft and led the investigator to where the equipment was hidden. Most of the equipment was recov-

ered, but was destroyed due to it being left out in the weather.

Joshua Eric Allen, 21, of Lake Drive, Loudon was charged with theft over \$1000, theft under \$500, burglary x2 and failure to appear.

### Results

Lows law enforcement officials to seek search warrants for blood samples in cases involving suspected impaired drivers. The goal is to deter impaired driving and reduce fatal crashes on Tennessee roadways.

Sixteen counties, two from each of the eight THP Districts, participated in this special DUI enforcement, including Knox and Sevier (Knoxville District); Hamilton and Marion (Chattanooga District); Robertson and Wilson (Nashville District); Crockett and Tipton (Memphis District); Carter and Greene (Fall Branch District); Cumberland and Overton (Cookeville District); Bedford and Maury (Lawrenceburg District); and Chester and Carroll (Jackson Dis-

trict). Preliminary reports indicate that three people were killed in three separate crashes in participating "No Refusal" areas, specifically Hamilton, Knox and Wilson counties. None of those crashes were alcohol-related.

Overall, seven people were killed in five total crashes during the New Year's Eve period, compared to five vehicular fatalities during last year's period. Two of the vehicle occupants were not wearing seat belts. Additionally, two people killed were pedestrians.
