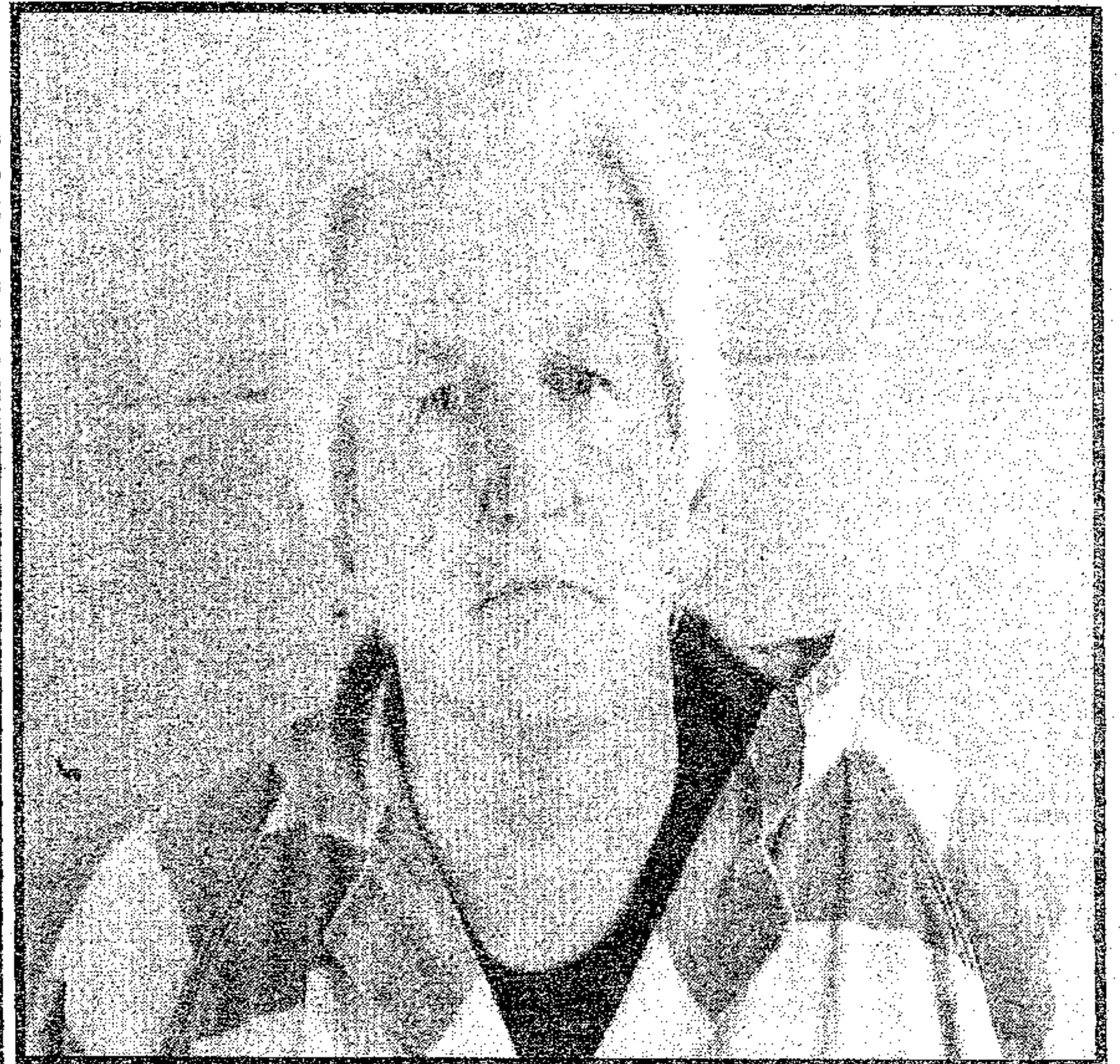
Stolen trailer found with DUI and more suspect and tools

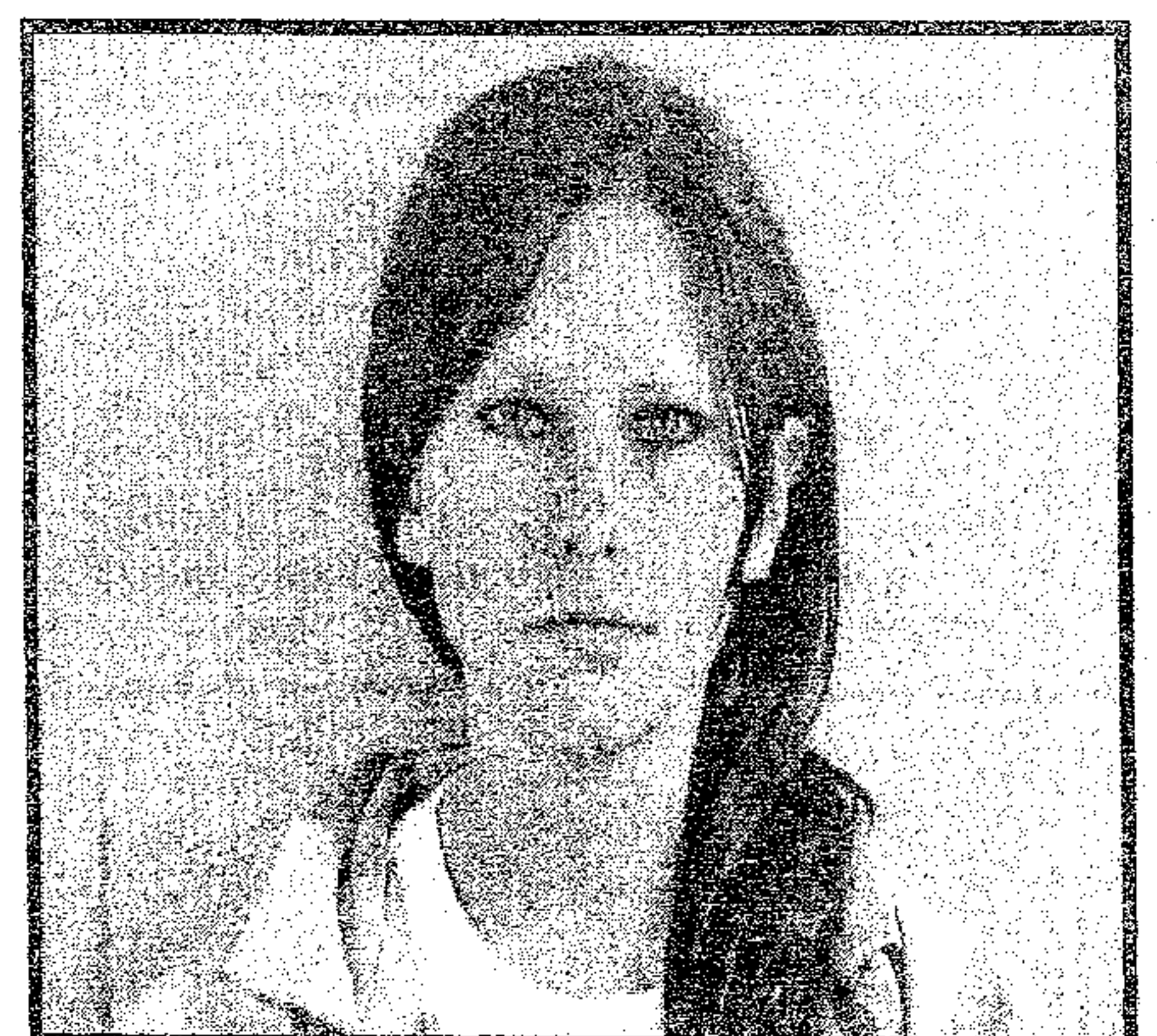

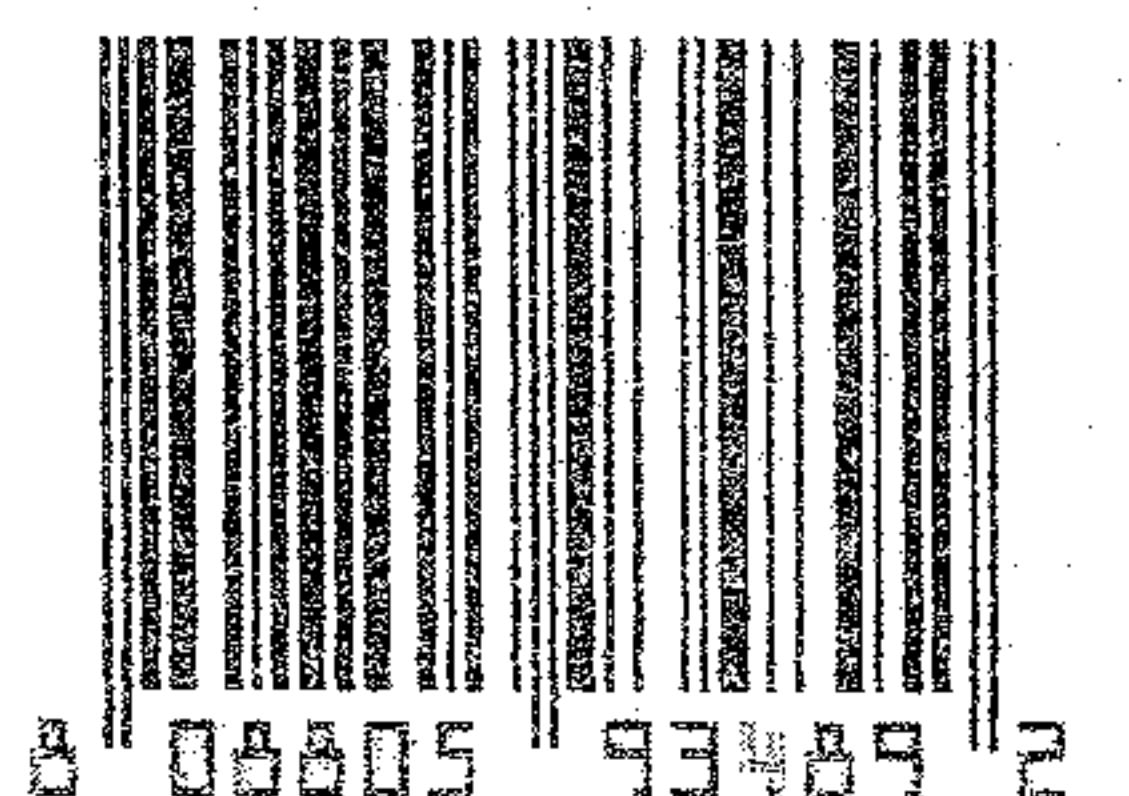



Deputy Burley asked if there was any weapons in the vehicle Miranda and the passenger Andrew Ward both stated no.

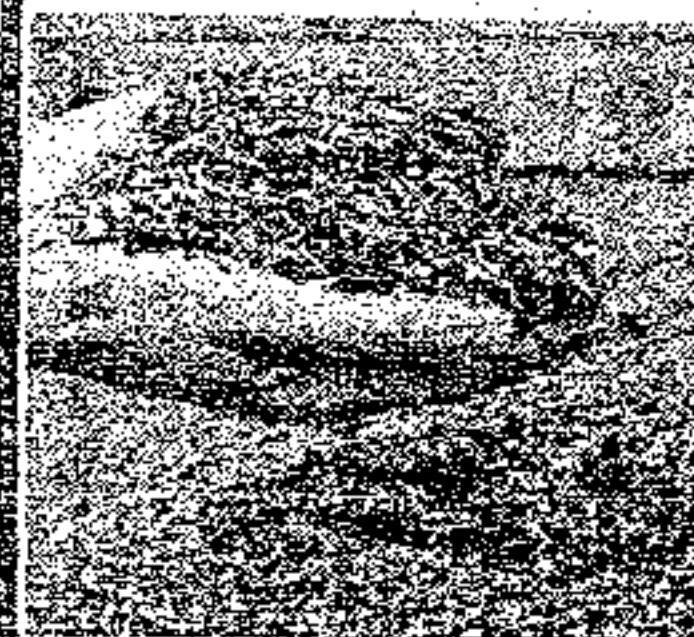
Miranda exited the vehicle
