### An Invitation to Change

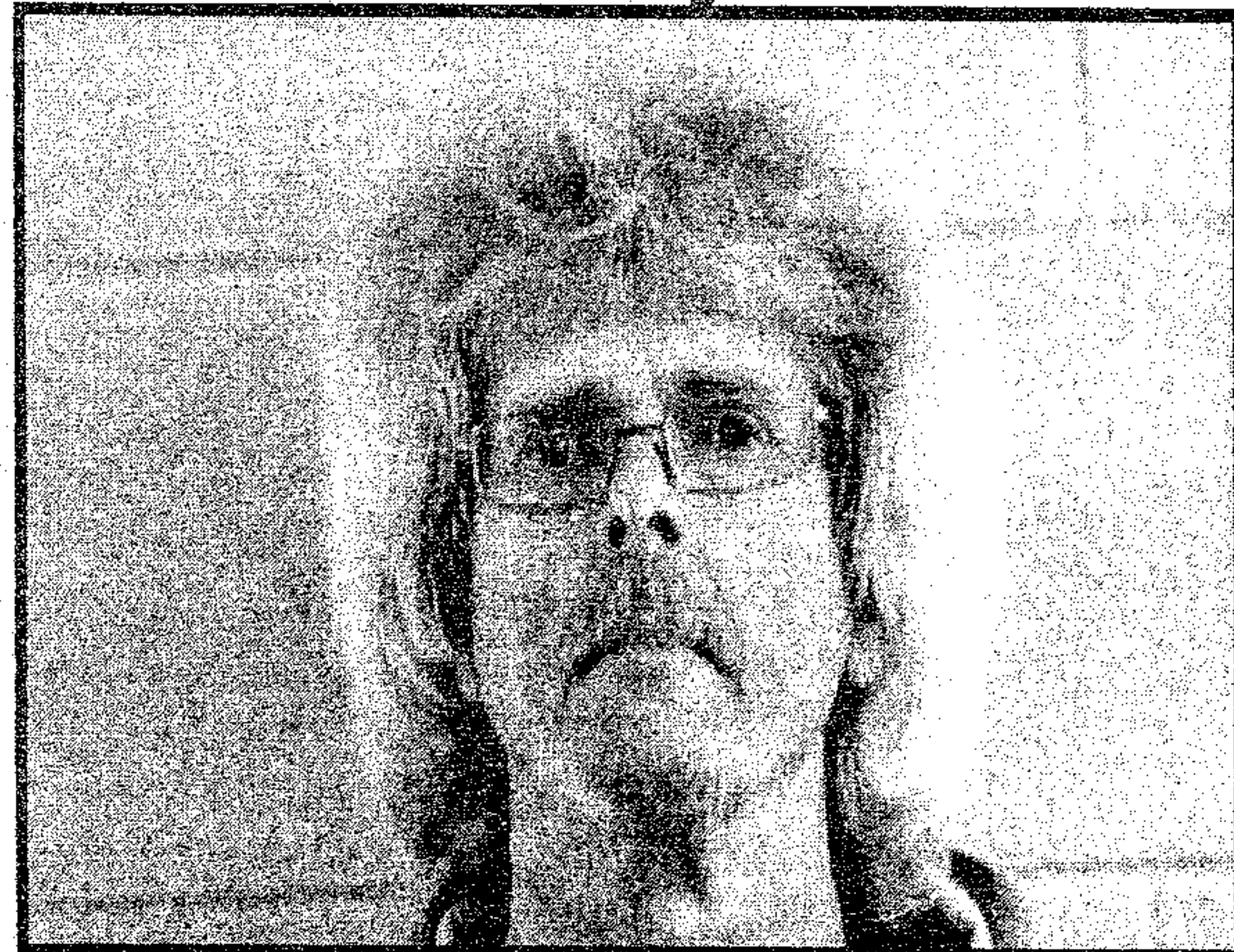

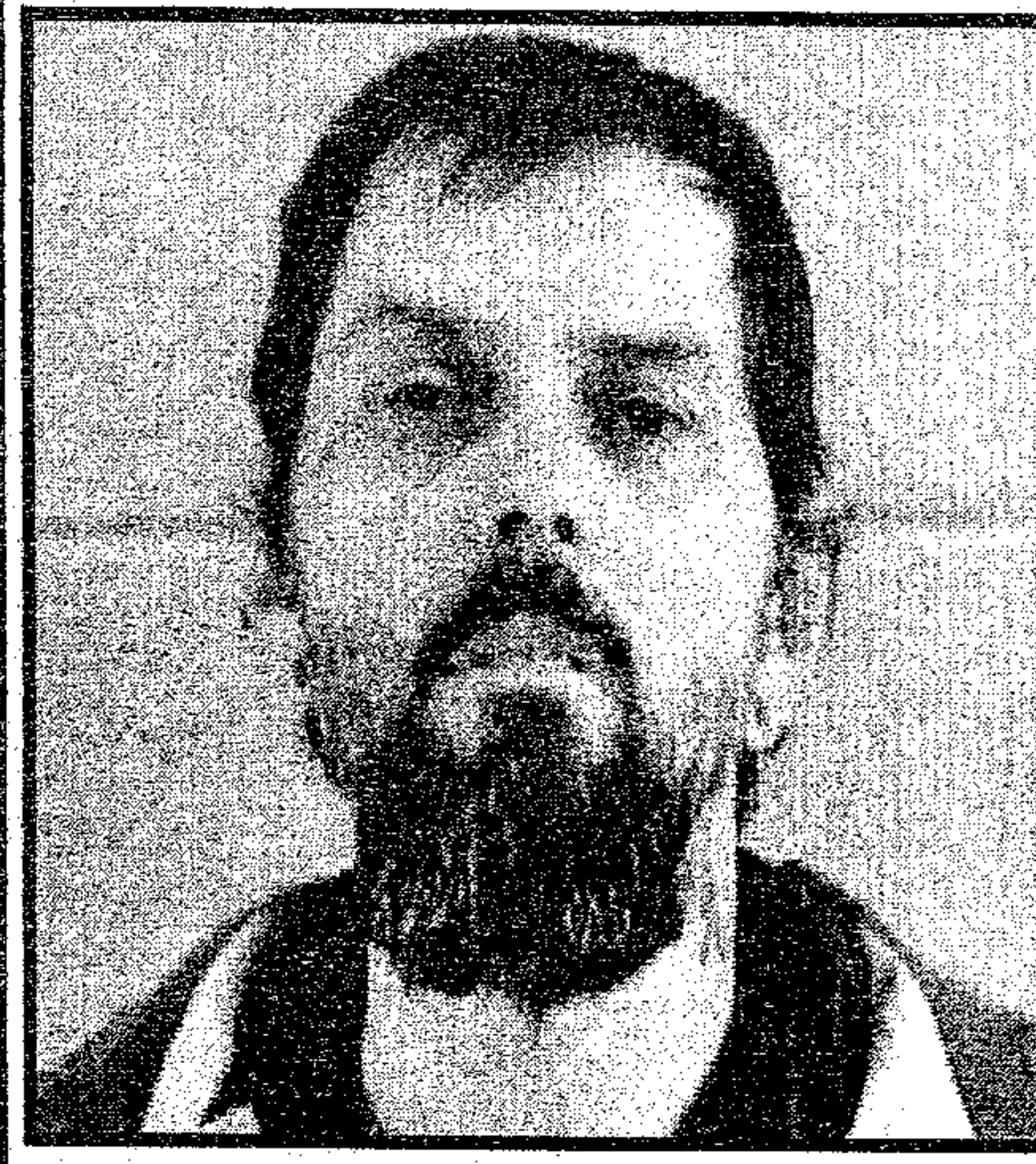

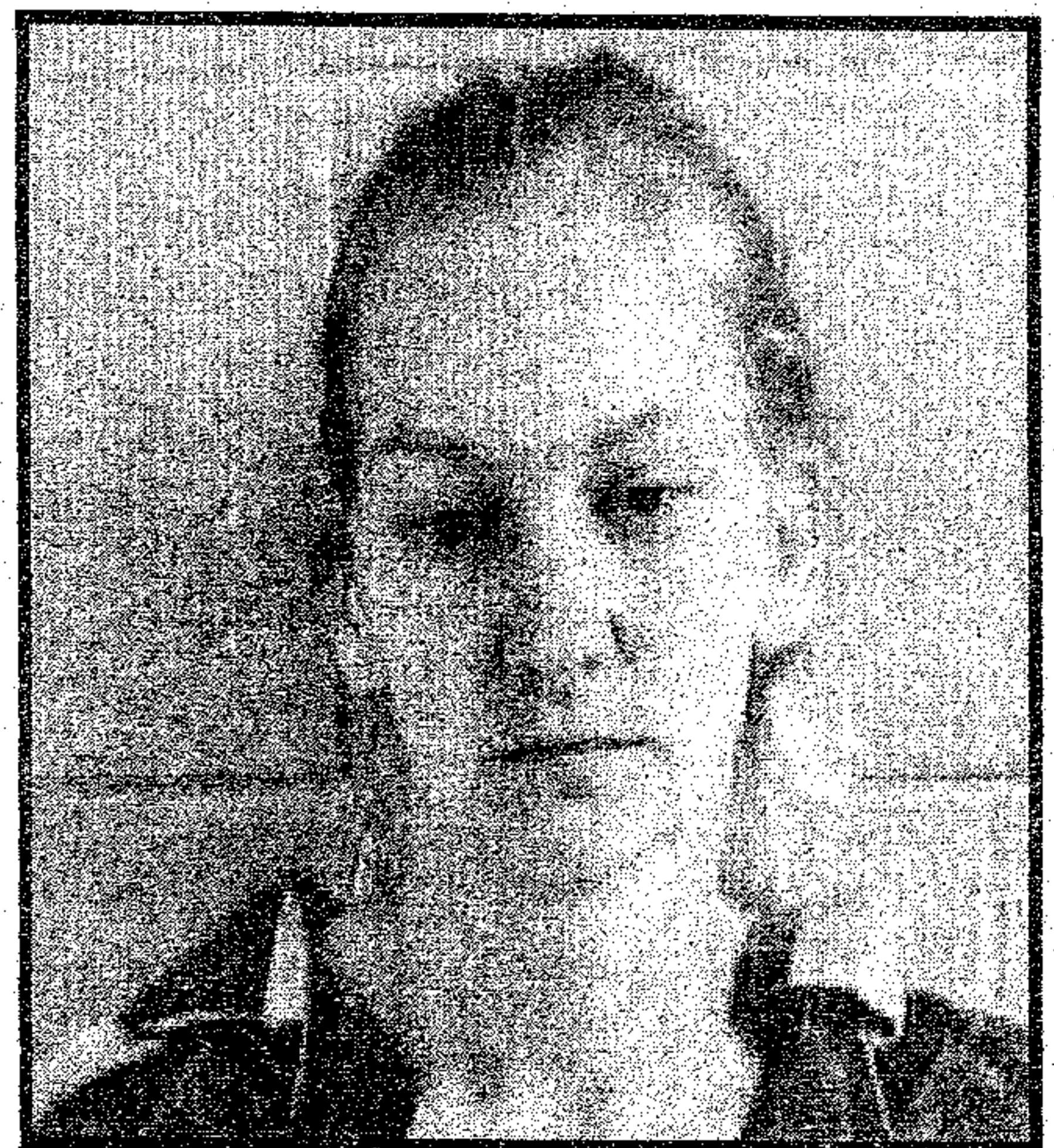

James Nevius was picked up at Knoxville Jail and transported to the Loudon Jail by Deputy Kevin Kirkland LCSO.

with Angie and me. My friend made it but his girlfriend wasn't feeling well and had some family run her to the doctor to see what was causing her symptoms. Within 24 hours my friend called me to say that his girlfriend was diagnosed with the possibilities of cancer that will require an aggressive approach to contain. The lives of my friend and his girlfriend were immediately changed and the dangers of cancer are now more than something that happens to "someone else". Their names are not as important as their need for Christians to pray.
