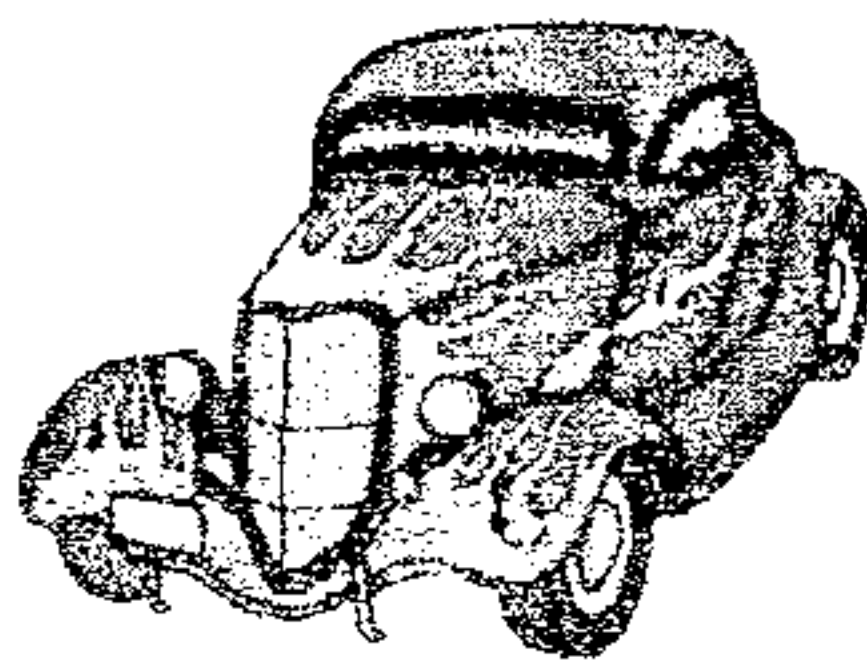

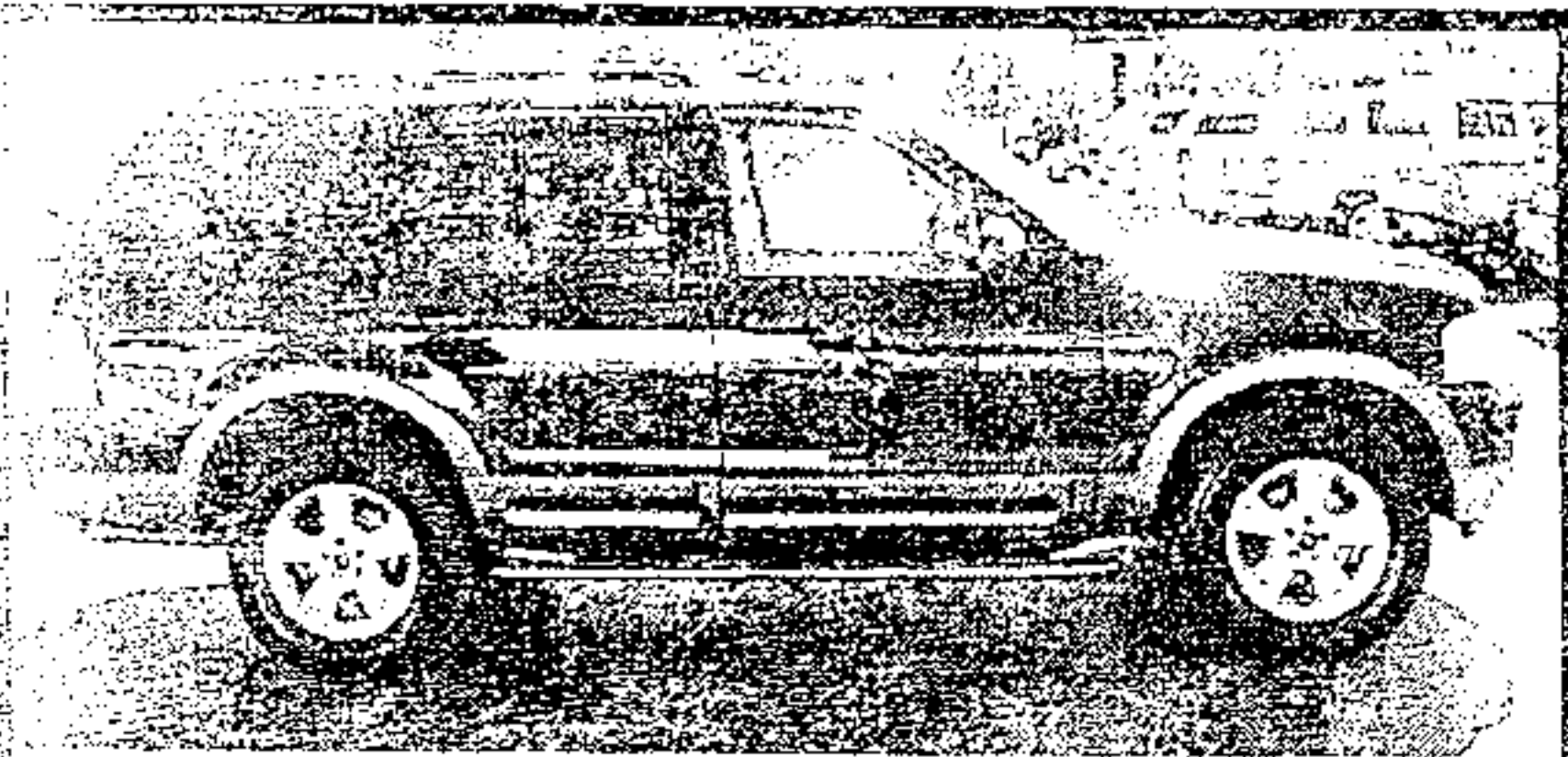

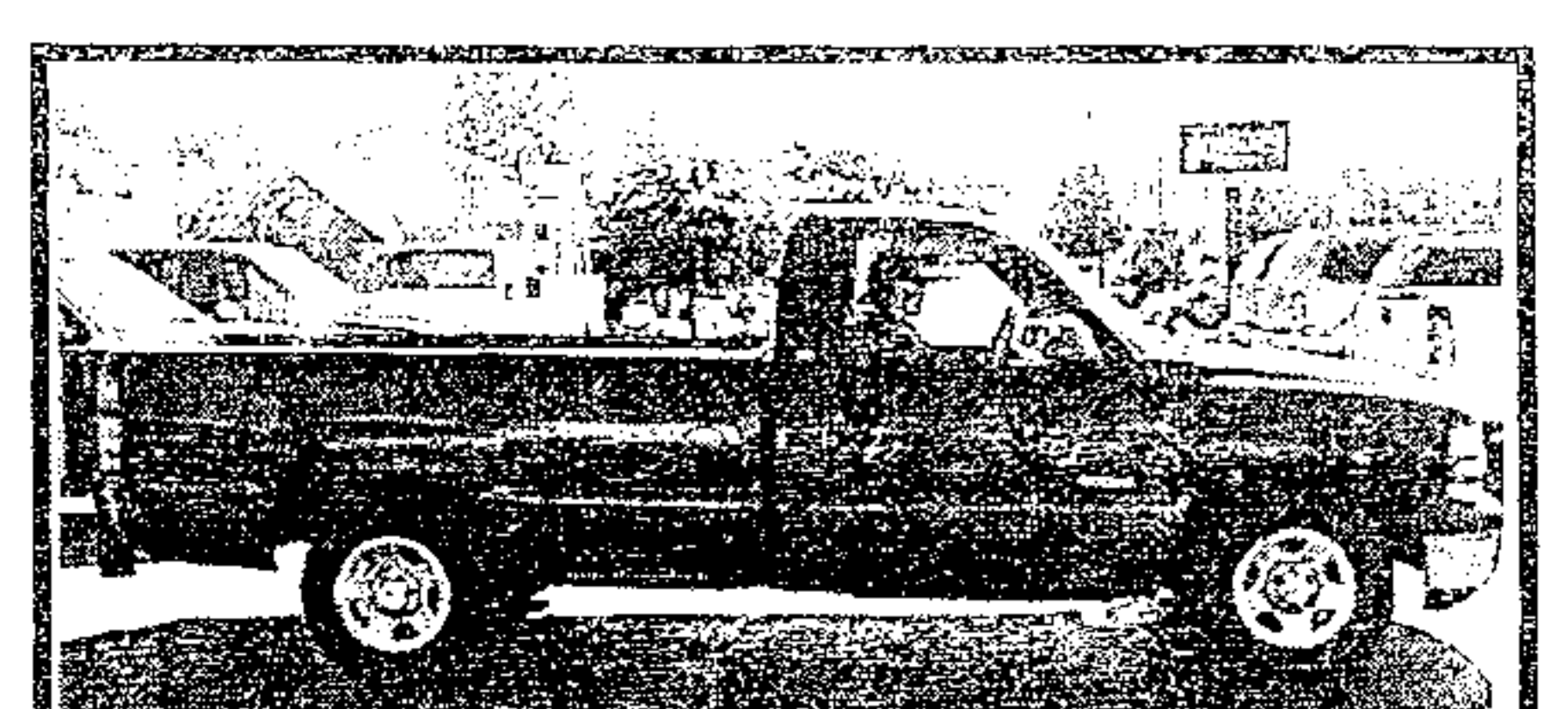

Mathew 6:25-34 (NKJV) (25) Therefore I say to you, don't worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing? (26) Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? (27) Which of you by worrying can add one cubit to his stature? (28) So why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin; (29) and yet I say to you that even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. (30) Now if God so clothes

the grass of the field, which today is, and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will He not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? (31) Therefore do not worry, saying, "What shall we eat? Or what shall we drink? Or what shall we wear?" (32) For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. (33) But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. (34) Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.

The key to tapping into God's promise within this passage is found in verse #33. We cannot seek the kingdom of God and His righteousness while also seeking that of our own, we must choose one or the other. Just one verse prior to this passage, Jesus explains that we cannot serve both God and

ourselves; Mathew 6:24 (NKJV) No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon.

I thank God for displaying His mercy on me when I was so far from Him. I thank Him for cleaning me up and giving me yet another chance. I thank Him for providing more than just my needs but for placing Angie and me in such an awesome place to serve and giving us so much more than we deserve.

If you are lost or just struggling today, let me encourage you to place your trust, your faith and your life in Jesus Christ. He is the provider of all things holy and all things great! He loves you and He desires to know you but the decision is yours to make. As for me and my house, we will choose to serve the Lord!

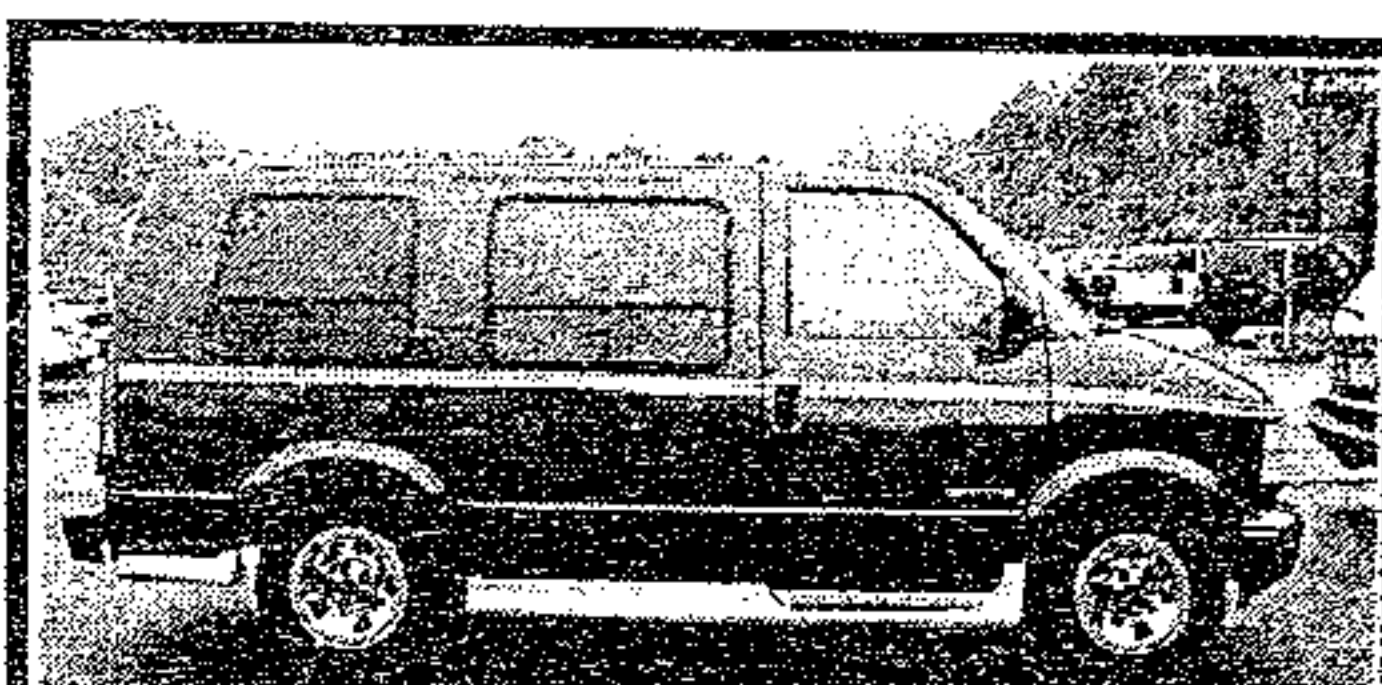

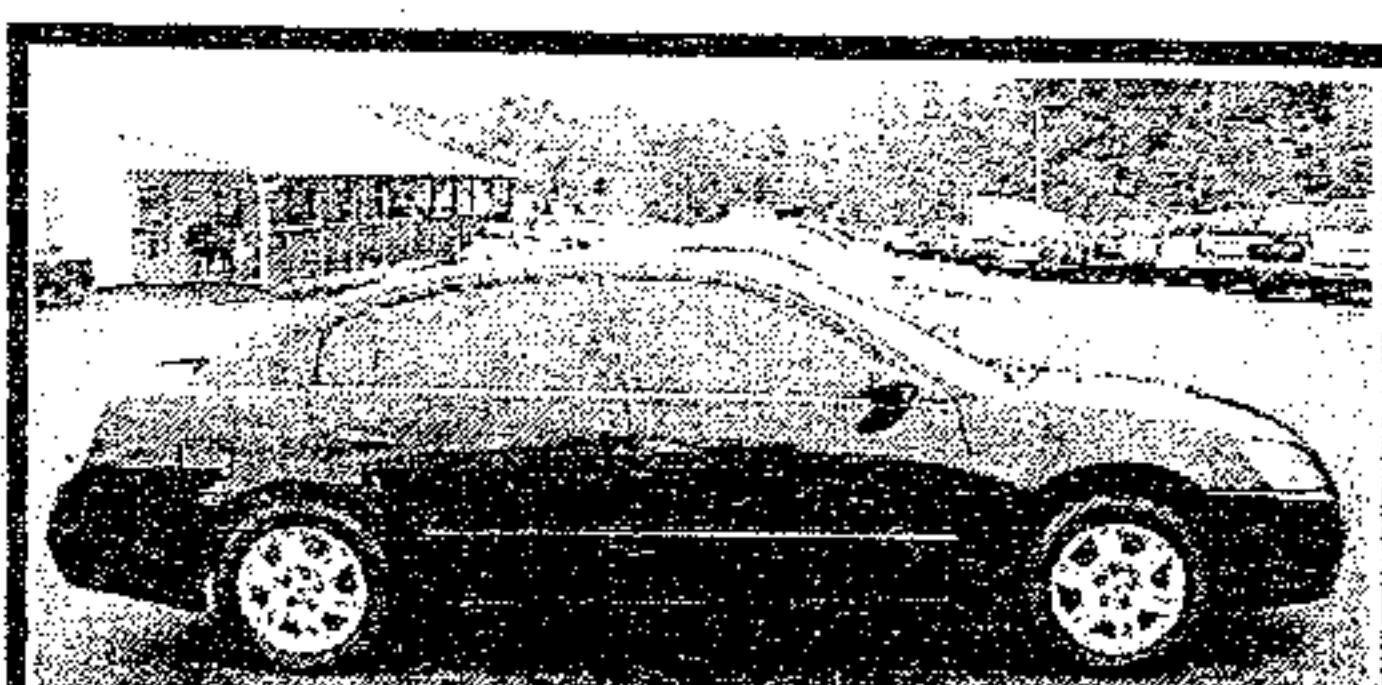
