2nd DUI

ing in sexually explicit activities with a child, were first recorded by the National Center for Missing and Exploited

Children (NCMEC) in April of 2013, and are still being circulated in numerous child pornography forums across the internet. The images provide several clues which may assist with the identification of the subject. The images depict a residence with a distinct plaid chair.

Male pattern baldness is apparent on the subject, who also wore a ring on his right ring finger. Based on audio from the video, the subject may have referred to himself as "Jimmy," and spoke with a southern accent. There are no details linking the subject to a particular state. The whereabouts of John Doe 27 are unknown. The public is reminded that no charges have been filed in this case and the pictured individual is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty in a court of law. Anyone with information should contact their local FBI office, submit a tip online at <https://tips.fbi.gov/>, or call the FBI's toll-

free tip line at 1-800-CALL-FBI. This individual is being sought in conjunction with Operation Rescue Me, and the Endangered Child Alert Program (ECAP) initiatives, both of which represent strategic partnerships between the FBI and NCMEC. Operation Rescue Me focuses on utilizing clues obtained through in-depth image analysis to identify child victims depicted in child exploitation material. ECAP seeks national and international media exposure to identify unknown adults (referred to as John/Jane Doe) who appear in images associated with child pornography.
