The defendant was wres-

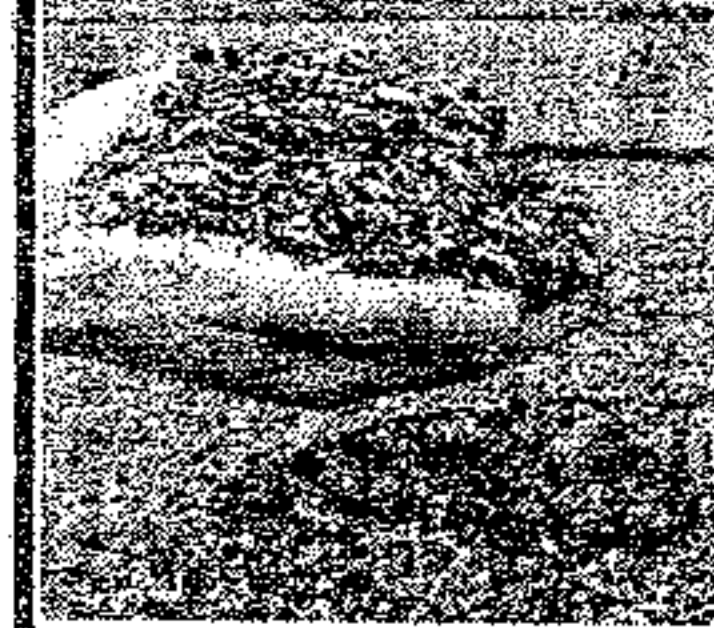
ting with the victim trying to stab her.

The County Clerk's Office came out and brought along some baked goodies to go along with their chili and it was a big hit for sure.

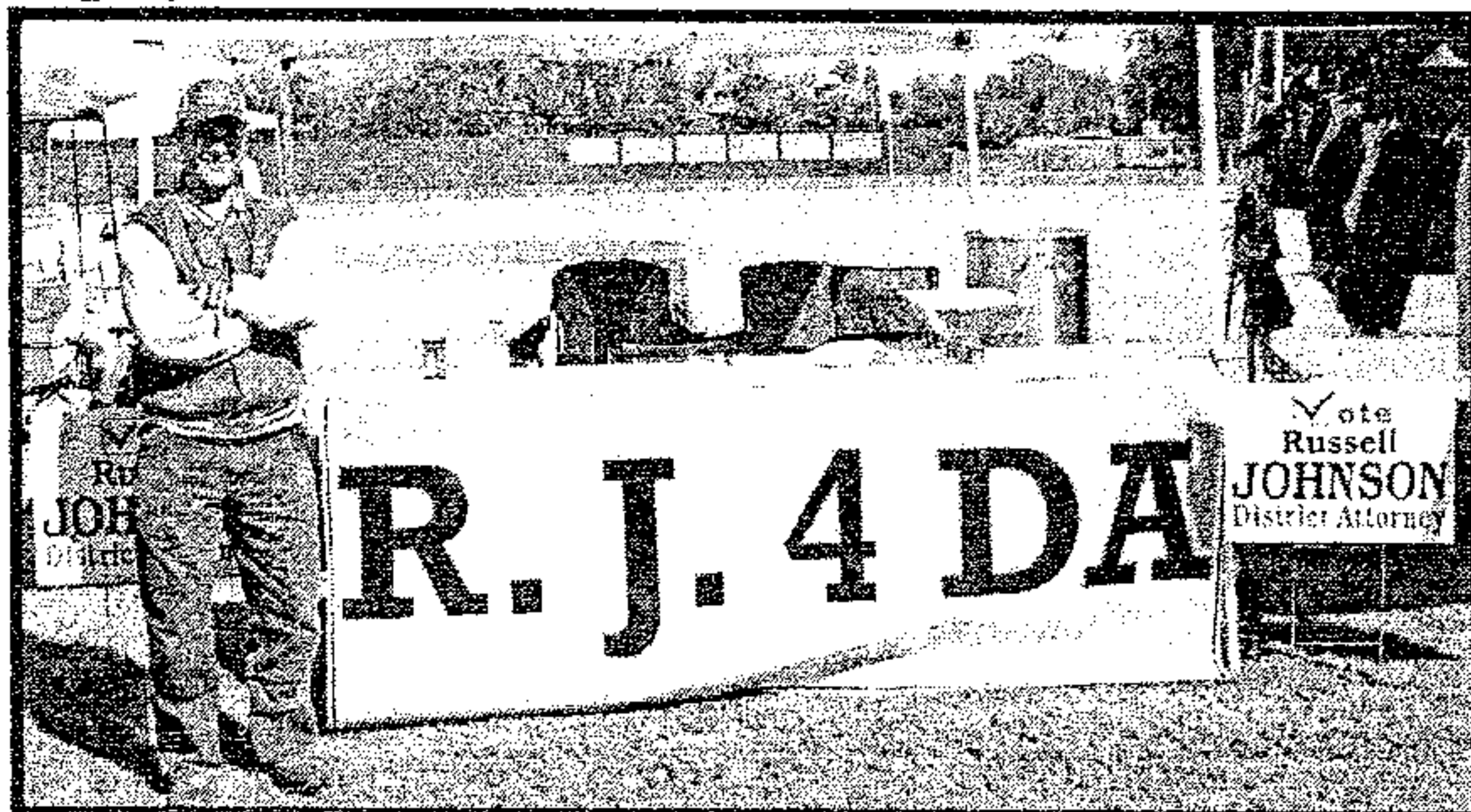

snow storm and then unloading our belongings once again. I was absolutely beat. We didn't have cable TV, satellite or even Netflix capabilities but I did see a DVD laying on the counter with a picture of Billy Graham on it that was given to us by a friend before leaving Tennessee.

I loaded the video into Blondie's laptop, connected the HDMI cord to my television and sat back in my chair with the intention of mindlessly watching a Christian broadcast before calling it a night. What happened next has constantly been on my mind for the last two days;

The film began by showing old footage of numerous Billy Graham crusades that took place in large venues like football stadiums. I saw thou-

sands and thousands of people gathered together to hear Reverend Billy Graham and I could see many of them coming forward to make decisions for Christ.

Being a new "missionary" in a new place and filled with the desire to make God's glory known to the people of Montana and at home, I was amazed by the large crowds and wanted to understand what Billy Graham was doing that drew so many people to one place. What was his secret? What strategy did he utilize to make such a tremendous impact on so many at one time?

I listened intently to the sound bites on the film to hear what he was saying and how he was engaging the crowds to see if there was some new (or old) strategy that I might be able to learn from and be more effective with

the mission that God has placed on Angie's and my heart!

The strategy used, the message proclaimed, the secret that Billy Graham had was actually no secret at all..... he was simply preaching the message of the cross!

Billy Graham was proclaiming that the only way to avoid an eternity in hell, the only way to obtain the forgiveness of sins, the only way to secure one's name in the Book of Life and inherit eternal life in heaven was by trusting and believing in the power of what Jesus did for each of us on the cross of Calvary!

If you had only three simple sentences in which to tell someone about the importance of salvation through faith in Jesus, what would you tell them? Here is my best shot at it:









