Hensley admit to having taken Percocet and Oxycodone and a marijuana pipe and cut straw with white residue was located in her purse during a consensual search. After being placed under arrest, it was discovered that Hensley had removed items from inside her pants, as well as from her bra which included Morphine tablets, Oxycodone and Marijuana. Hensley's mouth was checked prior to her being placed under arrest for the any possible narcotics hidden in her mouth.

Hensley's mouth was clear of any foreign matter prior to her arrest.

After being placed under arrest Deputy Huskins advised Deputy Burley that he needed to recheck Hensley's mouth where your Deputy observed a large quantity of a green leafy substance, as well as white residue which was not present prior to her arrest in Hensley's mouth. Hensley admit to have swallowed oxycodone, marijuana and percocet. Hensley did in fact swallow these items in an attempt to destroy evidence of the crime of possession of

Schedule VI and Possession of Schedule II. Hensley also did disregard a trace amount of green leafy substance believed to be marijuana on the deputies backseat which Hensley admit that she discarded. Hensley's estimates that there was appx. 3 grams of Marijuana that she consumed. Hensley further discarded multiple oxycodone pills as well as Morphine pills in the Deputy backseat. Deputy Burley did check his backseat prior to shift as well as Hensley was the only other person with access to that backseat.

After being searched by Dep. Lisa Rolen more oxycodone pills were located on Hensley. A total of 2 Morphine tables, 48 oxycodone tablets, trace amounts of marijuana, 1 glass pipe and 1 cut straw with white residue were located. Hensley did in fact intend to deliver the prescription medication to a third party later that evening. Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO made the arrest.
