well as Lambert showed Deputy Burley multiple pairs of work gloves still with the tags on them. At this point Deputy Burley did believe that these items were stolen, as Lambert did admit that he is a convicted felon for theft over \$1,000.

Deputy Burley had Lambert exit the vehicle, during which time Deputy Burley also spoke to Deputy Jamie Ketner LCSO who advised that the truck driver produced three pairs of work gloves consistent with those found in the property of Lam-

bert. It was at this point that Deputy Jamie Ketner LCSO did observe a glass pipe commonly used for smoking crack cocaine in the front floorboard.

Lambert was placed under arrest for possession of drug paraphernalia as well as open container. After Lambert consented to a search of vehicle, a marijuana pipe, 2 push rods, and billow pads were also located. Lambert advised that he is the only person with access to this vehicle as well as he uses this vehicle to purchase his crack cocaine on a regular basis. The last time that Lambert admits

he purchased crack cocaine in that vehicle was 1800 hours on 12/16/2013. Lambert did also admit that he was selling the above listed items in order to purchase crack cocaine after the Deputy stopped him.

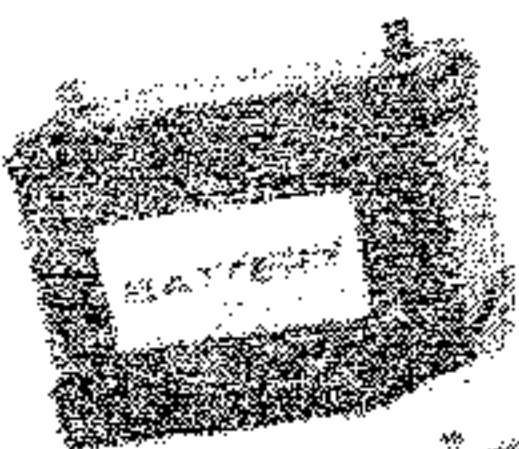
A search incident to arrest at the Loudon County Jail revealed that Lambert did have in his shoe, one pink pipe, consistent with a crack cocaine

pipe with billow inside of it. Lambert did admit that he uses the pipe located in his shoe to smoke crack cocaine.

Lambert was asked prior to enter the Loudon County Jail if he had anything illegal on or in him. Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO made the arrest.
