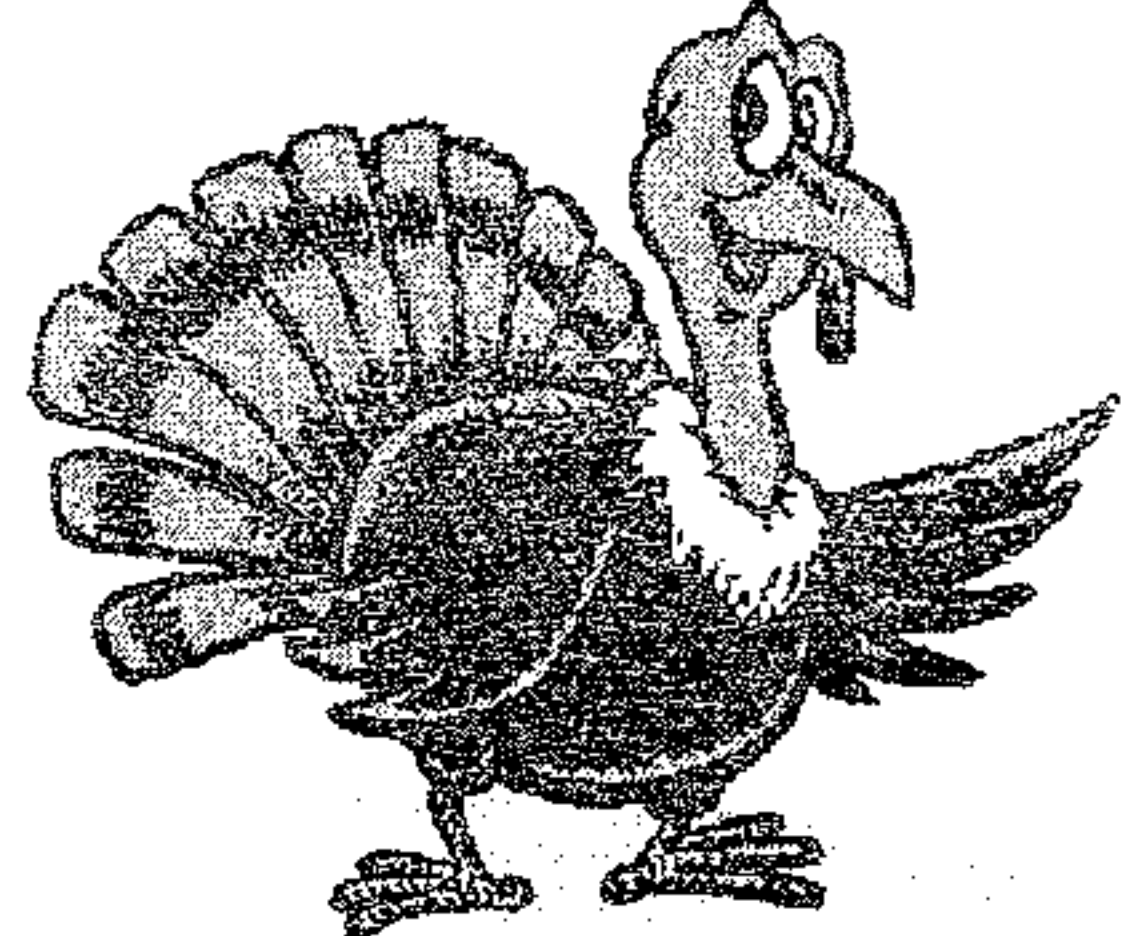
glass pipe were found Mr. Frutos was placed under arrest. Deputy Kenneth Palmer LCSO made the arrest.
