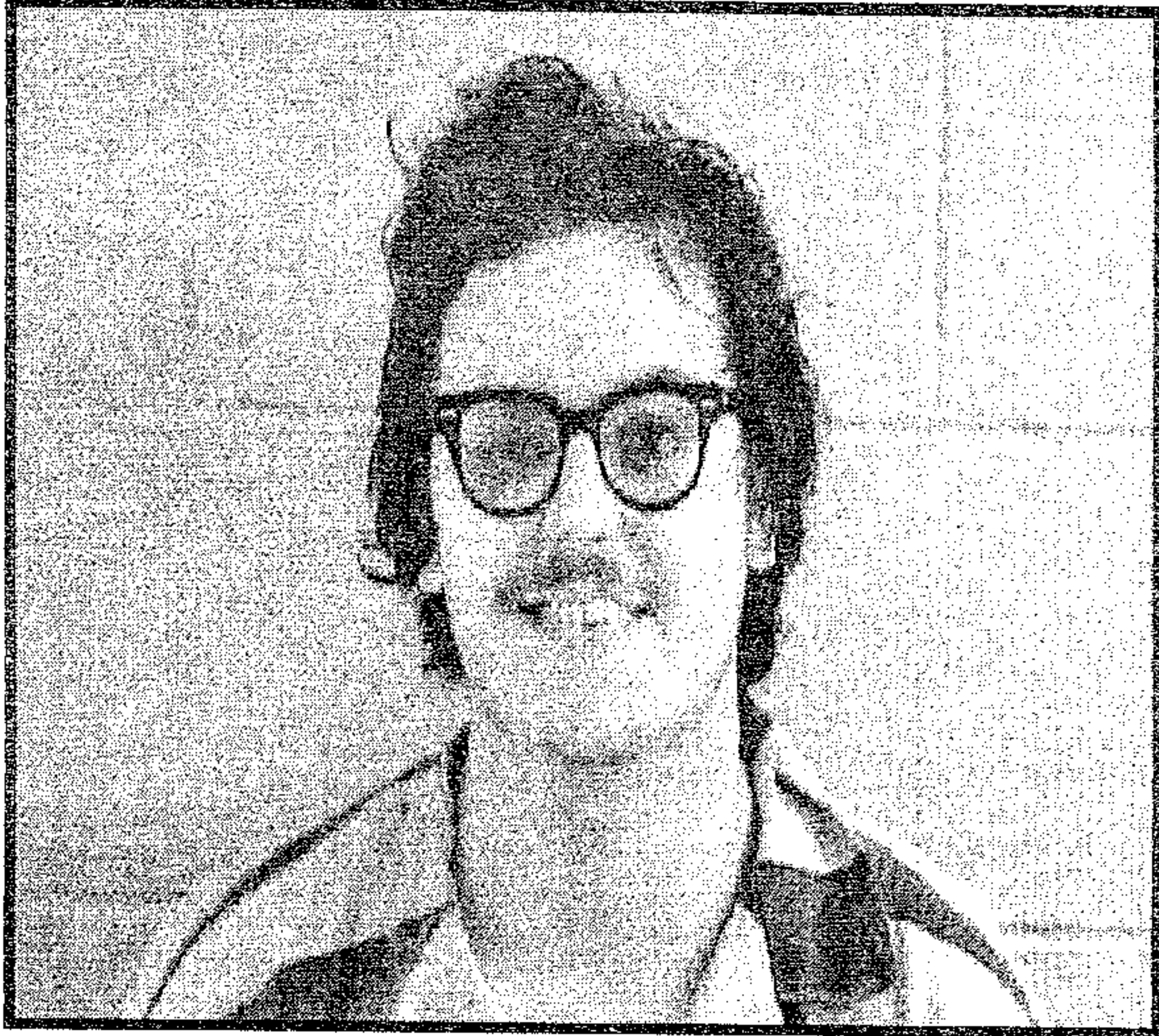

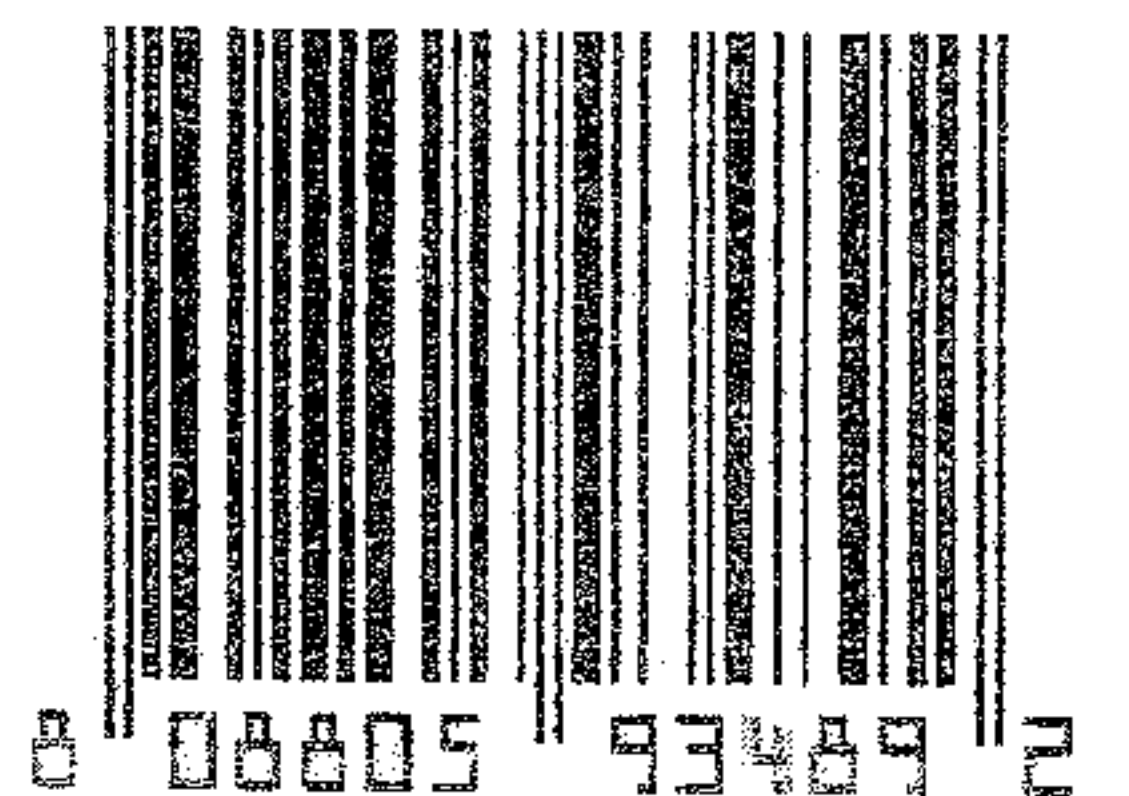

Jacob was placed under arrest. Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO made the arrest.

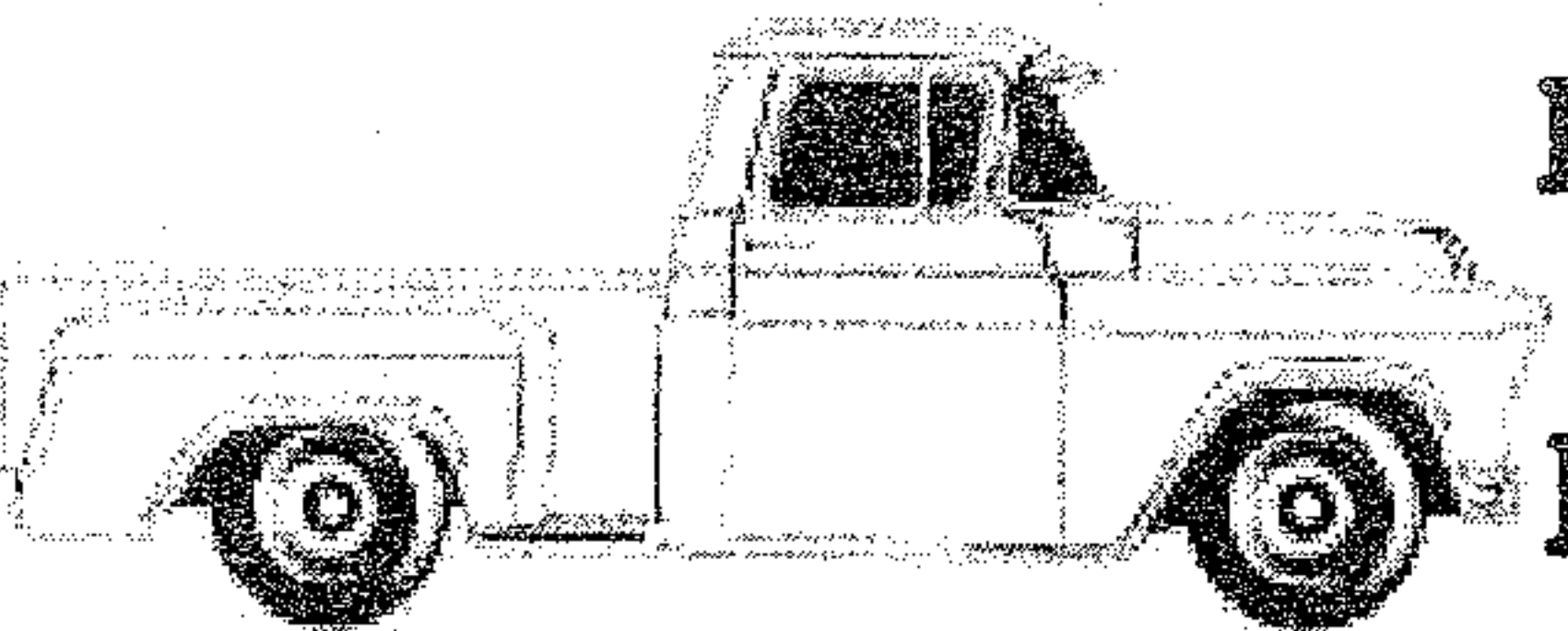
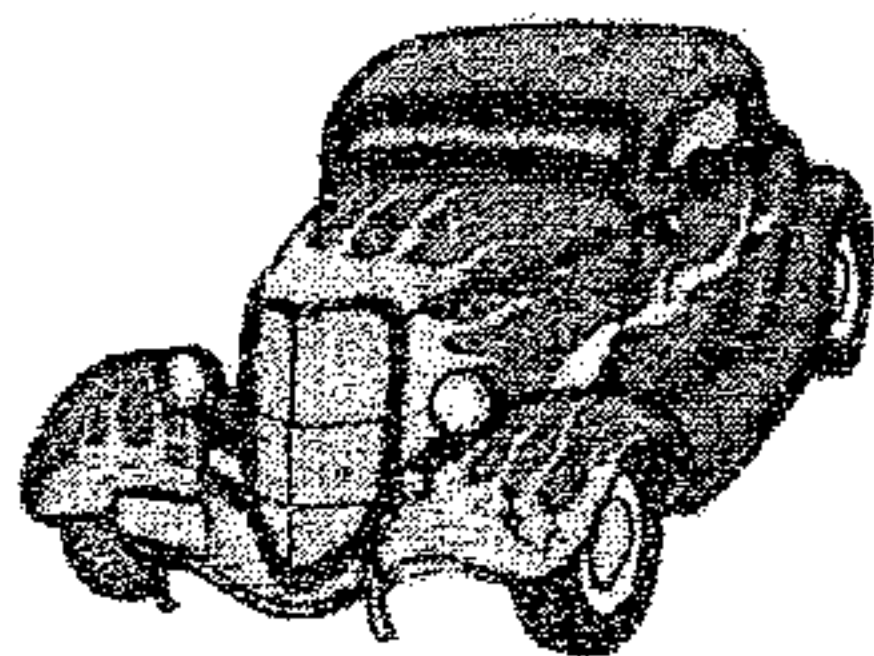

 twelve baskets of fragments that remained. (21) Now those who had eaten were about five thousand men, be-

sides women and children.  
 Did you catch it? Did you notice what Jesus did? HE HAD COMPASSION FOR THEM!!! He not only

had compassion on the poor, hungry followers, He provided for them. He met their needs. Jesus didn't ask His disciples to point them to the Salvation Army,

He didn't ask them to call the deacon of the church, He said, "You give them something to eat!" While this was a teaching moment for the disciples and Jesus knew that they had no means to provide to the multitudes, Jesus also knows what means are available to you and me. He knows what we have because He gave it to us. Are you willing this Christmas season to sacrifice a little of what you have to help another?
