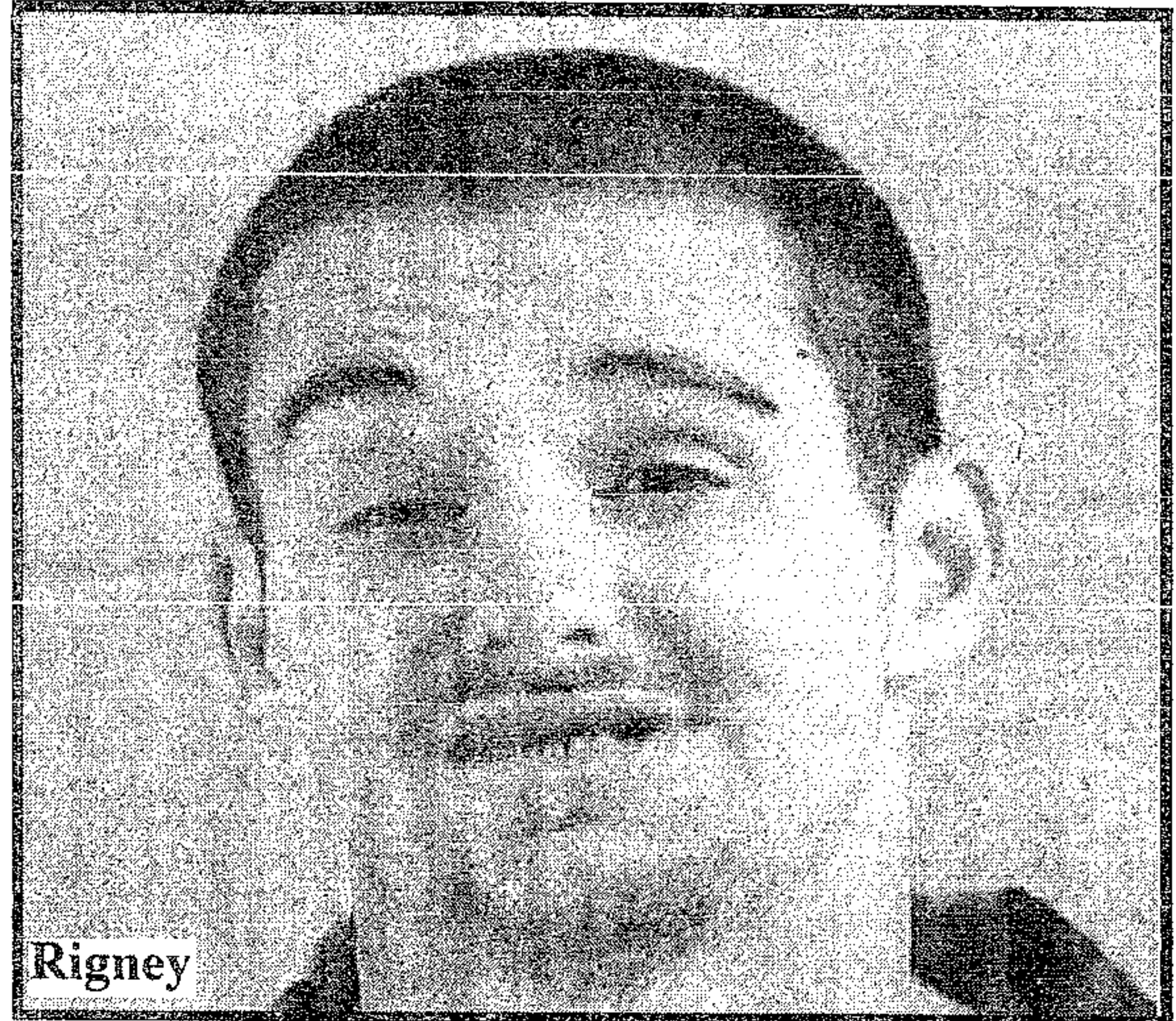

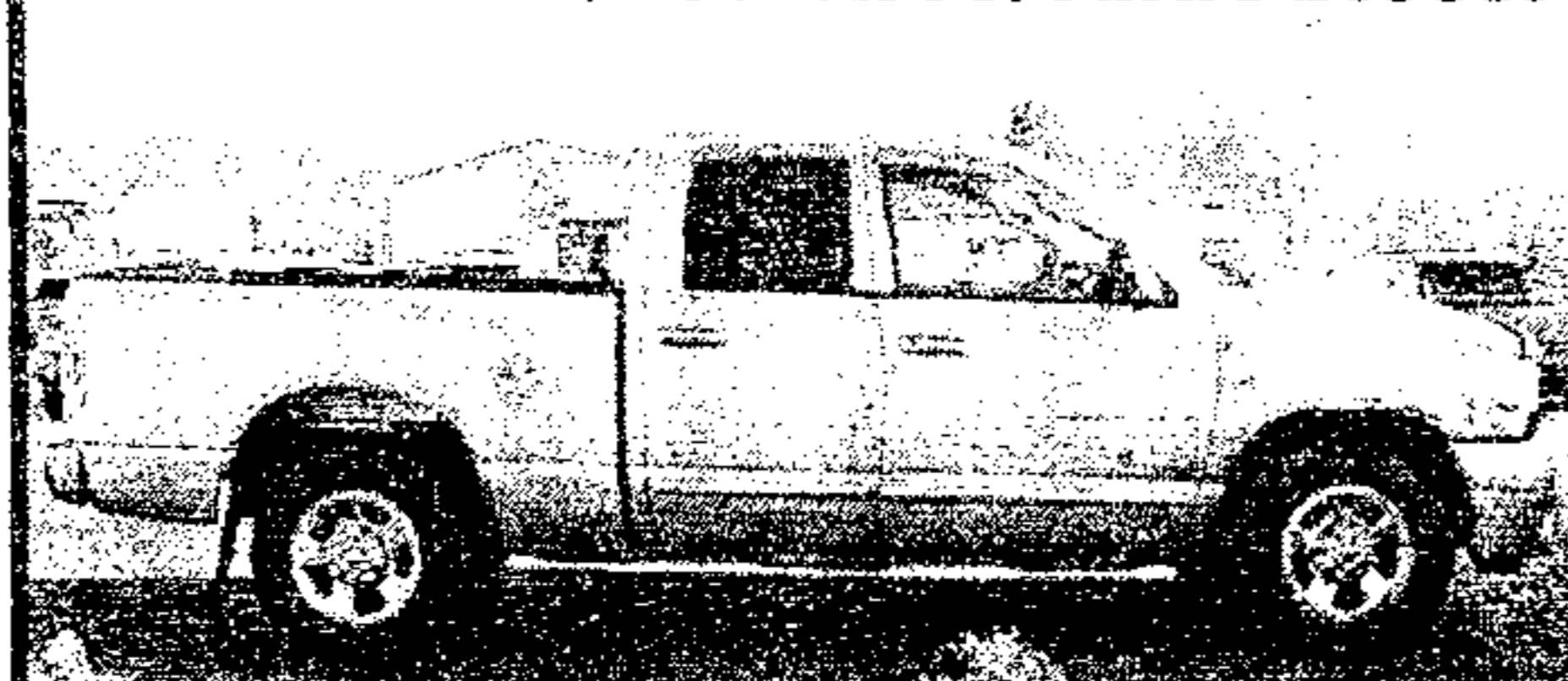

Jarrard

Officer Don Lorenz, LCPD was dispatched to C Street in regards to an assault. When the officer arrived, he spoke with the victim who reported Clayton Jarrard is her boyfriend and he had been drinking a lot because it was the anniversary of his mother's death.

According to warrants filed by the officer, the victim reported Jarrard became upset and punched a hole in her bathroom wall and was kicking the walls. The victim stated Jarrard also broke several glass picture frames.

The woman reported the other victim, who also lives at the residence, was able to get

Jarrard to go outside to calm down and when Jarrard was outside, he locked the front door.

Jarrard started to hit the front door and cracked the glass.

The male victim reported he opened the door because he thought Jarrard was going to shatter the glass. When the male opened the door, he reported Jarrard rushed in and started hitting him in the face and was pulling his hair.

The male victim reported he was struck in the right cheek and lip. The officer noticed some redness on the male victim.

The male victim reported the female victim tried to separate

Jarrard and himself and Jarrard struck her near the right eye. The officer observed a laceration to the female victim's eye and was bleeding.

The officer was notified by dispatch there is an active order of protection with the female being the petitioner and Jarrard being the respondent. The female victim reported Jarrard had been living with her since December 2012.

A local woman was jailed after she, another woman, and a juvenile reportedly worked together to allegedly assault another female who was accused of

stealing a wallet.

According to the report, the victim advised she and her fiancée went to get some children's clothes at a Town Creek Circle residence. The victim stated she started to leave and Virginia Spencer grabbed her arm, telling her she wasn't leaving until Spencer's wallet was found.

The victim stated she stripped down and told Ms. Spencer she didn't have her wallet. She then advised Ms. Spencer and another female, Dwanna Littleton, attacked her by hitting her and knocking her to the ground.

The victim stated both women were punching and kicking her and she told them both to please stop, because she was pregnant.

The victim further stated Ms. Spencer's son who is a juvenile, held her down while both of the females assaulted her.

The victim's fiancée came from the residence and stopped the fight. The victim and her fiancée got into their vehicle and drove

to CVS and called 911. The victim stated she had not been to see a doctor at the time of the warrant.

There were visible marks and bruising to the victim's mouth and face at the time of the warrant. Reports were taken by LCSO.
