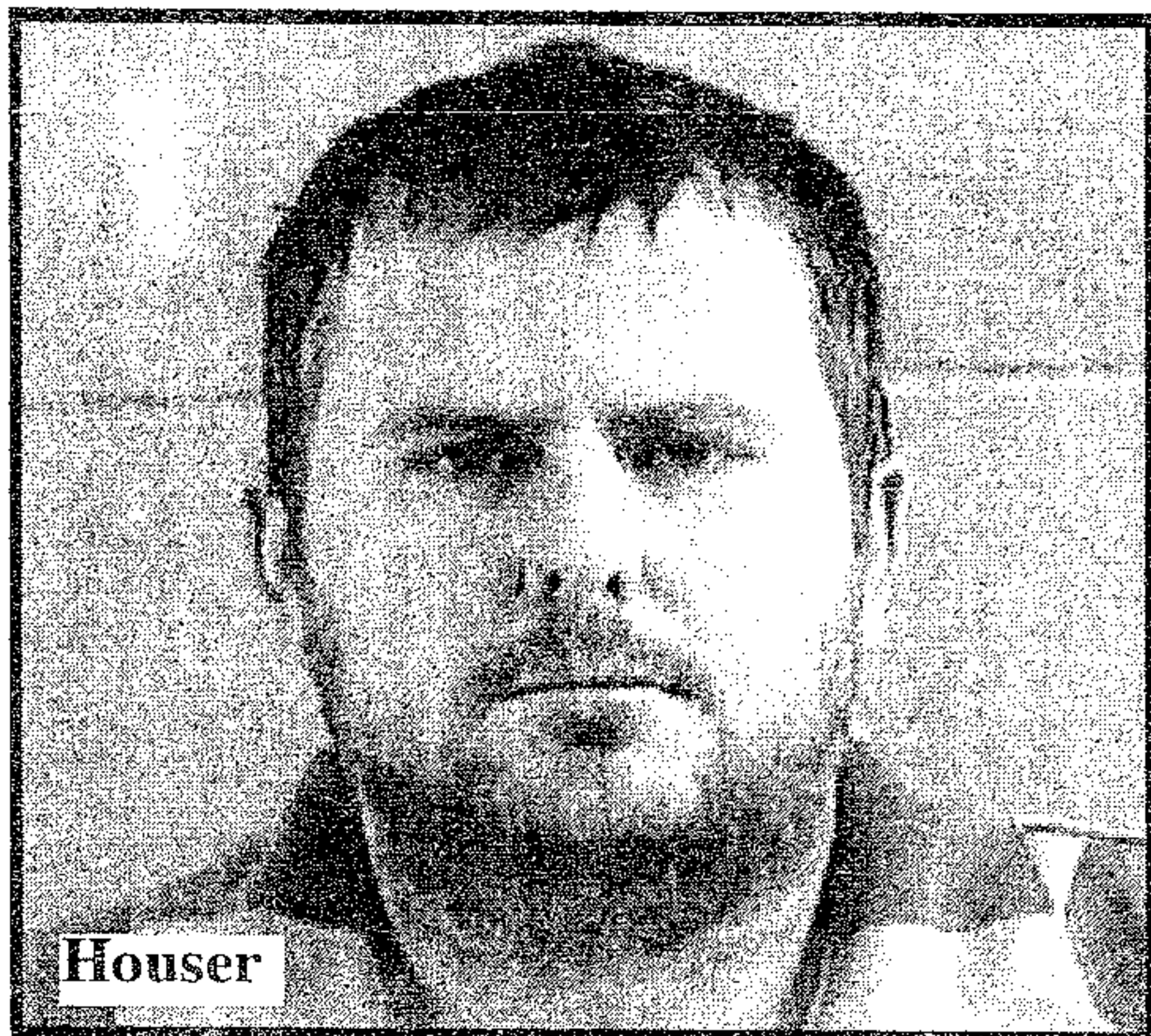

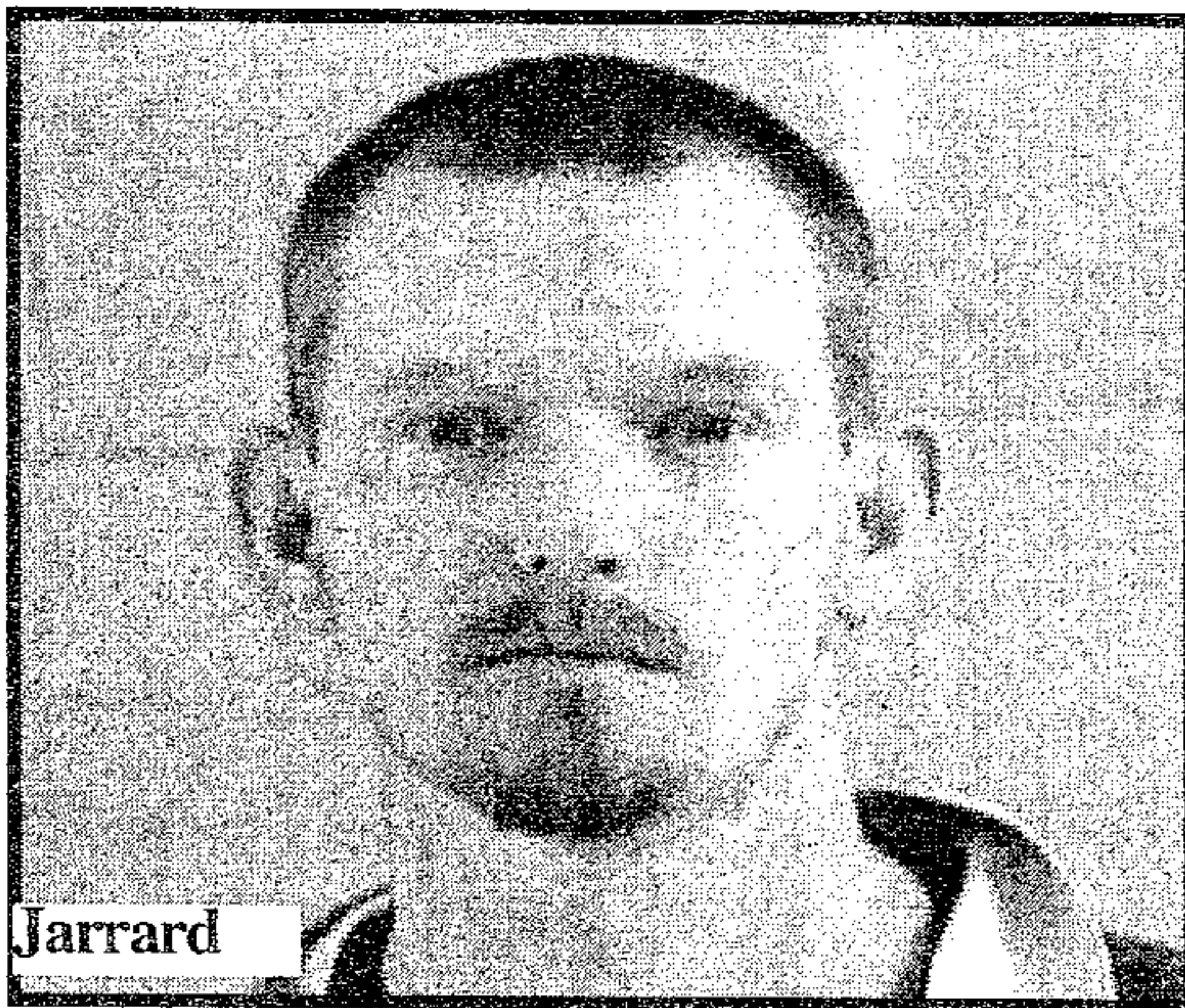

According to the report, the victim reported his residence was broken into and taken in the burglary were several weapons including assault rifles (AR style), shotguns, a .357 magnum Blackhawk.

Other items taken were a back pack, gas mask and a striating iron. Upon further in-

City has already been charged with aggravated burglary and theft over \$10,000.

Officer Brandon Gentry, LCPD went to Executive Meadows in an attempt to locate Matthew Hart. Hart had two warrants for his arrest from an incident that had occurred sev-

eral days prior. When the officer arrived he was given permission to search and found Matthew Hart hiding behind a couch in the living room.

According to the warrants, Ms. Ann Ma-

rie Lawrence was asked if Mr. Hart was at the residence and she told them no.

Upon searching the residence, however officers found Hart hiding and determined Lawrence had given false statements to the officers. She was charged with filing a false report.

In the warrants, Officer T. Holloway, LCPD was dispatched to a domestic assault and upon arrival the victim reported she was cooking dinner and Matthew Hart began arguing and threatening her. The victim became in fear for her and her children and went to the back bedroom of the residence. Mr. Hart then busted and broke the door in an attempt to get to the victim and her children. This caused fear and a 10 year old child was struck with a part of the door and he was transported to the emergency room.

Hart intentionally and knowingly destroyed the door, which caused serious injury to the child.

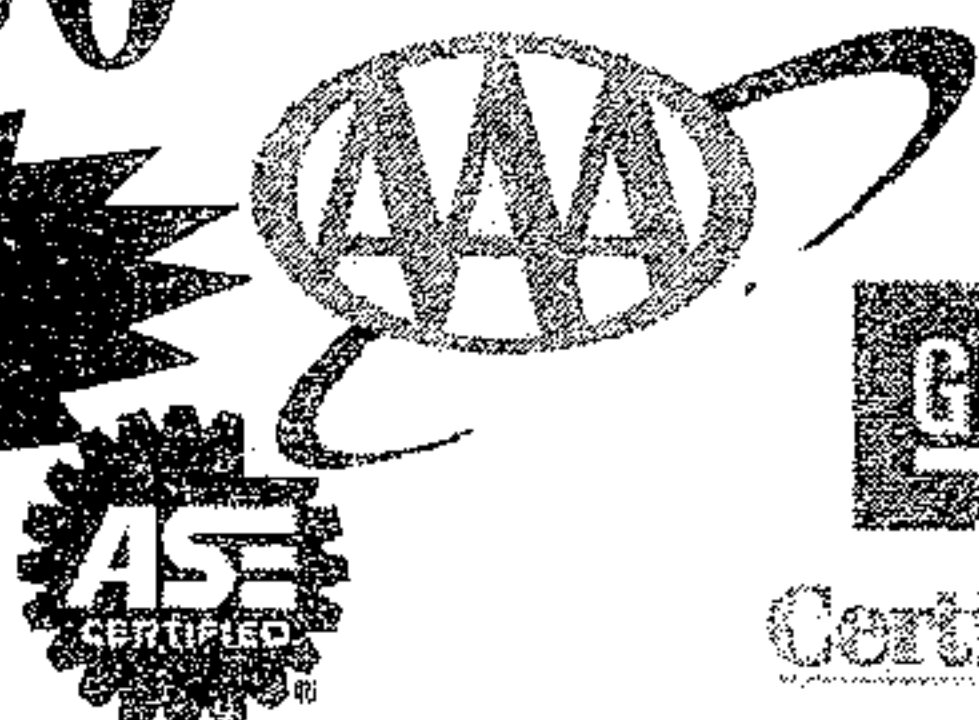

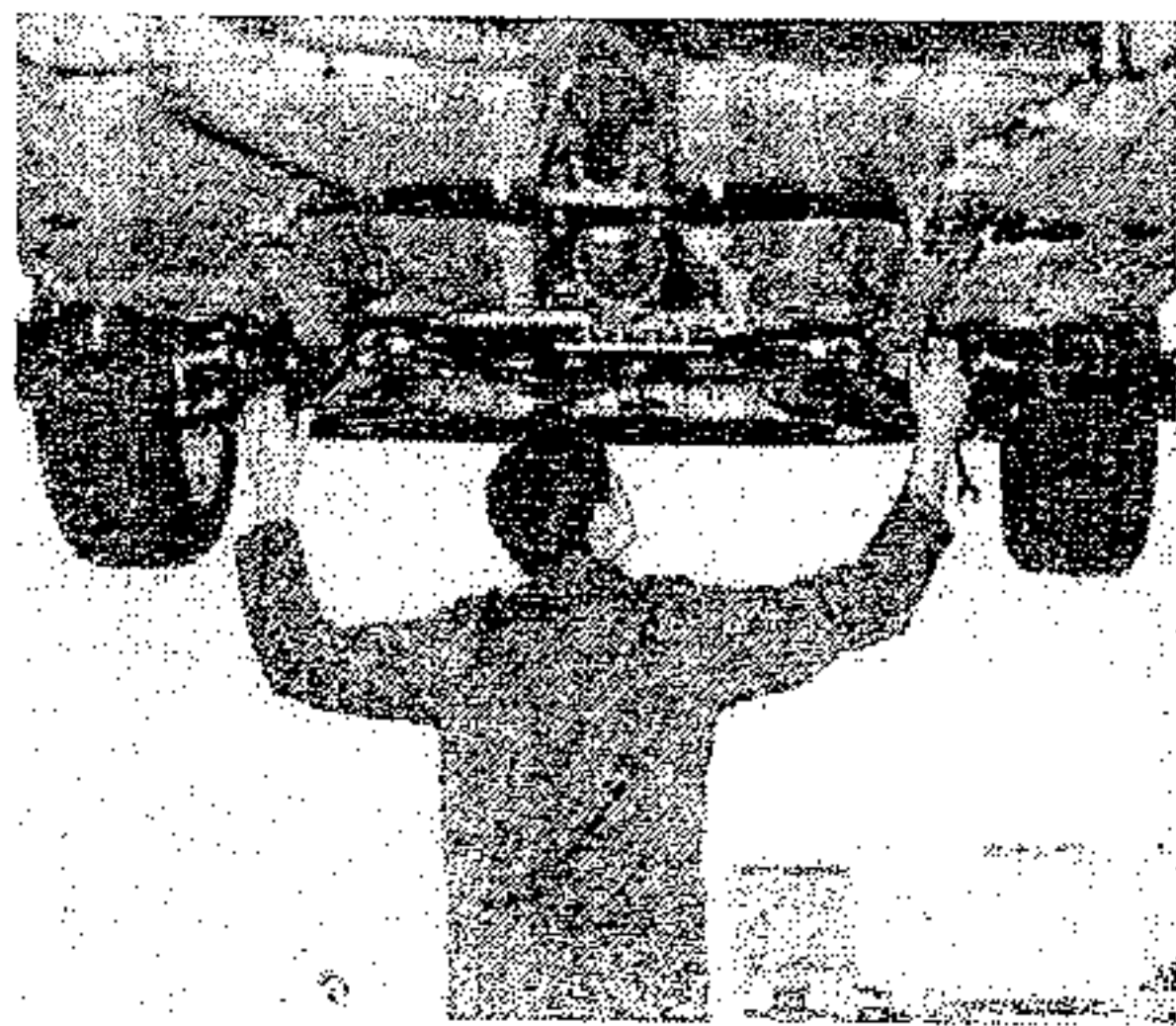

Lt. Paul Curtis, LCSO Narcotics Division stopped a vehicle on I75 for following too closely.
