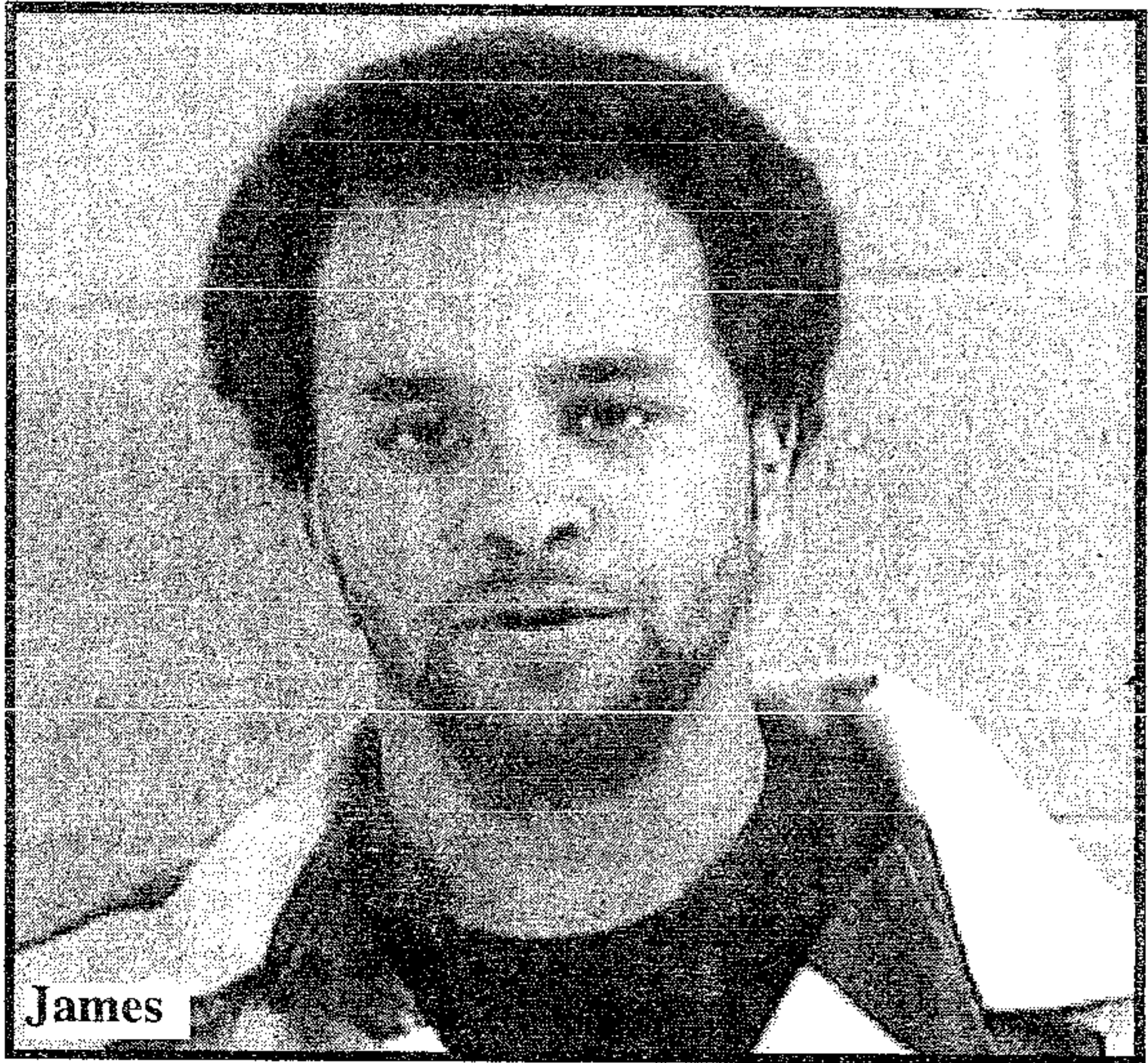

A Sweetwater man died early Sunday morning when he lost control of his vehicle on Interstate 75.

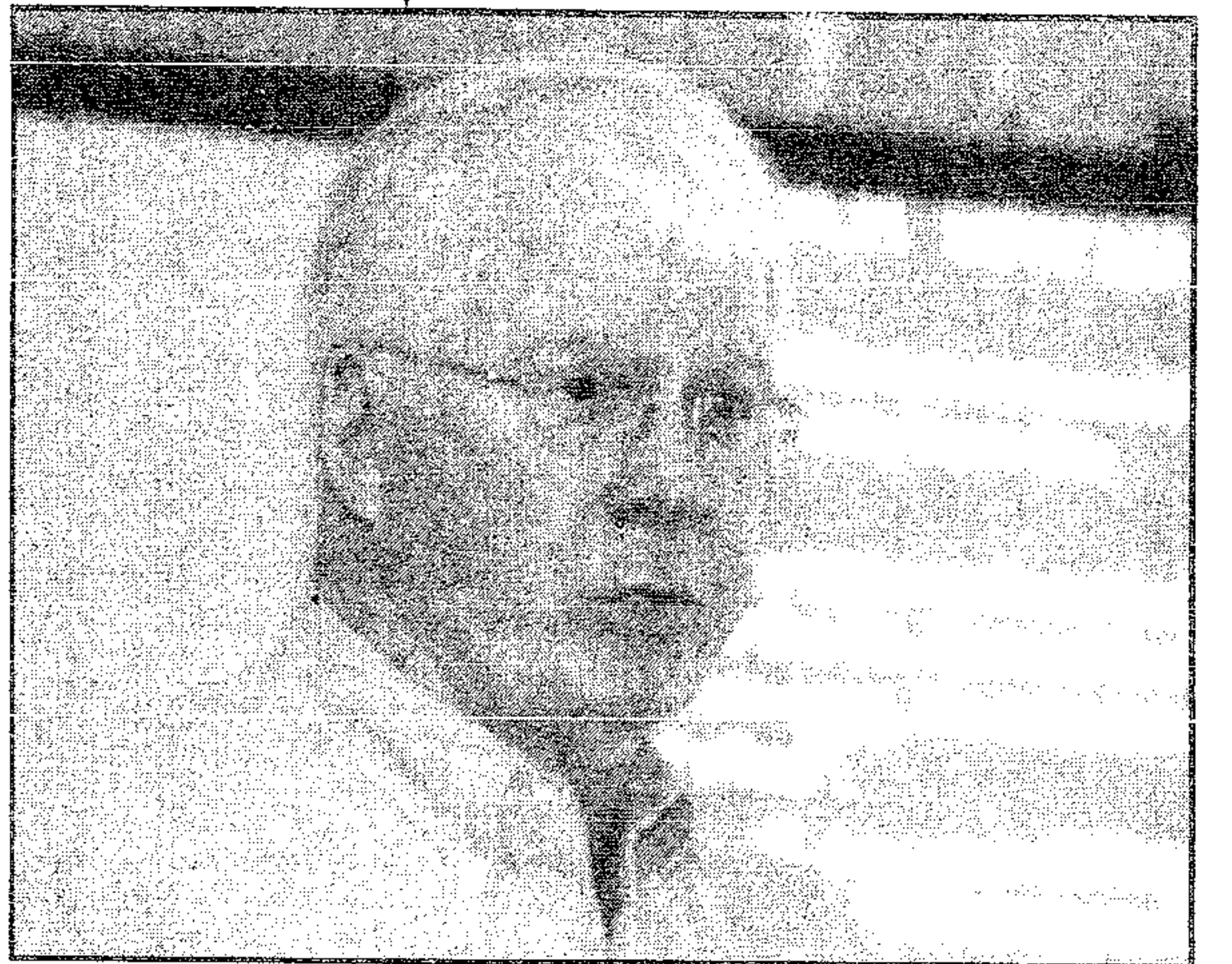

the TWRA website at [www.tnwildlife.org](http://www.tnwildlife.org). Applications will not be accepted after 11:59 p.m. (CST) on Feb. 6, 2013. Mailed applications will not be accepted. The application period began Dec. 12, 2012.

The areas available for the hunts are listed on the instruction sheet. Hunters have up to 12 choices, but will be drawn for only one.

Applicants may not use the same hunt code more than once. There are 19 hunts listed. No person may apply more than once.

A permit fee will not be charged to Annual Sportsman (Type 004), Lifetime Sportsman (Types 402-405) license holders or Senior Citizen Hunters (Type 166) with an Annual Senior Citizen Permit (Type 167). TWRA will pay the agent fee for these transactions. For all other license holders, the cost is \$10 per permit, plus the agent fee. When applying at a license agent, hunters must remain at the location while the application is processed. Hunters will receive a receipt with a confirmation number when the application is com-

plete. Hunters with internet access can click on "Buy a License On-Line." Once the Internet site has been accessed, hunters can follow the on-screen directions.



According to reports, Sgt. Eddie Range, LCPD received a call to Walmart in reference to a shoplifter. During the investigation, the suspect took off running and was stopped.

After further investigation the suspect gave a name that was later discovered as false. The correct name was Christopher Lavon James aka Christopher Jones.

James was observed by Walmart loss prevention concealing an HDMI cable valued at \$19 before he ran from the store.

James was wanted for a VOP, and according to that affidavit, Christopher Jones was convicted of domestic assault in sessions court and sen-

tenced to probation for 11 months 29 days. Since then he has failed to report to probation officer, failed to pay costs/fines, owes \$564.50 and failed to pay supervision fees, owes \$207.50.

Christopher Lavon James, aka Christopher Jones, was charged with theft under \$500, criminal impersonation, violation of probation and failure to stop, frisk, halt. Sgt. Eddie Range, LCPD made the arrest.

**Tello**

According to the report, Corporal Michael Watkins, LCSO clocked a vehicle on radar at 70mph in a 45mph zone and stopped it. The driver, Mr. Tello had no license, no social security number, and no insurance.

Mr. Tello did have a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person and blood shot eyes. Mr. Tello reported he'd consumed three beers, but he performed poorly on sobriety tasks and registered .11% on the intoximeter at the jail. Corporal Michael Watkins, LCSO made the arrest.

**Assessments**

ance of the Tennessee Grain Indemnity Fund, which was established in 1989 to provide financial protection for grain producers against the failure of grain dealers and warehouses. State law governing the fund was amended in 2011 to increase the minimum balance from \$3 million to \$10 million.

"The new provisions of

the grain indemnity law places a responsibility on the commissioner of agriculture to reactivate the assessment in order to maintain an adequate fund balance," Johnson said. "Given the fund's low balance and today's high value grain market, I'm authorizing the assessment in order to comply with state law and to ensure that Tennessee grain producers are protected."

The assessment on all grain will continue until the fund reaches the new \$10 million minimum balance.

Tennessee producer organizations sought the changes in the state law due to the higher market value of grain. All grain producers who participate in the program can file a claim to recover losses in the event of a grain dealer or warehouse failure, depending on circumstances.

Grain producers can request a refund within 90 days of being assessed; however, in doing so they forfeit protection

under the program. Producers who previously opted out can also be reinstated but are required to pay back assessments with interest.

The law also requires that all grain storage facilities and grain dealers comply with bonding and insurance requirements. Warehousemen and dealers must be licensed with TDA, and the required surety is based on volume and license classification. TDA monitors highly speculative positioning by handlers, conducts an annual inspection of records and may seize assets of failed handlers and take other actions to protect the interest of producers.

Since the fund's inception, nearly \$1 million has been paid in claims to 76 Tennessee producers. In 2011, Tennessee farmers produced a combined 2.3 million acres of corn, soybeans and wheat valued at nearly \$1.3 billion. Soybeans are the state's leading crop, generating \$461.3 million in farm cash receipts last year.
