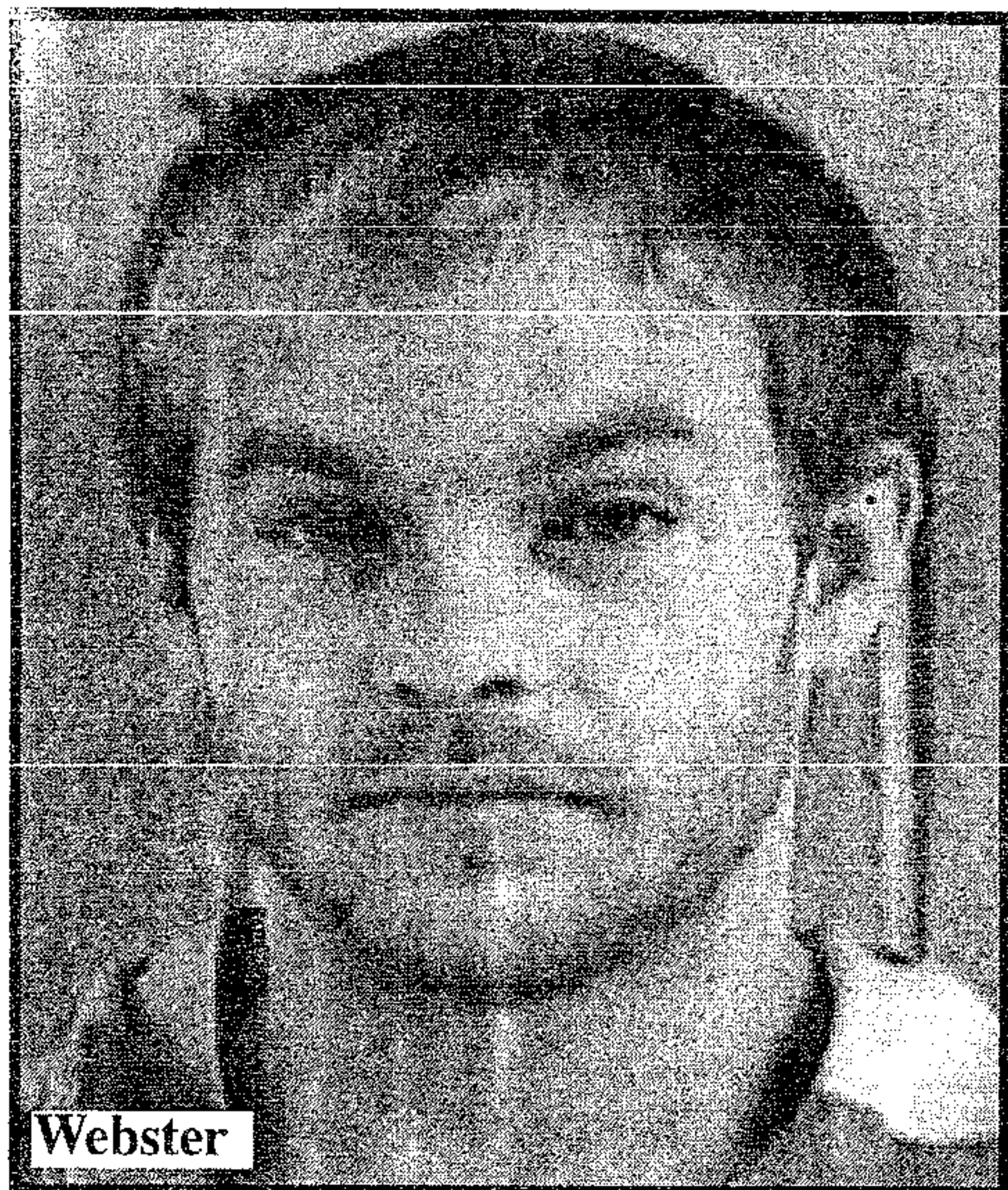

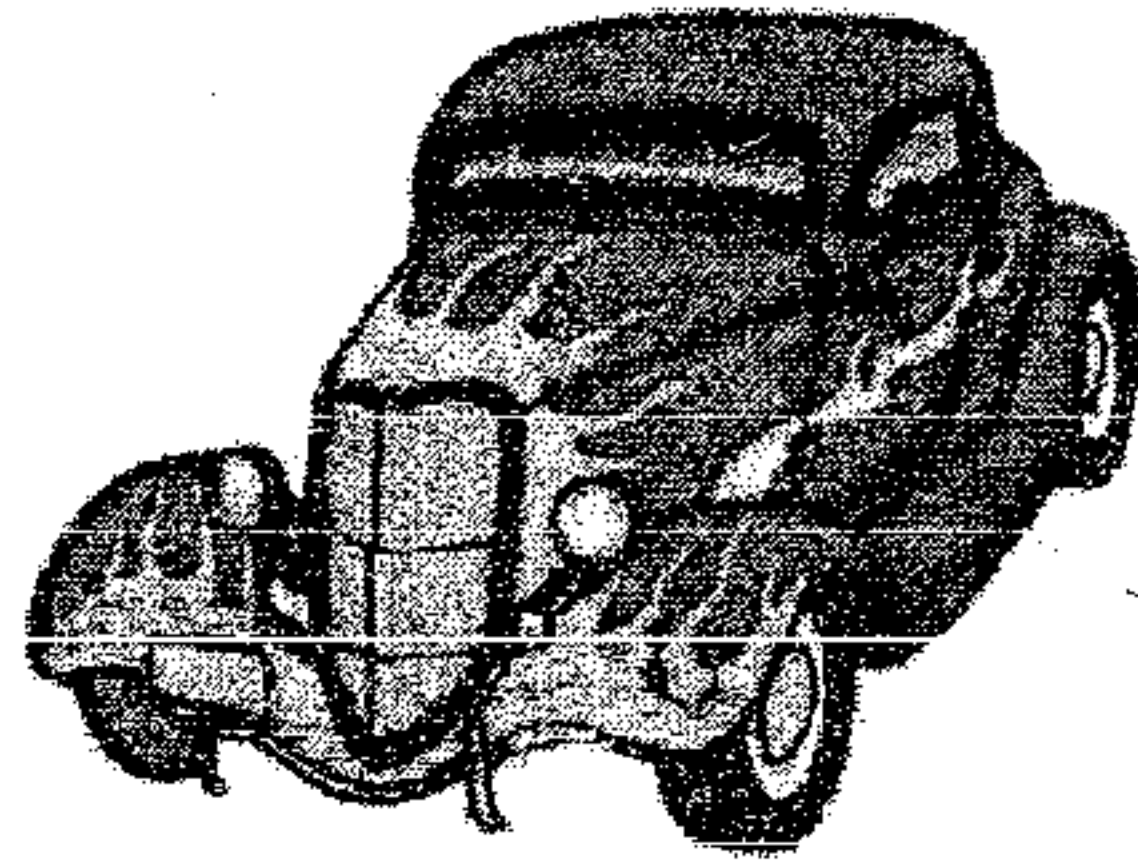
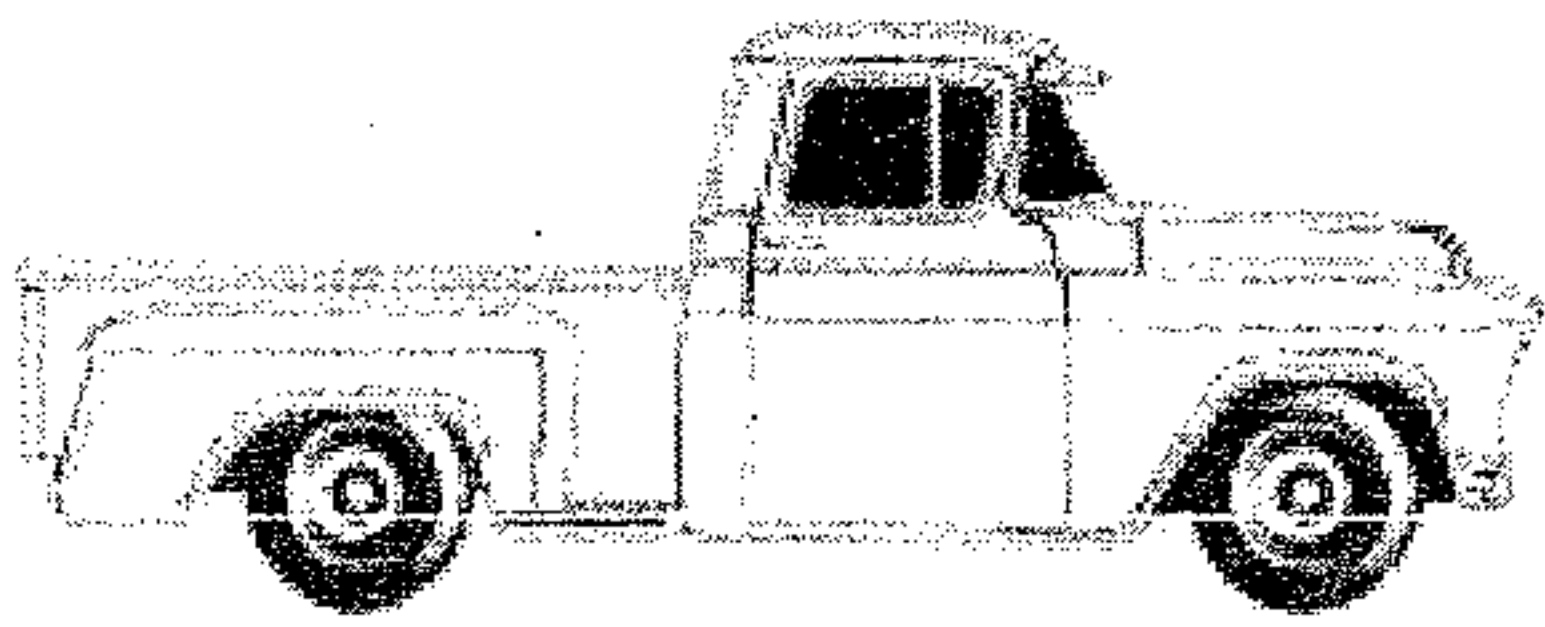

contact with the victim, who was lying in the bed with difficulty breathing.

The victim reported Dustin Lee Webster, who had lived at the residence and who has a

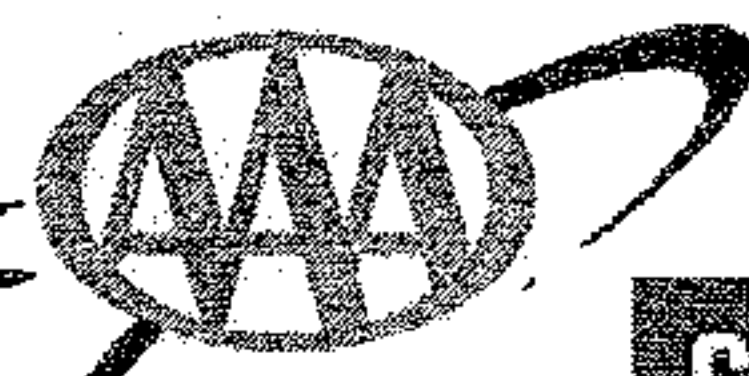

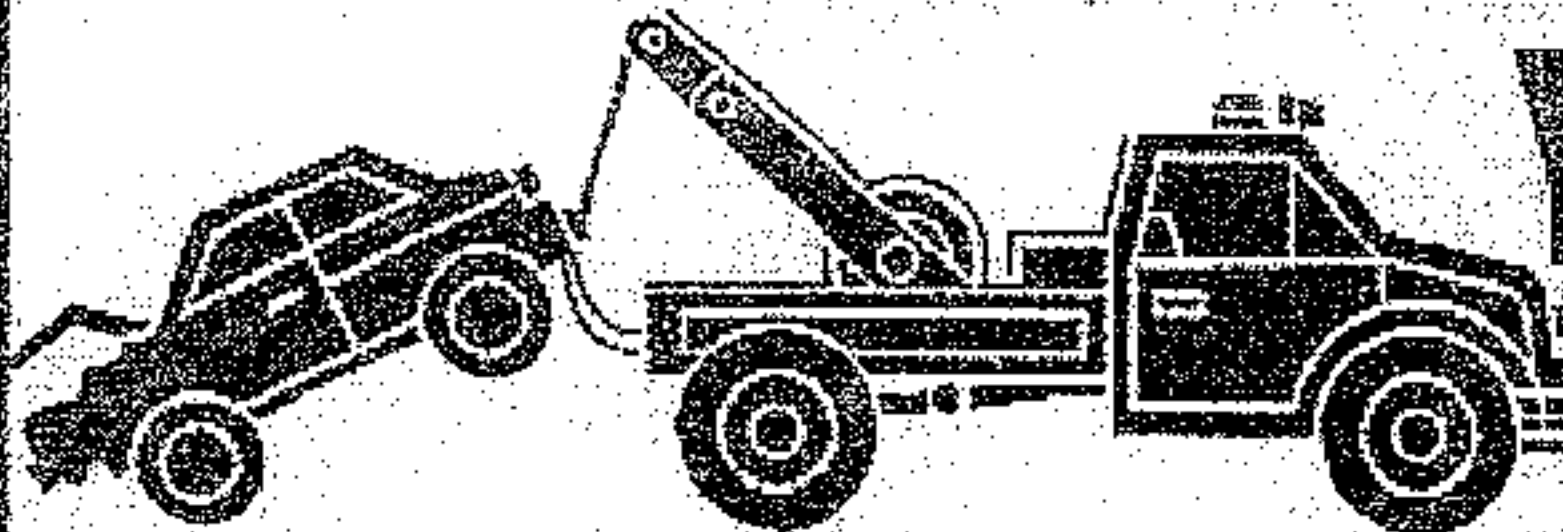

the home and was unable to wake a female subject up. Fearing an overdose, she called 911 and took the two minor children from the home with her to family member's next door.
