The Good News

God presented me with one of those moments today and I am so thankful that I listened to Him. I am convinced that God was using my life to demonstrate the power He has to change us when we surrender our lives to Him. I want to humbly share this experience with you today in hopes that other Christians can learn from my mistakes and some lost person may see the hope we have in Jesus.

I was walking out of the courthouse today when a young man spoke to me, stating that he enjoys reading The Good News and asked if I was still "preaching". As I turned to speak with him I noticed a lady that I had seen there a couple of times recently. She had made it obvious on each occasion that I would not be receiving a Christmas card from her anytime soon but I didn't know why. As one whose profession consists of the taking of freedom from others, I am somewhat used to that type of antisocial behavior towards me at the courthouse, but this was different.

For some reason I felt compelled to find out why this lady disliked me so much because I was pretty sure I had never met her in a "professional" capacity. Unknowing how the next few moments would play out, I asked her if she wanted to talk about what I had done to offend her.

As she began to explain her feelings I could only stand there and wonder how many others feel the same and I was truly ashamed. She began to recall standing in front of that same courthouse about three or four years back and watching me publically humiliate and verbally assault a defendant in one of my cases who had smarted off to me after a hearing. She reminded me of how loud I was and how horribly I spoke to the man in front of many others.

This lady then began to tell me that every time she sees this article she is disgusted at my hypocrisy and how mad she gets when I portray myself as some kind of Christian man. My actions from several years ago were still able to generate what appeared to be a genuine hate for me, for this article and ultimately for Christians in general.

When she had finished explaining her feelings, my response was simple; "I am guilty and I am sorry." She calmly listened as I explained in agreement to how horrible of a person and what a pitiful excuse for a Christian I had been until a little over two years ago. I shared how Christ had convicted me of my sin and how I had to confess to sins that I didn't even remember committing because I was so far from God. I was able to share with her how God had completely changed my life and how The

Good News articles began only after I had rededicated my life to Jesus and began to understand what being a follower of Christ is all about. I asked her to forgive my previous conduct and to see that God has changed everything about my life. I told her that I am still a work in progress but far from the guy she saw three or four years ago.

As our conversation came to a close, this lady shook my hand, stated that her confidence in me had been restored and then asked if I would pray for her son. I did. This is what is meant when you hear the term "Divine Appointment". God knew that my previous actions were causing hurt feelings and hate within someone's life. He knew that I am the only person who could share His power of forgiveness and loving mercy with this person concerning these feelings.

I hope the lady I met today not only understands that God can change lives, but that He also cares enough about her to arrange that meeting, in that place, at that time with no interruptions or distractions. God is good! He knows everything about each of us and wants to have a relationship with us. I invited her and her son to come to church with me at New Providence, I hope she comes. (If you're reading Ms. P, I hope you come on Easter Sunday)

After that meeting I

wondered how many others might take a few moments to discuss our failures and God's kindness and mercy. I wondered how I could make myself more available just to talk with folks about what is going on in their lives and how God has changed my life. God has placed a desire within my heart to share His words and His strength and power with others who desperately need Jesus. I wondered if there are folks who have questions but don't feel comfortable in a church setting with lots of other "Christians" present. While pondering these things as I drove down the road, God placed this challenge on my heart; "Make yourself available to others!"

So here it is.... I am going to commit at least 2 hours each week in a public place within our community to talk to folks who will stop in and speak with me. There may be someone who has a question about Jesus, a question about eternity, wants someone to pray with them or maybe someone just wants to talk about the problems in their own life. Your problems can't be any worse than mine were and Jesus sure changed me!

I will begin on Tuesday, March 26th at the Bojangles on Hwy 321 in Lenoir City from 6:00 p.m. till 8:00 p.m. I will be the guy in the corner of the room sitting at a table with God's word in front of me. You may be a Christian who wants to talk about some scripture, or a church leader seeking someone to speak to a group within your church about what Christ is doing in their life. You might be a lost person wanting to be introduced to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ or you might be an atheist just wanting to see what a Jesus freak really looks like. No problem, all of the above reasons are fine with me. If someone is with me, sit down anyway and we can all talk together. There is only one God and He loves us all the same so please don't walk away. If no one drops by at all, well, it will be a good time to study God's word alone too!

My heart's desire is to be obedient to God and make myself available to anyone who may just want to talk. Are you that person? If so, I'll see ya at Bojangles! Thanks for reading and thanks Ms. P for your honesty and your forgiveness.

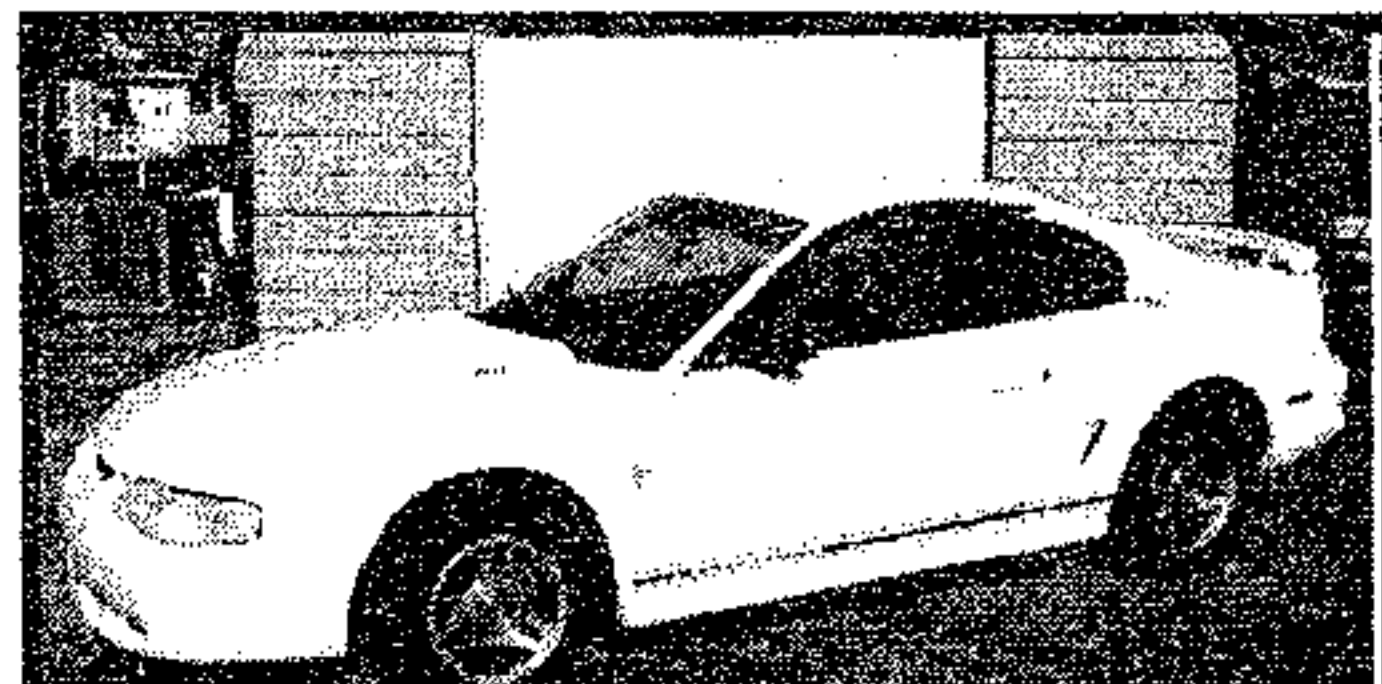

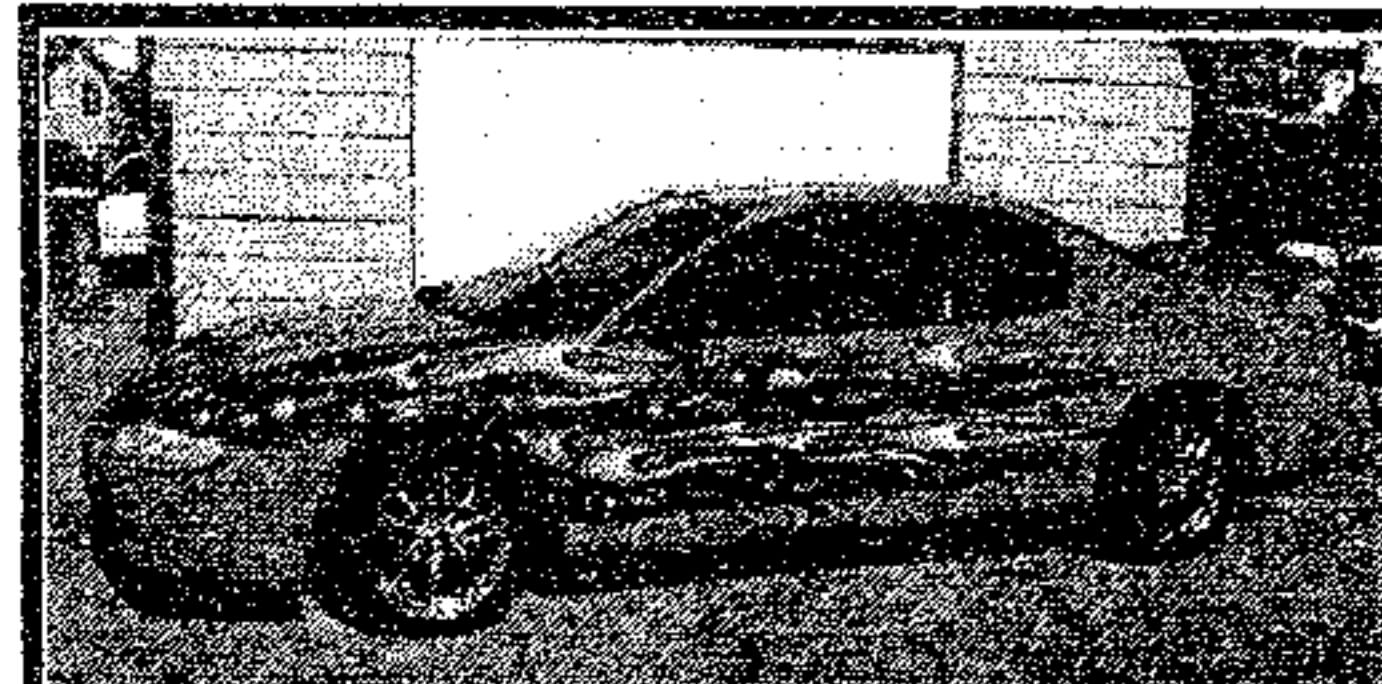

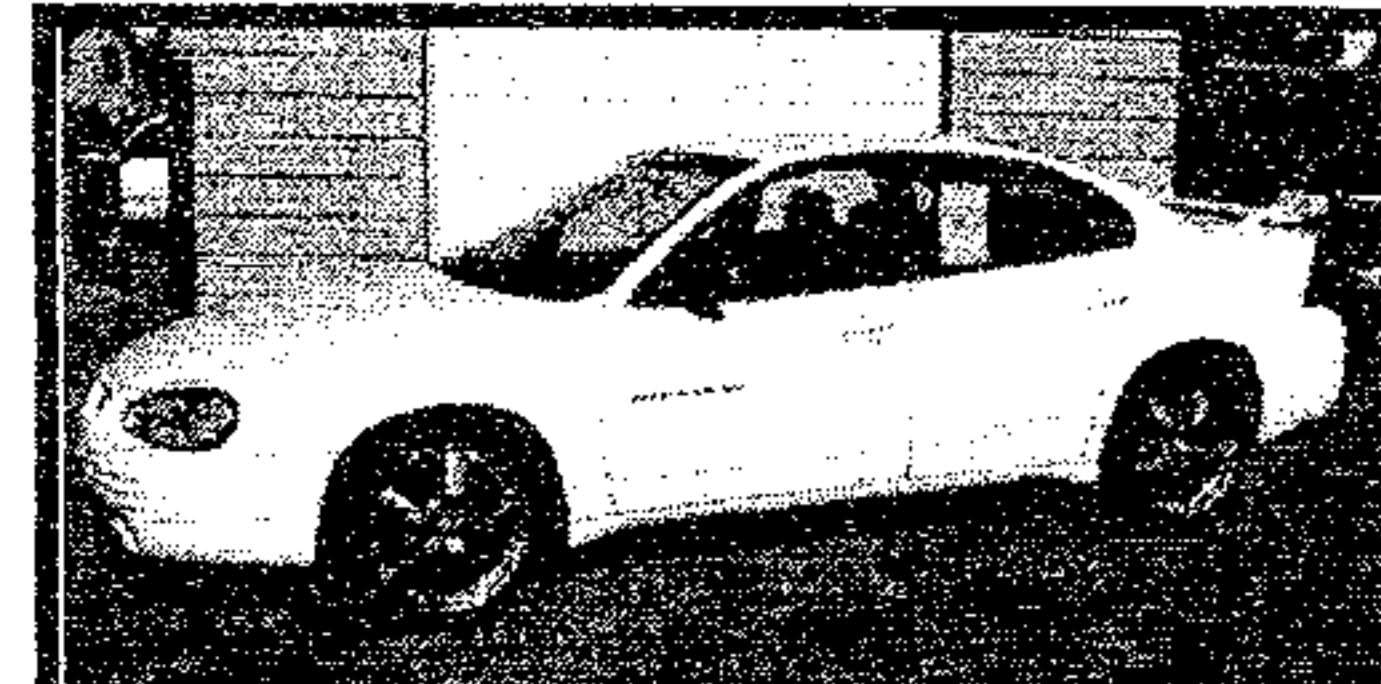
