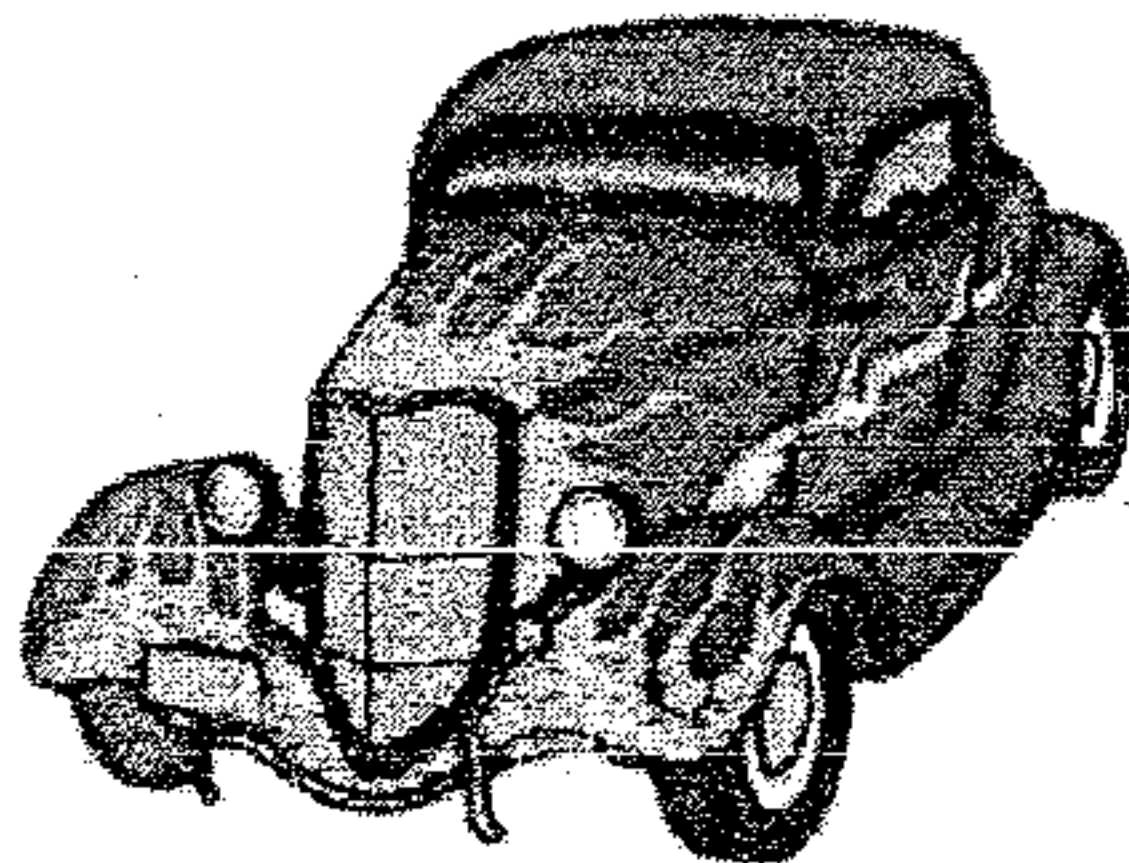
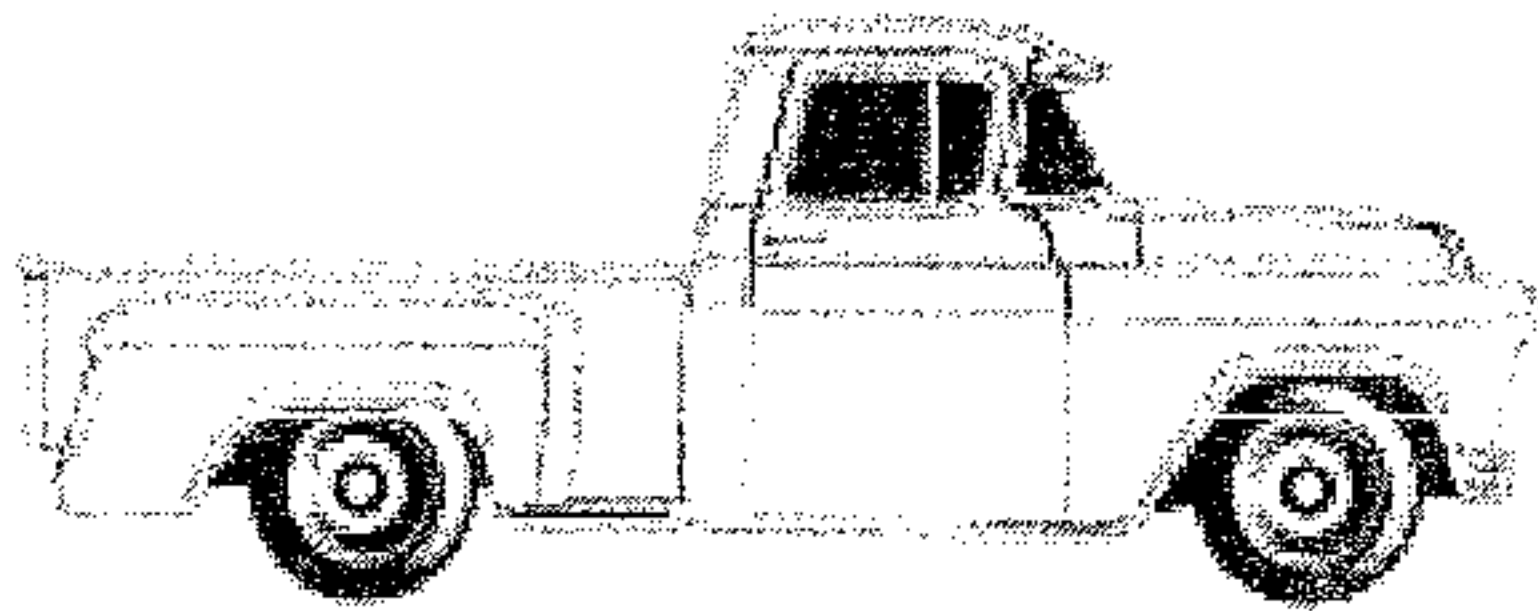

The notorious McGhee Square has again been found to be the residence of another drug dealer. This time according to the warrants, it all began with a traffic stop and then to the man's residence in McGhee Square Apartment where numerous drugs were found that were for the purpose of being distributed.

According to the reports, the Loudon County Sheriff's Office Narcotics Unit assisted

Corporal Michael Watkins, LCSO on a traffic stop of Michael David Tarallo and Tamara Tarallo. Approximately 28 grams of a green plant material believed to be marijuana was found inside the vehicle.

Michael Tarallo advised officers the marijuana belonged to him.

The LCSO Narcotics Unit obtained written consent to search the apartment belonging to Tamara Tarallo located on Kelly Lane, otherwise known as McGhee Square.

During an interview Michael advised he had been staying at the apartment for approximately 4 or 5 months.

A blue Reebok shoebox was found located on Michael's side of the bed. Approximately 2.9 grams of an off white rock like substance that tested positive for cocaine base, razor blades, empty baggies and cash were found inside the shoe box.

Two small round pills identified as 30mg Oxycodone were found in a cigarette pack and a plastic bottle fashioned into a bong was found behind a table with several burnt roaches.

Approximately 1.3 grams of an off white powder that tested positive for cocaine base was found in a table drawer in the living room.

Michael David Tarallo, aka Mike "T", of Kelly Lane, Lenoir City was charged with possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of schedule II (crack cocaine) for resale, possession of schedule II (oxycodone) and possession of schedule VI for resale.

Investigator Shane Ezell, LCSO NU made the arrest.
