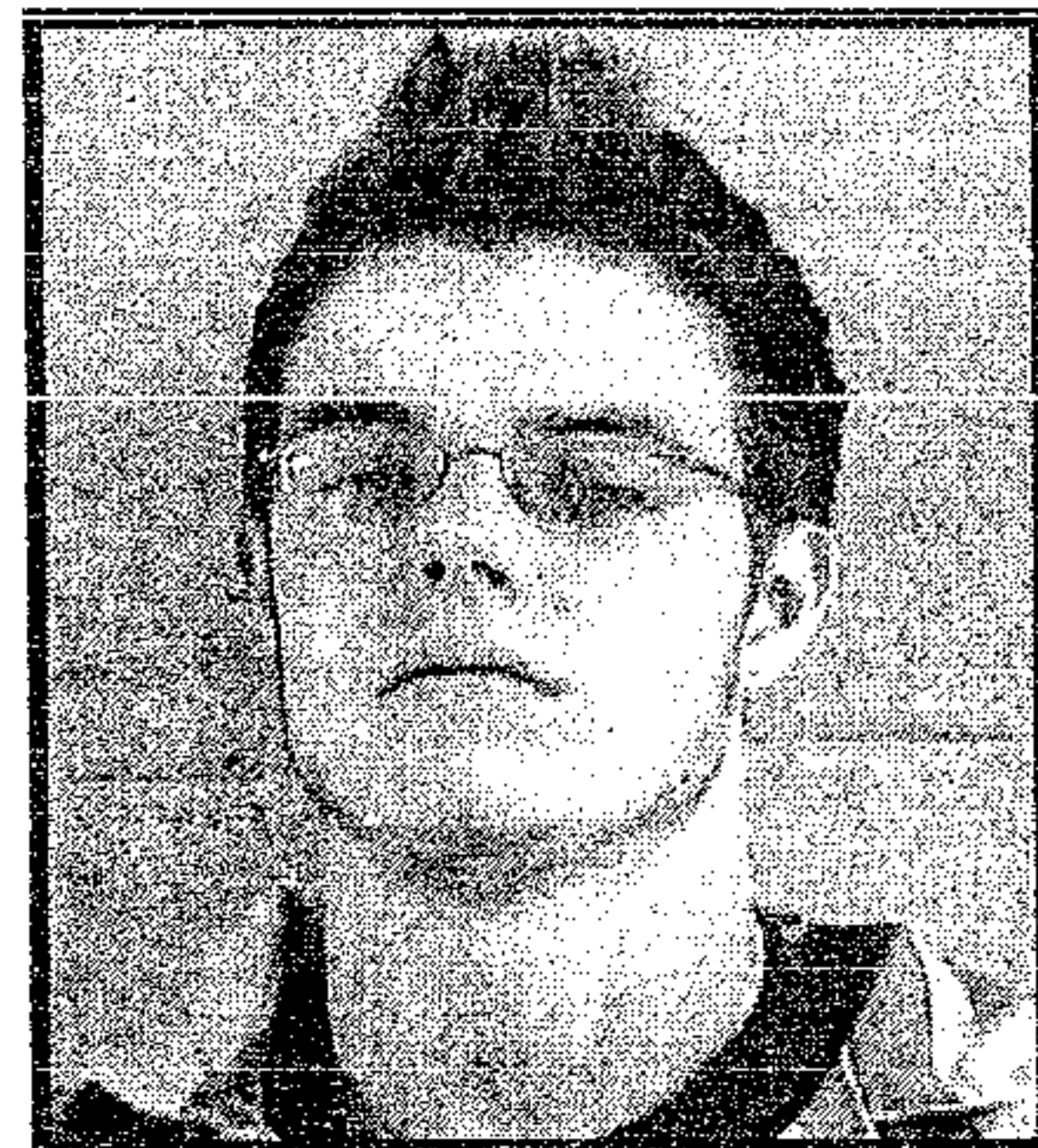

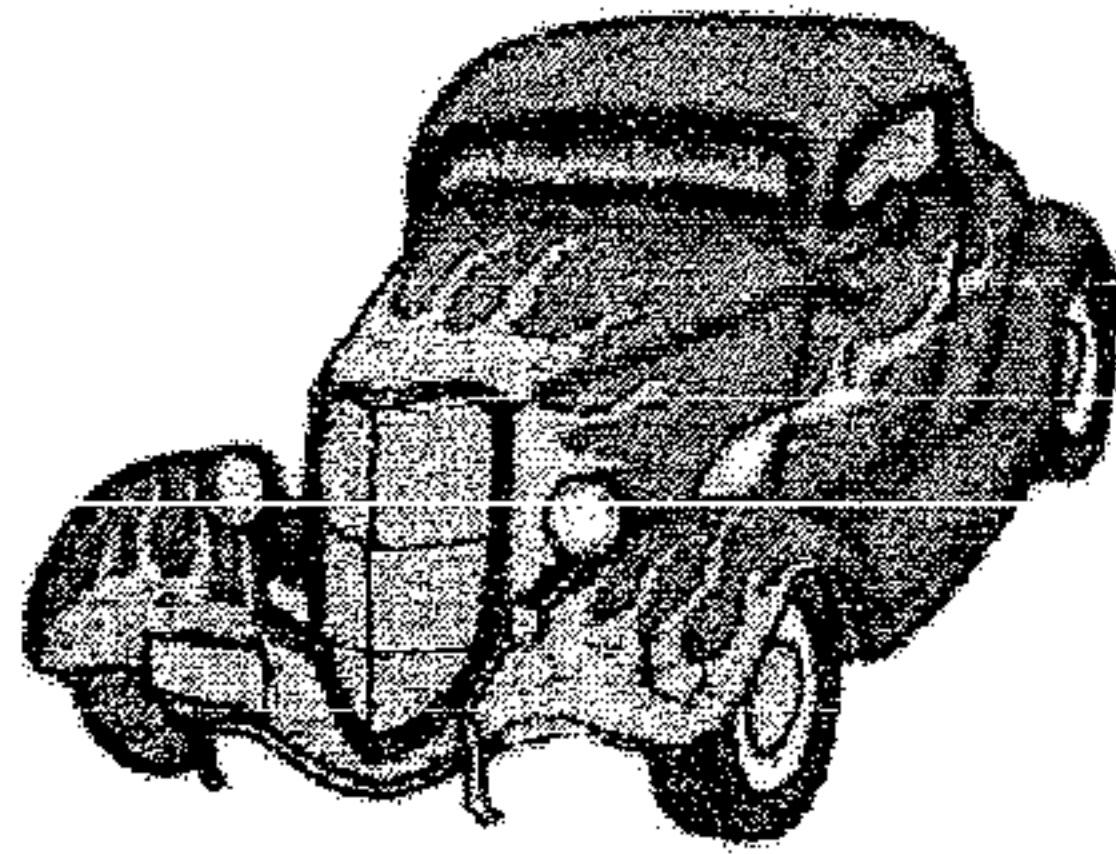
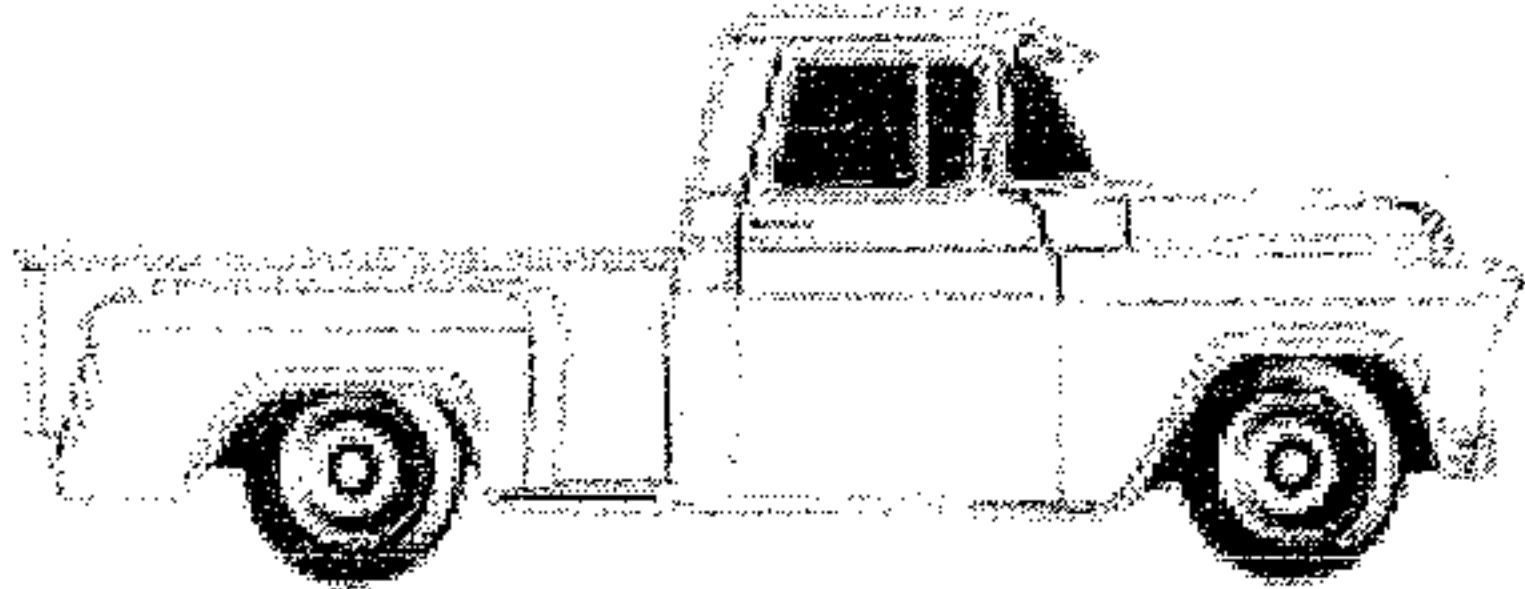

Xterra traveling on I75 that accelerated to speeds of over 80mph and switched back and forth between lanes and stopped it. The vehicle immediately pulled to the left hand side of the road and stopped and the deputy told them to move to the right hand side of the roadway.

The deputy then made contact with the driver Larue Edward Livingston 3rd. The passenger was identified as Lyle

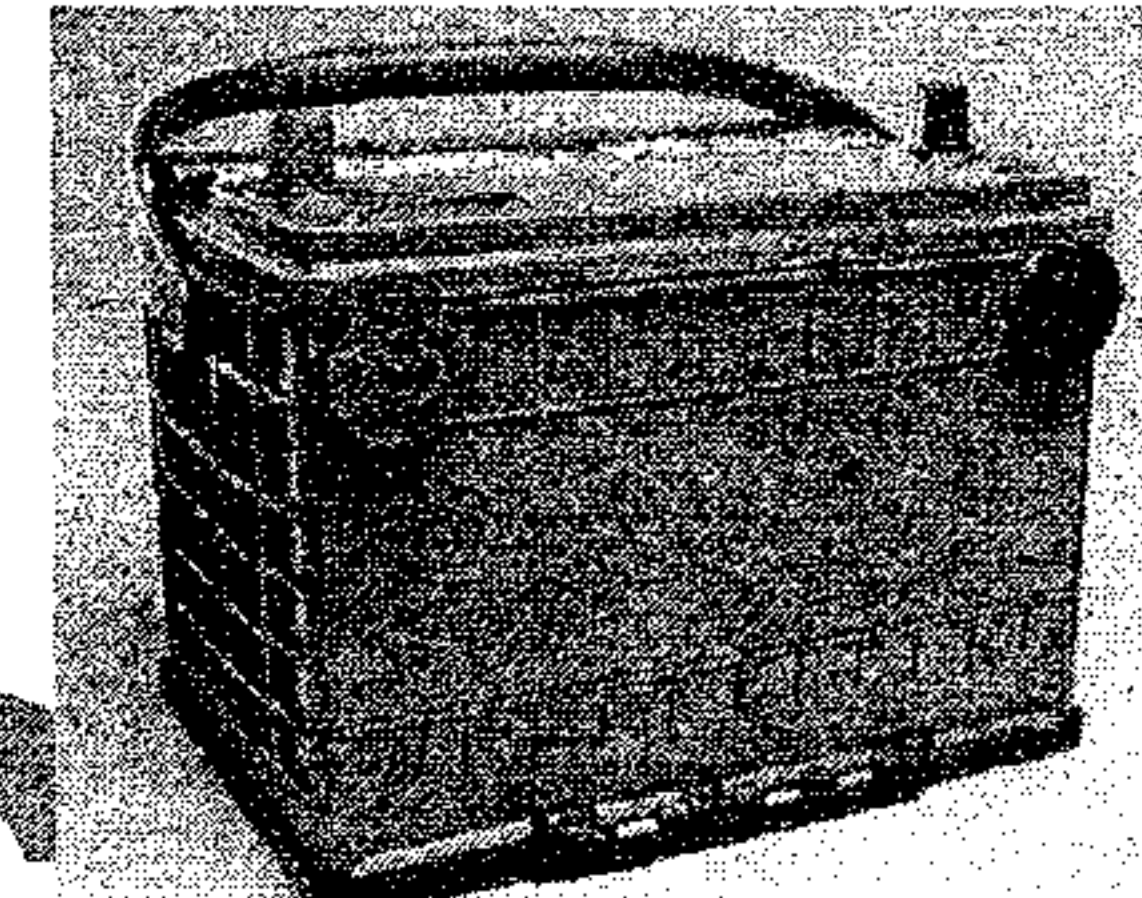

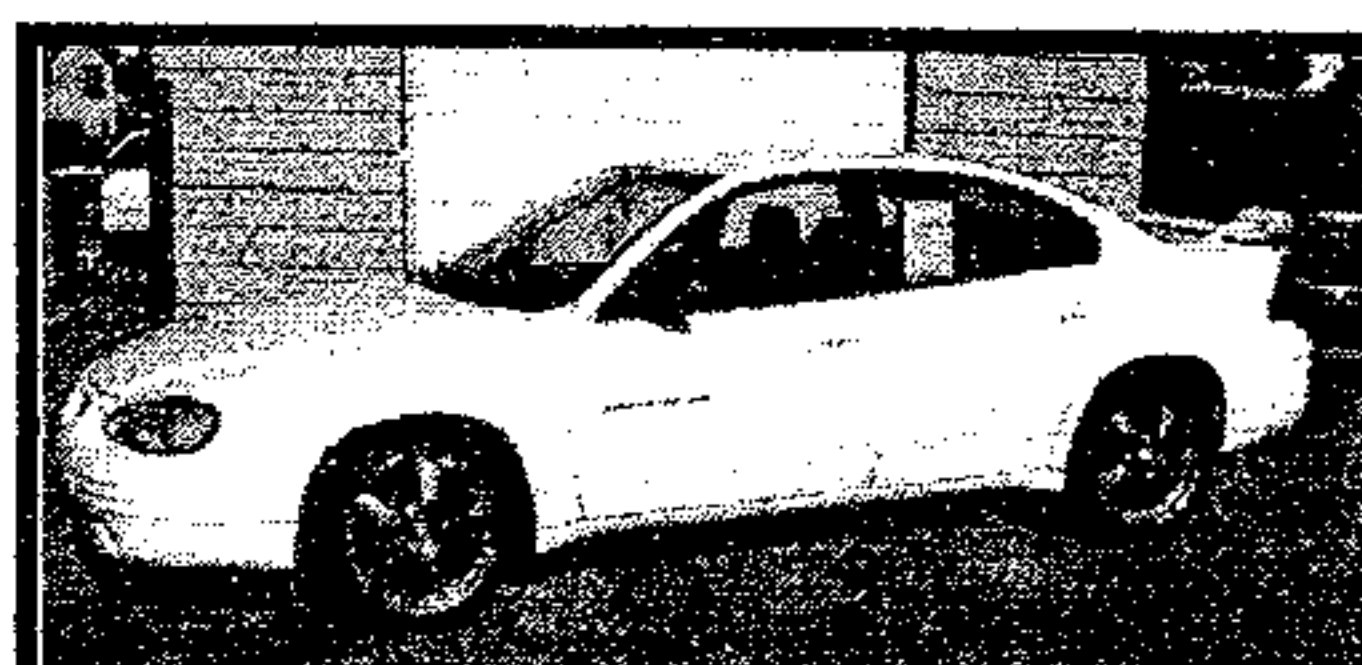
