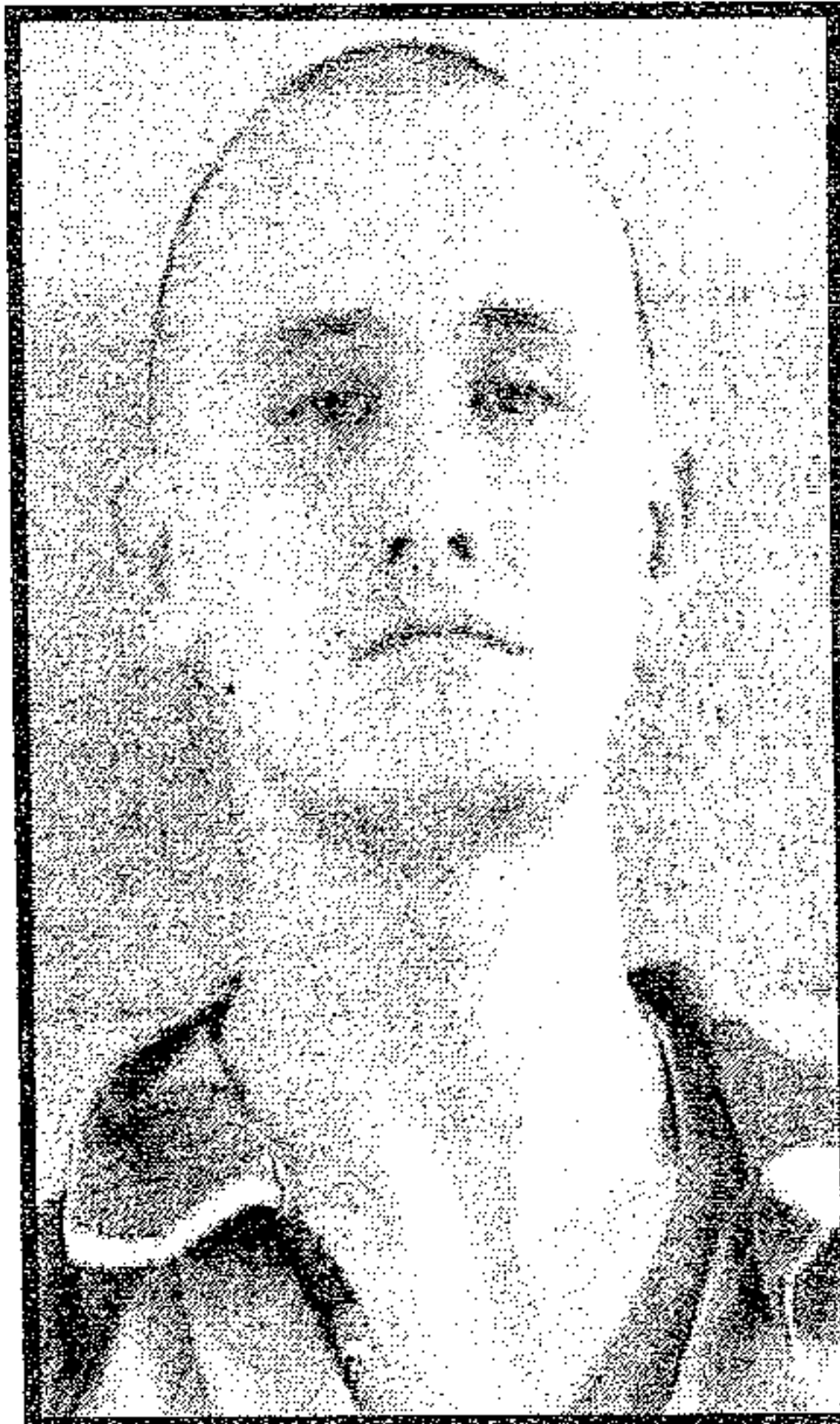
2 charged after I75 wreck

turning from the methadone clinic with his prescriptions loose and unlocked in a small box container.

Mr. Brooks was unsteady on his feet and seemed disoriented. Mr. Brooks was given several field sobriety tasks and he performed poorly and his license was found to be suspended in 2011.
