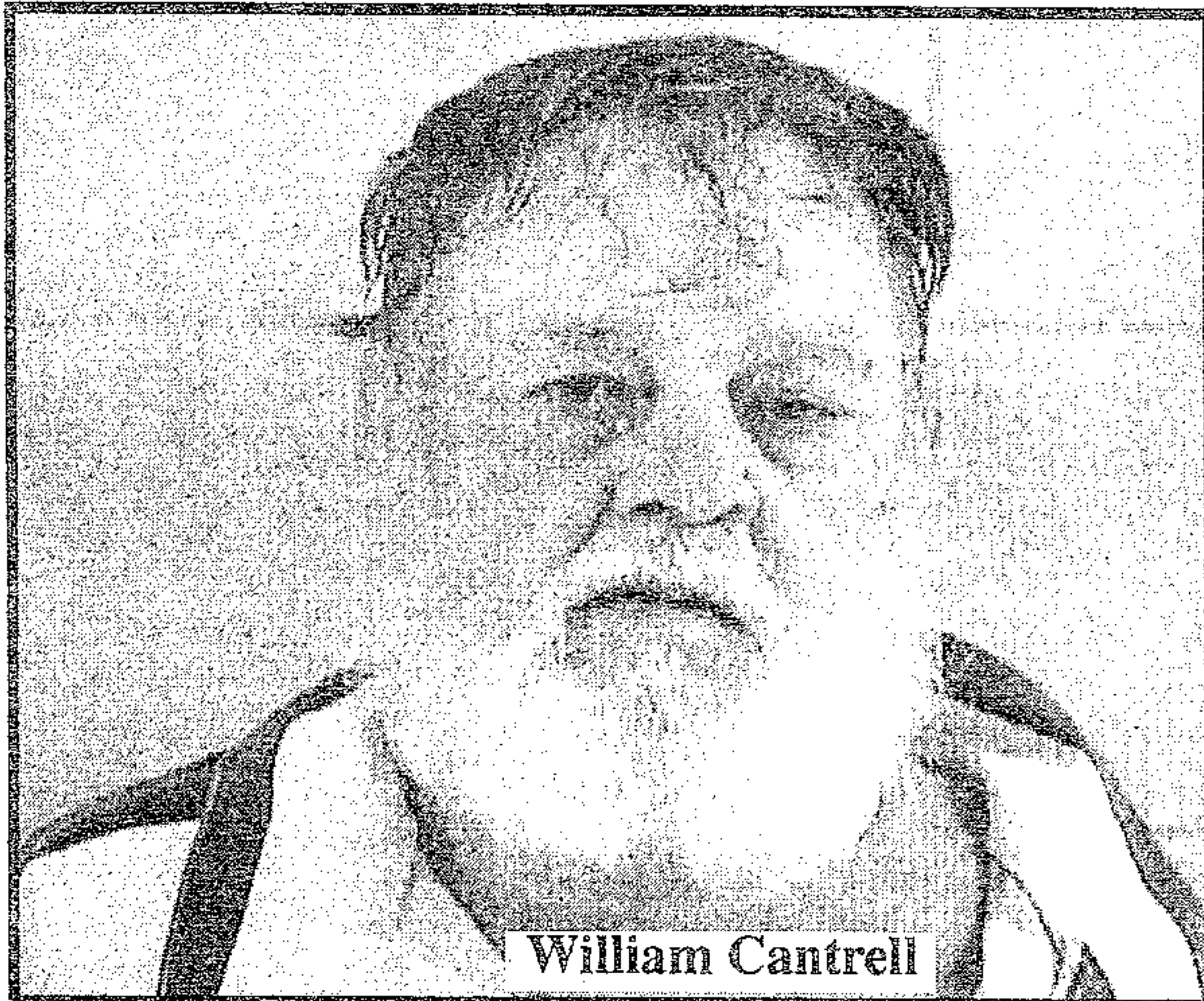


Weed and gun taken in truck down embankment
