Deputy Keener then secured the scene and approximately 15-20 minutes later noticed a vehicle coming toward him at a high rate of speed. 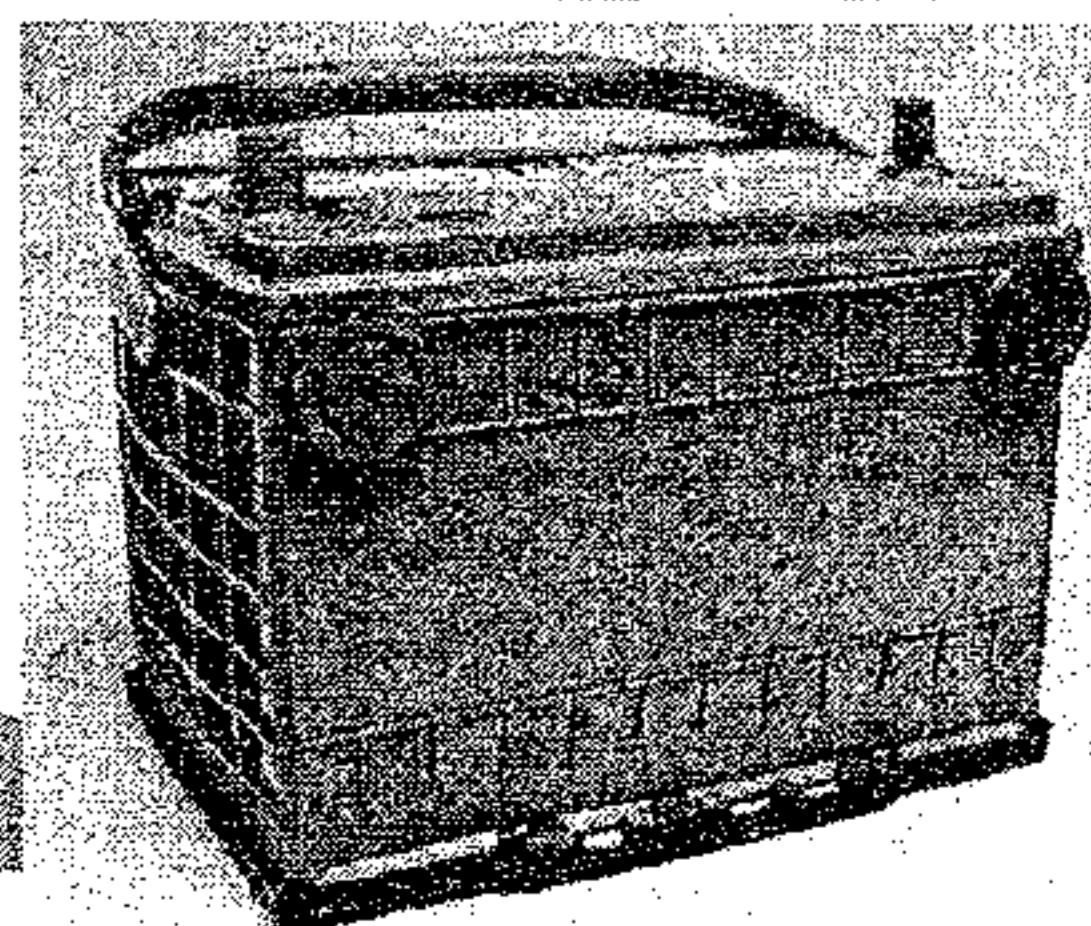

me a while to understand how Jesus views each of us and how we should view others.

Today I would like to share a real story with you from the life of Christ but before I do, let me remind you that Jesus Christ is the same today as He was in this story and He will remain the same forever. (Hebrews 13:8)

John 8:2-11 (NKJV) (2) Now early in the morning He (Jesus) came again into the temple, and all the people came to Him; and He sat down and taught them. (3) Then the scribes and Pharisees brought to Him a woman caught in adultery. And when they had set her in the midst,

(4) they said to Him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in adultery, in the very act. (5) Now Moses, in the law, commanded us that such should be stoned. But what do You say?" (6) This they said testing Him that they might have something of which to accuse Him. But Jesus stooped down and wrote on the ground with His finger, as though He did not hear. (7) So when they continued asking Him, He raised Himself up and said to them, "He who is without sin among you, let him throw a stone at her first." (8) And again He stooped down and wrote on the ground. (9) Then those who heard it, being convicted by their conscience,

went out one by one, beginning with the oldest even to the last. And Jesus was left alone, and the woman standing in the midst. (10) When Jesus had raised Himself up and saw no one but the woman, He said to her, "Woman, where are those accusers of yours? Has no one condemned you?" (11) She said, "No one, Lord." And Jesus said to her, "Neither do I condemn you; go and sin no more."

If you believe God's word to be the truth, and I hope you do, then imagine this woman at the moment this scene was unfolding. She was caught red handed committing an act that was punishable by death un-

der Old Testament law, and dragged into the temple by a handful of folks who were trying to exploit her sin to discredit and disprove that Jesus is the true Son of God and Savior of the world.

As Jesus reminded the Pharisees of their own transgressions, they began to understand that they too were not perfect and therefore unqualified to enact justice upon the adulteress woman. One by one they began to lay down their stones and walk away. I can almost picture the woman as Jesus stood up and turned towards her; she was most likely half dressed, dirty from being dragged through the streets towards the

temple and undoubtedly embarrassed, ashamed and shaking with fear. Jesus then tells her that He does not condemn her, which is equal to saying, "I forgive you". I can imagine the look of relief and appreciation she had as Jesus tells her to go and sin no more.

I have been that woman! There was a time, not too many years ago, that I was ashamed to go to church, embarrassed to go around my own family and felt as if I had committed too many sins to be forgiven. When my life was completely upside down and I was at the end of my spiritual rope, Jesus looked at (see TGN ctd. pg. 5)

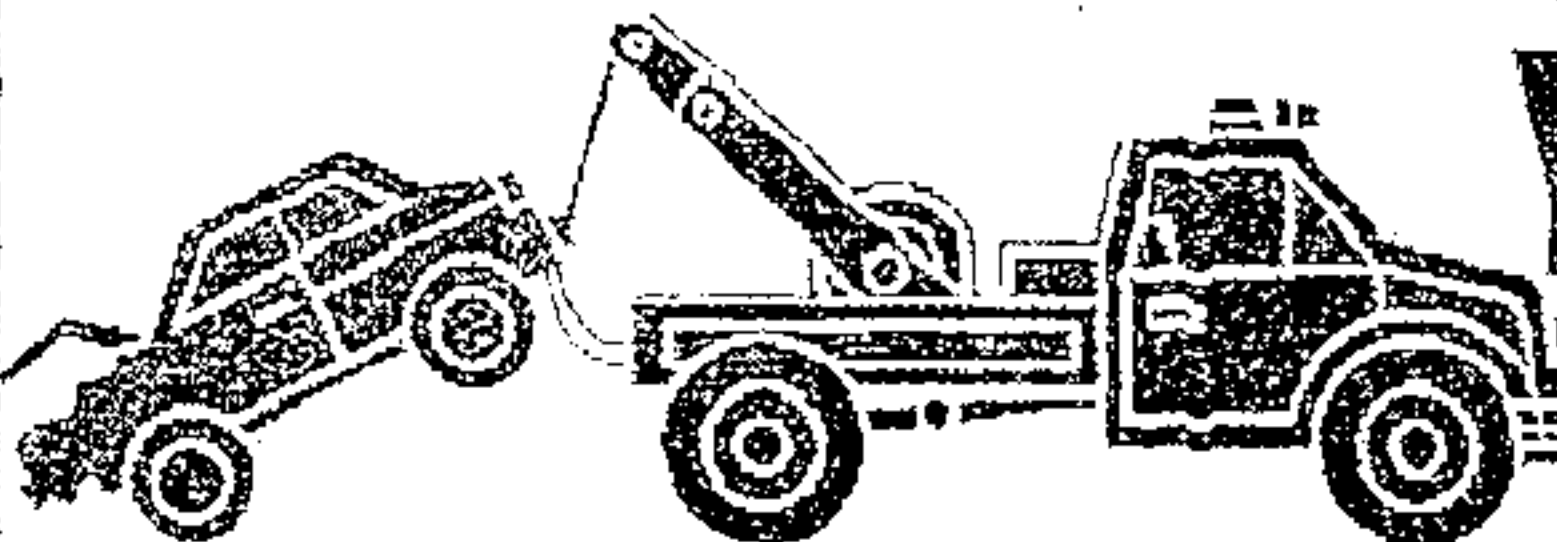

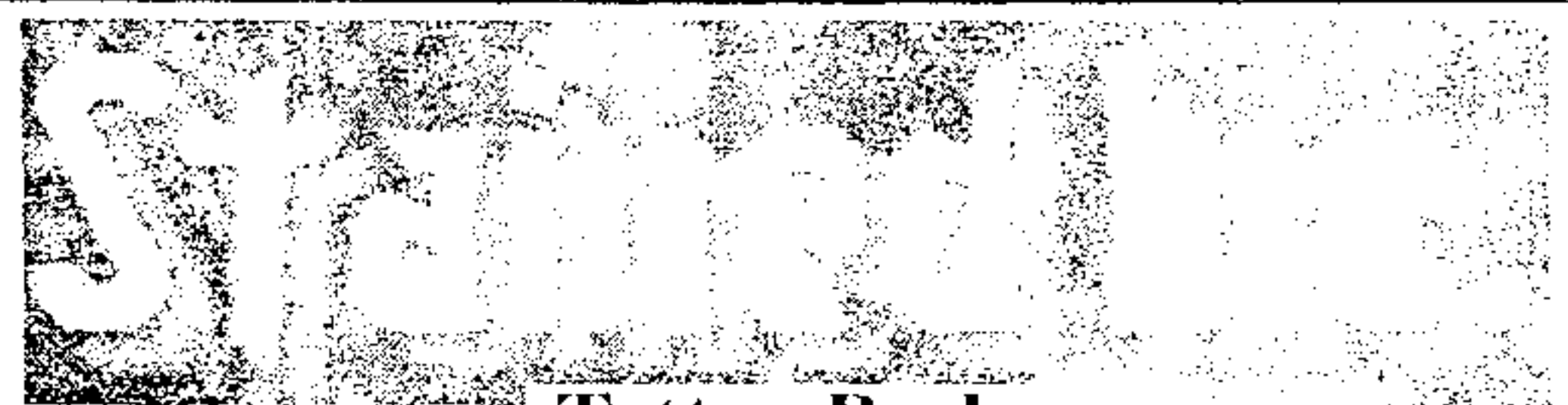
