UPON ARRIVAL TO THE AREA DEPUTY BUTLER OBSERVED THE VEHICLE A BLACK ISUZU SUV TRAVELING ON INTERSTATE 75 AROUND THE 81 MILE MARKER AND OBSERVED THE VEHICLE MAKE LANE CHANGES WITHOUT SIGNAL AND THEN OBSERVED THE VEHICLE TRAVEL IN THE MIDDLE OF THE HIGHWAY. Deputy Rayfield stopped the vehicle and a check showed Duncan to still have a sus-

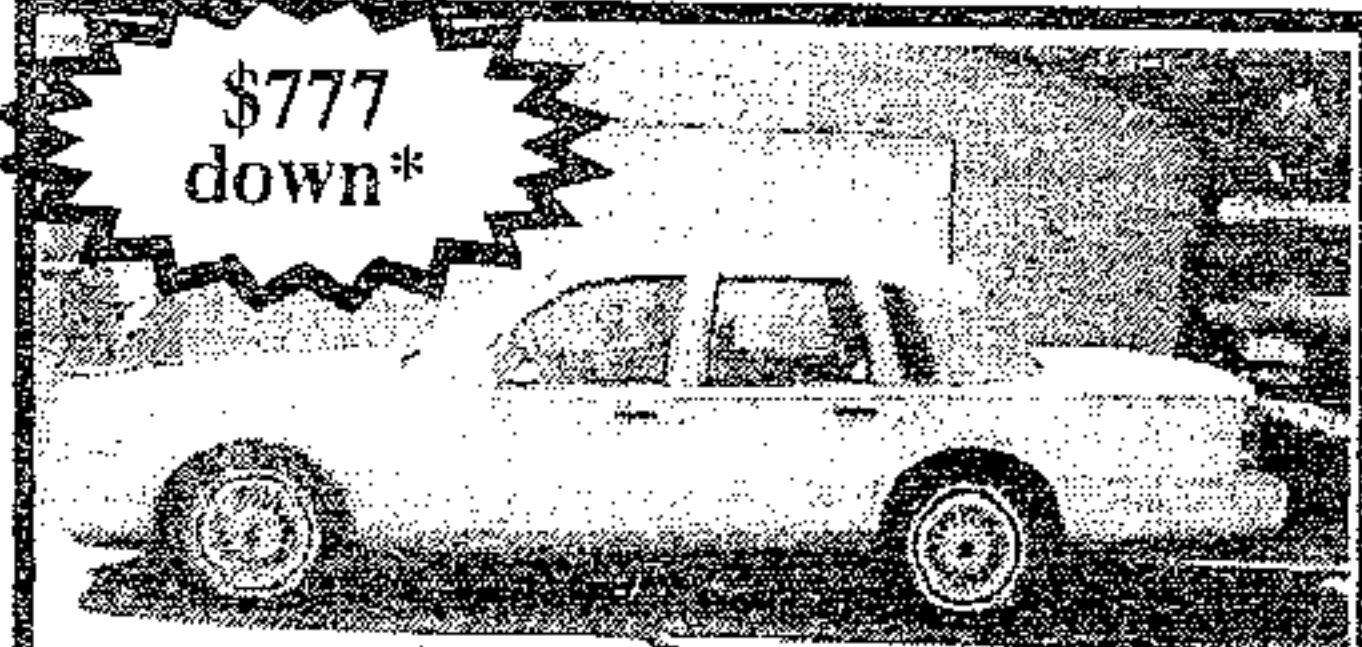
