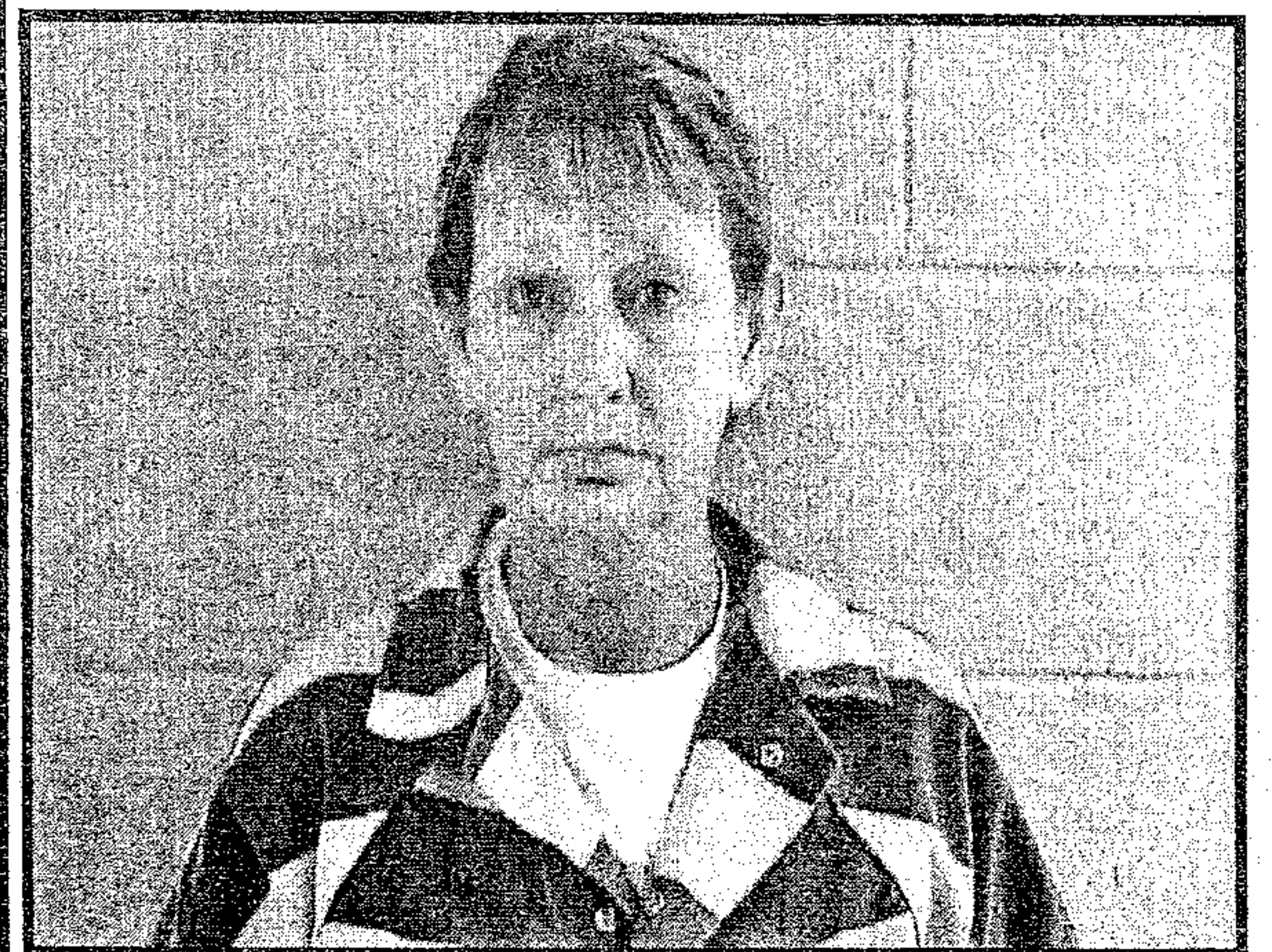
Over \$3000 in bad checks lands man in jail

account. The victim cashed the checks and they came back as insufficient funds. The checks totaled \$3070. The checks were on a Sheila Bowie account. A check of bank records indicated that as

of March 6, 2013 there was not enough money to cover the checks that were written.

Sheila Bowie had opened the account in February 2013 and listed Gary Wayne Gibson as her fiancée. During a recorded interview and after having been read

his rights Mr. Gibson stated when he presented the checks to Ms. Gibson he knew the account did not have sufficient funds to cover the amounts.

Gary Wayne Gibson, 33, of Foster Road, Lenoir City, was charged with worthless

Forgery

A Lenoir City man was charged with forgery and theft following an investigation by the Sheriff's Office. The man reportedly wrote two checks for over \$300 each that were stolen. The checks were written at Food City in Loudon.

Jamie Diane Kitts, 23, of Lakeview Road, Lenoir City, was charged with forgery x2 and theft under \$500 x2. According to one warrant, filed by Investigator Jeff Russell,

LCSO CID; on or about May 9, 2013 the victim reported someone had taken a check and purchased items at Food City in Loudon in the amount of \$369.62. In another warrant, on the same date the victim reported another check was taken to the Food City in Loudon and items purchased in the amount of \$330.95. This was done without the permission or knowledge of the owner of the check. Investigator Jeff Russell, LCSO CID made the arrest and filed the charges.

Funds Intended to Benefit Homeless and Abused Animals Stolen from Morristown Shelter

An employee of the Morristown-Hamblen Humane Society altered receipts to conceal the theft of \$51,130 from the organization's adoption fees and other funds, an audit by the Comptroller's Division of Investigation has revealed.

Receipts in the humane society's computer system were backdated - up to 11 years before the installation of the computer system - so they would not be included in daily collection reports. That meant money from adoption fees and other sources didn't appear in the organization's records. Investigators concluded that money was stolen by the employee, who was later fired.

Investigative auditors reviewed records from July 1, 2009 through October 31, 2011 after Hamblen County officials discovered the altered receipts from collections were not deposited into the humane society's bank accounts. The stolen funds should have been used to operate the animal shelter, enforce animal control ordinances and conduct ani-

mal cruelty investigations.

The employee involved had been responsible for gathering collections, matching collections with receipts and delivering those collections to the bookkeeper for deposit. During questioning by investigators, the employee admitted to backdating one receipt to "borrow" \$120. The employee refused to speak with investigators after being fired.

Investigators also found weaknesses in the humane society's accounting and record-keeping procedures, which made the theft easier to conceal.

"It is very important that there is an appropriate amount of oversight when public funds are being accepted, recorded and spent or deposited," Comptroller Justin P. Wilson said. "Putting too many responsibilities in the hands of one individual without that kind of oversight can create situations that are ripe for fraud or abuse. It is very unfortunate in this case that money that could have been used to help stray and abused animals in Hamblen County isn't available for that purpose because of this."

The Comptroller's Division of Investigation has forwarded copies of its report and supporting information to the Office of the District Attorney, Third Judicial District.
