Col Bee having an extensive knowledge of cyber operations kept his information unclassified as he explained the enormous challenges in the protection of the nation's computer operations. He also put the term Cyber combat into perspective, "Cyber warfare, challenges our notion; unlike traditional warfare where nations with

military forces compete on battlefields, in cyberspace we don't have to physically go anywhere to fight this war."

Col Bee also explained, "With potential adversaries from North Korea to China and organizations like Anonymous attacking our business and government computer systems daily the 24th Air Force has one mission, to make sure U.S. computer systems are as safe and secure as possible."

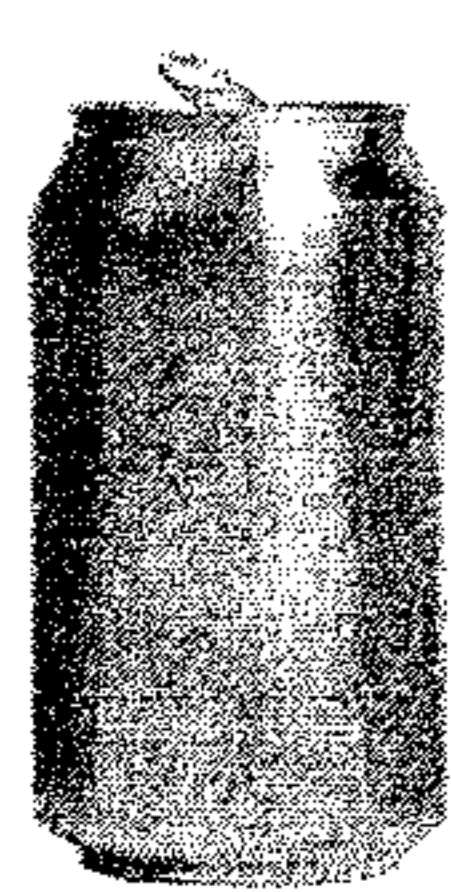

next three years and will add 200 permanent full-time jobs upon completion, as well as 400 jobs during the construction

phase.

The project will convert some of the plant's can sheet capacity to high-strength automotive aluminum capacity, as well as install incremental automotive capacity.

The Blount County expansion is scheduled to begin this month and be completed by mid-2015. When completed, the plant will be a key supplier to both the packaging and automotive markets. Much of the volume for the automotive expansion is already secured under long-term supply agreements.


