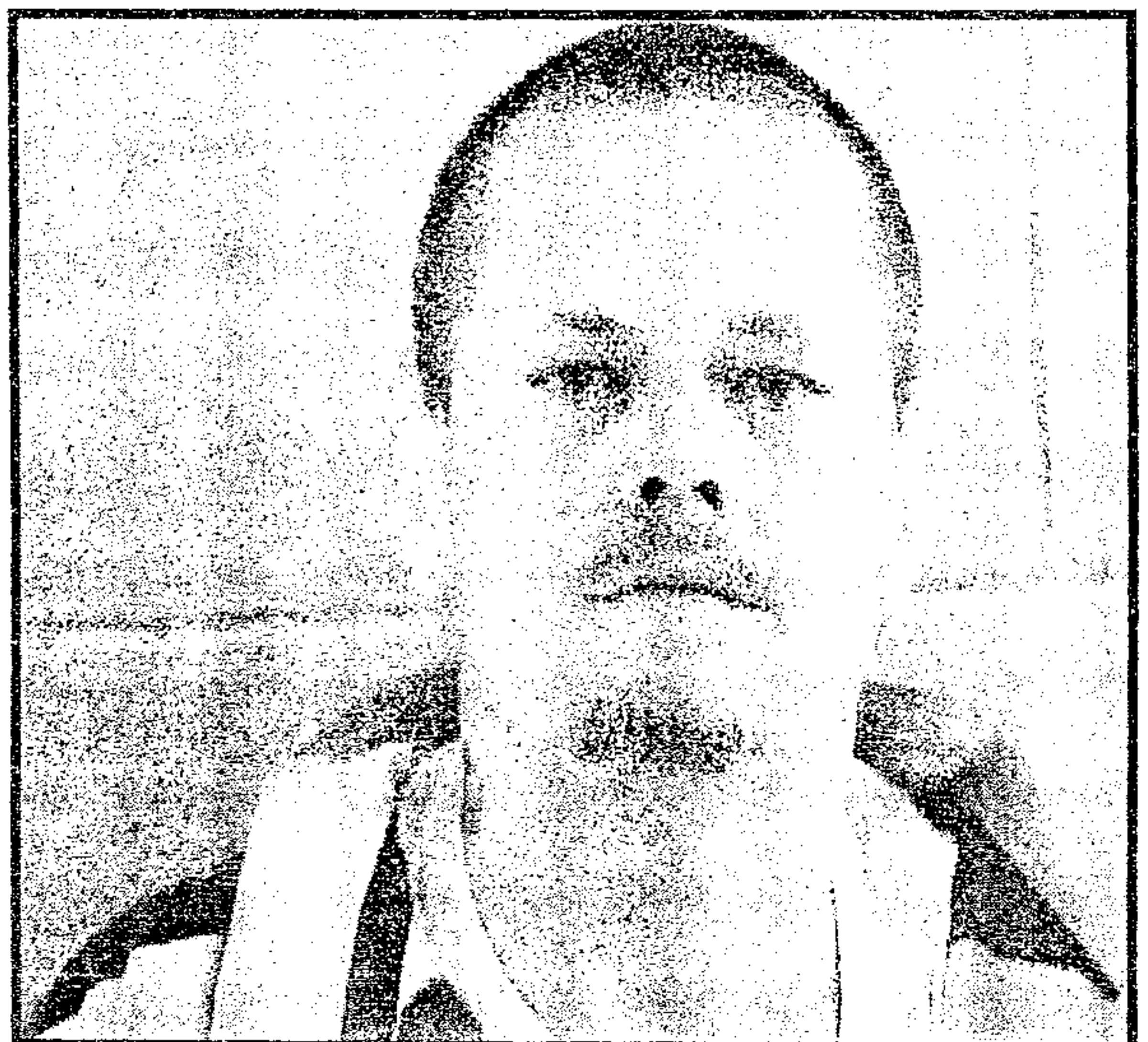

Assault over year old incident occurs in jail

ior change in the vehicle. The vehicle turned down a road and accelerated and the deputy followed it and activated his emergency equipment. The vehicle then sped onto another road and yet another before finally being stopped. The driver was identified as Joseph Lee Tipton, aka Joe Bag, and he reported he had drank about 9 alcoholic beverages prior to being stopped. Mr. Tipton had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person and

stated he "already got pulled over and got a dui". A check showed Mr. Tipton to have a revoked license for DUI. After refusing implied consent Mr. Tipton stated "I've been through this before". Mr. Tipton performed poorly on sobriety tasks as well.

Joseph Lee Tipton, 28, of Nebo Road, Walland, was charged with evading arrest, DUI 2nd, reckless driving, driving on revoked and implied consent. Deputy C. Huskin LCSO made the arrest.

Meeting

9th District Attorney General Russell Johnson held his annual drug and violent crimes task force annual meeting Tuesday in Kingston. Among those in attendance included our own Sheriff Tim Guider, Chief and Lenoir City Mayor Tony Aikens, Lenoir City Police Chief Don White, Investigators Kevin Condee and Jason Butler, Loudon Police Chief James Bear Webb and the notorious Sgt. RS Scott Newman. Loudon County Circuit Court Clerk Lisa Niles and State Representatives Jimmy Matlock and Kent Calfee were also in attendance.

General Johnson was joined by fellow DA's from neighboring districts including Assistant District Attorney Charne Knight from Knox County. Ms. Knight will be seeking the of-

fice of Knox County DA in the upcoming election there. 7th DAG Dave Clark, 12th DAG Mike Taylor and 8th DAG Lori Phillips gave presentations to the group about the alternative approaches to meth. The alternative described is a drug called Nexafed: the clear alternative to Sudafed. This drug works the same as Sudafed but when mixed with chemicals it turns to jelly and is unusable for methamphetamine production.

Also discussed was the requirement of a prescription for pseudoephedrine, which is already being done in Oregon and Mississippi.

Agents, officers, investigators, deputies, representatives all echoed the same message that methamphetamine use is clearly a problem for everyone and without relying on each other it will be much harder to rid our areas of the dreaded drug.

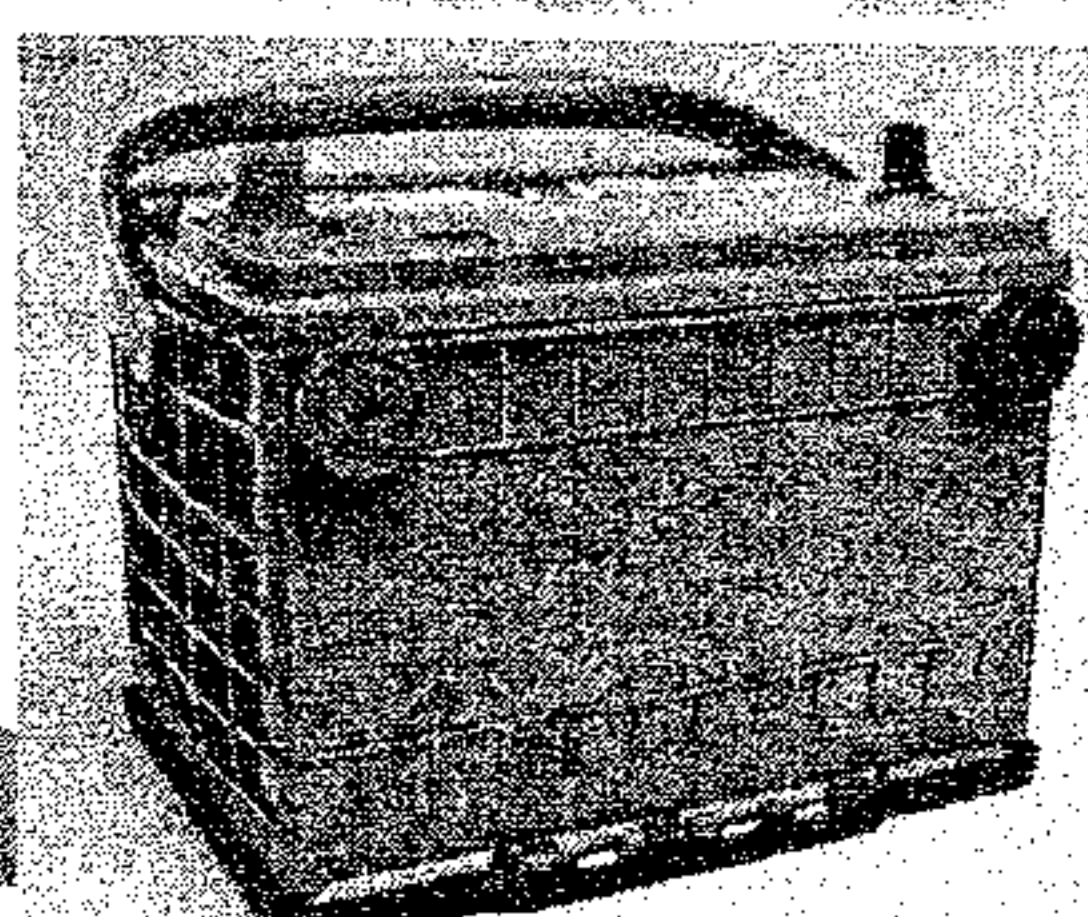




