the ground as if looking at her front bumper. As I got closer, I saw her stand up and walk over to the edge of the road carrying a pretty good sized turtle that she placed in the grass before hopping back into her car to continue her day. (I usually just try to straddle objects in the road with my car but occasionally I do accidentally send a rabbit or squirrel on to the hereafter.) The lady waved, as did I, and the little ninja turtle disappeared, never really knowing how close it came to being no more.

The lady I saw this morning was not driving a BMW and wasn't dressed in fine clothes;

she was driving like a ten year old Buick and was probably headed to an average paying job just like I was. As I traveled on to work, I began to think about what I had just witnessed and about the character of the lady. It was not the saving of a turtle that made her interesting to me, it was wondering that if she was willing to stop in the roadway to keep the turtle from getting ran over, then how much more does she do for her family or the other people she comes in contact with each day?

Have you ever noticed that those who have less to give always tend to give more than those who have plenty? Or that those who have the most need seem to

always be the ones doing for someone else? I certainly have and I believe those kinds of people will be truly blessed by God for their giving and caring hearts.

As we continue to look at the Book of James this week, I encourage you to examine your own heart and allow God to speak to you through His word.

James 1:9-11 (NKJV) (9) Let the lowly brother glory in his exaltation, (10) but the rich in his humiliation, because, as a flower of the field, he will pass away. (11) For no sooner has the sun risen with a burning heat than it withers the grass; its flower falls, and its beautiful appearance perishes. So the

rich man also will fade away in his pursuits.

James had spent many hours with Jesus. Even before Jesus began His ministry and began to display the power that God had given Him over heaven and earth, James lived under the same roof, shared the same dinner table and had a familial relationship with the Savior of the universe. James knew and understood the character, as well as the teachings of Christ. He considered the topic of humbleness and selflessness toward others important enough to address it within the first few lines of the letter he wrote to the twelve tribes. Here are the same words as Je-

sus taught them;

Mathew 6:19-21 (NKJV) (19) Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; (20) But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. (21) For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Mathew 23:12 (NKJV) And whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.
