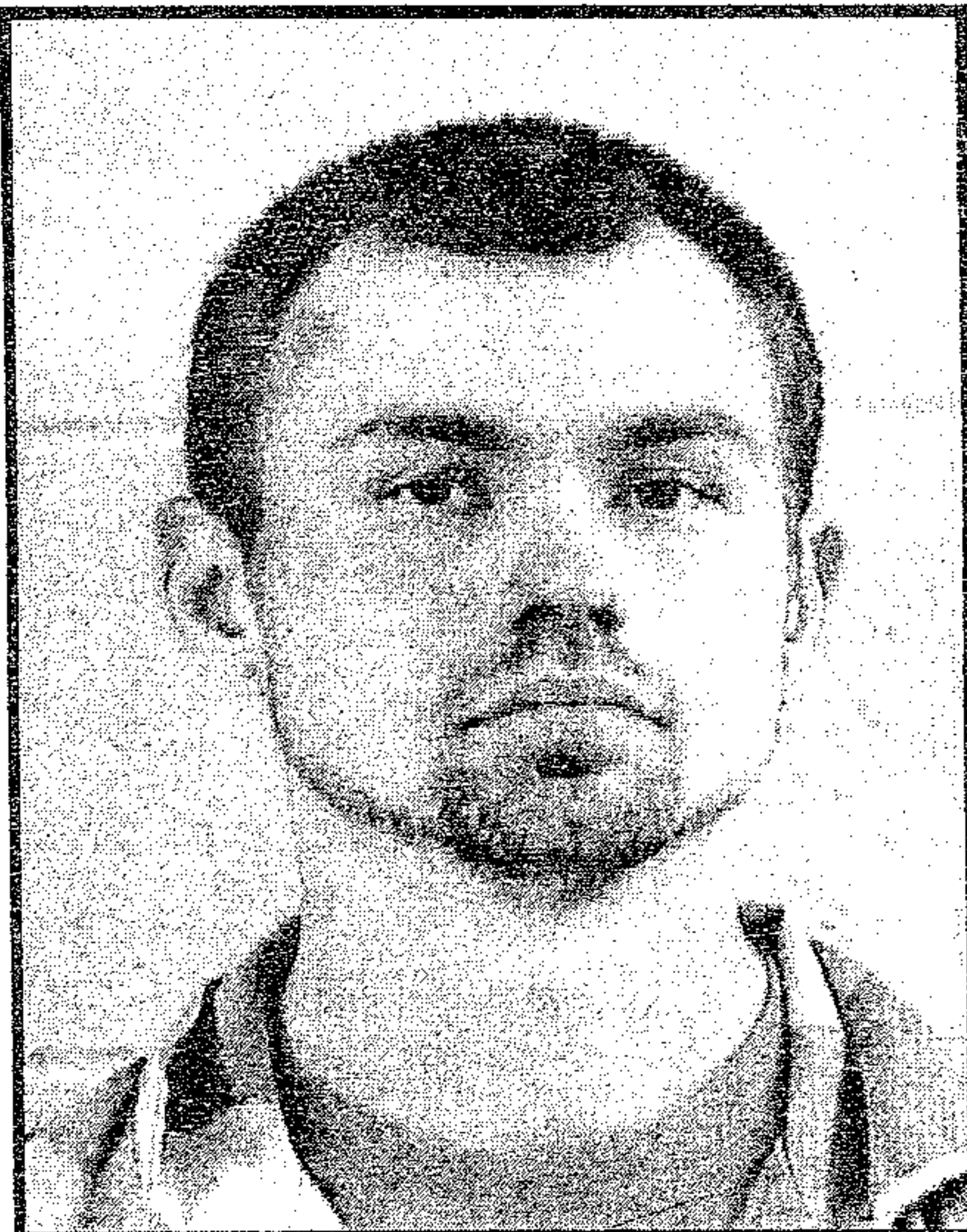

Deputy John Bearden, LCSO made the arrest.

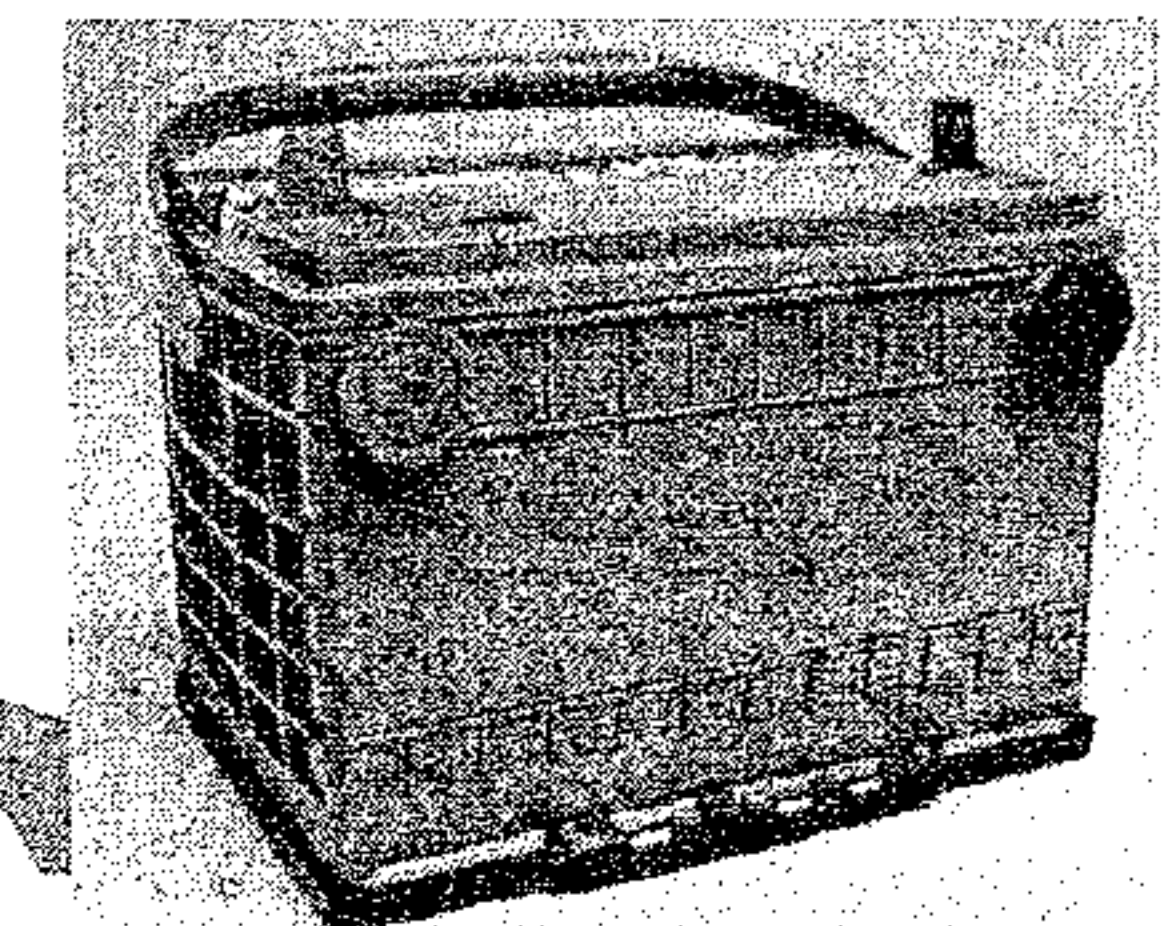

church only because others expect you to or because you feel guilty if you don't go? If we are honest with ourselves, and God, most of us have been guilty of going to church on Sunday for reasons other than growing in our relationship with Jesus. During those times in our life, we can usually leave the church house without even remembering what scripture the pastor had preached on and with no intention of applying that message to our lives in the upcoming days. I admit that I have been guilty of this, have you?

Sadly, we are not the first generation of Christians that are guilty of such unchristian like behavior, although I do believe we are the largest. As I studied and prepared to share the last lesson of the first chapter of James

this week, I couldn't help but wonder how great an impact the Christians of our community could make if we all applied today's scripture to our daily lives. While James was writing to new Jewish Christians about two thousand years ago, lets unpack this scripture as if he had written yesterday.... to you and me.

James 1:21-27 (NKJV) (21) Therefore lay aside all filthiness and overflow of wickedness, and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls. (22) But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. (23) For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; (24) for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. (25) But he who looks into the

perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does. (26) If anyone among you thinks he is religious, and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this one's religion is useless. (27) Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this; to visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep one's self unspotted from the world.

James is reminding the twelve tribes, and us, that as Christians we should not participate in the filthy and wicked things that are now so tolerated by the masses as normal. We shouldn't be drinking to excess, we shouldn't gossip about others, we shouldn't look at sexually explicit material, we shouldn't cheat on our spouses, we shouldn't

approve of homosexuality, we shouldn't gamble with lottery tickets, we shouldn't hold grudges against others, we shouldn't tolerate people blaspheming our Savior..... we shouldn't participate in things that God specifically tells us is sin!

Instead, we should "receive, with meekness, the implanted word, which is able to save our souls." When we truly accept Jesus into our hearts and lives, His Holy Spirit is implanted within us and therefore reminds us through conviction when we are living outside of the perimeters God has established for our lives in the Bible. God gave us a road map for an awesome life here on earth and an eternal life with Him later, but many times we close our ears and our eyes to God's plan because it is

rarely consistent with our own!

James 4:17 (NKJV) Therefore, to him who knows to do good and does not do it, to him it is sin.

God intends, no, God expects us to receive His word into our hearts and our lives, and then to respond to His word by doing the things that glorify HIS name instead of our own. We are told in verse 22 that if we hear God's word but do not obey God's word then we are deceiving ourselves!

Are there folks in our churches that get up on Sunday morning for church but then live like the world during the other 6 1/2 days of the week? Sure there are. Are they deceiving themselves to think that God is ok with that? According to this (see TGN ctd. pg. 5)

scripture, yes they are. Does this mean there are people within our churches claiming to be Christians that are possibly deceiving themselves

thinking they are saved but are not? According to God's word the answer to that question, unfortunately, is yes. (Read Mathew 7:21-23)

Through repeated failures in my own life and

eventual submission to God's plan instead of my own, I have come to realize that Christianity is not just a prayer that we pray to avoid eternity in hell and it's not just a simple label we can claim that makes

everything peachy with our souls. To be a Christian means to be CHRIST-LIKE. To be a follower of Jesus means that we die to ourselves, put God's plan in front of our own plan and we begin to live for His glory and to honor Him in all things that we say and do so that others will see His love for us and accept Him also.

When we begin to understand this and fully commit our lives to the Lord, we find that our way wasn't that great after all. We discover that a life dedicated to the Lord is more rewarding than a winning lottery ticket, a pocket full of 30's, a double shot of Jack and Coke or a brief affair that wasn't as awesome as we

thought it would be after lives are torn apart. Jesus is a winning ticket and His retirement plan is eternal! He will change every aspect of your life for the better when you place your trust in Him.

I don't want to be a hearer of the word; I want to be a doer! Whatever God is doing around my life, my church and my community, I want to be in on it! I want God to use my life to bring a lost person to salvation through Jesus or to bring a wayward Christian back to God where God can bless their life as He is my life these days. I don't want to deceive myself and I sure don't want to deceive you..... Let's Be Doers and Not Just Hearers!

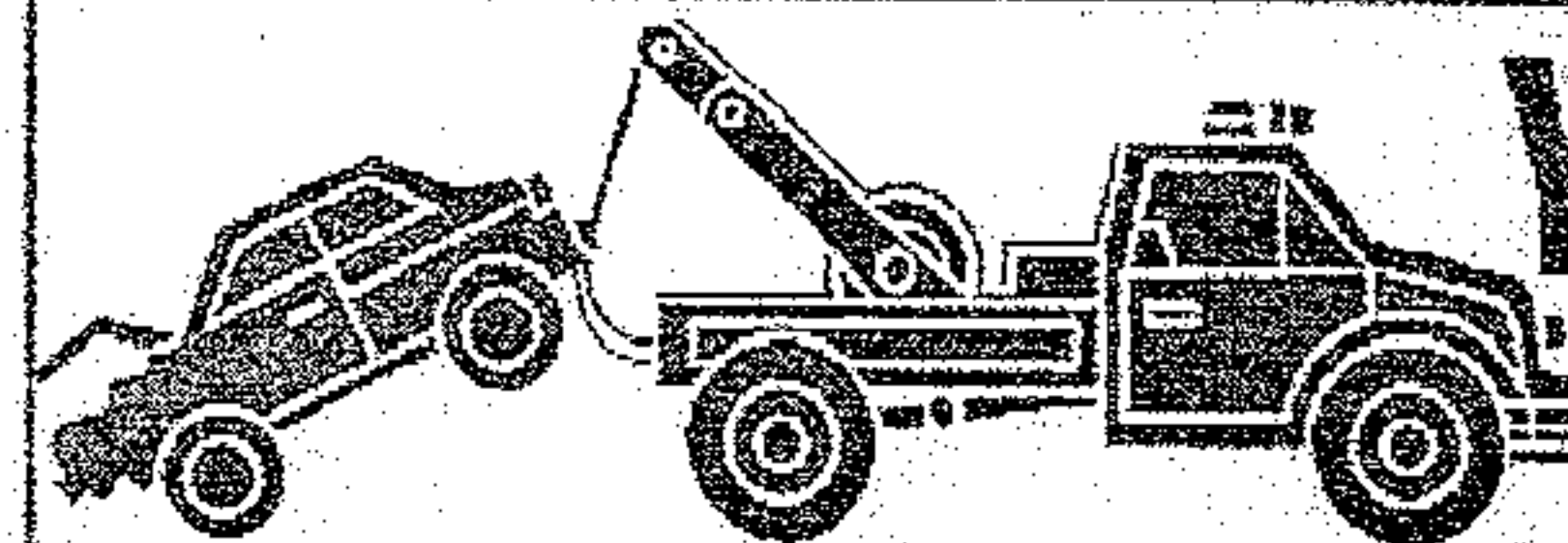


